### Lunsford Family Journey To Faro. Good Interest — One Baptized Many Witnessed To

Manaus, Amazonas  
 January 1, 1959

We (the whole family) had a very enjoyable trip to Faro, with only one regret, there was no one who made a profession of faith. We hope that good seed was sown, and that there will be some reaping later. I am convinced of one thing, concerning Faro, and that is: a family approach will have more influence than one or two preachers there. I also believe that holds true in most of the places where we have been. There are young people who will come to the services, because of knowing other young people who will be there, when they wouldn't come otherwise.

#### Members Firm In Faith. One Baptized

We found the members there firm in the faith, and glad that we had come. The services were well attended, but the best services we had were those in the homes of the believers. The next trip there, I plan to have nearly all of the services in the homes, and may not have any of them in the building that is rented for that purpose. In a sly way, I got one of the teachers to attend some of the services. She is a catholic, but I asked her if she would come to the services and take notes on my errors in the language. She did, and then the next day she would show them to me. In this way, one more person there got to hear the gospel. The adventist family who came out of their errors to our faith, are one of the joys of the trip there. Just to see them happy because they now know that they can be saved without baptism, and observing the commandments. While there I baptized the 12 year old girl in their family. She had been saved on our previous trip there.

#### Witnessing Along The Way

One of the best things of the trip was

the opportunity to witness to the people during the trip. The young man in charge of the passage and book work of the boat is a Jew. Ava Lynne asked him if he would read a New Testament if she gave him one, and he said he would. I told her that it would be better to give him the whole Bible, and in that way he would come nearer to caring for it, because it would have the Old Testament with it, in which they believe. On the trip back home, he was also on the boat, and Ava Lynne asked him if he had read any in it and he said he had. We never know when something like that will bear fruit. There was also a passenger, who got on at one of the small towns, named Paulo M. Itou, a Japanese of 50 years of age. We talked until late. He had been in some of the Methodist services of his country before he came here. Here he had married, and was considering himself a Catholic. I had a tract in the Japanese language, and gave it to him, and from that we got into a good discussion of the Scrip-

Juan Castro is looking for another house to have services in, as the one he has, the dust is terrible there. Juan has run into a part of town that seems hard to work, but the Lord is able. Bro. Lewis left quite a few books here in Spanish and I intend to add to this for a library for the preachers. This will be a good thing if it works.

We thank all who pray for us and we pray that God will bless all of you. May the Lord send others here in this needy field to labor.

Juan Ruis said that he had 67 present in the service last night at Astoria, he is starting a Sunday School there next week also.

tures. I brought out both translations of the Bible, the one we use and the translation by the Catholics, and showed him that our basic doctrines were alike in them. Then I showed him their catechism of how it falsifies about the Bible, even to telling them to burn or give to the priest, any copy given to them by one of another denomination. Also they tell them that it is not necessary for them to read it. Then about the first of the ten commandments, they plainly say that it forbids idolatry, but in the next two questions and answers, they say that it is all right for them

to have services of adoration for the saints, angels, and the relics of the saints, because they are our *intercessors* with Jesus Christ. Also I showed him how they teach that Baptism saves and that its form is sprinkling, then I showed him in their translation that they are liars. I let him have a New Testament, the Trail of Blood, and the tract in Japanese. Some day I hope to make a visit to his town just to visit with him, and see how his studies are getting along.

We met other people on the trip, and visited in one town where there is a dire need for the gospel to be preached. There are about 100 Adventists there, and no Baptist work.

**Back in Manaos and 5 Professions**

There was another profession of faith at the Bethel Church last Sunday night. Calvary Church had a one week meeting and had three who professed faith. At the Belo Jardim (Beautiful Garden) Church there has been another profession and a baptismal service. I don't know if any of the other churches had any professions during the last week-end or not, so all I can tell you for certain is that there have been five professions.

Calvary Church has built new walls to their building, and a new fence, and have given their church house a new paint job, and everything looks good. Bro. Argemiro's church, Belo Jardim, excluded two trouble makers, and had a baptizing immediately afterward. Bro. Santiago did the baptizing for Bro. Argemiro, because he was hoarse and had a cold. I haven't heard from Miguel since he went back to Codajas.

We hope and pray for the best of everything for each and all of you there during this year of 1959, and wish you would keep on remembering us in your prayers.


THE EMBAIXADOR

# PICTURES OF CALLEY JOURNEY UP THE JURUA RIVER




John Anastacio, "The Old Patri-arch" at Parana dos Mouras and Paul Calley. The old brother is about 87 or 88 now.

## Calley Baptizes Nine At Mourapiranga. Mrs. Calley In Belem Hospital For Checkup And Treatment.

Dear friends in Christ,

God continues to bless the work here and since writing to you last there has been eight professions of faith and nine baptized. During the Christmas season we made a trip to Mourapiranga off the Moa River and preached to many at the church there. At the morning service on Christmas day a hundred people or more attended the service and the new church building and benches were filled, and a few had to stand. About fifteen indians from the indian village of Barao, about a half day trip from Mourapiranga were there and several of them have been recently saved during the trips that Brother Cido Francisao Lima, our native preacher brother, has been making there. That afternoon I baptized two of them, a young man about 20 and girl about 18 years old along with seven of the young people of Mourapiranga who were waiting baptism making nine in all. A large crowd also attended the baptismal service.

Before I go any further and give the wrong impression, I want to explain that I know that Christmas didn't get its origin from the Bible. At the start of my sermon to the church at Mourapiranga on Christmas morning I pointed out that Christmas day shouldn't mean more than any other day for God's people. That we should praise God every day for the incarnation of our Saviour, when He took upon Himself flesh and bodily form as we are but without sin, to fulfill God's law for us and be our sin bearer when the iniquity of us all was laid on Him at the cross of Calvary.

However, I believe in taking advantage of any day, be it Christmas, Easter, or any other day when we have the opportunity to preach Jesus to many who are lost. "In the morning sow thy seed, and in the evening withhold not thine hand, for thou knowest not whether shall prosper, either this or that, or whether they both shall be alike good." Eccl. 11:6. Also when we worship God in truth and spirit God get's glory out of our worship, although the world in general may be using that day in a false worship and revelry.

Faith Baptist Church here at Cruzeiro do Sul is very active in spreading the gospel and we have two more new preaching points. We have services scheduled for every night except Tuesday night. Monday night is prayer meet-

ing night and we have services on Wednesday and Friday besides the Sunday services at the church. Thursday and Saturday we have services at various preaching points. Here recently a young man about 18 years old who lives at one of these preaching points was saved and will soon be baptized along with a young girl about 15 years old who was saved at the church. On New Years Eve, Faith Baptist Church took the Lord's supper and the presence of the Lord could be felt. Some of the members who live downstream came to town for the service which started at 8 o'clock and ended a few minutes after mid-night. Brother Rodrigues and I both preached and there was singing and prayer.

My wife's health has been about the same this past month. She has been up and about most of the time but not feeling very well and can't keep much on her stomach and lost a little weight. We have decided to go to Belem to a well known hospital there where she can get a complete examination. The doctor that we have here has advised us to do so because he has given her much medicine with very little results. So the Lord willing we will embark on a plane for Manaus on January 26th. There we will visit Brother Lunsford and the work there for a couple of days before going on to Belem. We hope that it will not be necessary for my wife to be hospitalized for more than a week and pray that the doctor's there might find the source of her trouble. On the way back we plan on stopping in Manaus for another week and be back in the work here within a month or less, the Lord willing. We covet your prayers that God will restore my wife's health and may the Lord bless all of you there.


