




## BUILDING THE HOUSEBOAT "EMBAIXADOR II"



Sebastion, a son of the "Old Patriarch", is building a large houseboat for Paul Calley and wife to live on permanently. First he built this shed to protect the lumber and boat from the hot sun and the rains. This is on the Parana dos Mouras river and this Brother is building this houseboat, which will be about 40 feet long, completely by hand.

## NEWS ABOUT NEW BUILDING AND PROGRESS ON LAUNCH

Dear Brother Overbey,

Well, by the time you get this letter the year of 1957 will have about "hit the dust". It seems impossible that time could go so fast and so little could be accomplished. We are well advised by the scriptures to "redeem the time".

I received your letter written Nov. 30 after the Conference and was thrilled to hear about it.

All goes well here with us and the Lord's blessings continue. Due to the fact that I could not leave the building at this time I sent Brother John Dias to Faro. He should arrive there this afternoon. Due to the fact of the intense heat we have had a terrible battle with all of the wood in the roof. The heat twists the ends of the roof overhang (in spite of the tongue and groove) that it has been almost impossible to get the waves out of the roof edges. However all of the tongue and groove is laid and the "battle of the bulges" is about won. Tomorrow, the Lord willing we will start laying the strips for the tile which means that if we do not have too much rain we should have the tile laid by the 14th of this month. Yesterday, they started to set the frames for the windows and doors which have to be set before the stucco goes on the walls. The windows and doors should be done the first of February. I have not ordered the tile flooring yet but should do so this week. For all the painting that has to be done I think I am going to buy a spray gun. I have figured it up and think that it will be much cheaper than the labor of having it done by hand, besides being a better job.

I didn't know what to do about the launch. The builder was a good worker and a Baptist from Santarem. I really wanted him to finish the boat but he and the man from the bank that has helped me from the beginning had a falling out and the man went back to Santarem. I didn't know what to do. I tried to buy what was already done and take it to Santarem for the fellow to finish there but the man at the bank would not sell it. He said "I will finish your launch but I will not sell the wood for him to finish." So, I decided to stay with the bank man trusting the Lord to provide us with a well made launch. All of the ribs are cut but as yet he does not have another builder to work. Brother, a contract means nothing whatsoever. Let us pray that the Lord will see that we have a launch in a few months.

Miguel Ibernion's oldest girl (age 13) is living with us now to go to school. She has completed all the grades that they have in Codajaz.



The saw mill. The log is first hewed square by hand then it is elevated about seven feet high and the boards are sawed out of the logs by hand. The boy on top pulls up the long saw and Sebastion on the ground pulls the saw down cutting through the log. Sebastion has been working on this boat for almost a year by the time you read this. We did not receive the pictures until after the December MISSION SHEETS were printed. We hope to have this boat finished and ready for the Paul Calleys to move in and live on it by early spring. ## PRESSING NEEDS - A BAPTIST DEBT

Missions is a debt. It is a Baptist debt. No one can do Missions in full as the Great Commissions commands that it be done except Scriptural Baptists. ANY can GO. SOME can GO and MAKE DISCIPLES. But only Baptists can GO and MAKE DISCIPLES and then Scripturally BAPTIZE them and then INDOCTRINATE them, or teach them to observe the all things. Baptists can pay this debt by PRAYING, by LOOKING, by GOING and by SENDING. It is a debt that we never get paid. We owe the gospel to the lost.

### Church and Preacher's School Building

There is a great need for funds to finish the new building in Manaos. At present the church part of the building is being finished, then the School part of the building and the breezeway that connects the two buildings together. We do not know the exact amount needed to finish this building and do not know how to estimate it accurately. We estimate that it will take about (at least) \$7,000.00 to finish this building. About \$13,000.00 has been raised so far.

### Launch

Brother Hatcher has had a great problem in getting a builder for the Launch. We estimate that it will take at least \$2,100.00 or more to finish the launch. The most pressing need just now is for the funds to buy the motor for the new large Houseboat for Paul Calley and wife to live on permanently. We believe that this boat will be complete and ready for the motor by April the Lord willing... but we do not have a motor to put in the boat. We believe that we have enough funds on hand to finish the boat itself, and pay for it in full. We estimate that it will take about \$1,600.00 to buy the motor and parts, etc. This new houseboat will be named the "Embaixador II". The old smaller houseboat, the "Embaixador" has been turned over to Brother Bruce Lunsford and he and his family are making journeys to the regions beyond. Please join us in prayer about these needs and give as the Lord shall lead you. There are churches and Pastors that support this work that give sacrificially. Many churches that give small offerings are the best givers because they give a lot in proportion to their size and ability. Then there are some churches that could easily buy this motor for Paul Calley's new houseboat, and they would get a blessing for doing so. Remember that you are not buying the boats and motors for the missionaries personally. The boats are for the

## THE LAUERMANS ARE WELL AGAIN; STUDYING SPANISH

Dear Brother Overbey,

Three month's ago yesterday (Sept. 14) we arrived in Iquitos, and it seems like only yesterday. Time sure flies. This also makes 9 weeks that we have been taking Spanish lessons. Every day we think that we will just start in and rattle off this Spanish, but then we realize there is a lot that we have not even touched. Pray that we will learn it soon.

The weather has been warm and dry for the last few weeks, after a cool, damp spell. To my amazement, I found out that the rainfall here averages 3 times that of the state of Kentucky. It seems, though, that when the weather is hot our family stays healthier. My wife was down several days with the flu, as well as our daughter, Karen. This rounds out all of the family to have had sickness since we have arrived here. Paul, also fell on the bed and cut his eye open and it needed a few stitches to mend it properly. It seems like there is always something to keep you on your toes. After one is able to preach, maybe some of this tension will leave. All are well now again. The children have toys to play with now, which helps to keep them occupied. Brother Simon gave them a dog, which they think is real nice.

I am going to buy a guitar. I used to play, when I was younger. Brother Lewis thinks this will be good for river trips as well as here. Later, after I learn the Spanish I want to take lessons on a accordeon, as I believe will not be too difficult. I believe I could start off on this guitar after a little brushing up.

Brother Lewis ought to have his boat in the water this week, the Lord willing. This I am sure will please him. He has waited so long for this. We again thank the Lord for the fellowship with the Lewises. Words cannot express our feelings.

Heresy and filth are still on the rampage here. Some are either trying to steal your workers, get your members to think that you are too radical or do anything privately to hurt your work. Also, one was saying the other day that the Holy Spirit had started a work of salvation in a man's heart and has now stopped. As for filth, one section of Iquitos, called "Belen", has homes with thatched roofs, dirt floors, holes in some of the walls, and houses connected together, and the children run with half enough clothes on, which one can see why the people are usually sick. Two of the three theaters, that were torn up by the young people recently, are opened. Candles are burning here in most of the homes for the Saints, and the Christmas decorations are spreading every day, and it is just a mess, but God is able to overcome all of this.

This is the lowest cost to get a missionary family on the mission field that we have had in recent years. This was due to the fact that there were no household goods shipped by boat, and no customs charges for same. Also, Brother Mitchell Lewis advised us of a new Airline from Miami to Lima, that saved several hundred dollars on the airplane tickets.

## Royal Calley Has Nervous Breakdown In Brazil; Refuses To Come Home

On Sunday, Dec. 8, 1957, Brother Royal Calley appeared at the door of John Hatcher in Manaus, Brazil all unexpected. He did not speak or say anything for several minutes. A Doctor in Manaus examined him and said that he had a complete collapse of the nerves and advised him to return to the United States immediately. Royal refused to come home and the doctor recommended that he go to a health resort near Rio de Janeiro for 20 days. Brother Hatcher went with him as it was not safe for him to travel alone. The Doctor at the health resort gave the same diagnosis and recommendation, but Royal refused to come home. Brother Hatcher called us on the phone from Rio de Janeiro and advised that three Doctors advised that Royal must come home, but that he would not come and he could not do anything with him. They returned to Manaus. The children were still in Cruzeiro do Sul and Brother Lunsford was not successful in getting them to Manaus. Brother Hatcher cabled us for Brother Paul Calley to come immediately and Brother Paul got his passport visaed as soon as possible and left for Manaus, Brazil on Thursday, Jan. 2, 1958 and arrived in Manaus on Saturday, Jan. 4. Royal left Manaus for Cruzeiro do Sul the same day that Paul arrived in Manaus but before he got there. A cablegram received today (Jan. 7th) from Paul Calley advises that he will have to wait a week for a plane to Cruzeiro do Sul and that all will be a slow process. We feel that all the supporters of Baptist Faith Missions are entitled to know the facts and we have given them the best we know how. Please remember that Brother Royal is the Lord's servant and that he has been faithful and has done a good job as a missionary when he was well and able. He is not in a condition to either receive or write letters. We all love Brother Royal, and all will continue to love him and be patient and understanding. Please join us in daily prayer for him and his children. The John Hatchers in Manaus, Brazil and the Bruce Lunsfords in Cruzeiro do Sul have done all they can and know to do. They are about exhausted. Please pray for them also. We trust that Brother Paul will be able to get Brother Royal (and the children) to come home. It is a problem that only the Lord can solve. Pray much.
