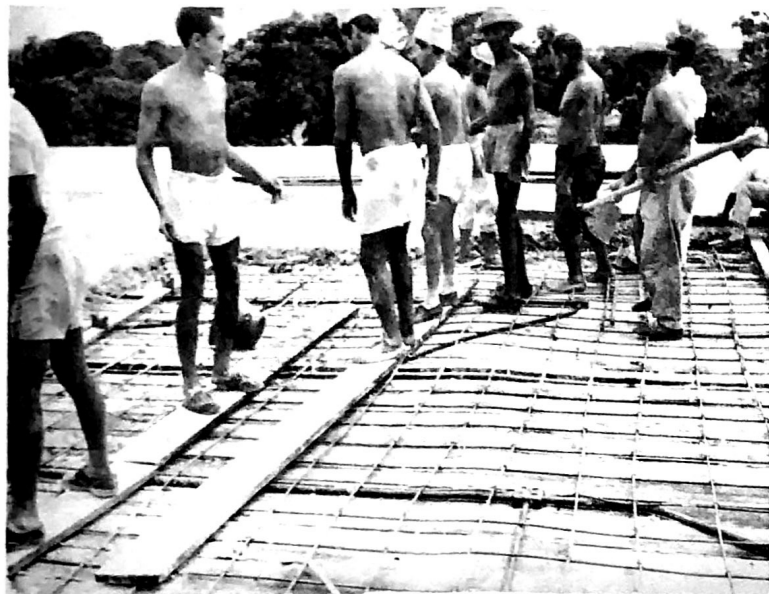

Manaus, Amazonas
February 15, 1962

Seems as if it were only yesterday that the page of January was torn from the calendar at which time I thought, "Has it really gone?" Time — what a precious possession, yet impossible to hold and hard to utilize. How different it will be in the "land of endless day".

Vacation Bible Schools at Salem and Chapada Churches

During the last two weeks of January God blessed greatly in the Vacation Bible Schools. At the Salem Baptist Church there was an average attendance of 100. During all the week of the Vacation Bible School there were revival services at night. During the week there were a total of 13 professions of faith. We had a great time and the Pastor and wife are choice servants of God. Mrs. Hat taught the primaries along with one of ladies of the Salem Church. Mrs. Sarmento, the Pastor's wife, and Elnice Holanda, member of the Salem Church and student in the Bible School, taught the beginners while Brother Sarmento and I taught the older children. The following week the Sarmientos helped us at the Chapada Church and we had an average attendance of 51. There was one profession of faith during the school.

Trips by Students through the Vacation Period

Manoel Costa made two trips to Anuma, each trip lasting a total of thirty days. There were six or eight professions of faith. He also made a weeks trip to Terra Nova and a weeks trip to Jeturana.

Brother Julio Dantes spent nearly the whole time in Manaus. Brother Bratcher was with him in a meeting and Bible School and has told about it.

Ranulfo Tobar made two trips or perhaps more, to Mira-Aua.

Verino Freitas made a trip to Faro where they held three services per day having as high as 125 persons in the services.

Argemiro Leite went to the far away state of Pernambuco to preach to his family which he had not seen for 15 years or more. His mother, when she trusted the Lord, tore off the images and medals hanging around her neck and gave them to her son and said, "do what you want to with them." Also two brothers or sisters and five nephews professed faith in the Lord. On the return to Manaus, Argemiro visited the baptized believers in Maranhao where I had gone in December.

Back to School

On the 5th of February the new quarter of the Preachers school began with an enrollment of 15 students. There are three new students. Two are sisters, members of the Tabernacle Church who will be teaching in our Grade School next month, and one is the wife of Ranulfo Tobar who is in a special class of elementary studies for those who have not had primary schooling.

Building Progressing

The whole lower floor of the new building is now in use for which we are so thankful. On the 5th and 6th of February we put on the poured concrete ceiling of the second floor. They are now laying up the bricks of the two ends and the wood is on the lot for the making of the trusses and the roof rafters. We trust that by the month of July all the building will be ready for use.

Primary School to Open in March

In order to utilize the new building in the maximum way possible, we felt led to begin a Baptist Primary School that will meet in the afternoons and we are looking forward to having a Baptist High School which will function at night.

Escola Batista das Americas

The Baptist School of the Americas is the name of the primary school. We are beginning with the last three years of the primary school and in August we hope to have all the rest of the building in order to have the complete school. We have three fine Baptist teachers. The school will have a devotional assembly each day with the prayer that through the years to come, many children will be won to the Lord, and the saved ones, taught their

responsibility to be faithful in serving the Lord and serving in his churches.

An Appeal

The children who attend the school will pay a small amount each month. What will be received from them will not, however, be sufficient to pay the teachers. Each teacher will be paid about \$16.00 per month, making a total for the three of about \$50.00 each month. If God leads you to have a part in this will you do it? We believe it is money well spent.

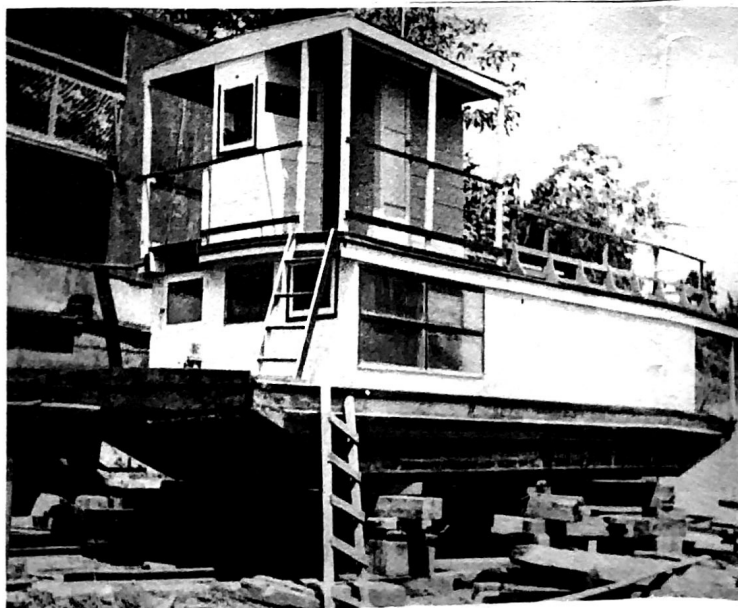
Branch of the School in Chapada

The Baptist Church of the Chapada voted the founding of this work and one branch will operate in the Chapada, being far from the city. This school will be taught by another Baptist girl who lives and works in our home is a student in the Bible School. Beginning first of the month she will still live with but will not be working for us. She will study in the morning and teach in the afternoon. Her salary will be paid in full by the Chapada Baptist Church.

Dear Brethren:

Here in Iquitos we are in a revival meeting at the present time. I'm having the privilege of leading the singing. Brother Marcial Macahuachi, Pastor of Hojeal Baptist Church, is doing the preaching. Also, I'd like to add that Miss Karen Lauerman is playing the organ and doing a real fine job. We are praying that many will be saved and that the church will be blessed during these days. When you go before the throne of grace in prayer remember the church here and the Pastor Brother Lauerman.

Floating Boat House

This has been another month of study and hard work. Every morning after class I've been working on a floating house to store our aluminum boats and motors in, and, I'm glad that I can report that it's all done and the boats are in it. We just got it finished in time before the river came up. We started it back from the river thinking that we'd have possibly several weeks before the river came up. But it came up fast, and we had to work very hard to get it finished. In fact, the last job of getting the anchors fastened, I did in the water. We are all happy here because this

will save us much time in carrying things back and forth and will save much hard work. I'm also sure it will save the mission many dollars in equipment in the years ahead.

40 H. P. Johnson Outboard

One other thing I failed to mention in my last letter was the new 40 horse Johnson motor that we purchased for the 18 ft. aluminum boat that we took the top off of. I've been using it for week end trips and it's just wonderful. It's much faster than the 18 horse that we have, and I can get to more places than before. For an example, I went to Orellana Saturday the 20th of January, preached Saturday night. Sunday morning I left for San Antonio where I preached, came back to Orellana and preached. After dinner left for Hojeal where we had a baptismal service that afternoon, and for another service Sunday night. And also got back into Iquitos Monday morning in time for our 8 o'clock class in Spanish at the school. We've thanked the Lord many times for the motor that really has been a blessing to our work.

Large Houseboat

Just a word about the big boat. We have done nothing more to it since repairing the bottom and putting it back in the water. We are praying that soon we can have the necessary funds for to buy the motor and to fix it so it will be liveable for my family. I only wish that every one could come here and make a trip on the river and see the great need here of preaching the gospel. I know it would make you pray and to give more.

Belen . . Two Professions

At Belen where we probably have had our last Friday night service until the river goes down again the Lord has wonderfully blessed. Eddie has been helping lead the singing and we are real happy about this. Friday night, February 2nd, we had two young men trust the Lord as their Saviour. Last Sunday night, one of them was baptized, and I'm hoping that the other one will see his need also. This section now is all covered with water and will be until some time in June. Many thousands of people live on floating houses and houses built on poles up out of the water. We do thank the Lord for the services we've had there since last June. And praying that we may have the opportunity when the river goes down to preach there once again.

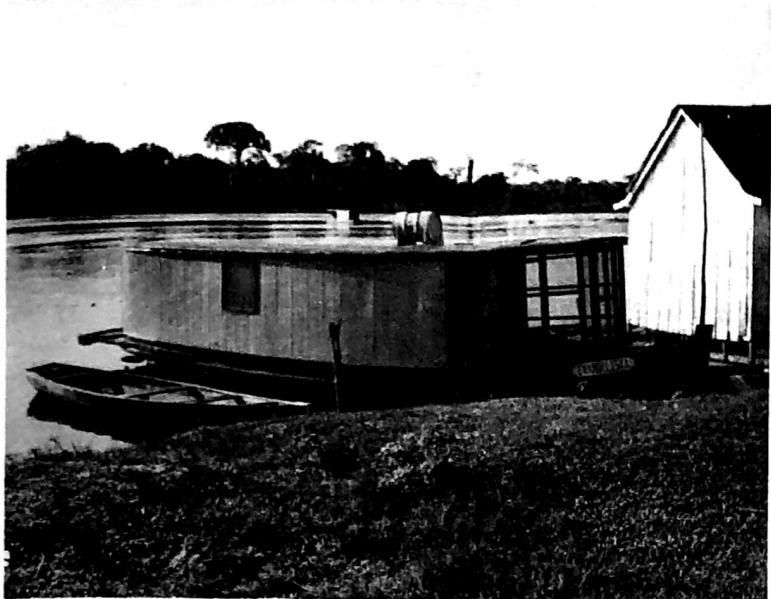
San Antonio and San Pedro.....Four Baptized

On January 28th, I was at San Antonio where Brother Torres, the Pastor, baptized two. Then after the morning service we went to San Pedro where he baptized two more that afternoon. We also stayed for the Sunday evening service. I had the privilege of speaking at all the services. We are going every third Sunday to San Pedro. Pray for this place, that the Lord may start His good work there. One of the men Brother Torres baptized, was the Mayor of San Pedro. He asked me after the service about building a building so they could have services every Sunday. I told him I thought it was a wonderful idea. I'm going back Sunday and I hope I can encourage them in doing it. We now have 9 baptized believers there. Pray that the Lord will save others and help us in the work there.

Tamishajco and Shato

We have made two trips to Tamishajco this month. The 11th we had all the services at the mission, and Sunday night a fellow asked me if I would go to his house and preach some hours up the river at a place called Shato. So last Saturday I left here in the afternoon and went up river taking Brother George Macahuachi with me. After several hours we left the main river and entered into a smaller river and found that it was impossible because of logs and fallen trees in the river. And by this time it was getting dark. So we turned back and stopped at the first house on the river and asked if we could stay there and have service, and they kindly consented. The next morning a fellow offered to take us by foot to the fellows house where we were to preach. He told us that it was only a few minutes walk through the jungle. Many of these people don't know what time is. It took us an hour and few minutes to get there. Many were waiting for us and I'm sure there would have been

JOURNEY TO CODAJAZ...EIGHT PROFESSIONS OF FAITH...OPEN AIR SERVICES...NEW TERM OF SCHOOL STARTED.

Dear Brother Overbey: Manaus, Amazonas February 16, 1962

As I sit here in front of the typewriter thinking about what to write for this month's Mission Sheet letter, there comes to my mind the words of Moses in Psalm 90:12 "So teach us to number our days, that we may apply our hearts unto wisdom." I am asking myself, have I numbered my days and used them in a way to bring honor and glory to our Saviour?

Roll Call
For about two more weeks after I wrote the January Mission Sheet letter, I continued preaching at Zion Church in the absence of Brother Melo, the Pastor. On Sunday, January 21st, our church observed "Roll Call Sunday." Sunday morning I called the church roll. The church has 38 members in Manaus and a Mission in Brasileia in the Acre with four members making a total of 42 members. Of these 38 members in Manaus there were 32 present either Sunday morning or night to respond to the roll call. There were 65 present in the service Sunday morning. The record of the past year showed that the church received 13 new members by baptism and excluded four. The Baptist churches here believe in and practice church discipline. After calling the roll, I preached on the church as the Body of Christ.

Brother Melo, the Pastor, returned from his missionary trip to Brasileia on the 24th and reported a good trip and one baptism.

Codajaz
On Sunday afternoon, January 28th, I made an hour and a half plane trip to Codajaz a small interior town where Brother Miguel Ibernon, one of our native missionaries is pastor. I can truthfully say that I passed an enjoyable week with the church and pastor there. I had the privilege of preaching each night and directing a Vacation Bible School in the afternoons. We enrolled 118 and had an average attendance of 65. Best of all, there were 8 of the children that made professions of faith during the school or at one of the services at night.

Ouricuri
On Wednesday night a group of us crossed the river and visited the Ouricuri church. This is a young church with only 18 members and without a church building. I received a blessing in preaching to this church "in the wilderness."

We started our revival last night in the First Baptist Church and had a real good crowd. Brother Marcial Macahuachi, Pastor at Hojeal, is preaching for us and really bore down last night. We are looking for a week of real blessings. I baptized one last night also that was saved in the Belen mission point where Brother Mayfield is. We had our Bible school and had an average attendance of 86. It was good for our church although we had no one saved. It has given us new children for our S.S. The offerings are up a little more again this month. Pray for us as we try to lead this church in a good, sound, faithful and missionary church. We are having services now in the building that Brother Mayfield rented for one of the preachers as he does not care to use it. So we are preaching there on Thursday nights and Sunday afternoons. Some of the brethren preach for me now and then in these services and the house or home preaching that we do on Tuesday nights. We had one profession of faith in this home service, but I have only seen him once since he made his profession. Pray with us about these various places where we are preaching. I have always

The Independent Church ordained their pastor and I went and helped ordain Alfonso Varsallo and they asked me to preach the sermon also, which I did, and had a good time doing it. Alfonso was to baptize yesterday his first time. I was unable to get there to see him. I was not able to teach the preachers this month as all had trouble getting to Iquitos on the days we could teach them. I was let down much over this. My wife and Karen and I went to Astoria January 28th for the morning services. He had a small crowd but good listening. I am to go there the week of March 4th for a revival and Bible School. I pray that this will be a time of revival indeed for that church.

Hojeal
Also Karen my daughter and my wife, Sister Mayfield and Eddie went to the Baptism at Hojeal with me on January 21. Brother Mayfield was already there as he will tell you about. But again we got to preach and this time on baptism. Brother Mayfield was to preach that night. It seems that I have gotten more opportunities this month to preach than ever before and on all different kinds of subjects. The Lord called me to preach and that's what I want to do more than anything else in this world. We ask you all to pray for Juan Ruis. He attends now and then and is very cold spiritually. 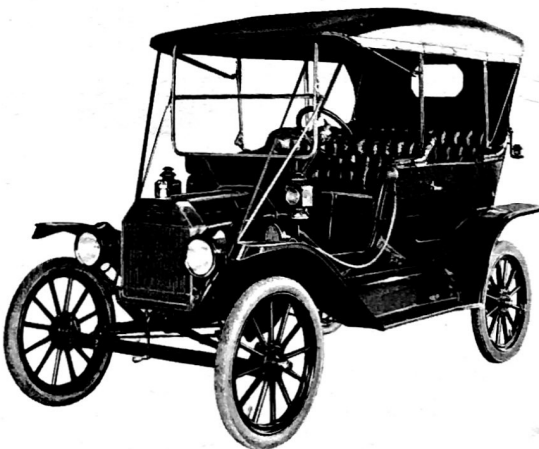

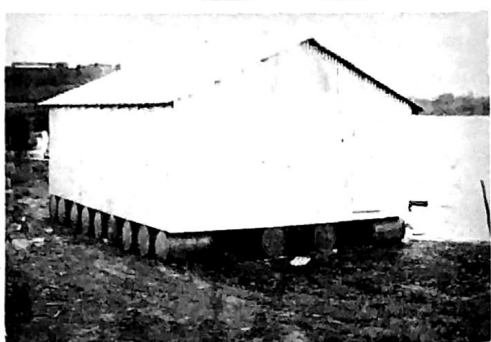

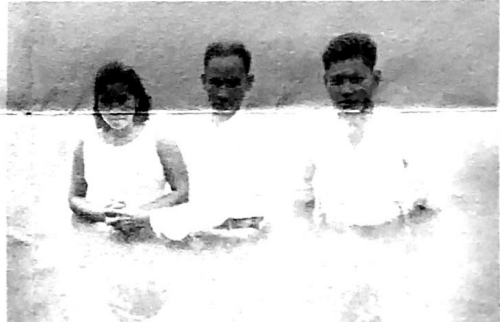
