Lee Creiglow Arrives In Brazil For Visit . . . Father Died In Ohio . . . Ready To Return To Cruzeiro do Sul After Operations In Manaus

Dear Brethren,
Manaus, Brazil,
July 23, 1965
Since the last Mission Sheet letter I have had the privilege of preaching several times for several different churches. I think I enjoyed preaching this time more than any other time that I have preached in Manaus. After a little over a month without preaching I found that I had to train my voice all over again and several times I almost lost it.

This week we have been attending a revival meeting in the 14th of December Baptist Church where Brother Bratcher is Pastor and also Evangelist for the meeting. There have been several professions of faith thus far, with very good attention and attendance every night.

After going in vain to the airport several days in succession the plane that we had been waiting for finally arrived, bringing my brother Lee. We have spent this week showing him the sights of Manaus, while we were making preparations to return to Cruzeiro do Sul. We will leave tomorrow for home taking my brother Lee with us to show him what the Lord has done in and near Cruzeiro do Sul. He plans to spend two weeks with us and we are thankful unto the Lord for his visit and hope that it will be a blessing to him, also.

It seems that during the past few months we have had a small sample of the trials of Job. Just after Betty and I started getting around after our operations, one evening Brenda came home after staying a few days with Lynn Hatcher, she was crying and doubled over with pains in her stomach.



While Brother Bratcher was going to get a car to take her to the emergency room at the hospital she handed me a telegram from Mike saying that he had dropped a motor overboard and was not able to find it. After some X-rays and other tests the doctor prescribed two kinds of treatment. By the time my brother Lee arrived we were all back in good health again, but he brought the news that my father had died the week before. Well we know that we have not suffered near as much as Job, but we can still say with Job, "Blessed be the name of the Lord." We are returning to our field of labor in hopes that God will double our ministry and if so we will be as satisfied as Job.

Although the news of the death of my father was somewhat of a shock it did drive me to deeper thought. As I thought upon this and the burden we had for his souls salvation the thought came to me that God is not a respecter of persons and what right have I to have more of a burden for one man than any other. Many times we complain, saying we have our rights, but we should remember that Christ came assuming the position of no rights for us. Also, we were reminded that death comes to all sooner or later and it is a fearful thing for a sinner to fall into the hands of the living God. We can do nothing for the dead, but God has given us much to do for the living and that is plead with them to put their trust in the Christ that sacrificed himself for the salvation of their souls. He will save all that trust in Him. Pray for us that we might be faithful to His calling.

Two Preachers Ordained . . . Witnesses To Jewish Rabbi . . . 17th Anniversary Service At Tabernacle Baptist Church

Dear Brethren,
"In the morning sow thy seed, and in the evening withhold not thine hand: for thou knowest not whether shall prosper, either this or that, or whether they both shall be alike good." Ecclesiastes 11:6.

For this month's letter, I'll not report on each day's activities but on about half of the days. The other days were spent in a similar manner.

June 16th-Pastor Julio Braga of Umatia preached for us at Fourteenth Church.

June 18th-I served as moderator and interrogator at the ordination of Jose Francisco da Silva, pastor of the newly organized Bairro Vermelho Church.

June 24th-I went with Deacon Antonio Eugenio de Nascimento to visit the Jewish Rabbi here in Manaus. He wasn't at home but we met his brother, Moises, an old gentleman, who showed us the Jewish Synagogue of Manaus. It is a very beautiful brick building with cushioned seats. There, in the synagogue, for a few minutes, I preached Christ to Moises. (Excuse me, I've just discovered that I am spelling Moises as it is spelled in Portuguese). When I declared to him that Jesus Christ was God, he responded "Nao." (No).

June 25th-Visited all the houses on a street a few blocks from the church where I had never visited before. That night I assisted in the ordination of the deacon, Antonio Eugenio de Nascimento to the ministry. He has been called as the pastor of the Codajas Church.

July 3rd-I preached the anniversary message at Tabernacle marking the end of the 17th year of the church. The church reports 19 baptisms since the last anniversary service and a present membership of 154.

July 4th-Bobby Creiglow preached for us tonight at Fourteenth Church. He brought us an inspiring and helpful message.

July 5-8th-Preached each night and visited each afternoon (except one) at the Santo Antonio Mission of the Salem Baptist Church where Brother Sarmento is pastor. There was one profession of faith on Tuesday night. This is a new work in one of the suburbs of Manaus between Sao Raimundo and Sao Jorge.

July 11th-We had 117 in Sunday School this a.m. and 111 tonight in the Evening Service at Fourteenth church.

July 13th-I returned and this time encountered the Jewish Rabbi and in a pleasant and calm conversation, we spent two hours discussing the Old and New Testaments in relation to Jesus Christ. Once when I declared Jesus Christ as the Jewish Messiah he responded "Pode ser." (It might be) Pray with me for the salvation of Rabbi Jacob Azulay of Manaus. Afterwards I visited a Japanese family, whom a Japanese in the interior, whom I have witnessed to and preached to, requested me to visit. I was cordially received and they listened well.

July 14th-This a.m. the opportunity presented itself to me to witness to a Jewish merchant (owner of a Drug firm). The conversation ended with him saying that God is an ideal but not a person (being). He, earlier in the conversation, said that religion was for the "simples" (plain,

common people.) Brethren, if it is thus, I'm glad I'm "simples". Tonight, Lee Creiglow, Missionary Bobby Creiglow's brother, who arrived Tuesday to visit his missionary brother, gave a word of greeting and testimony, translated by Brother Bobby, in the Prayer Service at Fourteenth.

July 15th-As I finish writing about the past, I am thinking also of the future. We will have an eight day revival at the Fourteenth church, July 18th-July 25th with the Pastor serving as the evangelist. On the 31st I plan to be at Rio Preto for some 8 days of preaching there. Next month, sometime after the 15th, I must go to Rio Urubu (Buzard River) to visit our mission there.

Thus, Brethren, we give you an insight to our labors here. We covet your prayers as we labor believing Romans 1:16-17 "For I am not ashamed of the Gospel of Christ for it is the power of God unto salvation to everyone that believeth, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. For therein is the righteousness of God revealed from faith to faith, for as it is written, 'the just shall live by faith.'"

Brethren, pray for us.




