Brother Hatcher and I soon had the canoe loaded when we noticed that the houseboat was setting very low in the water. We opened the hold to be confronted with a fountain of water that we thought would give "Old Faithful" some good competition as for size, but after some examination we saw that it was only a hole of about three inches in diameter. After pushing the boat off the stick that had made the hole we spent the next two hours bailing and repairing the leak. By the time we had finished with all this Mike had returned with the boys and we heard for the first time of the good week they had had. About 1:00 o'clock in the afternoon Mike left with two of the brethren going to the Parana dos Mouras while the other went to Mourapiranga and Brother Hatcher and I to Colonia. We were to start services that night in Colonia, but due to all this we did not arrive until after time for services to start.

We had a good week while in Colonia with the best attendance in Bible School that we had ever had there. The last day was the best attendance with 111 present. There were two souls saved in the Bible School. The night services were not so well attended other than the members, but they were good for all of us.

The other brethren returned with good reports also. The last week was spent with a preacher's school in the morning and a Bible conference with two preachers each night. There were two churches that gave offerings for the work of Baptist Faith Missions in Brazil and the last night of the Bible Conference there was an offering

received from the church here in Cruzeiro do Sul for the three preacher students that came with Brother Hatcher. The attendance in the conference ran from 90 to 115 each night. Beyond the good time of fellowship there were 22 professions of faith, 6 reconciled to the churches, 3 rededications, 19 baptized by Brother Hatcher into the fellowship of the Cruzeiro do Sul Church and 2 called to preach. We give thanks to God for you who have given, making it possible for them to make this trip. One of these boys made it known during the conference that he was called to preach, but the other did not make it known until about an hour after the brethren had left for Manaus. When we returned from the airport my son Mike and I stopped at the warehouse for awhile and while we were there Mike told me that he thought the Lord had called him to preach.

Mike and the other boy have both been preaching at least once a week and both want to go to Manaus to study in the seminary, so Mike may be leaving us in the near future.

Due to the fact that Mike may be leaving us soon and that the houseboat is in bad shape we have rented a six room apartment and have spent the past two weeks painting, cleaning and moving. With us living on land once again I can now leave Betty and Brenda here in Cruzeiro do Sul while I travel when they do not want to go with me. Mike and I hope to make at least one trip together before he leaves.

With no more news from here I will close wishing the Lord's blessing for you all.

Hatcher With Three Seminary Students Spends Three Weeks With Creiglow In The Acre . . . VBS, Revivals And Conferences . . . Other Seminary Students Travel . . . 14 Trips In All . . . VBS At Chapada Church . . . Seminary Has Largest Enrollment

Dear Brethren,
This past month has been a full one, running over. The Lord has blessed His Word and His work in many ways. During the month of January, which is a month of vacation for the Seminary, many of the preacher students traveled to the interiors where they directed Bible Schools for the children and revival meetings. Praise God for the blessings!

TRIP TO CRUZEIRO DO SUL

On the 7th of January three seminary students and I made the trip to Cruzeiro do Sul at the invitation of Brother Creiglow and the churches. The students were Raul Vera, Jose Aives Araujo, and Moises Lima. The two last ones are from Cruzeiro do Sul. The Creigloes and some of the brethren were at the airport to meet us and it was a real joy to see them again.

Brother Creiglow had all the plans made so there would not be any loss of time. The next morning, which was Saturday, Mike left in the speedboat and took Jose Alves to Japiim, Raul Vera to Humaita, and Moises to Baron. Brother Creiglow and I stayed in Cruzeiro do Sul during the first week where services were held every night and Bible School every morning.

At the end of the first week Mike went to get the three brethren and took two of them to Parana dos Mouras and Moises went to Mourapiranga. Brother Creiglow's family and I went to Colonia where, during the second week, we held another revival and Bible Schools. Many persons asked for services but the days were not enough.

At the end of the second week or rather the beginning of the third week we were all

back in Cruzeiro do Sul. During this last week there was held a week's study for the preacher brethren and interested persons. This study was held from 7:00 to 11:00 each morning. All of the preacher brethren attended and with the others it seems as if there was an attendance of about 14 each morning. Brother Creiglow taught classes in Bible Geography and History, Studies in Exodus, and Studies in the Book of Daniel. Each morning one of the young preachers brought a devotional message.

GREAT BIBLE CONFERENCE

During the last week the church was filled nightly and all the brethren, pastors of the churches were with us in the Bible Conference. It was the greatest Bible Conference I have ever attended here in Brazil. There were two preachers each night. As they preached, God was glorified and praised.

During the three weeks there were about 22 professions of faith, 6 reconciliations and two young men called to the ministry and two young ladies who manifested desire to study in the Seminary.

The young preachers and I came back to Manaus rejoicing in all that the Lord had done. Brother Creiglow had done a great job in having everything planned and the churches received the brethren in the best manner possible. Fellowship with Brother Creiglow and his family was for us a real joy. When you say that we are both in Brazil it sounds close but actually we live more than a thousand miles apart on a straight line, and 2500 miles by boat.

OTHER BRETHREN STUDENTS TRAVEL

Just among the students which are members of different churches, there were about eleven who made a total of 14 trips to different places. There were nine Vacation Bible Schools and eight weeks of conferences or revivals. There were a total of

A report from Iquitos is that the son of the pastor of the Iquitos church is very ill. The boy has rheumatic fever. He has had this almost from birth. The pastor is Jorge Macahuachi. Other word from there, two professions of faith in Tamshiyacu. We are hoping to organize there as soon as we return, the Lord willing. The attendance at Astoria church is running about 60 now since the revival there. The pastor Purificacion made another trip up the Itaya River and he thinks that there are many possibilities on that river also.

The San Antonio Church building is done finally. Although this church has been slow on its building it has sent out two preachers and 4 families to other churches there. The two mission points that it has are doing real fine, also. The Hojeal Church still without a pastor has had visits from the pastors of the Astoria church, Iquitos church, Mapa Cocha church and the San Antonio church. I thank God for this church as it is doing better than the others even without a pastor. I also, of course, thank God for the brethren that went there to help out. Please pray for these places and people and preachers. Many of you have seen the slides of these places and heard me talk so much about these so

I was at the Home church from January 28 to January 30 and the combined service on February 1. February 2 through 6 with Brother Hille and the New Hope Church of Dearborn Heights, Mich. February 9 with the Northside Church of Lexington, Ky. Brother Gerald Smith pastor. Yesterday, February 13 we had the pleasure of being with the Pleasant Ridge Church here in Lexington also, Brother Earl Thomas is the pastor. I want to thank the young people of the New Hope Church for the new beautiful 35 mm slide camera. It is just what I need and I will surely use it in the work. We of course thank all the rest not only on this trip but all others for all the blessings which I could not remember anymore. Eternity will tell just how much we have appreciated all.

Everyone of our family now has their tonsils out except my wife and the doctor has surprisingly said that hers are good. All of us are now fine and we thank God for this. Pray for us as we prepare to return to Peru June 10. May the Lord bless you all.

Negotiating With The Lord's Money Till He Comes . . . Eight Days Journey To Cambixe With The Whole Family . . . Revival And Two Baptized At Cambixe . . . Eighteen Baptized Into Three Churches In One Day In Manaus

Manaus, Amazonas

February 14, 1966

Last night in my message I made reference to the parable of the pounds as recorded by Luke in Luke 19:11-27. I would like to call attention to verse 13 which reads as follows in the King James Version, "And he called his ten servants and delivered them ten pounds, and said unto them, Occupy till I come." The American Standard Version reads . . . "Trade ye herewith till I come." Williams translates: "He called in ten of his slaves and gave them twenty dollars apiece and told them to do business with his money while he was gone." Our Portuguese translation reads: . . . "Negotiate till I come." Thus the lesson is that we as followers of Christ are to be negotiators, spiritually speaking. I want to be like the first slave who reported: "Lord, thy pound hath gained ten pounds." I know that each of you want to be like the first one also and not like the wicked servant who did nothing. Now, let me share with you some of the negotiations, spiritual negotiations, that we have done, using the Lord's money that you have given because you are interested also in obeying the command of our Lord to evangelize all the nations of the world.

Saturday morning at 8:40 we (the "we" included beside me, my wife and three children, the two girls that help my wife with the housework, the boy that helps on the boat, a girl from the church who went to play the accordion during the meeting, and Brother Manuel Costa) left Manaus and traveled down the river for three hours until we arrived at Cambixe. Brother Costa had to return immediately. After getting everything unloaded and arranged in the house

where we were to stay during the next several days, we ate dinner, then rested a little while and then spent the rest of the afternoon distributing tracts and invitations for the revival of January 23rd to January 30th. During these eight days we preached each night, besides the two Sunday morning services. Our attendance ran from 35 to 70. We visited each afternoon with the pastor of the mission on both sides of the river. On Friday morning we visited a place called Gurupa where we had services in a house with some twenty present besides the ones that came with us from the mission. We walked some thirty minutes in the rain to arrive there and returned in the rain also. The harvest was not large but on the last day of the meeting, January 30th, I baptized two who had been previously converted and then Sunday night, a young man made a profession of faith. (A week later there were two more professions).

Since returning to Manaus we have been busy in the work of the church. Also I am teaching 4 hours in the Seminary. Yesterday we had a most blessed day in the work of the Lord. At the Sunday morning service at the 14th of December Church there were three professions of faith and five approved for baptism. Yesterday afternoon I baptized nine into the fellowship of the 14th of December Baptist Church. Also during the same service Brother Newton baptized seven from Moria Church and Brother Dantes two from Peniel. Thus 18 were baptized yesterday in the baptistry of the Tabernacle Church. Last night there were 3 professions of faith, two received under watchcare and 1 approved for baptism. Thus we conclude our letter calling upon you to rejoice with us. Let us all strive to faithfully negotiate for the Lord until He returns.

We are full of gratitude to God for the support of our friends and brethren in the great task He has committed to us.

After writing the last MS letter, I had another x-ray taken and it showed that the stomach ulcer had healed up. I have gained three pounds this month. I give the Lord praise for these blessings.

Again we can say that the jeep is a real blessing and a God-sent. We want to thank Bro. Clark and The Grace Baptist Church for making this blessing a reality.

SAO LUIS

I want to share with you some of the experiences we have had in our preaching points this month. At Sao Luis, we have changed the days of service. We have S.S. on Sunday mornings and then we have services Tuesdays and Wednesdays. We have had one profession of faith this month, a seven year old girl. We have a woman who comes to our service who is not a believer. I have talked with her at least a half dozen times in private about her soul's salvation. When the invitation is given she sits just and cries. This is the first person that I have seen cry over their sins, since I have been in Brasil. I baptized a 15 year old boy Sunday February 13. I reported his profession of faith in last month's MS. We now have 16 baptized members in the Sao Luis Mission.

ARRAIAL

We had a week of meetings at Arraial this month and also the usual Saturday services. We started the meetings January 31, and closed it Saturday, February 5. There were three professions of faith during the meeting. Then on Saturday, February 12 an eleven year old girl made a profession of faith. Pray for this place as there are so many lost folks that live there. They want me to come back and have another meeting. I want to soon, if the Lord wills.

VILLA OF MARANHAO

This is the place where Brother Agustinho moved his family until after the rains stop. He is a construction worker, and usually construction stops during the rainy season. We are in the rainy season now, which will last 6 months. There are two seasons here-wet and dry, six months of each.

We have been to the Villa every Sunday night this month, and I do not have too much to report except the people are starting to attend the services better. Sunday February 13 a man stood at the end of services and said he was trusting Christ as his saviour.

AHANAJATIVA

(pronounced A-na-ja-tiva)

We have opened up another preaching

point, about four miles from Arraial, but you go a different route to get there because of the water. There is a man attending services at Arraial who is a Baptist and years ago he, with a Conservative Baptist missionary, opened a preaching point. Thirty people were saved and baptized. This missionary was transferred to another city in Maranhao. He left the work with the missionaries that were left in Sao Luis, and they abandoned the work. The Pentecostals started a work there and stole some of the Baptist believers, but not all of them. They invited me there for a service, and the first day I went someone cut the jeep windows while I was inside preaching. The believers were sick over the matter and the next service they put a man to guard the jeep while I preached to them the Word of Life. After learning all the details about the other mission being there first, I talked to the American Missionary and he said he was not going back there anymore, and did not have anyone to send. He then said he wished me God speed there in that place. The first day I went there the brother that arranged the meeting was taking me and introducing me to all the saved folks. We entered one home and poverty was noted from every corner of the room. A boy led a blind woman out to the front room where we were seated. She told me she was ready to meet Jesus, and then she told the boy to bring two eggs and wrap them up in paper. I brought them home with me, and ate them after I got home that night. I could not help but wonder how one was this poor and still gave two eggs to the man of God who came to preach the word of God to her. Brethren, Jesus can make a difference in a person's life.

Thursday, February 10 a man stood and said he was believing in Jesus. There is much interest shown in this place. We go to this place (A-na-ja-tiva) every Thursday night. Brethren, remember us when you pray. May God's blessings be over each and every one of you, is our prayer. In all our work this month there have been seven professions of faith, and one baptized.

We're happy to report that it has been one filled with the blessings of the Lord. I preached last night on the subject CRISTO ES LA ROCA, Christ is the ROCK, and I used a verse in closing that I would like to give you. 2 Sam 22:2-4 the part I tried to drive home was verse 4, "The Lord WHO IS WORTHY TO BE PRAISED." How wonderful He is to us, and I'm hoping that you will PRAISE Him with us in all that He has done for us and through us. We want to thank all who have prayed and given making our being here possible. I hope that you will rejoice with us and praise Him who has made all things.

So we have three families coming faithfully, and the attendance has been very good. I'm hoping that we'll be able to start the rooms on the back, and get the tank in for the baptistry. The week in San Francisco was a real blessing not only for us, but I'm sure to the people. Brother Mulling was the only other American that they ever heard preach and they enjoyed him, I'm sure. There were seven professions of faith, and many coming for baptism. Several came confessing their sins and wanting to be faithful to the Lord. We love the people there, and they love us. We now have four families to get legally married so we can baptize them. Two have already started working on their papers. The problem here is that it costs about 16 to 20 dollars to get them married. Also during our week there we had Bible School for the children, and they sure had a good time. On Saturday we had a FIESTA. This was a great day. The ladies all made what is called Juanies, and umites. Juanies are made of rice, chicken, olives, eggs, and duck. This is all mixed up and wrapped in a large leaf from the jungle and cooked for about 4 hours. Brother, that's good eating! Umites are fresh green corn mashed with several seasonings and wrapped in one of the husks and cooked several hours. They also made a corn drink that is called chicha, NOT FERMENTED. This we had to drink. This was our first time for something like this, but I'm sure it will not be our last. We have another day planned for June.

I had another experience this month that I have just about forgotten. Brother Mulling and I came on to one day to buy supplies, only to find that one of the families that have been the most faithful had lost a loved one. Thank the Lord she was a saved woman, and had a good testimony. The man asked if we'd read the Word and speak before they nailed the lid on the coffin (which was just a wooden box). After this we went to the cemetery with the family. There we found the grave too small. Brother Mulling and I had to help them put the box in the hole. When they started throwing the dirt in the hole the man said, "stop", and asked me to lead them in prayer. There was so much crying around the grave that I had to ask them to stop before I could pray. I'm sure we'll never forget this. The man and his family are still faithful here and we ask you to pray for them that they'll continue to be so.

I'd like to thank the Mullings for coming and helping us. They were a great blessing to us, and the people here and at San Francisco. We cannot tell the full extent of the meeting, but eternity will tell. Praise the Lord. May the Lord bless each of you.
