

June has had another electrocardiogram made and the problem with the valve returning the blood to her heart remains the same. Remember to pray for her as you pray.



Despite a multitude of problems, we are
most thankful for the privilege of serving
the Lord here in Peru and we thank God for
each one who helps to make our ministry
here possible.

Our gas shortage is so critical that I bought a bicycle. We go more than a week at a time without any gas whatsoever. When gas arrives the lines are incredible and sales are often limited to 5 gals.

This is the worst rainy season in many years. All the roads to Lima have been closed.

rainy season in many years. All the roads to Lima have been closed. Bridges washed out, telephone lines washed out or buried, landslides, and flooding have isolated Huanuco. There is little hope that the highway will be open for the next 3 weeks. The city of San Rafael is all but washed away. Plane service is limited due to the rains and low hanging clouds. Food short-

ages are getting critical. There is no sugar, and it is difficult to buy shortening, rice, canned milk. Our electric plant which already is rationing electricity is running out of fuel and in a few days we will not have any power. This also means no water. We have a portable power generator, but only enough gas to run it for a few hours.

Despite our problems, there isn't any place on earth that we would rather be. God has blessed our unworthy efforts so marvelously this past month that we are driven to our knees with prayers of gratitude and praise. We had 8 professions of faith this month, one who came in a spirit of renewed dedication, and many others manifesting real spiritual growth. Among those saved and asking to be baptized was one of the Judges for the Department (state) of Huanuco. Attendance in Ambo continues to improve and all the brethren seem to be very much encouraged.
