Calleys Faithfully Working At Task In Manaos, Brazil

October 28, 1953

Dear Brother Overbey:

We received three letters this week, one to me and two to Royal. I was glad to hear that Paul was waiting and coming with his family. It is so much better that way. I want to thank you and the church for your sympathy. It is still hard for me to believe that my dad has pass-ed away, but I have the conso-lation that some day I shall meet him in Heaven.

Royal has dropped his visiting and teaching for a while, till he feels better. He still goes every evening to the services and preaches four times a week. We have services every evening. He teaches Exodus, John, Revela-tion and Isaiah. These people are really interested and are learning something. We don't have a lot of members but the greatness is not in numbers Royal has really worked and taught these people. John Dias (native missionary), said the other week how thankful he was to have a missionary to teach him something and when someone asks him something he says

he can answer by the Bible.

As for the chairs for the church, we do not want the mission to pay for them. We gave the money to the church and the church bought the chairs. We give our tithes and offerings into the church like we did at home. the church like we did at home. We give way over our tithes and the church buys the chairs little at a time. All the members but a few give their tithes.

Missionary Lewis Is Happy In His Work In Iquitos, Peru

Dear Friends

Since I had the two hour discussion with the Jehovah Witness and we have been having services every Sunday morning refuting the heresy which they teach, our services have shown a decided increase in attention as well as attendance. Last Sunday I had ten men in my Sunday School class and they all gave me close attention.

At the present time a man who married one of our exclud-ed members has been saved and wants to be baptized. He was married by a Catholic priest which is not legal. This man also sells liquor in his store. He has invited me to teach classes in his store every Tuesday night. Last Tuesday night I taught the class about baptism, there were class about baptism, there were sixteen adults present and we certainly had a wonderful time. The subject of baptism always interests these people as true baptism is so different from what the Church of Rome and the Pertenting the Pertenting the Protestants teach.

I had to drop my class in the home of the paralytic as he al-ways remained in the bedroom while I taught in his front room. The front room is about five feet wide by ten or twelve feet long. The neighboring children would come in and makes such a disturbance that the man could not even hear mo. Juan is now making visits with him during the day when the children are in school.

Simon gives me a wonderful report from his visit to Piquroyaco. The great majority of the

inhabitants are Witoto Indians, the same tribe as Simon. They are now making a request to the Peruvian government that they might have Pigurovaco and surrounding territory as a reserva-tion exclusively for themselves. They have respect for Don Simon and want him to do all their preaching. They are going to construct a house for Simon to use as a preaching point and al-so to use as a place to live while he is there with them. They want preaching more than once a month so we will wait upon the Lord and see how he leads in these matters.

We are thrilled that the Hunters might be coming out even sooner than we expected. The housing situation here is terri-ble. For the last six months we have been looking for a better house, or I should say a house in a better location. The Hallum's did a fine job is getting us this house, but now we have so much traffic on this street and we also have a government op-erated restaurant next door, so therefore the noise and dust becomes a burden at times. Will do all that we can to help the Hunters on their way.

The Lord is blessing and the

truth is having its effect and I feel more content and more satisfied than I have ever felt before in my ministry. The field here is tremendous and the opportunities are enormous. English language fails to des-cribe the need as we look around and see these people spiriually dead and blind to light of the glorious gospel of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.
