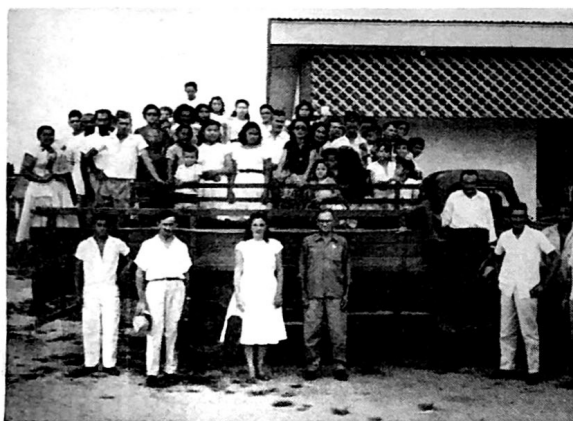

Detroit - Toledo Expressway Now Open

Those coming north on U.S. 23 take Ohio Route 199 at Fostoria, Ohio, to U.S. 20 and turn left on U.S. 20 for about two miles and then turn right onto Ohio 120 which is the Toledo-Detroit free expressway with only one traffic light for 49 miles. Ohio 120 becomes U.S. 24. Follow U.S. 24 and exit at West Road (well marked) and follow U.S. 24 about ten miles and turn right on U.S. 12 and follow the expressway non-stop about 16 miles and exit at Mt. Elliott and follow above directions to church. Those coming north on U.S. 25 or 68 turn right at Perrysburg, Ohio, onto U.S. 20 for about 11 miles and then turn left onto Ohio 120 and follow Toledo-Detroit Expressway as outlined above. Those coming east to Toledo will do well to follow U.S. 20 and take the Toledo-Detroit Expressway. This new Detroit-Toledo Expressway will save you many traffic stops and save you much time and the speed limit is higher also.

Hatcher Goes To Acre Territory; Visits 5 Churches; Baptize 9; Dias to Faro; 4 Saved

Manaus, Brazil, Sept. 22, 1959

Dear Brethren:

Terra Nova

The past month has been a busy one and so I shall try to relate to you some of the things that have come to pass. On August 26th Brother Argemero and I left Manaus for Terra Nova where we had service that night. This is the new church which was organized before Bro. Lunsford left Brazil. It was a real joy to see many who were known to me and to make new acquaintances in the work there. We had a good service and we praise the Lord for the good work there and the faithfulness with which Brother Argemero has had toward it. The brother who lives in Terra Nova who has felt that the Lord has called him to preach was our host. If it is the Lord's will for him to come and study in our Bible School I am sure that he will be a faithful servant to the New Testament teachings.

Jetuarana

On the next day we went by canoe and outboard motor to Jetuarana which is on the other side of the Amazon river. These humble people have gained a very warm spot in my heart. The Lord gave us a wonderful service after which we returned to Terra Nova and the next morning we caught the launch back to Manaus and arrived home about four o'clock.

Manaus

During the next week I visited at the Calvary Baptist Church, the Bethel Baptist Church, the Tabernacle Baptist Church and visited in the open air service of the Bethel church. The Zion Bap-

tist Church was preparing for a one-week revival and conference and so I made about 1200 invitations to be used in the visitation of the church.

Cruzeiro do Sul

On Sunday, August 30, at 2:30 p.m. we arrived by plane at Cruzeiro do Sul, Acre Territory, and the church there had rented a truck to come and meet me at the Airport. The Lord gave us a joyous time together and it was a joy to see Brother Rodrigues and the other brethren in that part of the country. I am enclosing a picture of the truck load that came to the airport. I preached that night at the Faith Baptist church in Cruzeiro do Sul. The church had bought a P.A. system and had it hooked up for all the preaching services. The next day Cido, one of the native preachers and I bought things necessary for traveling and on Tuesday, Sept. 1st we left Cruzeiro do Sul for Maita. Because at this time the rivers are very low and full of fallen trees we could not travel in the *Embaixador* so we used Cido's canoe which is much smaller.

Maita

After six hours of travel we arrived at Maita and at the night service there were 41 persons present. Five people here who had already made professions of faith stated that they desired to be baptized and they came on the following Sunday to Mourapiranga where there were others to be baptized.

Barao

Leaving Maita at 7:30 a.m. we arrived at Barao at 3:30 in the afternoon. With no cover on the canoe, by that time I was pretty well done. All of the be-

lievers here are Indians and many of the Indians still have the tribal tatoos on their faces. The history of this place is a principal chapter in the development of the Territory of the Acre. The people manifest a great desire to hear and to learn. We arrived unannounced and many of the men were away from home working on their rubber tree routes. We had a good service. The next morning one man invited us over to have some fresh milk and when we arrived he had the glass ready and tied up the cow and milked the glass full and gave it to me. It has been a long time since I drank milk that fresh.

Japiim

We left Barao at 7:30 and arrived at Japiim at 3:30. Brother Mario is the pastor here and it seems to me that this is one of the best works that I have seen. We slept in the Mission building but we ate all our meals in the home of Brother Mario. The fellowship with this brother is first rate. There were 40 persons present at the night service and my message was taken from the first part of the Revelation and the subject was "Our Works Known to the Lord." The widow of Cicero Bispo lives here now and she brought me a half dozen eggs and two beautiful cucumbers. The next day Brother Mario and I visited her at her home. We rested in the afternoon (I must be getting old) and about 4:30 p.m. we left for Colonia which is about a 45-minute walk where we had services.

Mourapiranga

Leaving Japiim at 8:00 a.m. we arrived at Mourapiranga at 3:30 p.m. On our way we stopped at Maíta to bring with us a crippled boy of ten years of age who was going to be baptized on Sunday, the day following. It is a 45-minute walk from the river to the home of Cido in Mourapiranga so the son of Cido had brought his horse for the crippled boy to ride.

The next morning, Sunday, Sept. 6th, we had services at the Mourapiranga Baptist church and following the service we went to the creek to have the baptizing. There were nine baptized and I am enclosing a picture of them. In the afternoon we went to Cruzeiro do Sul where I preached in the night service.

Parana do Mouras and Tatajuba

On Monday, Sept. 7th everything was closed because of a national holiday but on Tuesday we left at 8:00 to visit the church at Parana do Mouras. After traveling 10½ hours we came to a large boat where we stopped and hung our hammocks and slept until 5:00 the next morning and we arrived at the home of the "Old Patriarch" at 10:30 a.m. The old man was despondent because so long a time had elapsed since a missionary had come but the old man is almost 90 years old and things are not as bad as he imagines. We were here for two services and the Lord blessed and we had a great

Juan Ruis Is Ordained In Iquitos, Peru; One of First Acts Was To Baptize Four

Iquitos, Peru

Dear Brother Overbey,

Once again it is time to send the news. We are reporting only of what we have seen and heard. The brethren again have been hard at it and report good results. I do not lord over my brethren I only preach to them what I believe to be the Will of God and leave it with the Lord.

Ruis Ordained

The church here in Iquitos ordained Juan Ruis on August 24th. After several songs and prayer I questioned Juan thoroughly on what we believe as Baptists. As there were other visitors from the other churches present, and I wanted them to understand thoroughly what we believe on certain doctrines. After this, Juan Castro asked several questions and some of the other brethren asked some useless things. After this we had the laying on the hands and prayer. The church presented Juan with a nice gift, a fountain-pen holder set. We all stood, and took a nice long breath and sang "When We Walk With the Lord." We all left at a late hour, but all happy.

Astoria

Of course the devil likes to work in a new church, and we believe the Lord is trying and testing the new church in Astoria. They are having only about 25 or so in their services now, as there is a movie show in Astoria now, and naturally the same nights that the Church has services. Juan goes on and serves the Lord. Pray much for this young church and its pastor. In spite of all of this, Juan has had his blessings this month. Besides being newly ordained, and pastor of a new church, he had the privilege of baptizing 4 from Picuruyaco on August 30th. Picuruyaco is an hour's walk from the Nanay River, but nevertheless practically the whole village came to the baptizing. The new church in Astoria has taken on Picuruyaco and Sapotal as mission points, therefore the church here in Iquitos has granted 3 letters to them in Astoria, which now makes 7 baptized believers in Picuruyaco and these are all members of Astoria. There is another family that have made a profession but are not legally married and are to be married the end of the month, in order to be baptized.

Juan Castro

Juan Castro has preached 2 weeks this month for Juan Ruis in Astoria, and Alfonso Varsalles has preached for Juan Castro in the Mission here in Iquitos. Juan Castro preached for Juan Ruis so that Juan Ruis could be with his wife, as she is recovering from her nervous breakdown. Also his children all had the measles and a very bad case of them. The rest of the time Juan Castro has been visiting and preaching in the city.

Simon Gaima

Simon Gaima reports 3 professions of faith in Santa Rosal and 1 in Bella Vista across the Nanay River from where we keep the boats and motors. We pray that these will follow the Lord in Baptism. Simon is seemingly going after his work with greater desire than ever before.

Javier Freitas

Javier Freitas reports 1 profession of faith in Mapa Cocha, for which we thank the Lord, and he is to be baptized soon. Javier has really had his troubles in Mapa and San Tomas, as the priests have these people pretty well in hand. Javier reports this Sunday he had 25 in Mapa Cocha and about 20 in San Tomas last Wednesday. Javier said he has really given the priests the battle and he is going to stay at it until the end and be faithful. He has visited Ruma Cocha, a village about the same size as Mapa Cocha, and it is a 45 minute walk from Mapa inland and he intends to have some regular services here. Manacamira has a full house every Saturday night says Javier. Brethren we have some good Peruvian brethren here that are proving that they want to preach.

Iquitos

The Lord has given us good crowds again here in the church in Iquitos. We averaged 72 in Sunday School and we had 81 on one Sunday. We don't have too many members in this church yet, but God sends a lot of visitors and we are assured in His good time He will give us more. I am teaching Baptist Doctrine as outlined in Brother T. P. Simmon's book, on Monday and Friday nights and selected sermons from Psalms on Wednesdays. I take as much pride in pastoring this church as I would any other church back home and I have worked just as hard at it or harder. Pastoring is hard work as many of you know, when done right, but it is the least appreciated many times. I preached on Sunday mornings this month, sermons on "Who Has the Right to Worship" and on Sunday nights, "What is Real Worship?" I am going to start this week to teach what little music I know, a half hour before Sunday evenings service. Maybe after a few months we will at least start and end together. Many of the older people, who have come for years, and visitors who have not come for some time say, "never have we seen so many people in the services." We praise God for all these blessings and try to give Him all the glory. Seems like I am always arranging and re-arranging our Sunday School rooms, in order to have enough room.

I made a mid-week trip with Juan Ruis and preached at Sapotal, where

visit and time in the Lord. Arriving at Tatajuba the next day about 1:00 p.m. we found the church in a weak and pitiful condition but much of the guilt lies with the disobedience of the members. In our preaching we tried to show them that they were not only to receive but also to assume the responsibility to serve. We left Tatajuba at 7:00 a.m. and arrived at Cruzeiro do Sul at 4:00 p.m.

On Sunday, Sept. 13th, I was in Sunday school at the Faith Baptist church in Cruzeiro. This was the third Sunday since the Sunday school was organized and the attendance was 42. This is the first regular Sunday school that we have in the Acre and to me it was a real step forward. At the night service I preached.

Manaus—Revival at Zion Baptist

Monday, Sept. 14th we left Cruzeiro do Sul at 5:45 a.m. and arrived home at 3:00. On the day before the Zion Baptist church had begun a week's revival and Bible Conference. Brother Miguel Iberon of the Codajaz Baptist church was the visiting preacher and I taught each morning a Bible class from 8:30-10:00. Our morning subjects were: "Evangelization", "The Battle", "The Soldier", "Our Salvation", and the "Second Coming". It was a good week and all benefited. Every afternoon the brethren from the other churches here helped in visitation and there were personal visits made into at least one thousand homes. Several nights there were people standing.

Much To Do

I had hoped to start our Bible school again by now but there is much to do and as yet I have not been able to do so but perhaps before the next letter we will be at work. I am going on a four-day trip tomorrow and still have trips to make to Faro and Maues before opening the school. On the 13th of October I will be in Codajaz for a week and hope during that time to organize a new church in Urucuri.

Dias' Trip To Faro

John Dias made a trip to Faro for one month during which time there were four professions of faith, one being an aged man. We have obtained a piece of property there in the main part of town and we pray that in a short time we can start a building there. The brethren are working and I am waiting upon the Lord and trusting in Him for the increase which in due season will come.

Printed Ministry

We hope that before the next letter that we will have launched our printed ministry on a permanent basis.

Bratchers

The Bratchers are adjusting rapidly and are studying hard. No one knows the difficulties that one suffers the first few months unless they have experienced it. Brother Bratcher is doing the only sensible and sane thing and that is to devote his whole time to the language study. He spends hours each day. There is no other way. I have not invited him to go with me on trips because if I do I am robbing him of what he needs most. Pray for them and us.

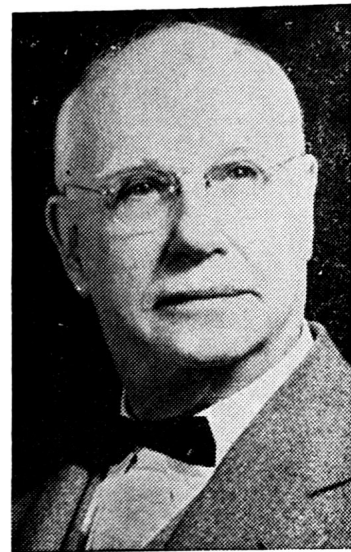

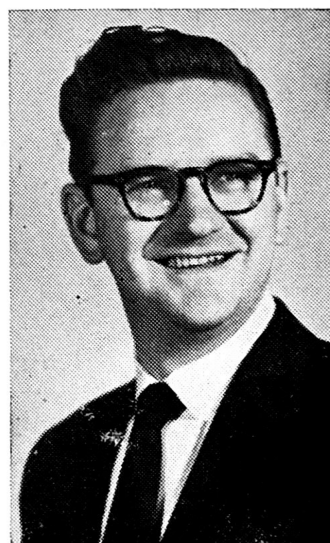
