York Makes Journey Into The Interior, Souls Saved, To Cruzeiro Do Sul Again

Dear Brethren:

How wonderful it is to be able to say with the Apostle Paul that "a great door and effectual is opened unto me" for a couple of months ago a Twentieth-Century "Cornelius" from the interior arrived in Manaus and requested a couple of churches to send a preacher or a missionary to visit the lake where he lived to preach for the people. He waited for over two months and no one was sent there to preach. (Does that remind you of some of the churches there which receive the "Macedonian Call" today and do not care enough for the souls of men to send a preacher or support a sound mission work?)

Edson Basta de Silva, the young preacher-boy from Cruzeiro do Sul that lives with the Hatchers and at-

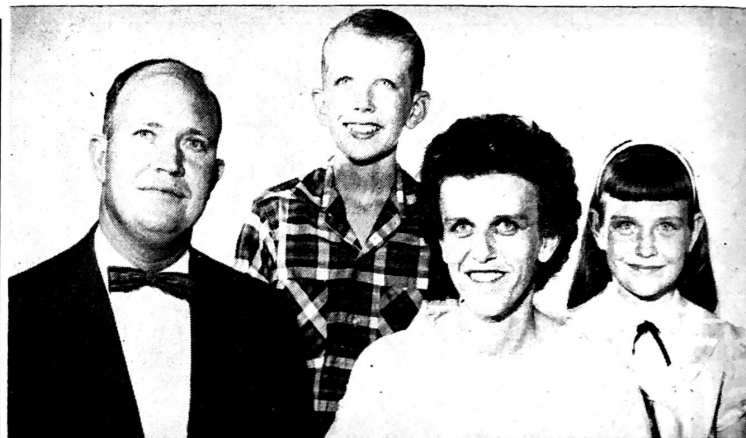
tends the Baptist Bible School of Manaus, heard of the man's request and talked to me about the situation. We felt impressed of the Lord to go, trusting the Lord was opening another door for our work.

Lake Mira-Aua

We left Manaus Friday morning at 9:30 A.M. on a launch which is a combination of a Greyhound Bus (for the river) and a Red Arrow delivery truck. People were so packed on the launch it was reminiscent of travelling during the war ... baggage was stacked anywhere and everywhere ... and hammocks were hung in the same manner for babies ... big and little.

After travelling an hour and a half on the Black River (Rio Negro) we took a short cut through a strait and entered the Amazon River, travelling in the direction of the Pacific Ocean.

Working On New Building

Dear Brethren:

Once again it is my pleasure to come to you by letter in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ. Each day is filled with blessings of the Lord who is the same yesterday, today and always, and all of it together for the good of His children. His grace towards us is so great.

Salem Church

This past month has been about the same at our church, Salem Baptist. We have not had any professions of faith this month. Our attendance has been down to about 26 on Sunday morning, but the night services have been very good with around 35 in attendance. The night service is when the lost attend more than in the morning. In this land where the people have been told lies about God and His great plan of salvation for so many years, when they come out of darkness into His marvelous light it reassures us that it is God that justifies the ungodly.

This past month I have been trying to spend more time working on the new Preacher's School Building. Sometimes the work seems to go slow and not much progress is made, but when we stop to think that the laborers are working in the hot tropical sun, the concrete mixed by hand and carried in buckets to the forms, the progress is very good.

Preaches First Sermon in Portuguese

After almost six months of study and with very much difficulty in the language, on February 23rd, 1961 I preached my first message in Portuguese. I went to the pulpit with my Bible, notes and the promise that God would never leave nor forsake me. Needless to say God kept His promise. I preached on "THE THREE MEN OF CALVARY". I had better liberty than I expected and was able to add some as I went along that I had not written down before. I was a little disappointed that no one made profession of faith. Our pastor said that

YORK MAKES JOURNEY INTO INTERIOR

Late that evening we reached the Manaquiri River on which we journeyed until approximately midnight when we entered a large lake which is named "Mira-aua." At two o'clock we arrived at the floating house where we left the launch and entered another launch, which was tied-up for the night, to sleep. We were informed the next day that had the owner of the launch known we were Baptists and not Catholics, he would not have permitted us to sleep there. I was glad he was asleep and did not ask who was sleeping there because after sitting on a boat for eighteen hours I was tired enough to sleep even with mosquitoes as bed partners.

Saturday morning we took another launch which took us on up the lake until we reached an out of the way place that you man easily say is the uttermost part of the earth. We arrived at the home of "Cornelius," (Obadias Freitas dos Santos), at 10:00 A.M. only to find he was not there but gone hunting which is a necessity here and not a sport. We planned a service for later in the afternoon trusting that he would arrive in time for the service. His daughter was sent out in a canoe to invite people to the service.

Six Professions

When the people arrived we began our service with 25 in attendance and

Edson taught on the Good Samaritan. Feeling God had opened the door and was going to bless he gave an invitation after the lesson and there were three professions of faith. Then I had the opportunity of preaching and the Lord blessed with another profession of faith. These people were hungry for the truth and readily accepted it when preached.

At dusk, "Cornelius" arrived and was disappointed that he had missed the services. We had been under the impression he was a saved man, having accepted the Lord in a service in Manaus, but as I talked to him he confessed that he had been under conviction for some time but was not saved. We told him we had time for a service before the launch returned for us and after supper I preached to a large crowd of seven people including Edson and myself. What a joy it was to give an invitation and see three of the four men there accept the Lord Jesus as their Blessed Redeemer!

As we were preparing to leave the man which had sent for a missionary said: "I have prayed and prayed and prayed that God would send a missionary here to preach for us and the day has arrived that God answered my prayers." How it thrilled my heart that Edson and I were the first two preachers to carry the gospel to this part of the interior and as we returned to Manaus we praised God from whom all blessings flow, for on this brief trip God had saved a father and mother and their fourteen year

old boy who is blind from birth. In addition to these three grown men which are desirous to have a church there. Obadias has already chosen the property that he wants to give to build a church on.

To Cruzeiro-Do Sul

We thank God for the opened door and for the grace and faith to walk through. Pray for this place that soon a church can be organized here. Edson and another preacher-boy are going back several days the first week of March. I would love to return there myself to baptize those who trusted Christ but have already made plans for going to Cruzeiro do Sul on March 5th with Brother Creiglow who is preaching now.

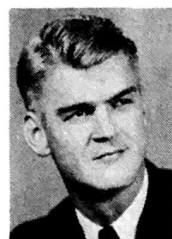

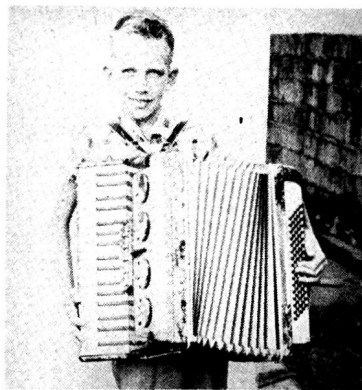
