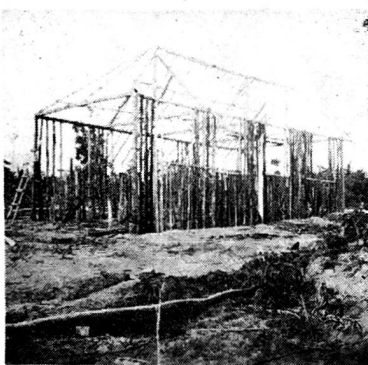

# BUILDINGS - LAUNCH - REVIVAL - SCHOOL - OPPOSITION



Five months ago in the April Mission Sheets we announced the organization of Beautiful Garden Baptist Church at Japiim, seven miles out from Manaus, Brazil. The services of this church are held in the large front room of the pastor's home. Now this new church is building a new church building. Pastor Argemero Leite is on the top putting up the roof joists.



Note that the lumber is all rough and cut out of logs by hand. Space is left for windows. The space between the upright pieces will be filled solid with mud and when it dries a thin coat of cement plaster like stucco will be put on the outside and inside of the mud. This makes a good cool, comfortable building. The roof will be wood shingles cut out by hand.



This is the first class of the Preacher's Bible School in Manaus, Brazil taught by John Hatcher. They finished the first quarter of school (three months) July 31st and after one month they will begin the second quarter of three months, and then another month off, etc. Brother Rodrigues and wife shown in the picture are visitors.



Work on the new church building is stopped, waiting for the lumber for the roof. Brother Hatcher hopes to start work again in September and go on to the completion of this part of the building. Its completion depends on you. Brother Hatcher cannot finish the building without the money to pay for materials and labor. Pray about it and then give.

## LEWIS PREPARE TO GO TO LIMA TO MEET THE LAUERMAN FAMILY

Iquitos, Peru, Aug. 20, 1957.

Dear Chosen Ones:

Things are humming around our house these days. We are preparing for the arrival of the Lauermans and for our trip to Lima to meet them. We plan to arrive in Lima a week or so ahead of time. Ruby still has the fungus on her head that she got in the hospital when Donna was born and we want to see if something can be done about getting rid of it. The Hallums appreciate our feelings (about the coming of the Lauermans) more than anyone else and I will never forget Bro. Hallum's words when we

first met, here in Iquitos, he said, "I have waited 17 years for this".

Our services are about the same in spite of the extremely hot weather that we are having. We sent a victrola and records to Sergeant Rios who is stationed on Tiger Island near the Columbian border. We also sent him tracts, Bibles, and some food. We are looking forward to his return to Iquitos in two years. Simon Gaima and his family are well. Juan Castro is progressing with his music lessons and is picking out some hymns now. He says he needs a little "polishing" now.

## New Church Building Going Up At Japiim; Hull of Launch To Be Started Soon; Revival Meeting At Calvary; Preacher's School Finishes First Quarter; Lumber Ready for Roof Soon; Other Baptists In Manaus In Union Meetings; Needs Offerings To Finish New Building.

Manaos, Brazil, Aug. 14, 1957

Dear Friends in Christ Jesus:

Needless to say, the greatest joy that we have had this month is to know that God has made it possible for the Lauermans to go to Peru without the usual long wait. I know that it will be a real joy for Brother Lewis to have Brother Lauerman as a co-laborer. The folk who support this work can be thankful to God for these two faithful families that He has chosen for the work there.

### Work In Manaus Going Well

We continually praise God for the blessings. I am sending some pictures of the new building which the Beautiful Garden Baptist Church at Japiim is now building. These pictures are a little out of date now because almost all of the shingle roofing has been put on. Putting on a shingle roof here is a little more difficult here than in the United States since the logs have to be cut in the desired lengths and the shingles cut out by hand.

### The New Launch

Perhaps our friends get a little impatient to hear about the work on the launch. We have tried to find a builder

since January or before, the truth of the matter is that there are many builders but they build just a common type of hull and they do not build by plan. Some might think that a launch is going to cost a lot of money and that we are being too particular, but a launch to travel on the Amazonas river has to be almost strong enough to go to sea. We have storms here on the river that sink very large boats, and when these storms come even the largest boats that travel the rivers pull into a protected place and wait for the storm to die down. This is the reason that a launch for this work has to be a well-built thing. The man who drew the plans for the hull is also building a launch and has employed two men who are going to build his and ours, so in a few days we hope to give the notice that work has begun.

### The New Building

All work on the new building is now stopped but we are hoping to receive the wood for the roof and trusses at the end of August. Pray with us that when we start work on the building again that the money will be supplied so that we can finish it completely without having to stop work again.

We know that some of the Baptist churches will go into this deal but we are hoping some will not. The next meeting is to be held in the First Baptist Church. ## LUNSFORD MAKES JOURNEY DOWN RIVER - THREE SAVED



This is a picture of the church at Campo de Santana. It is on the Jurua river 125 miles up stream from Cruzeiro do Sul. This was taken after the Sunday morning service by Brother Bruce Lunsford on his last journey to this place. The only way to get to this place is by boat. Brother Cicero Bispo is the pastor of this Church.



While on the journey up the Jurua river to Campo de Santana, the missionary was waved down and asked to stop to give medicine to the baby being held by the woman. The baby had pneumonia. The sick was ministered to and the gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ was preached. Seed sown and some day it may bear fruit.

I return from Lima as I want to be on hand in case the priests care to make an issue of it. Peru is not as Catholic as the priests would lead one to believe. Some weeks ago a priest was arrested in another city for immorality with a 12-year old boy. The priests here went on the radio and said that it was all a lie but the facts remain that the newspaper published a picture of the police escorting the priest to the jailhouse.

We thank God that the Lauermans are coming to Peru and it is our heart's desire that the Holy Spirit will stir up others who will feel the great burden of the forgotten continent of South America. The need is great in this sin blighted country. Mr. George Wagner, a horticulturist, who has visited in many parts of the world told me that Iquitos ranks at the top of the list for immorality.

The Word of God is true, even if no one believes it, and it says that we shall reap in due time if we faint not.

### Down the Jurua River to Guajara, Alegria and Luciana; Three Professions of Faith; Plans for Long Journey Up River.

Cruzeiro do Sul, Aug. 3, 1957.

The Lord has blessed us with a good trip to Luciana, (first services to be held in that place) which is seven beaches below Alegria. We had a service in the home of the man who had been in the services of Bro. Hallum in Iquitos, Peru, 21 years ago. He was 23 years of age when there in 1936. His name is Clarindo Alves de Souza, a man with a family of five children, and much interested in the Gospel. He is well thought of in his community, it seems, by the number of neighbors who came to the service and the way in which they greeted him. Will have a picture when developed, if good. This community seems to be above the average in the ability to read and write. Seemingly, more people down the river read and write, on the average, than those up the river. There was much interest shown there, and many wanted to know how long it would be until the next trip there. We hope that we will be able to go there again soon.

#### Guajara

On our way there we stayed two nights in Guajara, July 24th, 25th. Guajara is a promising place for a good work, and needs to be concentrated on for several nights in a row. Maybe I will get to do that before long.

#### Alegria—One Profession

We left the 26th for Alegria. We were there for the night service, which was well attended. The house and porch were full as usual. Bro. Pedros' daughter, Alicia, made a profession of faith at the close of the service. In talking to her, after the service, she said she was trusting in Him, but she was going to follow Him in her way. This meant that she still plans to attend the things of the Catholic church. I believe a little later she will see things differently.

#### Luciana—Two Professions

On the 27th we went to Luciana, as I have already explained in the first paragraph, and came back on the 28th for

the Sunday night service at Alegria. We had the usual crowd, but at the close of the service, there were two professions of faith. John Evangelisto, who lives just across the river from Bro. Pedros where the services are held, and Isalda Francisca do Nascimento who is here in Cruzeiro do Sul to be baptized by Bro. Rodrigues tomorrow. She is a widow woman and eligible to be baptized, but the man is living with a woman and married only by the priest, actually not married by law, yet he said he had a desire to do whatever was necessary to be baptized and become a member of the Church.

We came on here to Cruzeiro do Sul after we had stopped for the night and a service in Guajara. Our plans were to stop long enough to get our mail from Bro. Calley and to talk to Dr. Abel, who has come back here to stay. After seeing the Doctor he told us to stay here from six to ten days before going on. On the 26th at the lake at Alegria, my boys and I had finished taking a bath, and were all out of the water, but Bobby slipped and sat down on the stump of a small tree that had been cut about a foot high. It was not real sharp, so the result was a hole torn about three-quarters of an inch in diameter and over one inch deep. Dr. Abel opens up the wound and swabs it out each day to make sure it heals internally first. He said we might get to go on up river next Monday, August 5, as by then Bobby will have taken the series of six Penicillin shots, and the wound may not have to be opened up any more after that. Our first thought was to come immediately back to Cruzeiro do Sul after Bobby was hurt, but we are thankful that we didn't, because of the professions of faith later. Bobby stayed in bed, aboard the *Ambaxador* during the remainder of the services and trip, and is now getting along fine.

We are hoping to have a real good letter after our trip up river. This would have been part of it if it hadn't been for having to stay in town for awhile. Pray for us. Yours sincerely,

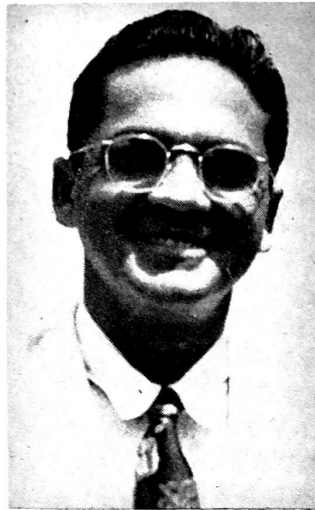
## ABOUT \$3,000,000.00

Ty Cobb, who is perhaps the greatest baseball player of all time, has given one million dollars to help young men from his home state of Georgia get an education. Mrs. Walter O. Briggs, the widow of the man who owned the Detroit Tigers, and the Company that made automobile bodies, willed to the University of Detroit, a Catholic Jesuit school, a half million dollars for a new building. Mrs. Gladys Lovelace of Peoria, Illinois willed to the First Church of Christ Scientist in Boston \$1,499,602.53. Added together these three people gave three million dollars, (less \$397.47). Ty Cobb is still living. The Catholic and Christian Scientist women are dead.

We read the announcements of these three gifts within about two weeks time in the Detroit papers. So far as we know, Baptist Faith Missions does not have any rich friends. But there are enough friends of BFM who are saved and love the truth who could give the money to finish the church and preacher's school building, the Launch and with another \$3,000 we could perhaps pay for the large house boat and motor and buy an extra motor or two. ## LUNSFORD OPENS NEW MISSION POINT IN VAJA; LEAVING ON LONG JOURNEY

Cruzeiro do Sul, Acre, Aug. 23, 1957

We are just now ready to leave for the upper Jurua. Bobby had to make twelve visits to the doctor to have his wound cleaned. He is OK now. That made it so near salary time for the workers that I just stayed until it was taken care of. In the meantime I have preached several times.

### Vaja

One neglected part of this city seemed to appeal to me, so I went there and preached several nights. Two times I took Brother Royal to preach. Last Monday night there were two professions of faith. Brother Royal came back from a visit to Mourapirango and I took him there to preach on Wednesday night, and there were two more professions of faith. Last night I stayed on the *Am-baixador* (houseboat) with the things we put there yesterday, because there has been a lot of stealing, but Brother Royal and Brother Rodrigues and family went, and Brother Royal told Ava Lynne that there was another last night who was saved. They are to go back again Monday night. The place is in Cruzeiro do Sul, but they call it Vaja.

### First Baptism in Brazil

Last Sunday (Aug. 18, 1957) all of the Lunsfords left here in the morning and went to the home of a family near Colonia, on the Jurua river. Both father and mother were believers, but the mother had never been baptized. We had two services there, and baptized the woman Sunday afternoon. If the pictures turn out good I will send them to you. This is the first time I have baptized anyone here in Brazil, but there are several waiting to be, that I plan to baptize on this trip, if they still want to be.

### A Bicycle Trip

A man here gave Jamie a bicycle and I am making good use of it. I have found out that there is a lot of work that could be done beyond the airport. One Sunday I went twenty minutes beyond the airport with the accordion behind me on the bicycle and held a service in a home. The woman in the house said that she was the only believer beyond the airport, and she is of the pentecostal

type. I went to Mourapirango to take Brother Eufrazio's and Brother Cido's salary to them, and I was less than three hours on the road, and I visited with Brother Eufrazio 45 minutes. He seems weak yet, short of breath, but the swelling has gone out of his face, hands and feet. I have hopes that he may get alright in time. I hope to have some good pictures and a real good letter for the paper when we return from the trip up the Jurua. We hope to be gone a month.

I hope you have a good time at the Woodlawn Terrace Baptist Church conference. We received the Cablegram sent from Alderson, West Va. to Bro. Lunsford and myself. We were very pleased at their thoughtfulness.

Bro. Lunsford is away at Alegria and Guajara at the present time. He came back from Manaus as spry as could be and says he feels fine.

At the end of this week I intend to leave for Jajjim. I will be so glad to get on the rivers again. I am going on up to Barao also. This has been my first opportunity to leave Cruzeiro do Sul since Bro. Rodrigues went to Manaus. I hope that there will be some souls saved.

Last week a Jehovah Witness attended our services with a couple of his helpers. After the services he came up to Rodrigues wanting to know how he justified his doctrine over the soul, etc. I challenged him to a public debate. He accepted and the next night we debated over the Trinity. When we finished he was so stunned and nervous he could hardly speak, something about him touched me, I think he was really sincere and surprised that his position was not defensible. He said he didn't want to debate anymore. I went over to see him and the others with him. There are six

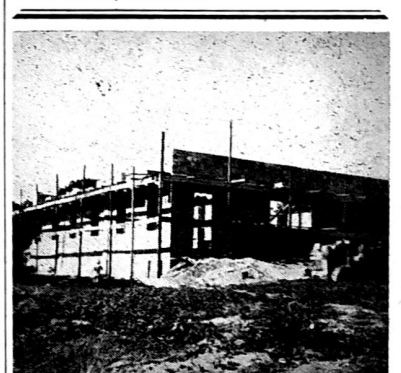
