DIRECTIONS TO GRACE BAPTIST CHURCH, 1907 Centralia Ave., Fairborn, Ohio:
(Fairborn is just east of Dayton, Ohio)

FROM I-75 (North or South) Take Exit 4-69. From 4-69 take exit 444. From 444 turn right on Dayton-Yellow Springs Road. From this road turn right on Ironwood and from Ironwood turn left on Funderburg 1/2 block to church.

FROM I-70 (Going West) Take exit 444 towards Fairborn. Follow 444 through Fairborn across railroad tracks and turn left at 4th traffic light. This is Dayton-Yellow Springs Road. From this road turn right on Ironwood and from Ironwood turn left on Funderburg 1/2 block to church.

FROM I-70 (Going East) Take exit 4-235 towards Dayton follow 235 and turn right on 444 through Fairborn and across railroad tracks and turn left at 4th traffic light. This is Dayton-Yellow Springs Road. From this road turn right on Ironwood and from Ironwood turn right on Funderburg 1/2 block to church.

FROM RT. 35 take 68 in Xenia, Ohio towards Yellow Springs. From 68 make slight left on Rt. 235 towards Fairborn. From Rt. 235 turn left at first traffic light (Dayton-Yellow Springs Road. Park on School ground off this road (3.5 miles)

Missionary Conference Manaus, Brazil, January 1971

Leave Miami, Florida, Friday January 15, 1971 for Manaus. Return: Leave Manaus, Brazil Sunday, January 24, 1971. Round trip plane fare from Miami to Manaus and back to Miami \$306.00 John Hatcher plans to bed and feed the guests who come. Those preferring Hotel, \$14.00 per day and up for two persons including breakfast.

Those going also to Peru: Leave Manaus Wednesday, January 27 to Iquitos, Peru and visit Pucallpa and to Lima, Peru to Miami, Florida. This will take about one week after leaving Manaus. Plane fare \$477.00.

You must have a passport and will need birth certificate to make application. You must have Vaccination for Small Pox within three years, to get into Brazil and back into the U.S. Also, for your safety you must have shots for: Typhus, Typhoid Fever, Tetanus and Yellow Fever, all these on a Yellow International Health Card with Passport. NOTE: Get passports and Vaccinations and Shots NOW and get them out of the way. See John Hatcher's letter this page and write to Hafford Overbey, 28855 Wexford, Warren, Mich. 48092 as soon as possible. We must know who, and how many are going. Dear Brethren,
Today we are in our newly rented house, but still in the process of setting up house-keeping. The name of the street on which we live is "Passage To Paradise". It is great to know that is exactly what these days are.

Our many thanks to all who labored to make these past days both smooth and joyful.

July 1st to 7th we spent at my parents. July 4th, Twelve-Ryan Baptist Church had a going away picnic for us, and gifts were given to each one in the family. July 7th we began our air conditioned (thanks to Bro. Harry Jefford member of New Hope Baptist in Dearborn Hts.) trip by car to Miami, Fla. We arrived in Miami July 10th. July 13th we sold our car. July 15th at 2:55 a.m. we flew out of Miami-landed in Lima, Peru at 10:30 a.m.

It was sure good to see Bro. Del Mayfield's smiling face when we stepped off the plane.

Our first night in Lima we attended Prayer Meeting at Bible Baptist Church where we enjoyed fellowship with Pastor Fortunato Barreto and the brethren. They have been very helpful. Sun. July 19th we saw our first Catholic procession. They made a huge image of the (so-called) virgin Carmen. Then many men carried it down the street on their shoulders. They know nothing about exalting the Savior-only their idols. Mon. July 20th we passed a Catholic Church--the doors were surrounded by street merchants--candles in one hand and lottery tickets in the other. May God give us grace that we might soon be used to bring light where theirs is such darkness.

It is with humility and gratitude that I close this first letter. We thank each of you whom God used to make possible our coming to labor here in Peru. May God make us worthy of your confidence in HIM in our behalf.

Dear Brethren,

This is being a great month for us for our three children are with us and only the Lord knows how we covet every moment of time to be with them. It is good just to look at them. Each of them has been busy since their arrival. Paul has preached almost every Sunday as well as some other nights also. Each of the three have been teaching Sunday School classes and I am only sorry that I do not have them all the time for this. They go visiting at least one day each week with some of the young people of the church.

June Was A Great Month

During the month of June we had the highest attendance in the history of the Tabernacle church. Our average attendance for the month was 218 and on the last Sunday one of the brethren counted 270 in the church service. We had over 175 first time visitors during the month. Naturally we do not expect all of them to return but we do expect to keep many of them in our Sunday School and we expect many of them to be saved.

Other Mission Points

Our church has at present four mission points in or around Manaus and three of these have their own buildings (built by the Tabernacle church) and at our last business meeting the church voted to build another building in a new part of town. Actually this new section is on the outskirts of town and all the houses are built of log poles and palm leaf roofs. One of the members of our church who received a lot in this section was interested enough to get a lot for our church and he and his wife worked hard to get it all cleaned off and ready. We are going to set the poles and put on the roof and then as able, we will continue the building.

Print Shop

During this month we have worked hard to get our print shop in good condition and it is well on the way. We are already printing and have printed many Sunday School lessons, tracts, etc. At present we are printing a small songbook to be used in the work in the interiors and in the schools and other mission work. The book "Alien Baptism and the Baptists" is out of print so we are going to print or rather, reprint it. We are hoping by the end of this month to get our monthly paper well established and get it going into the churches and works of the interior.

Hendersons' Arrival

Brother and Sister Henderson arrived on

the second of July and we had to go to the airport two times to meet them, since as you might expect, they arrived late. It was good to see them. At present they are in our home and we are enjoying their fellowship. The first days back are always busy ones and trying ones also but they will make it fine.

Bible Conference - January 1971

Already we have word from Sao Luis where Brother Bean works and word from Cruzeiro do Sul where Brother Creiglow works and they are planning on coming and now we are waiting to hear from Peru and the United States. Write and let us know that you are coming to be with us. Please write to Brother H. H. Overbey and let him know if you are planning to come so we can make plans for our guests. It is important to hear from you early since it is not possible to get things done as easily and as quickly as you can in the States. We want you to come and our desire is to make it the trip of your life.

In closing, I wish to express our appreciation to all of you who have part in this ministry and who support us before the Throne of Grace.

A Good Month In The Work . . . Four Professions And Four Baptized . . . To Lima To Meet The Art Gibbs Family

Dear Brethren,

This is very early in the month to be writing my mission letter, but I have a very special reason. I'm leaving for Lima tomorrow, so as to be there Wed. morning to meet the Gibbs family when they arrive. This will be a treat for me, and I'm very sorry that my wife Ada will not get to go with me. We were hoping that they would come through Iquitos and be able to visit with us a few days before going on to Lima to take up their studies. I'm also happy that I'll get to see the Lauerman family as they'll be going through Lima, and will arrive Thursday. We were hoping to get to see them before, but have been so busy that we couldn't leave the work to go and see them. So Ada is planning on going to the airport here and see them on their way through here. They stop here only for a few minutes and then on to Lima. We're praying that they'll have a good time at home, as we did last year. We're also anxiously awaiting the arrival of the Crain family who are hoping to come through Iquitos, and we're hoping so, as we'd like to have them with us a few days. We praise the Lord for the new families that are coming and pray that God may call out others to the field that is white unto harvest.

This has been a good month here, at San Francisco, and at Arenal. Our attendance has been real good, the tithes and offerings have been at an all time high, for which we are thankful. God is blessing our people here. We've had four saved this month here, and have baptized four. One of these four being one of our school teachers (Osambela). She professed to be saved, but the Lord showed her through the preaching of His word that she was lost. It was a joy to baptize her, and to know her testimony for the Lord. Her husband left her because of her stand for Christ with us. She has four children and has suffered because she took her stand with us here as Baptists. Pray for her, that her husband may return and see his need of the Saviour also. The day school is coming along real good. We had

one week vacation between the first trimester and second. So that was a real treat for every one especially for the students. I had another experience that was a blessing to me. One man came to the office asking to talk with me, and told me he had been a Catholic all his life and they had done nothing for him, and that he wanted to know the real Christ, and asked me to show him how to be saved. It was a joy to lead him to Christ and to show him from the word of God, that Jesus not only saves but keeps us, and that is for eternity. I'm hoping that he will come and follow the Lord in baptism and be a real soldier for Christ. Continue to pray for the work here. We do have our problems here, and even though I try not to write about them, we have them here, just like you do back there. So pray that God will continue to bless, and save the lost and add the saved to His church. We changed our services at Arenal from Thursday night to Friday night, and it has proven to be better. We had two saved last week, after I had preached on "El pueblo de Dios"—God's people. Some will say that God cannot save after a message on Election, but He did last week and we praise Him for His grace. We are hoping that God will call out someone to help in the work there. Our great need here is workers, so pray that some will respond to the call, and will go.

At San Francisco the work is coming along real good. Brother Sauerino is doing a good work and we thank the Lord for him. It is a hard life on the river, and it's only by God's grace that a man will stay there and preach.

I'm going to take this letter to Lima and mail it tomorrow, as we have not been getting all our mail. If you have written and we've not answered, it's because we haven't gotten your letter. So keep writing, as we answer every letter that we receive. We may be late in answering, but we'll get around to it. We appreciate those who give and pray for the work here, and make our being here possible.

The First church called Bro. Kissel as pastor as I resigned to come to U.S. I will keep my membership there though as I will be going back and our ministry

there needs it. Bro. Kissel preached 3 times while he was there (he came June 22) and he did real good. I enjoyed the messages also and there were some that came repenting one service when he preached. The last month for us there was wonderful. We really hated to leave and they all acted like they did not want us to. A great people in all the churches. We had a last fellowship meeting for us the 13 of July and the house was full—extra benches all over the house. I preached on "Thanking God, BUT lets go on". We showed on a blackboard the growth in the years, and then tried to show that we have just begun. We had a happy time. Every church was represented even the new one way up on the Marañon River 5 days in a boat. Our hearts pounded with joy and encouragement. I want to really get the gospel into other parts of Peru and I just believe we will by the grace and power of God. Keep on praying for those 9 churches there as they work together this year for His glory. I am sure I will forget many things that happened this past month so if I think of them in the months to come I will mention them.

We are enjoying our reunion with our two oldest daughters and grandson. We looked forward to this many times. It is just great. It makes one think of the grand reunion in heaven one day when we all get there and see Him who loved us and died in our stead and WASHED us eternally. Praise HIS name forever, Amen.
