Cruzeiro do Sul, Aug 4 1943
The last two Sundays have been ever so much better than usual, the
Lord has blessed the work in all of the preaching points, last Sunday
the house was fuller than I have seen it since I returned. The last
two weeks, at our prayer meeting services there have been conversions,
each time a man, last week it was a married man with nine children.
The family is now becoming interested and I hope that the children will
soon be in our Sunday School. There seems to be a number of others interested and I am hoping that the Lord will bring into the kingdom a
number of the lost ones.

MISSION BASE HOUSE BECOMING MOST POPULAR PREACHING POINT

Our new home is becoming the most popular preaching point, last Saturday night (Saturday is the night we have worship here) there were fifty men and women and a number of children. The room where we have worship was formerly a school room but it is not big enough, so as soon as possible we will remove the walls and make a good sized one that will accommodate 150 people. We will have to have more benches made, and now there are so few people who will work and the price is so much higher than it was that it seems ridiculous. Saturday night a man came, an unbeliever, he has some knowledge of medicine, but not a doctor, he treats people when they are sick, he brought news that a patient of his was very sick and that he had recommended to him that he send us word to pray for him that he might recover, and he did, and invited us there on Monday night to have preaching in his home. We went, had prayer and preached to more than forty people. He lives two miles away and when I returned I was tired but the next day I was happy to hear that he was better and wanted to hear some more of the gospel. It does encourage when the Lord extends His hand.

PREACHING IN THE HOMES

Last night (Aug 3) we had a fine service in rather a quite home, there were five young men who seemed to be very much interested. A young man just called on me, and as I presented the Saviour to him again, I ask him if he thought it too great a sacrifice to leave all and follow Jesus, he replied, "No I don't but the business I am in demands that I lie so much that I hardly think it worth while to begin." I opened anew at John 8:44 while he listened attentively, as he left he said he would go to the church building tonight to hear some more, he seemed to like it.

BRETHREN FROM MORAPIRANGO GET LETTERS TO ORGANIZE CHURCH.

The Brethren came in from Morapirango Saturday (July 31) and spent two days with us. They could not all come but the ones that did come brought a letter requesting the church to grant them a letter with which they could organize a church there. It was granted and they returned happy. If the Lord wills we will proceed on the third Sunday in August (Aug 15 1943). There were 39 lettered out for this reason. There are some to be baptized there but I do not know how many. There is an increased interest there and the Lord is blessing. The work is in progress at Japyni, the school teacher has begun her work among them and they are happy. I hope to go there when the church is organized at Morapirango and spend a few days. I do not want to be away from here long at a time any more, the work suffers and this is our base.

The mother church must not become weaker than the newly organized ones. The work is small and so little accomplished but at the end of the day I am weary. We have a mens prayer meeting that meets once a week that seems to be gaining ground. The Lord is blessing the work and I believe that it is partly due to the faithful, humble prayers of the brethren.

MONEY TO PAY FOR MOTOR, BOAT AND MISSION HOUSE

Yesterday I went and paid for the motor and boat and there is enough money in the bank to finish paying for the house. I do thank the Lord for the bountiful provision. I thank my brethren too. Last Sunday when I arrived at the lepers home there were twenty men waiting in the yard; soon another came, there was also a woman outside with a number Our services were very fine and the Spirit that prevailed was soul satisfying. The way to health and happiness is, to serve the Lord with your whole self the way that you can do it best and Jesus will take care of every need and heal every pain except the ones that must be endured to glorify Him and of course we do not want them removed but grace to endure. If Psalms 25:14 will comfort you as it has me, then it will certainly be a blessing. What could deepen my love for Him more than to know that He has singled me out from many more worthy than I and revealed a secret to me so amazingly great that it has confused the minds of multitudes in all past ages, who never seemed to understand. Yes the Lord has confidence in His people. often prove to be unworthy yet He is faithful to encourage us along the way. May His grace, love, mercy and peace be multiplied unto you all and His way be your way for His glory. Remember us to all the friends Sincerely, brethren and loved ones. J F Brandon

In the August issue of the Mission Sheets we told about Rebecca and betty Brandon being saved at the Grace Baptist Church in Detroit Mich during their week of Daily Vacation Bible School. Pastor B G Arterburn taptized them on Sunday night July 18 1943 and then the church sent a cablegram to their father Missionary J F Brandon in Brazil telling him the good news. In a letter to his wife and children which was dated four days after the one above, Brother Brandon tells about receiving the good news. With Mrs Brandon's permission we send you a part of this personal letter. It will make your heart glad. It reads in part:

Cruzeiro do Sul, Aug 7 1943 Dear Anna and children: - There are times that are more difficult than others, when perplexities arise that seem invincible but so far in such times the Lord Jesus manifests Himself in the most unexpected ways. After much prayer and hesitation this house was bought and it seemed after the deal was made that an abyss had been abridged and I still feel that there was. Another victory seemed to be gained when I accepted the offer of Louis and bought the motor without having the money to pay for it. I felt such a relief of spirit and was so happy over the trade, I can not express the joy I felt, still I knew not how the payment would be made. Since leaving there I have felt such an anxiety for the little girls and have lived in constant prayer to GOD for their salvation, and as it happened on the day that I received the telegram that the Lord had saved them, I was extremely sad, standing in the door of Pedreiras store, the boy brought me the message and when I read it my eyes as well as my heart overflowed. The attention of those nearby was attracted and thus an opportunity was offered to tell others of the amazing grace of the Lord Jesus that saves sinners from their sins and (Continued on page four)
