

I, also, made a trip to Guajara and once again the priest and his merry makers came to do what they could to disturb our services. We had more in our services than he had in his group and as we returned to our boat to return to Cruzeiro do Sul our congregation followed us and one girl told me they were going to the port with us and that if we had to run they would run with us. I told her I was too fat to run. Another lady pointed to the priest and said with this man teaching our children, what will they turn out to be?

July 13-18 I spent in the interior. Monday afternoon, four of us (Wilson, Joao Ricardo dos Santos, Asa Mark Bratcher and I) left Manaus aboard the Mission launch. We journeyed some two hours to Curari. That night I preached to some 24 at the home of Senhor Ofir Farias Correio. Tuesday night I

preached in the home of Senhor Osvaldo Nunes da Silva to 47 people. We rejoiced when Bro. Osvaldo's 21 year old daughter made a profession of faith. Wednesday moming we began our journey at 6:00 a.m. Forty five minutes later the pilot made a wrong turn and ran the launch aground in shallow water. It was almost 11 a.m. before we were able to get out. We arrived at 8:00 p.m. When I arrived at the meeting house of our mission there, the service was almost over but the young man leading abbreviated his message and turned the service over to me. I brought a short message to the 14 of us present. The next day we visited several throughout the day and that night the Lord blessed us with an attendance of 46. We received one new member by letter. Thursday night we rejoiced to have a distinguished visitor present who arrived by bus that afternoon-Dempsey Henderson. Friday was spent as Thursday was. Friday night Bro. Henderson brought us a challenging message. We increased the attendance again. 54 were counted. Several on the outside were not counted. Saturday morning at 4:00 a.m. we began our journey to Manaus. Bro. Joao stayed to lead the services Saturday night and Sunday. Pray with me that the Lord will give us a couple to live there and pastor the mission there. Manacapuru is a town of almost 8,000 and growing rapidly. Besides a pastor the mission needs a meeting house of their own.

At the evening service, Paul Hatcher preached. In the afternoon a group of the young people made visits. This has been a good month here, at San Francisco, and at Arenal. Our attendance has been real good, the tithes and offerings have been at an all time high, for which we are thankful.
