 We call this month here in Peru "The month of purple." The Catholics call it "El mes de los milagros" or the month of miracles. Everyone who has some kind of a sickness or other things they would like to see come to pass is told that IF they wear purple dress (Made of wool) for 30 days the Lord of miracles will bring it to pass. This is only one of the many false doctrines that is taught by the Catholic priests here. The last day of this month they will bring out their statues or images of Christ on the cross and march through the streets. Some will remember the slides that I showed of the one they have in Lima that

weighs ONE TON made of pure silver and gold. Of course they do not have any here like that but will paint a picture on a canvas and nail it on sticks and carry it through the streets with a multitude following after it, dressed in Purple. I wish the 90,000 people that gathered in New York to see the pope would come here and see what they do to a country. Oh yes! they had (12) twelve new priests arrive here the first of this month. They are to work here and on the river Ucayali. We as Baptists have one (1) missionary. What a great opportunity we have to tell people the truth, and yet so few hear the call GO, GO. The call is to the church, and if you're a member that means YOU. After the resurrection of Christ and just before His ascension He said in Mark 16:15 "Go into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature." If you will note Verse 19 and 20, "After they heard the Lord speak

Dear Brethren, Manaus, Amazonas, October 13, 1965

As I review and think back over the happenings of this month, I am made to realize that nothing unusual or extraordinary has happened here. Nevertheless it has been a good month in the service of the Lord. The days have been spent here in Manaus working mostly with the 14th of December Baptist Church. We have sweated more than usual because the weather has been hotter than usual, and drier too, here in the Amazon Valley where it is never cold or practically never even cool.

"Rejoice in the Lord always, and again I say, Rejoice." Philippians 4:4. In order to obey this command, we must be sure of our salvation, realize that the greatest joy in heaven is caused when a sinner repents here on the earth, (See Luke 15:7 & 10) and avoid sin in our lives. "Rejoice in the Lord always, and again I say, Rejoice."

I have preached regularly to fairly large congregations at the church. We have had one open air service each week which have been well attended also.

Since the beginning of the last quarter of the Preacher's School for this year, which

began, October 5th, I have been teaching a class in Old Testament.

I would like to share with you some of our plans for the next few months: October 17-24, Vacation Bible School at Amatori where the 14th Church has a mission. November 8th-13th, a week of revival somewhere in the vicinity of the Church, as the Lord leads. December 6th-11th, a week of Bible Study in the church. Sunday, December 12th, a baptismal service. January 3-7, Vacation Bible School in the church. January 16th "Member's Day." January 23-30, Revival at Cambix another mission of our church. During the months of October-January, also we will be emphasizing stewardship and tithing, hoping to see the number of tithers in the church increasing.

We ask the prayers of each of you that in each of these endeavors the Lord will bless. We already have 3 approved by the church for baptism. Pray with us that we'll have many others to baptize the 12th of December. Pray that the Lord will bless also, in increasing the number of tithers among us.

I close with my last Sunday night's text-Philippians 4:13 "I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me."

Good News From The Churches In Peru . . . Most Of Them Growing . . . Churches Visited In Tennessee, Kentucky And Michigan

Dear Brethren, Another month has gone by. We have been home four months from Peru and it seems like yesterday. It won't be long and we will be back where we belong, in Peru. We received letters recently from the churches in Peru. Every letter says something about wishing that we were back. Needless to say the feeling is mutual.

If the reports that I get from Peru are true, the churches there are doing real fine. All but the Mapa Cocha church is actually growing. The offerings are always real good in all the churches. There

were four professions of faith in the mission at Tamshiyacu but Brother Marcial who preaches there in the Mission reports that his wife was sick in bed for 10 days but is better now. The Mapa Cocha church seems to be at a standstill, with no new word on what the priest was trying to do to the church in Hojeal. Purification, the pastor at Astoria again visited the Ityaya River this past month for a few days. He had good attendance there and one profession of faith. This church also has two other preaching points that are near to Astoria. The place that is in the Ityaya River is 12 hours by boat from Astoria. The San Antonio Church is going right along. Pastor Antonio Torres reports good services in his preaching points especially where he goes in the Napo River. I hear regularly (two or three times a month) from pastor Jorge Macahuachi of the church in Iquitos and he claims that no disgruntled ones have bothered since my departure. There was one profession of faith there this month and a new preaching point opened up on Sunday afternoons in Celendin. Do pray with us that all would stay as it is. It is hard to come home and leave your work alone there but at the same time it has to stand alone someday and I prefer it to be now and as I said above all is well, as of now. I visited the following churches since

last writing: September 26th Berea Baptist Church, Clarksville, Tenn. Brother Sego, pastor, morning and afternoon and night September 29, Olmstead Baptist Church, Olmstead, Kentucky, Brother Wallace York, pastor, October 4th A.M. Bible Baptist Mission, Cadiz, Ky. Brother Bill Meador pastor, I went with Brother Meador to his Nursing Home service in the afternoon and I spoke there. In the evening of the 4th with Brother Dempsey Henderson and the Julien Baptist Church, Gracey, Ky. October 9th and 10th we were with the Faith Baptist Church in Jackson, Mich. Brother V.A. Turner, pastor. The 11th through the 13th nightly with the New Hope Baptist Church, Flint, Mich. Brother James Kissel, pastor. October 14th and 17th in the A.M. Faith Baptist Church, Genesee, Mich. Brother Morris Beadle, pastor. Oct. 15th Brother Beadle took me to their mission in Frankfort, Mich., where Brother Paul Calley preaches, October 17th we were back again in the evening with Brother Kissel at New Hope. It was good to meet and be with brethren that I had not known before and of course ones that I knew real well. We want to thank all that have had us to come to their churches and tell about the work in Peru. We only hope that we were as much a blessing to you as you were to us. In four months now I have spoken in 32 different churches plus two conferences and one 1-week Revival. Of these 32 churches, seven of them I have spoken twice and four, three times. It has been a little rough at times but it has been worth it all. Our family is well at present, although the three smallest ones, Kathy, Mary, and Debbie have been sick regularly with their tonsils. The Lord willing, they will all have a tonsilectomy on October 26th. It will be quite a job having three of them in the hospital for a few days but I wanted to do it while I was home with the family. Pray for us that the Lord would get glory from our lives and use us as a blessing to others.

Dear Brethren, We greet you in the name of our dear Lord, desiring His blessings upon each and everyone.

I would like to thank the brethren who have written to us this month. The letters and church bulletins were greatly appreciated as we do not have too many friends here.

I will now give you a report of some of the highlights of the month's activity. We now have services at the mission house Sundays, Wednesdays and Fridays. Mondays, I teach Brother Agostino his classes. I said last month that Brother Agostino preached and did real well. I would like to correct that a little and say he made some good tries. He has only been saved now about three months but he is willing to do all that he knows.

Sunday September 26, I preached from the 16th chapter of Mark and the 16th verse, "He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned. After the service two men stood and said they were trusting the Lord as their Saviour. Also Jose Arimatea, an 18 year old boy that lives near our house and made a profession last month stood and said he wanted to be baptized.

Monday September 27 Jonathan, our 8 month old baby fell down the stairs and cut his head. It took four stitches to sew it up. The stitches were removed three days later and now he is OK.

Sunday October 3 we had 8 in our SS. This was state election day and of course every one had to go and vote. That night we had 30 present two boys, one a 7 year old and a 15 year old made professions of faith. The 7 year olds father is a member of the First Baptist Church in Sao Luis and the 15 year old is his nephew and they will be baptized into the First Baptist Church some time later.

Word From Brother Sostenes Melo and the Peritoro Church

I had word from Brother Sostenes and the Peritoro church. He reports that they had five professions of faith last month and all of them will be baptized into the church there.

We have had several professions in our work here but for some reason we do not get to baptize them and then teach them. We are thankful we get to win them to the Lord but also we would like to teach them. This we leave in the hands of Him who knows what is best for us. And when we get to the other side we will be made to rejoice to see that the perfect plan of the Lord has been executed and will fit together like a jig-saw puzzle.

We share with you some of the blessings and experiences the Lord has given us this month.

The attendance was fair with about eight or ten lost in every service and although this helps numerically it is not something that you can count on in every service. If and when the Lord sees fit to save some of them we will be able to count them and say we have had an increase of so many, but until that time comes we will just have to be satisfied with what we have.

NEW PREACHING POINT

One Sunday afternoon we were invited farther into the interior to hold a service. It had rained up until almost time for services and we did not expect to have very good attendance, but to our very pleasant surprise there were about seventy present. Although the attention was very good, to our disappointment there were no professions of faith. One other night we were invited into another home for services, but there was a mix-up on the time with some thinking that it was to be in the afternoon, therefore there were only about thirty present, half of whom are lost. In the service with the seventy present there were over fifty lost and we were invited to return as often as we care to. This is a good preaching point and I hope to return there several times at least as it seems they will come to a home where-as they will not come to the church although it is not more than about a forty-five minute walk. Water Rising In The Rivers . . . Good Classes Regularly For Preachers . . . A Lost Woman Interested In The Services

Cruzeiro do Sul, Acre
October 14, 1965
Last month I was late writing my mission sheet letter, therefore this letter will only cover a period of about three weeks. It seems as though these three weeks have passed so fast that it seems only yesterday that I wrote my last letter.

I came back from Colonia with plans to get all the boats painted before the rainy season started, but it has rained ever since we got here. The water has come up once already and is now on the second rise. It has come up enough that we can now travel up the Moa River in the speed-boat, although there are some logs in the river that are not covered with water we can travel with safety using a little care.

I wrote last month about having a class for the young preachers in our churches and also for Sunday School teachers. When I returned to Cruzeiro do Sul my students followed me and so for the past two weeks we have carried these on with four classes per week starting on Tuesday and running through Friday. The first week of classes here in Cruzeiro, and one that the church here has elected to be ordained as deacon said he wanted to study with us when he could, but that he would have to spend some of his time working to provide for his family. I can understand why he has missed about half of the classes, because he has about nine children to support. The young preacher of our church in Colonia and the pastor of the church in Maita have been the most faithful and have not missed a class. They seem to be learning well, due to the fact they have the most interest. Neither one of them have had more than the second grade of schooling which makes it more difficult for them. They say they are learning very much and hope that we can continue until they are well grounded in the word of God. These two seem to be the most

zealous of the few preachers we have here, so perhaps with them well grounded in the truth we can see some progress in the work here. I must confess that the progress has not been too satisfactory up until now, but we still have a great God.

With the water up and good to travel I have spent two week-ends in Colonia with the brethren there. One week end was not too good for any one other than the church because it was the week of the annual Catholic feast in which every one is completely given to idolatry and drunkenness. In spite of all this there were several lost that attended the night service. One of these being the wife of one of the believers there. We have been expecting and hoping that she would be saved and her husband told us that she said, "If he had given one more invitation she would have made a profession of faith." The next week I went there also, but due to sickness in the family she could not attend. I went to their house and visited with them for about two hours and I think she listened with more interest than ever before. This is the lady that some of you may remember that I told about when I showed the slides. She was afraid to come to services because of the priests and at first only came through the woods so that no one would see her. She now comes quite regularly and we trust that in the next letter we can report that she along with many others have been saved by the Lord.

We want to thank Brother Warren Redding and the brethren of the First Baptist Church of Alexandria, Kentucky for their fine offering helping us out with our hospital bill. This indeed was a great help to us. It made me remember the fine time of fellowship that I enjoyed with you all when I was home. May the Lord bless you all for your kindness.

This is about all the news that we have from here so will close desiring the Lord's blessings for you all. We are feeling pretty good at the present time.

and saw Him go back into heaven, it says that "they went forth and preached everywhere" the Lord working with them. We're praying that many will see the great need we have here and will help. We have borrowed money from the regular fund as there was not enough to continue with the building, in the building fund. Those who have given and are standing with us we appreciate, but so many have not helped. Will you not pray and then do what the Lord leads you to do.

The walls of the building are done and the roof is going on. We still have the floor & the plastering to do, along with the trim work. The walls would have been done if we would not have had to wait for blocks and cement. Material here is very hard to get, and prices seem to go higher and higher. We are very anxious to get in the building, and plan to start using it as soon as it's finished enough to move in.

We have made three river trips along with the work here. The houseboat is a real blessing to our work. The Lord continues to bless the work at San Francisco. The attendance has been down some due to the fact that many children have been sick with the measles, and polio. Many have died here in Pucallpa and other places, but so far none at San Francisco. I just about died a couple of weeks ago from shock. When I started to leave the boat there was a snake laying for me just outside the door of the boat. We were very happy after we killed it to find out that it was not poisonous. I'm hoping that it will be the last, poison or not. We have had two saved this month. One man who we never liked to see come, because he only came when he was drinking that is, until Sunday night. Sunday night he came, and this time to listen. The Lord spoke to him through His word and at the invitation he stood and professed faith in Christ as his Saviour. Thank the Lord for His saving grace. Pray for this man that he'll follow his Lord now and be faithful. The other a lady that was saved is the married daughter of Brother Ponce. We have many to baptize but are waiting for the river to come up, and also want to finish teaching the doctrines of the church. I told the people Sunday that I want them to know why they were Baptist. Continue to pray for the people there. Hope to visit some of the other mission points the first of the month.

Let's remember the words of our Lord GO, GO. If you can't then help send others. May the Lord bless you all.

DAY CLASSES

Also while we were in Colonia I held classes in the afternoon for Sunday-School teachers or anyone that wanted to increase their Bible knowledge. These classes of about three hours length were divided into three parts with the first part a verse by verse study in Matthew, the second part a doctrinal study and the last part outlining of lessons. It kept me busy in the morning preparing the lessons, but I think it will be a big help to all of us in the long run. The pastor in Humaita came also and spent the week with us and then returned for the Sunday services at his church. He came the second week also but after the first day class I came down with malaria and spent the rest of the week in bed. On Friday night of that week as we were returning home from services our neighbors told us that there had come a message over the radio for us that our house-boat was in

danger and that we should return to Cruzeiro do Sul as soon as possible. We returned to the house-boat on Saturday to find that it had sprung a leak and had almost sunk, but the men in whose care we had left it managed to save it although when they started to bail they had little hope for it. We were very thankful to find it still afloat knowing the work, the mess and the loss that we would have had, had it sunk.

The attendance in the church here in Cruzeiro do Sul stays up pretty well and the pastor baptized twelve into the fellowship of the church this past month. Brother Miguel also baptized one into the fellowship of the Mourapiango church this month.

The Lord's blessings be with you all.
