

Bratcher Building Fund A Big Approved Project

Harold Bratcher has been our missionary in Manaus, Brazil for 14 years. He has a small church building that will not hold the people that come. He has a building site, lot 30 meters wide and 100 meters long (98 feet wide and 328 feet long). This is paid for. Brother Bratcher plans to start to build a large church and Sunday School building on this lot beginning in January 1974 (next month). Twelve-Ryan Baptist Church, Warren, Mich. has given \$5,000.00 to start this project. Brother George Bean, a plumber by trade plans to come to Manaus and do the plumbing for sewers and water. This building will be constructed by faith. It is the largest project at this time. Please take on this project and give until it is built. James Kissel In American Hospital, Lima, Peru With Infected Prostate And Hepatitis . . . Very Ill But Expected To Recover

Dear Brethren,
My husband is a very sick man, but the doctor says with complete rest and a very strict diet he will recover. He has infection of the prostate, but mainly it is hepatitis. I thank the Lord I was able to talk him into coming over here to the hospital in Lima, as in Iquitos the doctors just don't have time as there are so many for them to try to treat. The shots, etc. the doctor gave him in Iquitos helped him until he got here. Here they can treat him and the nurses are good too and they are clean. I asked the doctor where one gets this disease and he said from anything—there is lots of it here. But when we told him about going on the rivers he said that he could have had it for some time. I will surely be happy when our boat gets here and in use, so we can eat our own food and drink clean water, although the doctor said boiling water does not prevent hepatitis. He also insisted on me getting a gamma-globlin shot so I won't get it too. I

thank the Lord he does not have what I feared—he had such a terrible look and he hurt so bad, especially in his head and stomach, that I feared he had a tumor. The doctor says with complete rest for a month and curtailed activities afterward and proper diet, he should recover rapidly. Monday they will do other tests to evaluate his progress.

I flew home to Iquitos to take care of a lot of things and arrange for someone to take care of the services. Thank God for some faithful ones like Simon's grandson. He is the church secretary, organist, adult S.S. teacher and does everything we ask him to do, so he will have someone ready to fill in and we won't have to worry about it.

We were happy the Hubbs came but Jim felt bad almost all the time they were here, but we enjoyed them so much. They are wonderful Christian friends and we thank God for them.

Well, the Conference is history and we trust it was wonderful. Lauerman wrote what a wonderful time when you visited them—seemed to encourage them in the work.

Dear Brethren,
Our petition for land in Paucarbambilla has been approved by the Peruvian government. We will be needing about \$3000.00 to buy the lot.

We closed our last month helping Bro. Kissel with a meeting in Iquitos. There were five professions of faith, in addition to a great time of fellowship.

Here in Huanuco the Lord blessed us with seven professions of faith. Two were saved last week while Brother Mayfield was here preaching 3 days in Ambo and 4 days in Huanuco. One of those saved is from Ambo. It was great to have Bro. Mayfield here to preach for us this past week.

I still preach in Ambo each Thurs. night in addition to the special services. Twice this past month a band of "Jesse James" type robbers tried to stop passing motorists by blocking the highway with rocks placed across the highway. So far, we have managed to elude them by going over the rocks in our Land Rover.

The church in Huanuco continues to be in real need of a new building. The rented building we are now using passes water through the roof in terrible amounts and the walls are badly swelled from the moisture and are in danger of collapsing. It is an old "adobe" (mud-brick) building in a most deteriorated state. I have been looking to

rent another building but rents are high (about \$150.00 per month for anything suitable). I know that land is high here in Huanuco and that it will cost approximately \$20,000.00 to buy land and put up a building, but surely the Lord has a servant or a church that can meet this need. This needs to be done with out delay. Surely this is a little thing for the Lord and his people.

May the Lord bless you all. Let us pray, one for another.

At the country school mission one of the school teachers was saved and she, the principal's wife and 20 year old son were baptized. Besides these moves, several other church members have responded for various reasons and the faithful ones seem to be growing in the Lord.

Mr. Choi (my interpreter) has been teaching the "trail of blood" for about three months on Wednesday nights which has really helped to make a solid Baptist out of him as well as some other faithful members.

We've been using our nice new church pews since October 21 and how we thank God for them and you who've made it possible for us to have them. Last Sunday in children's Sunday School all the new pews were filled with around 170 children present besides about twelve teachers and helpers with the Sunday School.

Our weather has begun to get cold which has brought on extra expenses as well as sickness. Timothy has scarlet fever this week but is now feeling much better and all the rest have had colds, especially the 22 month older (Charity), but such are only small things for our Big God to take care of.

By the time you read this, the Thanksgiving Conference will be history but I pray it shall be the greatest and that God will speak to hearts. Brethren, there are approximately 30,000,000 here in South Korea, many having heard a Social Gospel but few having ever heard the True Gospel; "Come over to Macedonia and help us out".

Pray for us as we too have a Thanksgiving and dedication service of the church building and benches on November 22.

I would like to start building as soon as I get plans approved and city building permit. We will start the footings, sewer lines, water lines and then build on faith, as we did the first building.



We rejoice in the Lord as once again the time to write and thus communicate with you who stand by us with your prayers and offerings, has arrived.

This month has been spent in Manaus except for a short visit to Manacapuru where we attended one night of a week's revival that was in progress there.

Bro. Clyde Hankins, of Calhoun, Ky., whom I wrote about visiting us in last month's letter, left us on the 23rd of October. He'll spend some weeks in Mato Grosso before returning to the U.S.A.

Our Sunday school attendance on the last Sunday in October dropped from 170 to 106. It rained. The next Sunday evidently each one brought one because we had 212 present. Last Sunday we had 184 present. Sebastiao Pereira de Oliveira preached. He is the young man who

for years has been blind. He has spent some time in the south studying at an institute for the blind.

Last Sunday night I baptized 14, mostly young people. The baptism was witnessed by a capacity crowd for our building - 215.

The Lord willing, I'll visit Pastor Sotenes Nunes de Melo the end of this month and preach for him at his church in Sao Mateus de Maranhao in a weekend revival. We plan, the Lord willing, to journey then together to Fortaleza, the capital of the State of Ceara to visit our mission there. I'll then return to Manaus from Fortaleza by plane on the 10th of December.

Pray with us that we'll be able to begin the construction of our new building soon after January 1st.

We pray the Lord's blessings to be upon each of you. Pray for the three of us here and our son in the States as well.
