Leaving For Year Of Furlough After Four Years In Peru . . . Churches Visited . . . Building In Tamshiyacu Almost Completed . . . Revival Planned At Planned At Mapa Cocha . . . Missions Up Napo River Showing Results . . . Man Saved And Baptized

Dear Brethren, Iquitos, Peru May 21, 1965

The Lord willing we will leave Iquitos, Peru, Saturday, June 12 for Lima and then leave Lima Sunday afternoon and arrive early Monday morning June 14 in Miami, Florida where we will meet the Mayfields and visit with them a few hours before they leave for Peru. From Miami we will drive north in the Station Wagon that the Mayfields drive to Miami. We will be living in Lexington, Kentucky during our furlough, the Lord willing.

We have visited all the churches again this month and also the mission in Tamshiyacu. All the work is going along fine except Mapa Cocha. Mapa Cocha though has planned revival services soon and I hope they do not back down. I have been pleading and praying for this as they need to be awakened and also the village in general. The Hojeal church is the one that is the leader for the rest and I hope in the next year all will catch on, to what, and how they do it.

Antonio Torres went up the Napo River to Huanaña again and had 60 present and 6 saved in his 3 days there. That is a total of 27 now. They have planned to baptize some in the month of August. They are planning on building also. In Orellana there were about 20 present and many came wanting to start serving the Lord like they should. The Mission in Tamshiyacu has all the walls up, etc. Brother Marcial is still trying to help

those that need to get married legally. At times it is a problem to get all the papers in order and also to find where the papers are registered. There are three families that could be baptized if they get this all straightened out. Nothing yet on the land in Hojeal that the priest took from the people. I hope that all will be returned to them without them having to pay anything. Brother Purificacion had good services at the petroleum refinery but no visible results.

The classes for the preachers are closed for at least the year. I still have the classes at night. I have practically spent all my time on teaching this last year or so and I know it will pay off. Many times one wants to be going but has to do things that require teaching, and waiting.

I have preached several times in Iquitos this month. One night I had something happen that was interesting and also that had never happened to me before. Brother Jorge had one to baptize that was supposed to have been saved in another group here in the past. The baptistry was all ready and Jorge this night asked me to preach, and preach if I wanted to on something that would meet the need of this one that had come for baptism. I preached on "the man of God". In this I showed the difference in any man or any child of God, and then gave it to be "the man of God". When I gave the invitation this man that was to be baptized came telling that he realized he had never been saved but was just trying to be a good man and his baptism was all he needed. So the church voted again to baptize him on this profession of faith he had just

Leaving On Twelve Day Trip To Boca Do Acre . . . Baptists Twelve . . . Another Church Organized

Dear Brethren, Manaus, Amazonas May 17, 1965

Tomorrow I am leaving for some 12 days. I am going to Boca do Acre or Monte Verde where our church, 14th of December Baptist Church of Manaus, has a mission. A young preacher and student of the Seminary has been there this time since the 4th of this month. As usual I'm in a rush to get everything ready and leave everything in good shape here so if this letter is shorter than usual, that's the reason.

The Apostle Paul teaches us that we should always be . . . "abounding in thanksgiving . . ." Colossians 2:6 (American Standard Version). Certainly we all have reason to do that. The Lord has been good to us here and we trust He has been good to all of you there in the States. At the end of this last month, April, we finished another quarter's work of the Preacher's School. I will not be teaching the next quarter (June-August) in order that I might have more time with the church where I serve as pastor.

On May 4th it was my blessed privilege to baptize 12 into the fellowship of the 14th of December Baptist Church. Also, yesterday, May 16th, the 14th of December church had the glorious privilege of organizing another one of its missions into a New Testament Church. Yesterday, here in Manaus, was born another "body of Christ." The name chosen was "The Bairro Vermelho Baptist Church." Translated it would be, I suppose, the "Red Suburb Baptist Church." The church was organized with some 21 members and one of its members, Jose Francisco da Silva, was chosen as pastor. He is a student in the Preacher's School and will be ordained later.

Dear Brethren,

There is not much that I can report this month due to the fact that soon after writing my letter for the Mission Sheet last month Betty had a relapse and returned to bed. For the most part of the following three weeks she did not get out of bed. When she was feeling some better we thought we would go to Colonia to spend about ten days, so with the speedboat loaded we were on our way and after two hours we were there in the house just ahead of the rain. After being there only five days Betty had only been able to get out of bed long enough to go to one service, so we decided to return to Cruzeiro where we have been ever since. I went back to the doctor and after another round of questions and some time for him to scratch his head he prescribed some antibiotics which I could not find in any of the drug stores. Brenda has been having trouble with her eyes and I still have my hernia, so if Betty does not get better soon we three will go to Manaus for treatment.

Last month I wrote about our two youngest preachers going on a missionary trip. They were only gone a few days and were not well received. Although there were no visible results, this is at least a start and what is more encouraging is that they returned making plans for the next trip. While we were in Colonia they were on this second trip and were to stay ten days. We as yet have not received the report on this trip which was to Pentacost Creek where very few preachers have preached and I do not even know exactly where it is. It is a small creek that empties into the Moa River between Japiim and Barao.

While we have been staying here in Cruzeiro do Sul I have been taking care of the services here giving Brother Miguel the opportunity to go to Mourapiranga. One Sunday Brother Miguel took some of the brethren from here with him to Mourapiranga where he baptized two into the fellowship of that church and three into the fellowship of the Cruzeiro do Sul church.

This is all the news I have at this time so until next month may the Lord bless you all and don't forget to pray for us.

To State Of Maranhao With George Bean . . . House Hunting . . . Ready For Trip Into The Interior . . . New Pastor Ordained In Manaus . . . Another Term Of Preacher's School Finished, . . Students On The Go

Sao Luis, Maranhao
May 11, 1965

Dear Brethren,

This is written in the city of Sao Luis, about the size of Manaus with about 200,000 population, Capital of State of Maranhao. Population of State is over 2,500,000 more than three times the population of Amazonas, and yet only about 35 to 40 Baptist churches (of all kinds) and only 12 pastors. Two thirds of the churches are without pastors. This shows the need of our Preacher's School in Manaus. We are thankful that we have Brother George Bean and Brother Sostenes Melo here.



A BUSY MONTH IN MANAUS

This past month has been a busy one in getting everything in order to make the trip to Maranhao with Brother George Bean. Building materials had to be bought for the month, salaries of students who work on the building, teacher's salaries and substitutes for school classes. While I am away Mrs. Hatcher has all the responsibility. How I do thank God for my wife. She is a fine Christian mother, a faithful wife and a hard worker in the Lord's work.

NEW PASTOR ORDAINED

The Second Baptist Church on the Island of Patience called Brother Atadeu R. dos Santos as pastor and asked the Chapada Baptist Church to ordain him. This service was on April 26, 1965. Pastors Julio Dantas, Manuel Costa, John Dias and Brother George Bean were present. Pray for this young pastor. He is a third year student in the Seminary and has grown much in grace and knowledge of our Lord.

SEMINARY VACATION

Actually this is not a vacation, but as we have said before, the Preacher's School is set up to have three months of study and then one month of vacation for the Brethren

and Students to travel. This month Brother Bratcher and Brother Bean and I are all out. Students are also traveling and preaching. Atadeu, the one ordained, is spending about two weeks up the Amazon River at a new place and then two weeks at his new church. Moses Lima is spending the month where he has a mission point on the Island of Saint Anthony. He is leading the people in building a building and planned a V.B.S. also. Eliziario da Silva was planning to return to Boca do Acre. Renato Livino and Raul Vera, two students, are taking care of all services at Chapada Church.

HERE IN MARANHÃO

Brother Bean and I have been here since April 28. After arriving we soon discovered that in this city of 200,000 there were practically no houses for rent. After visiting all the real estate agencies we could find and consulting the newspapers, there was no alternative. We spent six days walking up one street and down another. Finally the Lord heard our prayers and Brother Bean was able to find a pretty nice house at

was able to find a pretty nice house at a very high rent. Brother Bean is in a State where travel is by road (not by rivers) and it would be a blessing if in some way he could have a Jeep or car. There is a way---

On Thursday we will travel south to a little country village, Peritoro, where I came for the first time some years ago. Since that time a Baptist Church has been organized here, and Brother Sostenes Melo has moved here from Manaus to be the pastor. So we thank God for the start and growth of His work in this State. To Sao Luis, Maranhao . . . Rents House To Live In . . . Buys Building For Mission . . . To Move In June

Dear Brethren,

I thank God for every remembrance of you and of the churches that give their mission offerings to make this ministry possible. I am now in the city of Sao Luis, the capital of the State of Maranhao, with Brother John Hatcher. Before leaving Manaus, I preached at the Chapada Baptist Church, Peniel Baptist Church and a mission of Salem Baptist Church. Two women made professions of faith at the mission service.

LEAVE FOR SAO LUIS

Brother Hatcher and I left Manaus by plane on April 28, 1965 for Sao Luis, Maranhao and arrived the same afternoon. Sao Luis has about 200,000 population with seven Baptist Churches, four Southern Baptist, and one a split from a Southern Baptist and two Conservative Baptist.

HOUSE HUNTING

The next day we started over the city by boat, then we walked for several days letting the Lord lead us to the spot that He wanted us to go. After much walking and talking, I rented a house in the older part of the city. As we were walking we were looking for a spot to start a work. We found a spot and had some street meetings, but they did not turn out too well as we are in the rainy season here, and a couple of times we had to call off the service because of the rain.

BUILDING FOR SERVICES

Then the Lord led us to a building that was for sale in the same neighborhood. We made a deal to buy it. Our time was almost gone that we had allotted to stay in Sao Luis. We decided not to try to hold any services in the building until I return with my family. There are several people interested. They listen well, and some of them will be saved, I believe, when we open the building for services, the Lord willing. The reason for buying the house is because you cannot find any kind of building to rent for church services.

We are expecting great things from the Lord here in Sao Luis. On Thursday, May 13th, Brother Hatcher and I plan to leave Sao Luis and go about four hours south by bus, where we have a church that Brother Sostenes Melo pastors. He is the worker that moved from Manaus to this place about two months ago.

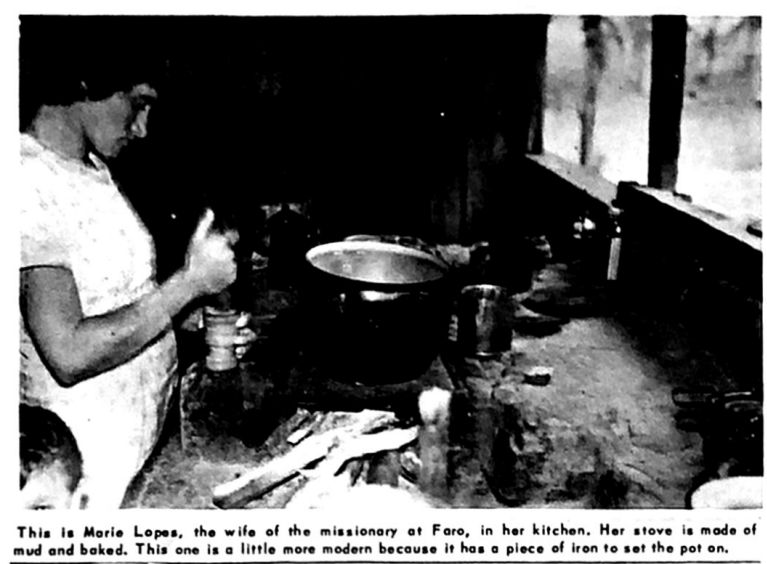

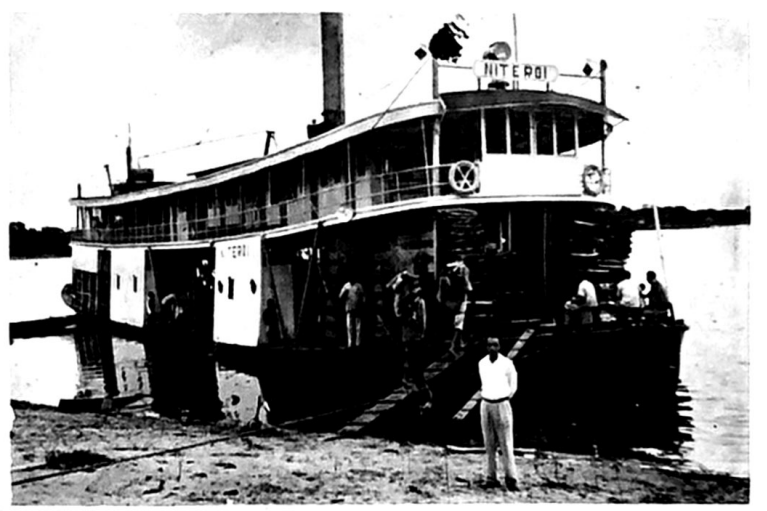
