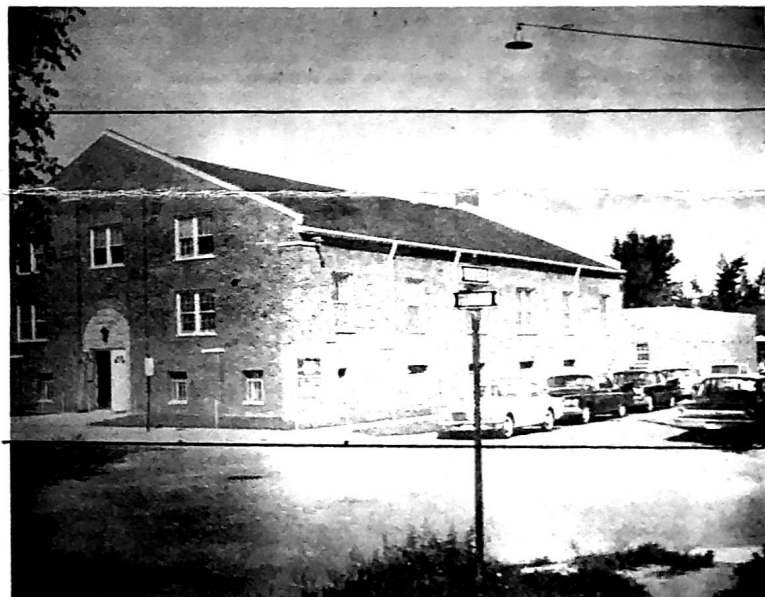

### New Roof Being Put on First Baptist Church, Iquitos, Peru

Iquitos, Peru  
 Dear Brethren: September 23, 1963  
 All the brethren reported a usual month in their churches. Manuel, pastor of San Pedro, visited several villages as the Amazon is the only navigable river.

Now for the church building; The San Antonio Church is just about done now. Because of the dry weather and no water in the creek, the San Pedro Church was unable to do anyone on their building. In Astoria, Brother Purificacion had no help this month and was unable to do very much by himself, as it takes several men to carry the lumber from several miles inland to Astoria. Brother Simon reports that there was a better attendance but no professions of faith in Hojeal this month. The Mapa Cocha Church building is completed now and was dedicated on Sept. 19th. There were 113 present that night. I had the privilege of preaching the sermon. This has been a bad month for Tamshiyacu, because Marcial's wife and baby both have been very sick and he has spent most of his time this month in Iquitos with one or the other. They all seem to be pretty well and last week the whole family went back to Tamshiyacu to live again. The church here in Iquitos had another good month, with Sunday School attendance about the same. More and more we are sure the church called the right pastor, Jorge Macahuachi.

I went to Tamshiyacu for the baptism or August 25th, but the candidates were not well enough to come to be baptized. We had a service, though. We got caught in a storm coming back and Jorge and I got drenched. We did not get back to the house until 15 minutes before seven and our evening service starts at 7:30. We almost turned the 40 hp motor and boat over running upon an unnoticed

beach with about a foot of water, and trying to get off of it, the boat reared up and let the water in on one side. It was quite a trying afternoon for us. I spoke that afternoon in Tamshiyacu and also was the preacher here in Iquitos that night for Brother Jorge. That night there was one profession of faith and one came for baptism. There was also another profession of faith last Sunday morning when Brother Jorge preached. Brother Jorge also baptized his first candidate on September 1st. So, all in all, it has been a good month.

We did not have Preachers Classes this month because the roof was off of the church building. I still have the Friday night class, as I was unable to find a suitable location to have a house service. The first 2 weeks of this month I worked practically every day in Mapa Cocha so as to get the church building done as was done so as stated above. I wanted to get the Mapa building done before starting on the roof of First Baptist Church here in Iquitos. The old tile roof has been torn off the building and the frame-work is half again on with new lumber. It was only a miracle by God that this roof didn't fall in. Most of the lumber was very rotted out and all but 2 ceiling joists were in 2 pieces instead of one. Because tile is made here only on special requests and because it weighs so much we are putting on a corrugated metal roof instead of tile. This is the very common roof here, corrugated metal. The church property had 6 meters open in the back and also 6 and one half meters on the side of the auditorium that had a low flat corrugated roof. This roof will be taken off and will be part of the one big roof that will cover also

The Sunday School attendances have been on the increase the brethren are out preaching and the blessings of the Lord are upon the schools. Some of the joy was dimmed however by the fact that a couple of the preachers have not been living as they ought, having been immoral in their lives and this has caused damage in some of the churches. Immorality is usually the rule rather than the exception but it has no place in a preachers life either here or there irrelevant of how much work they might do in an effort to cover up their sin. Pray for the brethren that they may resist the evil one.

### VISITS

Slides of the work were shown to the Good Hope Baptist Church where Brother William Brown is the pastor and good services were had on Sunday. Slides were

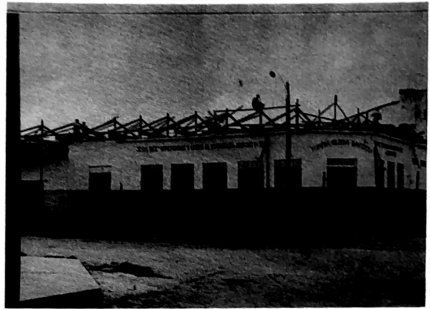

### Eleven Professions of Faith . . . Trip to Guajara With Sebastian . . . Sebastian to Mourapirango . . . Son James Preaches . . . Long Trip Planned

Dear Brethren:

Since our last letter of August 24th there have been 11 professions of faith near Cruzeiro do Sul and in it, in my last letter I told of the school I had for the boys in the town of Colonia and of 14 professions of faith up to that time. I had thought probably it was one of those times when they all come at once, but that proved wrong, because there are professions regularly in the services. I also mentioned in my letter last month that I was taking Brother Sebastian to Guajara with me for the week-end. He was going to see the father of a young lady there who is a school teacher in Guajara to see if her father would allow her to go to Parana dos Mouras to teach school. The home of the young lady is the regular preaching point there, and since it was Brother Sebastian's first time there I asked him to do the preaching. There were two professions of faith, and on the way to the port a woman made it clear that she was going to make her profession of faith on the next trip we make there. The father of the young lady would not let her quit teaching in Guajara until her school ends, but promised that after that she could go to the home of Brother Sebastian to teach school in that place. Brother Sebastian was happy over the two professions of faith, and the prospect of a school for his children. He even said he wanted to be taught also. He said that he would return to Guajara every time he came to Cruzeiro do Sul. One week-end, while Brother Sebastian was here working on the Creiglow's boat, he went to Mourapirango on a truck for services. He missed his ride and had to walk back after the services; it is just 14 kilometers.

As I mentioned in my letter of last month that my boy James and the son of Brother Miguel had been arranging for their own services. They don't ask me nor Brother Miguel to go to their services, and we usually are having services elsewhere anyway. They went to the Church at Malta, by bicycle, and Sunday week there were two professions of faith. James leads the singing with his horn, and they each preach on these trips. It was reported to me that there was one profession after each message. I never saw two boys more happy in being able to report the two professions. Last Sunday Brother Miguel asked me to take charge of the services in Cruzeiro do Sul while he was away preaching at the Mourapirango Church, and he came back with the report of two girls making professions. That makes four to be baptized there. Also Brother Miguel went to Malta to baptize two there since Brother Jose Cardona is not yet ordained and does not baptize those professing faith.

Monday, a week ago I went to attend a cottage service. It was looking like it might

come. Brother Miguel had developed a fever in the late afternoon and didn't show up to preach, and since it was the night after the election he wouldn't let any of the children come without him. James, William, and I went and no one else came from the church. There were two families present and we were starting late, since I didn't know that Brother Miguel was not coming, so I was feeling like that it would be another service without any moves. I was made glad, and also was ashamed of my lack of faith at the beginning of the service, when two men made professions of faith. They were the heads of the two families present.

Last night we were not to have a service anywhere. I had taken advantage of the chance to work late and painted the floor of our houseboat, getting it in better shape to begin our long trip which we hope to begin not later than next Monday. I had just washed the paint off and James came home with four boys, saying that he had planned a service at the home of John Rose above the mouth of the Moa River. I didn't have time to get ready to go with them, nor was I asked. They took the lantern and left paddling. When they returned they said there was one profession of faith at the close of their service.

I think I have told about the 11 professions which I had to report since my letter of August 24. The attendance is continuing between 80 and 100 here in Cruzeiro do Sul. Brother Sebastian is in Campo de Santana by now, if his plans went according to what he told me before leaving here.

I would like to take this opportunity to say that our mail from the States has been scarce lately. We have not heard from the Creiglows' since they left Malma. I am sure they have written. Brother Bratcher sent me the first two months offering sent by the Creiglows for the church at Colonia. He sent it on the 29 of August, and mailed me a letter about it on the 31st of August. I got the letter on the 14 of September, and the bank here had not as yet notified me that it was here.

We have painted the Creiglows' boat inside and it really looks good. I saw some wood drink up paint so. When you read this, we will be on an extended trip up river. We may be gone until the end of the year. If you don't hear from us you will know that it is because we will not be able to send letters to mail. Pray for us; for safety, health, and that we will follow the leadership of the Holy Spirit only and always.

The Auditorium area and the open space that was in the back. Or better said, we will have one big roof over all the Church property, which is 20 meters long and almost 14 meters wide (65 feet by 45 feet). The Auditorium is 11 meters long and 8 meters wide. We hope to have all this done, the ceilings and the odds and ends that we have to do, within 6 weeks at the most. Brother Jorge and several other members and I are working right along with the paid workers to get the job done quickly. We are now holding services in the other area I mentioned, that is alongside of the Auditorium. As soon as the Auditorium and the free area that is in the back are covered with the corrugated metal, we will have our services back on that side and then take the metal roof off where we are now worshipping. It is quite a problem and a mess now, and that is why we are working long hard hours, etc. We have only 2 complete weeks and with no rain in working hours, most all of the metal will be on this week, the Lord willing.

May the Lord bless you all and again we thank all that have made our ministry a reality.

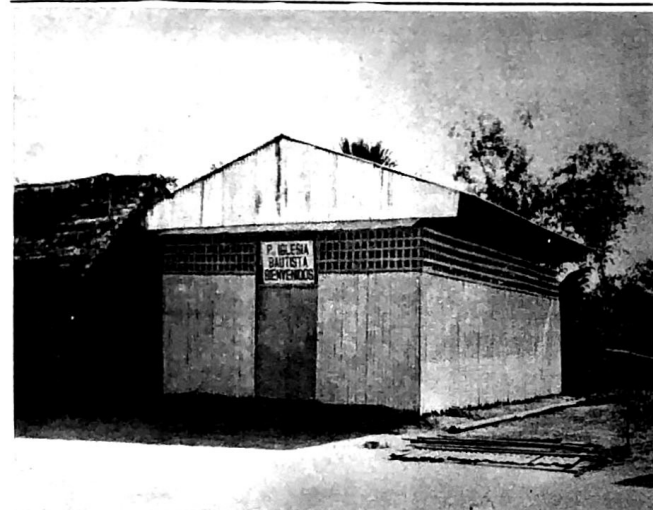

## Revival With Eleven Professions . . . One Hundred Ninety Three in Sunday School at Zion Church . . . Another Term In Preacher's School and Two Have Gone Into the Far Interior With Twelve Professions . . . Several Professions At Sao Jorge Mission . . . Trip to New Places . . . Five Baptized

Dear Brethren: Manaus, Amazonas September 14, 1963

When I wrote the last Mission Sheet letter we were in the middle of an eight day revival at the Zion Church with Brother Sosthenes Melo. We had a gracious revival indeed. The attendance at night ran from 75 to 130. We had a total of eleven professions and one reclaimed. The last Sunday morning of the meeting, the Sunday School attendance broke all previous records when the number of persons present was recorded at 193. Siao or as we call it in English, Zion Church has a membership of around 75. Thus we rejoice in the Lord and praise Him for the wonderful revival with this little church.

The work at the school continues on normally. We concluded another term of the Preacher's school the last of this month and will begin again the first of October. One of the teachers, Sarmiento Lima, who is also pastor of the Salem Church, with Elizario, one of our students, are now on a trip in the extreme western part of the Amazonas. According to a letter received by Elizario's wife from him, they are having a wonderful trip and have had 12 professions of faith, six from an Indian tribe, one of these being the chief. I do not know any more details. They will return on the 18th of this month.

The work at the 14th of December Church is going along well. I have had to be absent a great deal lately.

On the first of September on Sunday afternoon, I preached out in the country about 4 miles at a house where the Beautiful Garden Church has a preaching point.

From September 2-7, I lead the singing in a revival at the Sao Jorge mission. This is a new preaching point that has recently been opened by the Chapada Baptist Church where Julian Dantes is the pastor. He did the preaching. We had good attendance with the small house filled and some nights overflowing. There were several professions of faith during the meeting.

On September 9th I left Manaus and traveled with Deacon Antonio Eugenio de Nascimento on his boat for seven hours until we reached Anveres. This is one of the many places in the interior where I had never been before. The Beautiful Garden Church where Argemiro Laite is pastor has a preaching station here. Monday night I preached to 49 people. Many insects arrived too. Tuesday afternoon we journeyed further down the river for about an hour and arrived at another house where we had services and then at about 5:30 p.m. Brother Leite baptized 5 new converts. On Wednesday I returned home.

Today I am paying the preachers. Inflation is still raging here. Prices are still rising. The dollar is now worth a little more than a thousand Cruzeiros.

We are in the midst of a terrible heat wave and drought. It has been a month now since we even had a shower. I believe this is the longest dry spell we have seen in Brazil.

Thus, brethren, we pray the Lord's blessings upon all of you. Pray for us that the gospel may continue to be heard more and more here.

Since writing my last mission letter we have made three trips to San Francisco. We are happy about the work there, and are thankful to the Lord for His blessing upon the work there. We also want to say that the houseboat has proved to be the big factor, and a great blessing to our work. As I have said many times without it the work could not be done as it can with it. We would like to thank again all those who made it possible for us to have it. Wish all of you could make a trip with us, and then I am sure you could appreciate it as we do.

The old school house that we have been using for our services is just too small for the crowds that are coming. So now we have plans made to build a new building next month. The brethren have been waiting till their crops are laid by. We have the date set for the 14th of October to start. We are going to stay there and work with them until we see the building completed. Also I'm planning to have classes each night, and teach things about the church. Then we hope to organize the church during that time. We believe that it is best to concentrate on one place until there is a church, and then go some where else. By doing it this way it may seem slower, but I'm sure it will prove to be the best way in the years ahead.

There are two reasons for not being able to make a long trip. The real problem now is the gas shortage. We can only buy five gals. at a time, and you have to stand in line to do that. The reason for this is that the river is lower than it has been in years, so everyone

tells us. During the months of December and January we hope to be able to have daily vacation Bible school in many of the towns that we have visited. During these months school will be out and we have been promised the school buildings for not only vacation Bible school during the day, but also for services at night for everyone. Remember to pray for these months with us that it will be a time of great harvest for our Lord. We are getting everything ready. My wife is getting flannel graph material ready, and material for hand work. So we are looking forward to a great time.

I mentioned in my last letter about the man that has the large boat. I notice in the mission sheet that Brother Overbey has his picture along with his family who are all members of our church with the exception of the two small ones. He has been a real blessing to us. Last week end he went to a town below and brought a boat load to our service. He has a real desire to serve the Lord. They are a real happy family, and are growing in the grace and knowledge of our Lord. Pray for us as we continue to try and teach the people there.

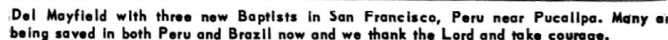
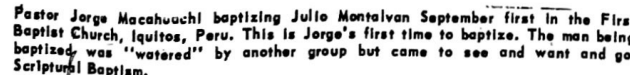
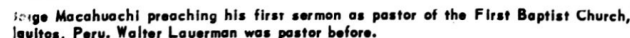
