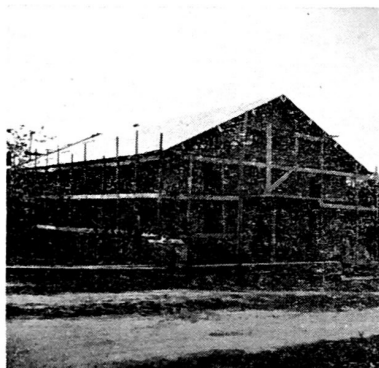

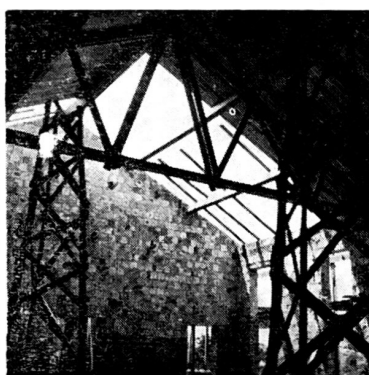

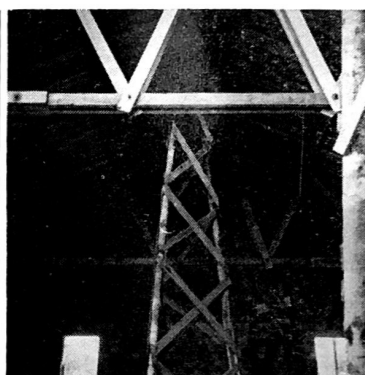
NEW BUILDING IN MANAOS — UNDER ROOF



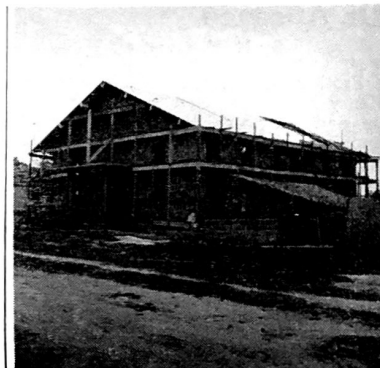
The roof boards are almost on this side of the building.

John Hatcher Has New Building Under Roof; Soon Ready To Use

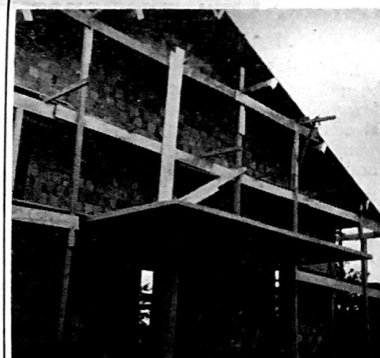
The pictures on this page show the new church building in Manaus, Brazil as it looked the second week in January. The roof was on and the plaster or stucco on both inside and outside except for the finish thin coat. Windows and doors were being made and the tile floor was to be laid and perhaps soon the building will be ready for the first service in it.

This has been a long, hard grind—over two years of hard work. Back of this building is to be a Preacher's School building the same size but with lower ceiling and divided into an office, libra-

ry, class rooms and assembly room. Then the two buildings will be connected with a Breezeway with roof overhead the same size as the two buildings.

We estimate that it will take at least \$8500.00 to build the Breezeway and the Preacher's School building. It may take a lot more. We do not know. It is very hard to estimate the cost. Please pray and ask the Lord what He would have you give on this building that it may be completed.

Funds For Paul Calley's Houseboat Is The Greatest Need At This Time

The Old Patriarch's son, Sebastian, has been building the new large houseboat. He has been working on it for about a year and a half and should soon have it completed, the Lord willing. He has had to cut and saw all boards out of logs by hand and it has been a hard, tedious, and long job. They say the boat will be a masterpiece.

We need the money to pay this man as soon as he has the boat finished, which means right away soon. We estimate that it will take a total of about \$2200.00 to finish this boat ready to run. There was only one motor in Manaus like the one needed for this boat and Brother Paul Calley had Brother Hatcher buy it, and Brother Paul will take it up river on a boat to Cruzeiro do Sul. To pay for this motor and the parts, tools, etc., that must be had for the boat it will take all we have in this fund and perhaps more. That leaves nothing as of today to pay the builder. To pay the builder first,

would mean that Brother Paul would have to make a special trip to Manaus to get the motor and other things, and also it might be sold by then. So we are acting on faith, believing that the pastors will join us and respond to this appeal and lead their churches in giving a special offering for the finishing of this new houseboat right away.

Canfield Avenue Baptist Church already had more in this boat than any other church, and she gave a special offering of \$190.00 to it in February and we plan to lead them in a special offering for it in March also. If twenty pastors would join us in leading their churches to take a special offering in March for this houseboat, we would perhaps have enough to pay it off complete.

Brother Pastors: Please join us in this and let's get this houseboat paid for. Surely several will want to have a part in it. No offering is too small. Pray and do as the Lord shall lead you. Send the offerings marked "For Houseboat".

In Detroit From Peru

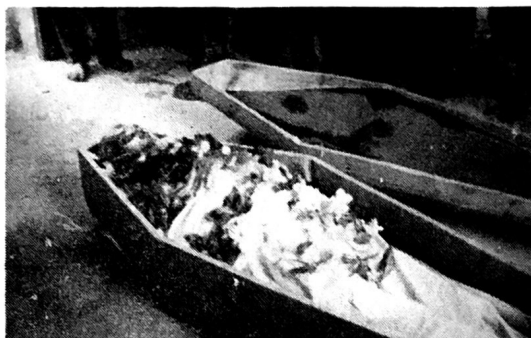

Mrs. Mitchell E. Lewis and three children arrived in Detroit Sunday morning, March 2, 1958 from Peru. Brother Lewis wrote that Mrs. Lewis spent 13 days in the clinic in Lima, Peru and then nearly three weeks in the Pension (the home-like hotel where they stay).

Brother Lewis writes: "We have had medical examinations made at the Clinic and at the Anglo-Americano Hospital and they find nothing abnormal organically. We intended to return to Iquitos the 20th but after talking to Dr. Vogel and observing my wife and praying about it I think it best that she and the children return to the United States. My wife has to take nerve medicine all the time and by evening she is completely exhausted and has periods of depression. She wants to stay but I am taking the responsibility of sending her home."

Pray for Mrs. Lewis. Brother Lewis has already returned to Iquitos from Lima.

Lunsford To Leave On
Journey; Cicero Not
Expected To Live

Cruzeiro do Sul, March 1, 1958

Today, March 1, we are all about back to normal. William's foot is apparently healed, but I'm a bit afraid that it might break out in another place, like it did the first time. I'm anxious to have it X-rayed as soon as we are where there is an X-ray. Jewel is the same as well, and I'm feeling better today than I have for some time. It seems that the Asiatic flu leaves people here with a siege of several week's headache. I thought for a while that it was getting to be a habit with the people here to complain with headaches, but I finally got it myself, and I know from several weeks of it that it is not imagination. In the beginning of it you are past going or doing anything for a week, more or less, and from then on, for several weeks it is just a lingering ache that makes you wish you didn't have anything to do.

The last two week-ends I have been to Guajara for services there, and with services between here and there. I took Bro. Joseph de Freitas with me on the first week-end. He is a young man of 29 years. He married a grand-daughter of Bro. Eufrazio, who was one of the oldest workers of Baptist Faith Missions and died February 1, 1958. Bro. Joseph has been helpful in the Church at Mourapirango for some time, but it was while Bro. Paul Calley was here that I asked him to lead in one of the services at Vazia. He was a little nervous, and did not talk very loud. This trip to Guajara I had him preach two times, and he does well. He had been in lake Tapari to fish many times, but he said that was his first trip to be there fishing for souls. I would like to see him make more trips there regularly. There are nine houses there, with about 40 or 50 people there,

Feb. 15, 1958

I did not write the week-end that Bro. Paul left with Bro. Royal because I knew they would get there before a letter would. There was nothing new to write concerning plans, etc.

Brother Eufrazio Soares Dies

I got word of the death of Brother Eufrazio (he died on Saturday, Feb. 1st) too late to write that week also. I went to Quartorze where he was buried the next day. (This is about an hour's walk from Mourapirango where he lived and died). It rained all morning and with such force that only 24 people came to the burial. I used the Scripture—"I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith. Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the righteous judge shall give me at that day; and not to me only, but unto all them that love His appearing." II Tim. 4:7-8. Only men and children came to the burial.

I was to go back to Mourapirango the following Sunday and preach the same message at the church when all the people could be there, but became sick on Tuesday and was unable to do anything until the following Tuesday. I am still weak, but able to go. I must have been poisoned, probably, with the creosote disinfectant that I cleaned the houseboat, the *Embaixador*, with on the day I became sick.

and it is near enough to Cruzeiro do Sul that a person could go there by canoe, without a motor, and have a service at 7:00 p.m., fish until the next morning. This would be profitable two ways: for the people there to hear the Gospel, and furnish the preacher with fish to use and sell. Pray for Bro. Joseph that the Lord may use him in a great way. We had no professions of faith on the two trips to Guajara, but there was one here in Cruzeiro do Sul.

We visited some people who live at the mouth of the Moa River, and later some of them came to my house and

I tried to get pictures of Brother Eufrazio in the casket, but had a very poor opportunity. It rained all the time, and he was inside an unfinished building, where we held the funeral. I took one picture at regular speed and three with time exposure, each a little longer exposure than the other. I hope they can be used.

Brother Cicero in Hospital

Brother Cicero Bispo (who has been in the Lunsford home for a long time) went to the hospital the day before I got sick. He would not take any of our advice as to what was good for him to eat, so I advised the doctor that it would be better for him to go to the hospital. That way we can be free to travel also. He is better, but not out of danger. (Brother Cicero has been one of our missionaries since 1935 or before: He lives up the Jurua river 125 miles, at Campo de Santana. He came down river for medical attention and the Lunsfords have been nursing him back to health. H.H.O.). I hope that Brother Royal has continued to get better, and that he has gone to the hospital or wherever they think best for him to get well. William's foot is not well yet, but we will know in the next few days. They have stopped pushing gauze through the hole now. He looks anemic. I will close for now until I am feeling better.—R. B. Lunsford.

asked us to come there for services. We went, and the house was full. They want us to come back. A woman begged us with tears to come to her house for services. She lives about 200 miles down the Jurua river, and is a believer, and says that it has been six years since anyone had preached there. Bro. Cicero, pastor of Campo de Santana and Amonha churches is seriously ill, in the hospital. Personally, I don't have much hope for his recovery. I need to go up the river and visit his churches, and others of the upper Jurua river. There is a need for

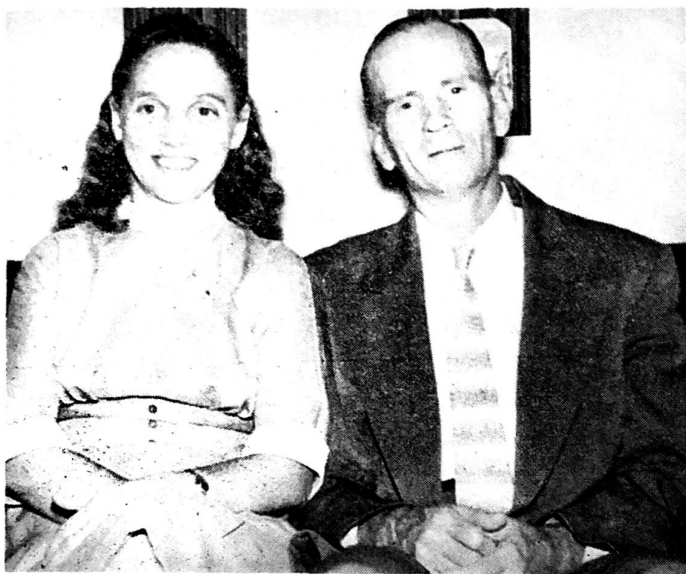

The Paul Calleys Leave For Brazil

Brother Paul Calley and wife, Florence left Detroit by plane Saturday morning March 1, 1958 at 6:45. Fifty-eight were at the airport to see them off. They were to arrive in Belem, Brazil on Sunday morning, March 2, and after two days in Belem to fly up the Amazon 1000 miles to Manaus. At Manaus they will visit the John Hatchers and buy aluminum sheets and tools, etc., for the new houseboat. Then they will go up river to Cruzeiro do Sul by boat so they can take the motor for the houseboat and the Aluminum sheets, tools, etc., with them. There is a new modern boat with diesel engine and with refrigeration on board that makes this trip now in about half the time that the old type boats take for the trip. They should make the trip on this boat in about 18 days from Manaus to Cruzeiro do Sul.

Going Away Party for Paul Calleys

On Monday night, February 24th we had a going away party at our house, 1210 East Grand Blvd., Detroit, Michi-

gan for Brother Paul and wife. The women outdid themselves in bringing food. Three tables were covered with food. It looked like the tables at the Annual Thanksgiving Conference. Those of you who attended know what I mean. We had a great time of fellowship. The house was full, and we mean full of people, with standing room being filled.

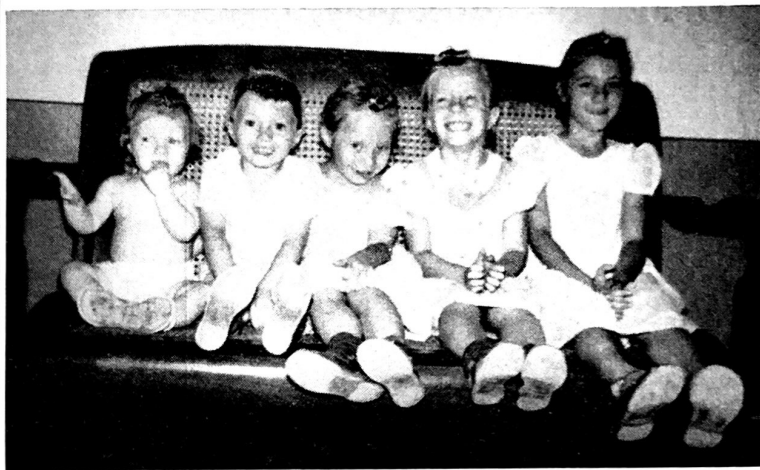

Sandra Kay Lauerma Dies in Peru

(This letter was written the next day after Sandy died and after she was buried. It tells of a father's feelings. H. H. O.)

February 12, 1958.

"On Christ the solid Rock I stand, all other ground is sinking sand." This is the way we feel about the death of our daughter Sandra (age five).

She was saved only last Friday. God waited until after that before He took her. Brother Overbey, God has always been that way with us. He could have taken her Thursday and then a doubt about where she would have gone, but none now. Sandy was one to talk about heaven, especially since Helen Calley died. She was one to grasp the Bible teachings and believe and apply them personally to her life, even more than the older ones. As we were talking about Sandy's belief in the Lord, Karen cried and said, "I want to go where Sandy went, I don't want to go to hell". We explained to her the plan of salvation and she said exactly what Sandy said, "I know that all are sinners, but I am trusting Jesus, and He paid for my sins on the cross of Calvary." She went on to say, "Mommy you said if I would trust Him I can go to heaven." I told her what the Bible said and she said, "I believe in Him and that He will take me to heaven when I die." "Amazing grace, how sheet the sound."

Barbara has cried much, but I think it is from loneliness. They were so close together and were always playing house and church together. We pray that even now God will start a work in her heart also. My wife went into hysterics when told, and fainted, but after that she has been real good. We just have a loneliness that only God can take away. Pray that I will have it taken away if it is His will. If not, for more grace.

My wife is and has been a good wife, but mostly a teacher to the children. Sandy and all the rest could quote many Scriptures on the Second Coming, plan of salvation and many others. She knew all the books of both Testaments. After Sandy was saved she asked about other people, whether they were saved, and wanted them to be saved also. She asked about our neighbors, and another American girl here, and folks at home in Illinois.

Buried Wednesday, Feb. 12, 1958

We buried her this morning, Wednesday, February 12, 1958. Juan Castro preached a good message (in Spanish) on "I am the resurrection and the life". Many Americans were there. The church was full and many on the outside in windows. Many lost souls were there.

People have been real fine about everything.

About Sandy's Death

She had an obstruction where her big and small intestine are connected. It was there from birth and had grown large enough in these five years to close. Gangrene set in and 18 inches of her small intestine were infected with it. She had swelled up very large in eight hours. Sunday evening (Feb. 9) as we were preparing to go to church she doubled over in pain. We took her to the hospital and after two hours of draining gas from her stomach, she slept good all night until about 4 a.m. and the pains started hard again, and they were going to operate, but she had a regular bowel movement and her fever went down and her stomach went down considerably.

At 3 a.m. Tuesday morning she was in much pain and at 4 o'clock they asked me if they could operate and I agreed. They thought it might be the appendix. When they cut her open, puss, blood and gas went all over the room. They called me in and told me of the gangrene and that they would have to cut it out and stretch the intestine together and sew her up before her heart gave away. This they doubted could be done. We prayed for God's will to be done, and we believe that it was when they called me and told me what had happened. They had only to sew her up when her heart gave away.

The Doctors Cried About It

The doctors cried about it. But what could they do more than they had done. It was the Lord's will. They wondered why some symptoms of this had not come before. She would have died in the States as well as here and they wondered why she had not gone sooner. We know the Lord wanted it in His plan to save. They tried to restore breath when it stopped, but that failed also. Sandy asked if we were sure we believed, because once a person believes they never perish. We loved Sandy. No one can replace her. God just has to make this departure for a while, a time of faithfulness. Pray for us in our loneliness. Paul Thomas is now asking many questions about the Lord.

I am putting down these thoughts as they come to me, so please excuse.

We sang "A Los Pies De Jesu-Christo" or "At The Feet of Jesus" and "Que, Amigo Tenemos Nos Christo" or "What a friend we have in Jesus". May the Lord bless all of you. Pray that we will learn the Spanish and preach soon.

In just three hours I will be leaving for Faro, so have just a few minutes to bring you up to date on the news. I am having to make this trip in spite of the fact that Paul will be arriving on the fifth. The contract for the house is up on the nineteenth and I have to go there to take care of the boat and the furniture that we have there (chairs).

The new building is going fine. They are hanging the windows and doors and the stucco is just about finished and the painting of the ceiling and trusses is about finished also. The biggest job that we have left now is the tile floor and the poured concrete roof over the baptistry and toilets. I have taken several pictures and hope to send them to you as soon as I return from Faro. The windows and doors are costing about \$400.00 not including the hardware or glass. The tile for the floor is costing about \$400.00. Of course you know the extras in finishing that cannot be thought of all at once. The light fixtures for the auditorium have been bought. Deposit a thousand dollars for the building fund when you deposit salaries for March.

My wife is doing fine now although still weak and the baby is doing fine. Her name is Kathy Lorene Amazonas Hatcher. Since she is our last one we had to give her a good long name. My wife went into the operating room at 10:30 P.M. and returned to her room at 2 A.M. Two doctors were with her until she had been given a blood transfusion and fed through the veins. Two days later she was given another transfusion and was fed through the veins for a day or two. Her stitches have been taken out and she is doing well. We were saddened to hear of the death of Sandy Lauerma, but we give thanks to our God for His Grace.

As soon as I return from Faro I plan to make arrangements to go to Codajaz. I must close now and go get this in the mail and get my suitcase packed.

We appreciate all you are doing for us. The suit was a little big, but the pants I am using. Paul's coat fitted me perfectly. The camera is a beauty and the flash works beautifully. I haven't gotten any pictures back yet to see how my timing is. Thanks a lot.
