### A \$6,000 Start On The Hatcher House

Last month we told of the urgent need to buy the house in Manaus, Brazil that the John Hatchers have lived in the past ten years. As pastor we told our church each Sunday morning for several Sundays of this urgent need, then on Sunday morning August 31, 1969 we told the church how the Lord had blessed us with one of the best building sites and building and parsonage to be found anywhere, and two years ago we owed about \$73,000.00 on this property, and that in two years we have paid \$20,000.00 on the amount owed and that we now had it paid down to \$53,000.00 and we have only 80 some members. So we asked the church to give \$1,000.00 and they did so, hoping that this would be an incentive to others to give, also. The next day, September 1st at the Labor Day Conference in the First Baptist Church, Independence, Ky; Pastor Kirtly Jolly raised about \$4,000.00 and then on Wednesday night Sept. 3, Pastor Eugene Clark led Grace Baptist Church to give \$1,000.00. This makes a total of about \$6,000.00 towards the buying of the house in Manaus, Brazil for the John Hatchers to continue to live in and for other missionaries to live in after the Hatchers have gone on to Heaven, the Lord willing. We need \$10,000.00 more. Give as the Lord shall lead and mark your special offering for "Hatcher House".

### No End To Needs For Special Offerings

There is no end to special offerings for missionary needs and they will continue on and on till Jesus comes, the Lord willing. We have the ground and buildings for the Seminary and Schools in Manaus, and several houses for missionaries to live in, boats, motors a launch, houseboats, jeeps, cars, station wagons, and the ground and buildings in Pucallpa, Peru etc. all because of special offerings, and all is the property of Baptist Faith Missions that the work may go on and on, the Lord willing after the present missionaries and we ourselves have gone on to Heaven. As we write this, the Pucallpa Building Fund needs \$3,503.92 to be even, and Brother Mayfield will soon be enlarging the church building, which cannot now seat the people who come, and it is estimated that it will cost about \$4,000.00, to do this. We are praising the Lord as we look back upon the few days that have passed into eternity since the writing of the last Mission Sheet Letter. The July Mission Sheet Letter closed with the first night's report of the revival. The meeting continued through Sunday night, July 27th. Six of us, pastors and licensed preachers of the church preached during the week. The attendance was large each night during the revival. 140 was the smallest and 312 was the largest attendance. Two nights some had to stand-the building wasn't large enough to seat everyone. There were 19 professions of faith, 4 requested baptism and two were received under watchcare awaiting letters.

Last Sunday night, August 10th I baptized 15 into the fellowship of the 14th of December Baptist Church and three were received on promise of letter from a sister Baptist Church. Our Sunday School attendance on the 27th of July reached 186 and last Sunday, August 10th, 182. Thus you can understand why we are calling upon you to "give thanks unto the Lord."

On Friday morning, August 8th, we had to bid the Creiglows good-by and God-

speed as they left Manaus by plane for Cruzeiro do Sul. We were blessed by their visit and presence in our home the three weeks they were with us.

The Lord willing, the 21st I'll be making a trip into the interior-Varre Vento-for a Vacation Bible School. I don't know yet whether I'll be able to take the wife and boys with me or not.

We ask for your prayers and pray the Lord's blessings to be upon each one of you.

### Back In Cruzeiro Do Sul . . . Found Church Flourishing There . . . Need House To Live In . . . Waiting For Freight Boat

Dear Brethren,  
After three busy weeks in Manaus repacking almost everything we brought from the States, we left there for Cruzeiro do Sul on August 8. We had to repack because we had brought almost everything in cardboard cartons and when we got to Manaus we were informed by the airlines that they could not take our excess baggage because they were all booked up for freight for several months ahead.

After getting ready to ship by boat that was to leave on the first of August, as is almost always the case, the date was set up for departure to August 5. It had begun to look like I was going to have to leave it for Bro. Bratcher to put on board. But, then just two days before we left they told me I could load it, which I did.

While in Manaus, the Brethren gave me the privilege of getting back into the swing of things by preaching in Portuguese several times for them. Bro. Bratcher's church has a service at the church in the leper colony once a month and I was asked to preach at this service while there. This is always a great blessing to me to visit with these people and preach to them. Their only hope is in Christ and it only takes one visit there to see why. Their pastor, whom I had met several years ago has since lost part of both feet and part of his fingers, but still has the same big smile with that radiant living hope in Christ. We who like to complain so much would do well to visit there often.

Because Manaus is a free port when we left to come to Cruzeiro do Sul we once again had to go through customs. While standing talking to the brethren before time for our plane to leave I told them I was glad that I was through customs for the last time for four years, but to my surprise when I got to Cruzeiro do Sul we had it to do all over again and will still have to do it again when the boat arrives with the rest of our things.

Several members of the church were at the airport to meet us and we were well received. Since we arrived, there have been

Mrs. R. P. Hallum died August 26, 1969, at the age of almost 84. Brother Hallum died July 27, 1964, at the age of almost 81. Brother and sister Hallum, with their daughter Marguerite, went to Peru as missionaries in 1935. They went by boat from Norfolk, Va. and it took them five weeks to reach Iquitos, Peru. Now it takes about six hours from Miami Fla. by plane. Brother Hallum literally sowed the word of God to every house in Iquitos at least five times and organized the First Baptist Church, in Iquitos and bought the lot and built the building out of his own salary and to keep the property from being taken from him, deeded it to Baptist Faith Missions and came home in 1955 after twenty years on the mission field. His work still stands as a monument to his labors and to the grace of God. May God's richest blessings and great grace be upon his daughter Marguerite and his son Eugene, both of Hammond, La.

This has been one of those slow months—nothing exciting—just lots and lots of the old grind. The Lord has been good to us and we praise Him for His constant care.

### Schools

All of the schools are progressing and we are enjoying one of the best years ever. Our enrollment in the Grade School is down but our enrollment in the High School is up over last year. The student body this year seems to be one of the best we have had. School work is slow and shows little progress since it takes several years for a child to develop and come to the place where he takes his place in life. Sometimes it seems that we neglect greatly the formative years in the lives of our children.

### Printing

Pray for the printed ministry. Our equipment is here and we have not had time to even open the boxes and set up the print shop. Here in Manaus day by day there arrives new doctrines and false teachers who affect and afflict our people. There has been at least one Baptist Church carried away with the doctrine of the "tongues"

Certainly there is a great need for printing simple messages about the doctrines and explanations of the Scriptures so that the people can be taught the truth.

### Robbery

One night this week two thieves broke into the school office and stole a portable typewriter, a transistor clock, small radio, and school balls and several smaller items. God does not slumber nor sleep. One of the thieves went one way with the large clock and the other went the other way with the typewriter. This one had not gone one block when he was encountered by a guard who was returning home from work. The guard arrested him and took out of his belt a knife about 15 inches long and sharpened on both sides. The man on duty at the police

station is a believer and attends the Tabernacle Church. When he knew that the things were from the school he sent a man to call us and sent a policeman after the other thief and all the objects were recovered within three hours of the robbery and nothing was lost. The typewriter stolen was the same one which was stolen from our home several years ago. Pray for us as we try to serve Him in the most efficient way possible, for after having done all we will still be unprofitable servants.

## First Church Building Painted And Inside Rearranged . . . Building New Third Church Building . . . Report On Fourth Mission

Iquitos, Peru  
August 17, 1969  
The Lord is good, not one of us will doubt that, but I wonder how we really enjoy his presence. Prayer is the biggest thing we have to help that and I wonder how many times we fail to use this great and best privilege we have.

The First Church is all painted and changed around as I told in my last letter—about 6 weeks of hard work. We are now building a new church building for the Third Church. We have the old house torn down and the roof up on the new one. Tomorrow we start on the walls. Maybe by next MS time we will have it about done, we hope. It seems like building is all I have done for the past two years, but it was all necessary. At least it helps keep the weight down. More on this next month. We have had 4 days of preaching this past month in the First Church after all the painting was done. I preached one night Bro. Daniel, pastor of Third Church preached one night, Jorge Macahuachi, pastor of the Second, and Bro. Bradley preached one night. All of you remember him, I am sure. We had very good crowds but no visible results. It was a great time in the Lord and our church seems to have a better spirit now. This week a young preacher from the Third Church has made known his desire to take on the new Fourth Mission of ours. We had been mentioning this all along and praying both at church and at home that one of our young men from one of the churches would feel the Lord calling him to this work. Pray that all is well in this and that God is in it and will use this young man there. He is to be married soon. He will be sacrificing much and one day he will have to give up

his real good paying job. Also, the village where the Fourth Mission is, is still giving us some trouble. I just do not know how much or where it is coming from. They tried to throw us out first, then made us pay fines for not helping to clean up in the village (they have these on Sunday mornings, of course). Now I hear they want us to defend ourselves before the Nuns. This is all after those other three Protestant groups tried to meddle in after we started out there. At least we have one thing to look at: they have made known that no other evangelic group can obtain ground for a church there. Pray for us in this. I went to see the man in charge out there and he seemed to think all was not as bad as our members think, etc.

I did not get to talk to the brethren from the river churches and missions too much this month as they came here and I was working on the Third Church, etc. I do know that Bro. Marcial is planning on going up the Marañon again to the place he has gone several times and has 5 baptisms. The place is called Maipuco. They wrote him and asked him to come up and sent money for the trip. He may organize them soon, even this trip, the Lord willing. Hojeal had 6 saved this month and one in Astoria. San Antonio is still weak, but Bro. Enrique has started a new work at a place called San Jose near San Pedro on the Amazon where we once had a church. Purification still had about 20 in attendance and keeps on working to get his house done in Otellano in the Napo River. Also, there was 4 saved in Tamshiyacu and two in the Second Church here. All the family is well and sends greetings. School is in full session in our home and Delores is always busy. Thank you all for your prayers and support and may the Lord richly bless you all for His glory.
