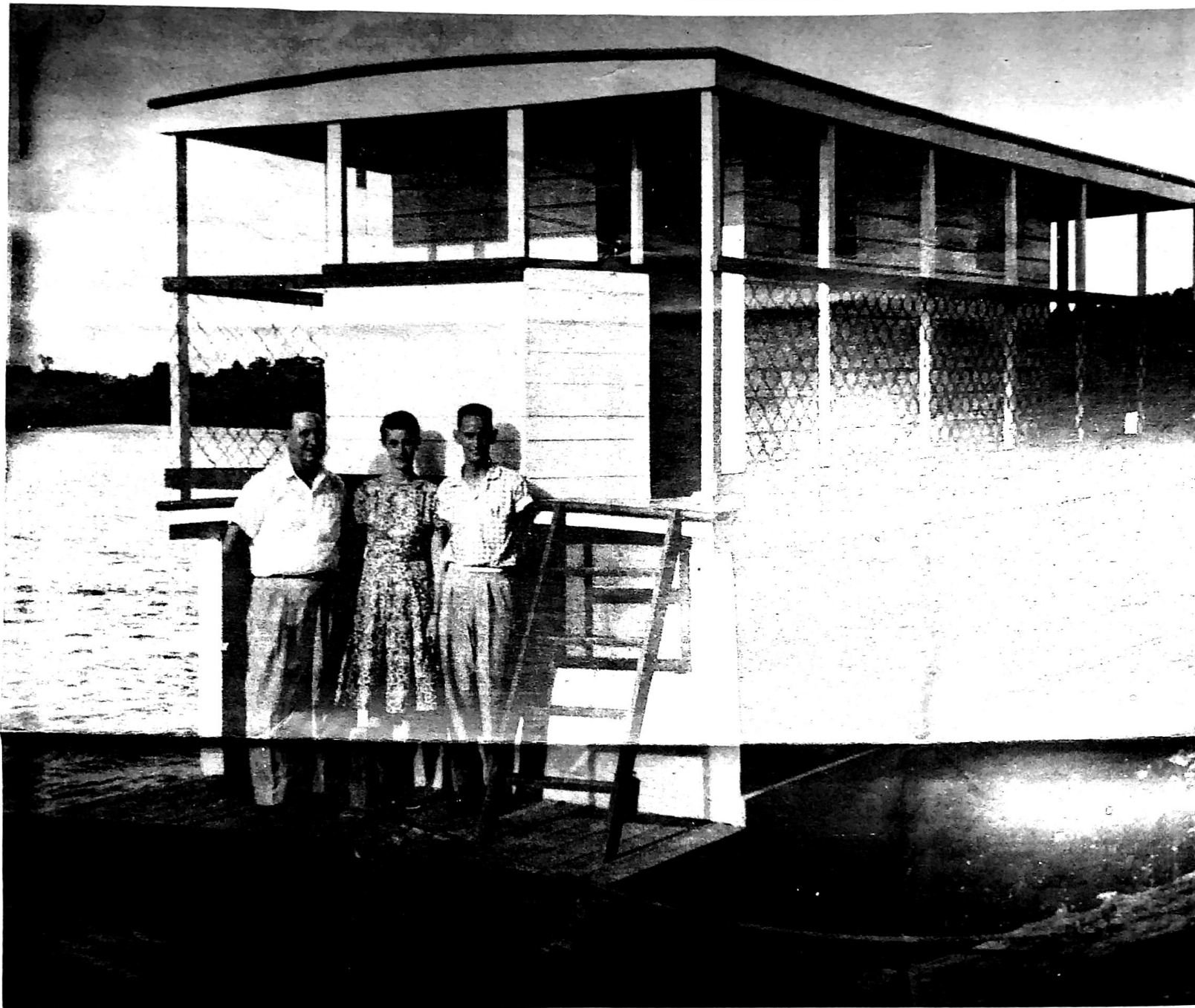

Pucallpa, Peru
August 20, 1962

We are all well at the present and hope for the best of everything for all of you there. No one here feels up to par because of the dry weather, but it will not be many months until the rainy season will be here again, then people can have wet weather to complain about.

So far as the work here is concerned we have nothing for which to complain. In 14 weeks of services there have been 17 who have made professions of faith. Of these 8 have been baptized so far. There are others who will be later. As always in a country like this or Brazil some have to be married before they can be baptized. One man and woman were married last Saturday and I baptized them yesterday. August 12th, I baptized two others. I hope to have another baptizing next Sunday.

The Church already has their treasurer, and we hope to see them elect their secretary soon. I would like to see it on its own feet with all Peruvian Officers even to a Peruvian Pastor.

Counting through yesterday, I have preached 78 times since we started having services on the 12th of May.

We have had some inquiries about our son Robert. He is in the service in the States and has been since the last of May. He has just been transferred to Massachusetts from South Carolina. We do not have his new address yet.

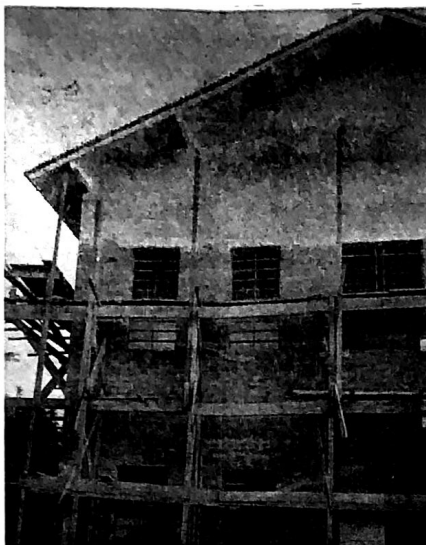

Our greatest work is the Preacher's School to train Baptist Preachers to evangelize and Pastor their own native Churches.

THE NEEDS

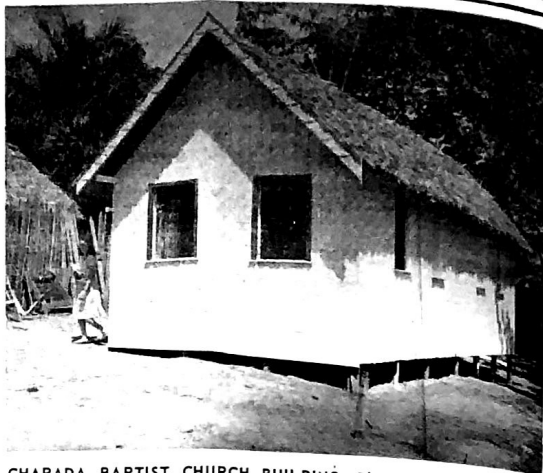

REPORTS FROM THE CHURCHES...GOD IS BLESSING EVERYWHERE...SOULS SAVED AND BAPTIZED...CLASSES FOR PREACHERS.

Iquitos, Peru
August 20, 1962

Reports from the Churches: New Church in San Pedro, one profession of faith, attendance about 40. Family getting settled on the field. Pastor attends our Preacher Classes in Iquitos now. San Antonio, S.S. 26, other services about 35. Pastor again visited several days on the field and visited villages of Sapo Playa, Vainilla, and Orellana weekly. Attendance in these places is between 35 and 50. Interest Brother Torres says is very good in these places.

Hojeal

Hojeal, S.S. attendance up, the Pastor Brother Macahuachi has started a graded S.S. now and has put three new teachers in to help him. Attendance at mission point about 20. This is a good church with a good pastor out in the middle of nowhere.

Astoria

Astoria, First profession of faith in 10 months as Pastor for Brother Taricuarima. He is to baptize this one and another that was saved sometime ago in Iquitos the 30th of this month. The Pastor was real happy and all smiles when telling us about it all. The Lord will bless in his time. This is what I try to keep before the brethren, and myself also. Attendance here is up, from 25 to 40. Brother Taricuarima has started preaching in Santa Maria where we preached several years ago.

Simon Hurt in Fall

Simon Gaima visited Sargento Lores, Capironal, Llanachama and Niniruma before falling from the roof of his house and hurting his leg. It is only a miracle he was not killed. Simon is old and cannot see very good and had no business climbing at all. Pray for him. He comes to Church on Sunday now.

Mapa Cocha

Javier Freitas, the other missionary besides Simon from our Church is now settled in Mapa Cocha. Attendance there is about 50 in every service. Two professions of faith and I baptized them yesterday. Javier is visiting

alot and this is a big help to the attendance there. Brother Mayfield, Karen my daughter, another young member from the Church here and myself, visited Javier in Mapa yesterday. Brother Mayfield preached before I baptized. Karen was the music. Last Sunday Karen and I and my son Paul, went to Astoria to be with the Church there and we had a good time also.

Iquitos

The Monthly Preacher's Classes I enjoyed again this month. I guess that this is the things that we all neglect and yet is the most important part of our work. We had six in every class this month. We went over "The Duties of a Pastor," and "His Life Also" and we also had more sermonizing. In the First Church we also have had a good month, three professions of faith, (1 in a home) I baptized one here in Iquitos plus the two in Mapa Cocha. I taught every Friday night of this month on the Doctrine of the Church. I also, by the way, am teaching Brother Javier Freitas and Purification in a class in my home on Saturday morning.

I visited two mornings, also this month, among the members of the Church and it might have helped. We have about five men and some women that are real faithful. We have Men's prayer meeting every Sunday night just before the preaching. I think that the Lord has started blessing us in our membership, although our attendance has fallen off this past month. We have several old members that only come on Sunday morning because they cannot get around well. Brethren Castro, and Macahuachi preached once for me this month and Brother Mayfield twice while I was away. Eliu Ramirez, excommunicated member of our Church, died suddenly although he had been sick in the past. He was in rebellion to the Church when he died and he had promised me a week before that he would be more faithful but he waited too long and the Lord took him Home before he straightened out. The woman that I mentioned making a profession of faith last month in a home service, died also. One of these died in rebellion to God the other newly-born in the Family of God.

God has given us another good month in the work here for which we praise Him. The Preacher's School closes its second quarter next week, so by the time you read this we will be getting ready for the third quarter, which starts the 24th of September. A young man who made profession of faith and was baptized into the Chapada Baptist Church, is a likely prospect for the new quarter of the Preacher's School. The Chapada Church has during the past month, built an annex for Sunday School rooms and also rebuilt the Church house which was about to fall down. Last week the Church enjoyed a three day Bible Conference in dedicating the new house.

Primary Schools Growing

The enrollment in our Primary School has gone to about 120 which is unusual for the first year of any private school. It is most likely that most of you do not realize the great need of such work but we are preaching the gospel to many who never entered into our Churches. Next month it is my desire to write you a complete story of our school work. At the present the primary school has six full time teachers, all Baptists and active in their respective churches. Three of the fourteen

students that professed faith in our school, have been baptized into the Tabernacle Church. One young man who studied in the Chapada division of the school made a profession in the church service and has been baptized and feels that the Lord is calling him to preach. If the Lord lays it upon your heart to have a part in this work we can use your help.

Baptist High School

The long slow process of the paperwork for a Baptist High School is well underway and we trust the Lord that next March will witness its opening. There are many requirements as to building equipment and teachers so pray with us. The Officials at the Educational Office have been encouraging and helpful and this is of the Lord.

Think of This!

If God sees fit to grant us the Baptist High School it will be our privilege to be able to train a child from the first grade to a Bachelors degree in Theology that will be recognized anywhere in Brazil, just as much as any other degree from any other institution.

We hope and pray the Lord will be pleased to use us to preach to many, and that they'll be saved. I only know of one other Baptist and I'm sure he's not our kind of Baptist that is working between here and there. So you can see that there is a great need here and also a great opportunity before us. I'm sure that we as Baptists, need a vision of the great multitude, and then set our hearts and minds to the task that we need to do for His glory. Gods word says: "Where there is no vision the people perish." We returned from Pucallpa the 24th of last month. The Lord wonderfully blessed us while we were there in a great way. Had three professions of faith, organized a Church, and had the privilege of baptizing four on the Sunday that we organized the Church. The work in Pucallpa is the first Baptist work, and is a town of over 20,000 people. As soon as we can return we hope to lead the people in building a church building for His glory. We are expecting the Lord to do great things for us. So continue to pray with us, that we will remain faithful to His call in preaching the gospel to every creature.

Preached in Iquitos

I had the privilege of preaching for Brother Lauerman twice this month while he was on trips. I enjoyed that very much and the Lord blessed us in the language. I still have trouble expressing myself in Spanish. The

Church here is in very good spiritual condition. The Lord is blessing and souls being saved and several baptized. I'm sure Brother Lauerman will write about the Church, so I'll not steal any of his news.

Mapa Cocha

Yesterday the 19th, Brother Lauerman and I, went to Mapa Cocha where Brother Javier Freitas is working. We had a very good day. The building was filled and as many outside, as inside, if not more. Miss Karon Lauerman went with us and played the accordion for the service. She plays very good and I'm sure the people enjoyed it very much. I brought a message on the subject "What we have in the Lord Jesus." After the service Brother Lauerman baptized two young men that had been saved under the preaching of Brother Freitas. I took several pictures with Brother Lauerman new camera of him baptizing. So I hope they turn out good and he'll be able to send them for you all to see.

We're hoping to get some pictures also of our houseboat that is all finished, with the exception of the part that connects the motor to the control. We think its really nice, and I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone who has had a part in supplying the needs. We'll try and use it to reach many that we could never be able to reach without it.

BUGS INVADE SKIN OF FEET...TRIP TO LAKE TAPIRI..BOAT BRINGING GASOLINE HELD UP WITH LOW WATER.

Dear Brethren,
After getting back from Campo de Santana last month, although we had our plans made to go to Matai on the Moa River as we had promised, we spent the next three weeks here in Cruzeiro. While we were in Campo de Santana working on the new church house due to there being so much mud, I spent much of the week without shoes and it seems that I invaded the house of some type of bug that was looking for a new home. About seven or eight entered into my feet and then was not satisfied so they began to travel under the skin. After three weeks of staying in the boat without being able to wear shoes they got sick of either me or the many medicines that I used and died. Although the skin all fell off where they were, by this time I was able to wear shoes almost all day.

Lake Tapiri

Some of the new converts from Lake Tapiri came here to Cruzeiro to attend the services and ask me when I could come there. With my feet still not well, I told them that I would try to come the next week. The water is now very low and it is not possible to enter the Lake by canoe, so they told me that there would be someone to meet us at the River to show us through the woods. This was one of those fifteen minute walks that you can make in a half hour if you walk very fast. We arrived on the Lake where there was a canoe left for us to paddle the last forty-five minutes of the trip. We made three trips in there and although I had to get out of the canoe in knee deep mud to pull it up to the shore my still sore feet suffered none the worse for it and are now as good as new. We found the eight new converts very firm in their new found faith and happy to hear the word of God once again and needless to say, we were happy to preach it. There were no professions

of faith, but as always there was some that seemed very much interested and we hope that it will bear fruit in the future.

Parana dos Mouros

Brother Rodrigues received a letter from Brother Sabastain wanting us to come to Parana dos Mouros to help them with a problem that they have in the Church, so last Monday we left here at eight in the morning. Upon arriving, we found the water so low, that we had to get out many times to pull the canoe over fallen trees or over places where there was just enough water to pass. We arrived there after dark by flashlight, very tired, and sun burned and the next morning Brother Rodrigues got up with a cold which he still has. Tuesday was spent trying to help them with their problem which we hope has been solved. We had a service that night that was well attended. We arrived back in Cruzeiro Wednesday afternoon late.

Boat Delayed

The boat on which Brother Bratcher sent gasoline to us before he returned to the States is somewhere below here and will not be able to get here because of low water so as of now it looks like we will be making our next trip down river to get the gasoline, after which we will preach on the way back.

Time is going very fast, and it is already a year this month that we started our trip from Manaus to here and it seems that we have been able to get so little done. Pray for us that in the time we have left of this term, we will be able to get more done for His glory and that He will send us more help as there is so much to do and so few to do it. We are all well at this time for which we give thanks to Him that doeth all things well.
