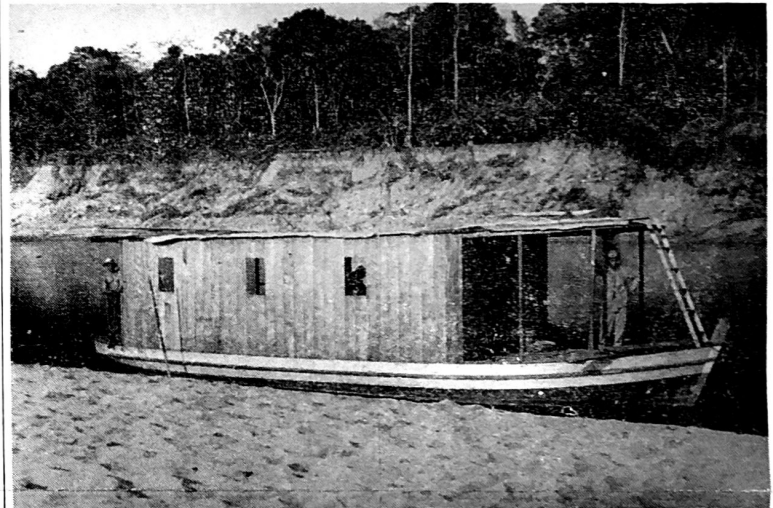

## Bratcher Is In The Swing Of Things . . . Busy Using New Language In Mission Work — To Teach One Class In Preacher's School

Dear Bro. Overbey:

We give thanks to our Saviour for His goodness and grace. Since our March letter I am happy to be able to report we have been busy in the service of the Lord. Before I report on my activities, there are some news items I wish to report. Zion church, where we are members, are building two new Sunday school rooms and hope to have them completed in time for the celebration of the church's seventh birthday, April 26th. Also, our pastor's wife whom I reported was sick in the last letter, is better and able to be back at church. This week Zion is having a week of prayer. We meet at the church each morning at 5:00. There were 6 of us present for the first one this morning.

I have had the privilege of preaching twice since the date of the last letter for the Mission Sheet. On March 27th I preached at the Sunday evening service of the Salem Baptist church where Bro. Manuel Sarmiento Lima is pastor. Yesterday, April 17th, I had the privilege of again preaching at Zion at the morning service. Also, this month, I have visited in homes of sickness and one home of sorrow where a little girl of almost a year of age had died. It has been my privilege also to attend two nights of

the revival conducted by Bro. Hatcher at Chapada. Bro. Hatcher brought great messages.

As I write this letter, Stephen, who will be six weeks old tomorrow, is crying. He has a strong voice and a good appetite. Asa Mark also is well.

On March 24th I celebrated my 33rd birthday. April 5th, Marie celebrated her 33rd birthday.

I have stopped studying with the two teachers I have had. I still need to learn much more Portuguese and I hope to learn as I use it in teaching and preaching. I am planning to teach one course in the school beginning next Monday, April 25th.

Brethren, pray for us as we continue our labors for the Lord in this land.

## New Term For Preachers School Started — Good Trip To Faro - Whole Church And Pastor Desire To Become Baptists — Revival Meeting At Chapada - Man Catches Wrong Bus But Goes Right — Ibernion Family Well Of TB

Dear Brethren,

I know that reading our letters must sometimes be dull and at times repetitious but nevertheless it is a blessing to us to share with you the things that the Lord is doing here in the Amazon Valley. The door is open wide in fact so many doors that we lack workers to enter them. The problem of faithful workers here is a big one for many reasons. The people are very poor and if there were the chance to preach and earn a living wage we would have more preachers than priests, but, unfaithful ones. Another reason is that the people do not have any sound Bible background and even those who are called to preach must be proven and proven well. The preachers must be taught to understand the doctrines and this is a process of time, not lost time but time. The preaching is necessary for the lost to be saved but the teaching is necessary if there is to be preaching that sounds a clear call. The work of the Preachers school is more than a full time job. One cannot teach and travel which is one of our greatest griefs knowing that there are so many places that have no work and many that

have never heard for the first time. Last quarter we had twelve brethren enrolled in the school and we taught three days a week. This quarter which opens day after tomorrow we will be teaching four days a week, and it looks like our enrollment will be close to twenty. During the month vacation of the school more desks have been made and equipment such as maps and speakers stand, etc. My brethren pray that the Lord will make it possible for the interiors of this vast region to be reached with the gospel.

### Preacher Boy From Cruzeiro do Sul

I mentioned in one of my letters that while in Cruzeiro do Sul that I met a young Indian boy who the Lord has called to preach. On the 21st of March he arrived in Manaus and is at the present time living with us. Our family is still growing. We are sending another, a girl of 15 years, to school and she works in our home in the morning and studies in the afternoon. Tomorrow, the Lord willing, she is to be baptized into the fellowship of the Calvary Baptist Church.

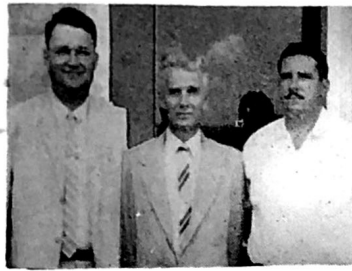

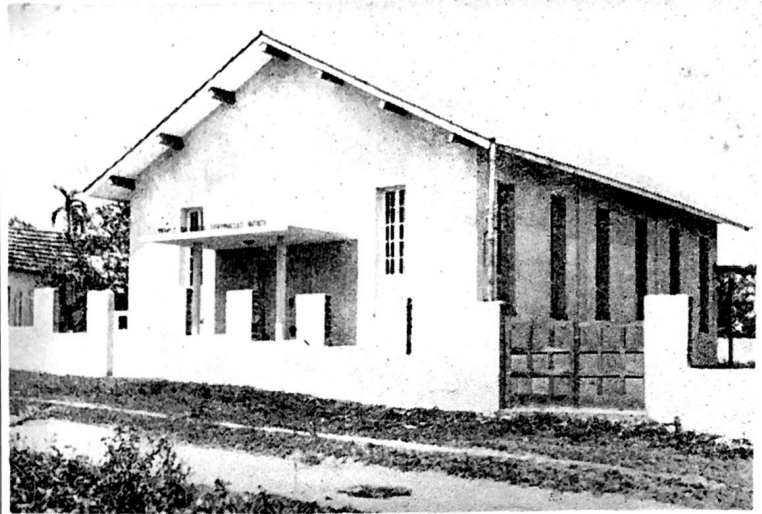

(Editor's note: In May, 1956, John Hatcher made a trip to Cruzeiro do Sul to visit Paul Calley and the work in the Acre Territory. Brother Hatcher made journeys with Brother Paul Calley up the Jurua, the Moa, the Japiim and Parana dos Mouras Rivers, visiting the churches and missions and preaching. This beautiful, strong, well built building is Tabernacle Baptist Church, Manaus, Amazonas, Brazil. This building was built by John Hatcher. He started to build in the spring of 1957 and finished it in the summer of 1958 before coming home on furlough. This building complete and the brick wall all around the four sides of the large lot cost to complete \$14,645.70. The Baptist Bible School Building (Preacher's school) is to be built back of this and connected to it by a breezeway. As of May 1, 1960 we have on hand a total of \$10,877.14 towards the building of the Baptist Bible School Building. We estimate that we need \$4,122.86 more to build it. Bro. Hatcher does not want to drag out the building time because Brother Hatcher says that if we have all the money on hand that he can start the building and complete it in a few months. But if he has to stop and wait for the offerings to come in that it will drag on for a long time. If you want to have a part in this building, now is the time. Pray about it and send your offering marked "for building."

## New Term For Preachers School Started

Church and whom Brother Lunsford has helped a lot made a trip to Faro during the holidays and was there for 26 days. His family had planned on going, but about four days before they were to leave the little one was afflicted with infantile paralysis. In spite of his serious condition Brother Dantes said that he felt that it was a proving of the Lord or a temptation of Satan and he was sure it was the Lord's will for him to go and to this his wife also agreed. After being away 26 days he returned from his first missionary trip and found his boy still paralysed but much better and already getting back strength and a little movement in his legs. The results of the trip? There were two saved, good services, a new building rented for services, and a young man who had been baptized by the Calvary Baptist Church and afterward excluded made known his desire to be reconciled to the church and sent a letter to the Calvary Church to this effect. Another young man, a preacher, who is a most humble and industrious person made it known to Brother Julio that he would like to bring his congregation to work with Baptist Faith Missions. This means that he and the congregation will all have to be rebaptized but with out too many details it seems that they understand this. We will know more when we are able to go there.

### Evangelistic Services at Chapada Mission

From the 10th to the 17th of April we had special services at the Chapada with an attendance on one night of 118 in the house and others out side who could not enter. The house is big enough for about 70 people. With the platform also serving as a bench the house filled and overflowed. The Zion Baptist Church brought a bus full two nights. One night a man caught their bus thinking that it was a regular bus, that is, he literally caught it for the bus did not stop but the man grabbed the handles and jumped in the back door. Recognizing that this was a different crowd he inquired as to where the bus was going. Having been

told that it was going to the Chapada to a preaching service but that he was welcome to go along he replied, "I guess that is about all I can do." He, to our knowledge, had never been in a gospel service before. As the service ended that night the man who went right on the wrong bus was the first of two men to stand and declare that he was trusting Christ to save him. The other man had been working on the building at the Zion Church and when invited to attend the services, did so and was saved. Well on Friday night when the Zion group returned there came in the group a woman who was in the same condition as the one thrown at Jesus' feet by the Pharisees and before leaving the service she too went away uncondemned. It is a wonderful privilege to tell folk about Jesus isn't it? Aren't you glad God gives you the chance to have a part in it?

### Family of Miguel Ibernón

The wife and children of Brother Ibernón have all improved wonderfully and perhaps by the time that you read this their family will be able to go back to Codajaz. His wife is cured and the oldest child is also, and the younger children are to go for X-rays soon.

### Brother Bratcher At Work

Brother Harold has been at work and hard at it but now his work is taking on a new aspect. He is preaching and teaching in the Zion Church and has preached for us at the Chapada and also sung for us during our revival. The Lord willing he will be teaching this quarter in the Preacher's School.

We have been thrilled and thrilled with the news from Peru and know that you all are looking forward to seeing and hearing Brother Lauerman when he comes home. We are looking forward to the York's arrival and for the arrival of others also as you obey the call of the Master as He says, "GO". May the Great God bless you all.

Dear Brethren,

Motor trouble, sickness and rain has hindered the work much this past month. The motor that Simon Gaima uses was in repair for 2 weeks and Javier Freitas 1 week. Rain and Sickness have really hurt the attendance here in Iquitos and on the rivers.

### Alfonso Varsallo

Only in Tamshiyacu has the crowds gone up this past month and Alfonso Varsallo is happy about it all. We failed to get the house that we wanted, but I somehow believe that God still is going to give us this house because it is ideal for the work. Alfonso is preaching yet in the house of our only baptized believer there and has taken a partition out of her house and we have her whole house to preach in. This old lady sure is faithful and willing to help in all things.

### Antonio Torres

Antonio Torres was in Iquitos for 3 days this past week and reports of 12 more awaiting baptism near the Napo River. He says that the services are good and he is teaching the lessons that I have given him. His wife arrived here sick, but after treatment has returned well. Antonio and his wife seem real happy and he goes by boat and paddle to Crellana, San Pedro Marupa and then 2 services in San Antonio every week. We hope to organize these folks in San Antonio on June 9th, the Lord willing.

### Javier Freitas

Javier Freitas has been real sick a week or so from a worm being lodged in his liver. He seems well now. He reports 3 saved in Sapotal and many interested in Santa Maria. Javier seems to have more interest in his work every day.

### Simon Gaima

Simon Gaima has made trips to Mapa Cocha, Bellavista in the Nanay River, Santa Rosilla Caprironal and Shiwa in the Momon River. Simon preaches to his own people (Witoto Indians) in Picuruyaco on Saturday's and Sunday's. Simon is an old man but he goes without fear and favor.

### Juan Ruis and Juan Castro

We spent another few days with the Astoria Church this month. I took Juan Ruis because the people requested so. Juan Castro has resigned as pastor of

the church in Astoria, in order to dedicate full time to Hojeal, which the Lord willing, will be organized into a New Testament Baptist Church on May 10. The people advised me when I was there they wanted Juan Ruis to lead them as pastor so I began to pray about the matter, without saying anything to Juan Ruis and a few days later Juan Ruis came to my house and said he knew that the Lord wanted him there and he is going on May 1st to take charge of the church, the Lord willing. Pray for Astoria church, that it will now go forward and also be missionary. In Hojeal the crowds are big and some are arranging to be married, to be baptized some perhaps before they organize May 10. Castro is preaching every Saturday in Sinchicu and the last 3 weeks on Thursday farther down the Amazon River in a place called San Rafael. Hojeal has started building a house for a church and also plan to build a house for the pastor to live in. These folks love the Lord it seems.

### Iquitos

In Iquitos we ran about 85 in S. S. Alfonso Varsallo's daughter was saved also I baptized two into our fellowship on April 3rd. We always have visitors in our services for which we thank the Lord for this. I am continuing in teaching Simmon's book, lesson by lesson, as he has it outlined. I am teaching the "Life and Journeys of Paul" to the preachers on Monday afternoons, and from what I hear these teachings have done more than all the rest that I have done so far. I intend to keep on preaching because it is the thing that God uses to change hearts and lives.

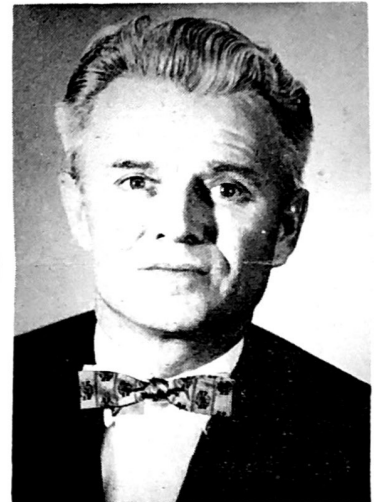
Dear Bro. Overbey and Brethren,
