CHURCH AT CRUZEERO DO SUL 16 YEARS OLD

Dear Brethren:

Cruzeiro do Sul May 18 1945

Yesterday I received four letters from you, numbers 5,7,8 and the MISSIONS SHEETS for January. I was glad to hear from you; I thought I had waited long enough, almost three months without a word from anyone. On our anniversary May 12 the church here at Cruzeiro do Sul was 16 years old. 226 active members, 32 dead and at least that many moved away. More than 50 excluded, many of which we hope are saved and later will return.

4 CHURCHES AND 18 PREACHING POINTS

We have 4 churches and 18 active preaching points here in the Acre Territory. We have 14 men who are able to conduct the service in the usual way of preaching or teaching the Word of the Lord. The church was organized 16 years ago with 10 members, 7 men and three women. The sower and the reaper equal nothing. The Lord has given the increase. Blessed be the name of the Lord. (Brother Brandon has also organized 5 other Baptist churches in the State of Amazonas. He is now completing his 22nd year in Brazil.)

RESULTS OF A MISSIONARY JOURNEY

The BETTY BROWN (this is the name of the boat with the outboard motor) arrived Saturday March 31 with the two brethren who were so-journeying up river on a gospel mission. They left here on the morning of Feb 14 and arrived in Tresi de Maio for worship in the home of the owner of the place. The house was well filled and they were surprised at the interest shown. From these they visited a place that I had not been able to visit. It is about an hours run from the mouth of the Mouro river. The interest was greater than he had ever witnessed. They remained there 3 days and gave promise to stop on the return. From there they journeyed to Urubutano where a widow lives whose husband deserted her twenty years ago. She had four daughters and the oldest is married and gave a profession of faith some years ago and still claims to be a believer, however she is not baptized. There have been other professions there also but no further progress. We hope to have a work here in the futrue.

THE FOURTH STOP

The fourth stop was at the home of SenhorFirminho Bezeiro, who is the father and grandfather of 66. You will recall that he is the man who ordered me off his place and as a parting remark I told him that the blood of Jesus Christ would cleanse his sin and give him a better disposition if he would believe in Jesus and receive Him as his Saviour. I didn't mind being run off, it wasn't the first time, but I wanted him to know who I was and I told him: "Today you are driving from your home a servant of the Lord Jesus Christ" He changed his mind as quick as a flash, bid us remain, prepared dinner for us and passed the day and half the night hearing the gospel of grace from the Bible. Well now it seems that some of his daughters and granddaughters are (over)

interested in hearing the word. They passed a day and night with them going and coming.

FIFTH STOP AT CAMPO SANTANO

The next stop was at Campo Santano, a half hour above the village of Humaita. The brethren were overjoyed to see them. A worker has been living here since I returned and the work is in progress. They remainthere several days confirming the faith of the believers and preaching and exhorting the lost to seek the Lord while yet he may be found. The results were wonderful. There were 11 conversions, eight of which were be ptized and then a very sacred hour in partaking of the Lord's supper with the body of believers. They remained there 9 days then took off for Ouro Preito at the mouth of the river by this name. Here there are five believers and a number of interested friends. There was a young ledy who wented to be baptized who was saved on another occasion, but they failed to encounter her.

DRIVEN AWAY FROM BELLO HORIZONTES

The next place up river was Bello Horizontes where I had great hopes. Well the man of the place told the pastor to be off that the priest didn't want him there anymore. Its a relief to know the truth and again we thank God and take courage. You will recall the journey as we were going up river and someone called us from the bank, the name of the man was Nene Martins with a large family and neighbors. Well they called there and were very well received and he requested that on another journey that they stop and preach the Word to them. Next was a stop at Grajuru, the home of the unmarried couple that have only fourteen children. The man is a spiritest and wicked, but poses as a good man. OnceI told I wondered how he found comfort on earth knowing that he must give account to God for all the bastard lives he had brought into the world. He assured me that he had no fear whatever. Rom 5:18. There seems to be some interest among the neighbors and for that reason we still go there.

GOOD CROUDS AT RETIRE AND PROLONGABA

Next was Retire where I spent 10 days last summer with a sore foot. The pastor was surprised to see the interest there and how well they could sing. There are only a few of them who can read but more than 50 attended the services. They preached there on the return also. Next was Prolongaba where more than 40 awere present while at the same time the spiritiest were in sesson within a stones throw. They were very happy with the results of this meeting.

OHNOMA TA SYAG SI

From themse they journeyed to Amonho: (This place is in charge of Cicero Bicipo da Cruz a native preacher who is supported by Brother Lee Cox of Calvert City Ky). Here we have a worker and five other baptized celievers. The brethren were overjoyed with their arrival and the 12 days there were full ones, visiting, preaching, praying and carrying on in the usual gospel way. The Holy Spirit is greatly manifested on such occasions and there were six professions of faith and all were baptized. Praise God from whom all blessings flow. I hope to go there as soon as possible and organize a church and ordain the worker (Cicero) to the full ministry of the Lord Jesus. On the return down river some new points were visited and great were the number of people who heard the gospel for the first time. (Turn to page four)

On the way down river they pent two days with the saints at Ouro Preito and a week with the saints at Campo Santano and then touching all the places they had visited going up river and arriving at the home of the interested ones at the mouth of the Mouro river where they found a number gathered to hear the gospel. There were three conversions here and all were baptized. The power of God was upon them. The worker from Campo Santano was with them and was revorably impressed with the new work and wants to pass some time with them. Our system employed seems to impress the people. Upon arrival te give thanks to God for the journey and seek His guidance and then at the departing we seek his direction and invoke a blessing upon those The remain. In eating from their tables we insist in giving thanks to God for the food and other blessings of life. Brother I enjoyed the journey as much as they did for I was in fellowship with them in the Spirit all the way. Then as they related the things that I have tried to tell you, my heart overflowed with profound joy of the Spirit of the Lord. My body was not able to make the trip but I labored with them in prayer. The greatest joy known to man on earth is that of new born souls as they come singing into the kingdom. May the grace, mercy and perce of the Lord Jesus Christ be with you all, Amen.
