From Route 4 take Route 444 exit.

From Route 444 turn right on Dayton-Yellow Springs Road.

From Dayton-Yellow Springs Road turn right on Beaver Valley Road.

From Beaver Valley Road turn left at the Church sign and mail box.

Proceed up the hill on the gravel drive to the church building.

From I-70 (Going West) Take Route 444 exit toward Fairborn.

Follow Route 444 through Fairborn and across the railroad tracks.

After crossing the tracks turn left at the 4th traffic light. (This is Dayton-Yellow Springs Road but is not marked.)

From Dayton-Yellow Springs Road turn right on Beaver Valley Road.

From route 235 make a left turn at the first traffic light. (This is Dayton-Yellow Springs Road but is not marked.)



Trip To Peru

Left Detroit Monday night July 12 and nine hours later (with one stop in Miami) was in Lima, Peru. Missionary Homer Crain met me at the airport. Overnight in the Crain home and with him Wed. 14 we flew over the snow-capped Andes Mountains to Iquitos, Peru. On the way we saw the city of Huanuco in the valley between two mountains. This is where the Art Gibbs live. The five day conference in the First Baptist Church, Iquitos, Peru, (James Kissel pastor) began Wed. night July 14th. Crain, Mayfield, Overbey, Gibbs, Mulling and Overbey preached in that order. Paul Mulling translated for me from English into Spanish during the Conference. Visited the Second Baptist Church, Third Baptist Church and Fourth Baptist Mission in Iquitos and made a boat trip up the Amazon River to the Tamshiyacu Baptist Church. Did not get to visit the other churches on the rivers. All five of us stayed in the James Kissel home in Iquitos. We had a great time in the Lord. Monday, July 19, Crain and I flew back to Lima. We could not get passage to fly to Tingo Maria where the Crains are to move. Tuesday I flew to Pucallpa and spoke to all the classes in Del Mayfield's School as he translated for me. These children hear the gospel preached five days a week. With the Mullings we visited an Indian Village below Pucallpa, and spent two nights in the Mulling home. We went to the new boat building factory that is to build the Mulling Aluminum houseboat. Mayfield says this will be the best houseboat in all Peru. With the Mayfields

we went in a boat down the Ucayli River to the church at San Francisco. Some of the people came across the river in a canoe and soon we had a good crowd. This is a good "country" church. Del Mayfield organized it a few years ago with 59 members and baptized 56 of them (all but his family of three). The preaching was with tears as Del Mayfield translated for me. Back to Pucallpa. They had a special young people's fellowship meeting outside on the school ground at night with lights overhead and many adults came. There were 375 present, by actual count. This was really something to see. I wept as I listened to them sing choruses led by Del Mayfield. The climax of the visit to Pucallpa was Sunday morning, July 25th. There were 310 present in Sunday School in Faith Baptist Church, Pucallpa, Peru. I was filled with emotion as I listened to 31 boys and girls sing in the choir and then I walked to the pulpit to preach in the new enlarged church auditorium. Mulling translated for me. When the vestibule is finished and a door moved, the auditorium will seat 330 adults by actual measurement, not counting the choir. The adult choir sang at night and I preached again. It was good to be in the Mayfield home and see their work. Monday, July 26, flew to Lima and in the Crain home overnight and Tuesday flew to Huanuco. The big four motor plane worked its way down between the mountain ranges and landed in the narrow valley at Huanuco where we were met by the Art Gibbs family. At the first Wed. night service in the rented mission building, there were 35 present. I preached and Art Gibbs translated for me. Bro. Gibbs has a good mission going here.

The Lord blessed us with a glorious service Sunday July 18, 1971 at Olho Dagua. We organized the mission into a church with 36 members, and at the same time dedicated our new church building. Brethren Bean and Melo preached. More on this next month with pictures. We have had 13 professions of faith, 2 baptized and 7 awaiting baptism. I am sure you have heard the saying "I complained because I had no shoes, until I saw a man who had no feet". Well, one little boy who was saved a month ago in our mission has neither hands nor feet, but he runs and plays, and Dempsey Henderson writes, and does most everything else that a normal boy could do, and when I can't go get him, he walks about a mile to church. He is not baptized yet. Pray that he soon

will be. "The heavens declare the glory of God, and the firmament sheweth His handy-work". This glorious truth was brought home to me as I stood before a small group of people, beside a mud hut, on a hillside overlooking the beautiful shores of the Atlantic Ocean. Under the canopy of a beautiful, blue, Brazilian sky, we lifted our voices in songs of praise and thanksgiving to the God of all glory and power, accompanied by the soft music of the rolling surf and the wind rustling through the fronds of the stately palms. We were fulfilling the wishes of a young man already with Jesus who before he was ruthlessly run down and killed by a drunken driver, had requested us to have a service of thanksgiving in his home, because of the Lord's answer to special prayer. So we sang and prayed and preached and praised the Lord of all creation, who doeth all things for our good and His glory.

We send our heartfelt sympathies to the Crain and Maple families in the loss of their parents. Our loss is heaven's gain. May the Lord comfort them with this treasure of truth. God is so good to us, praise His holy name.

Dear Brethren,
I have just finished reading the best newspaper in Brasil, the MS came today. We are all well and enjoying the blessings of the Lord.

The church has started the Street meetings each Sunday morning as the rains have stopped. We also have SS in a new housing project on Sunday afternoon. We have four services every Sun. and I am in every one. We sometimes meet our self. I am happy doing this, for this is what God has called me to do and I would not be happy doing anything else. We are finishing the new building. It will be real nice, in fact the nicest one in SL, I think. I had a letter from Bro. Overbey today and the building fund owes the mission regular fund \$6000.00. This money

has to be paid back. I believe some church or person has this money in the bank not doing anyone any good. If you would like to invest in eternal things, invest it in the Lord's work. We need your help at this time. I made a trip to Sao Mateus and was in a five day Bible Conference with the mission there from the Peritoro Church. Bro. Sostenes came from Fortaleza and we had three professions of faith, with seven baptized, and one man acknowledged his call to preach. They have bought property and will build a building, and are thinking about organizing in December the Lord willing. There is a depression here and it is so hard to find a job in these interior towns and the preachers really have a hard time as well as the believers or all the people as far as this is concerned. Pray with us that we can secure the means to send men into these towns with the Gospel. I believe God's people have the means stored up in the banks not being used. Our enemy is working.

Believe me, this has been a great month for us. To have Lynn and John Mark with us for a few weeks is a real treat. Lynn arrived on the same plane with Mike and Beverly Creiglow. After about two hours and a few hundred dollars, the Creiglows were through customs and soon at our house, bag and baggage. They spent about ten days with us. They needed all of them to buy little things and big things, to take care of broken bones, etc. It was good to see them and to have them in our home.

At the present time we are in a two weeks meeting at the Tabernacle Baptist Church. God has blessed us with good services. Sunday morning there were three professions of faith and Sunday night the house was full and there were eight persons who received baptism. The last five nights of the meeting, John Mark will be preaching. This is our mid-semester vacation month. It gives us a

chance to get caught up a little. Our biggest problem and work to keep up is the printing. There is nothing to do at times except let it go until we can make time to take care of it.

The grade school had a program for the closing of the first semester. It was based on the creation story of Genesis. About 130 children were in the program. All of the story was told in song (words written by Maria, asst. principal) and the children depicted the creations of the different days. The last part was where God took the innocent animal and killed it to make a covering for the guilty. I wish you could have seen it.

This is a critical year for our schools financially, so please pray for us that God will supply our needs. We need more designated offerings "For teachers in Brazil". Day by day, the legal demands and red tape becomes more and more difficult. Subversive activities among the nations have made many suspicious of foreign elements and many new laws make our work more exacting, as we give to Cesaer that which is Cesaer's. Pray for us.

318 In S. S. . . . Church Broken Into . . . To Start Another Mission And Classes For Preachers . . . To Conference In Iquitos

Dear Brethren,

The 13th of June we hit an all time high with 318 in Sunday School. It was the first time to go over 300. The 15th we had a young peoples meeting out in the playground of the school with several hundred more, but not all young people. Our church was broken into. They took two wall fans, a big clock in the school, and several other things. They robbed our Mission building at Arenal 3 times, to get our kerosene lamps that cost almost \$25.00 a piece. The Catholic church here teaches that it's alright to steal from some one that has more than you do and that you do not have to confess it to the priest. Our windows have steel bars and I'm thinking of putting in double doors of steel. The Lord is blessing in Arenal, and also in San Francisco.
