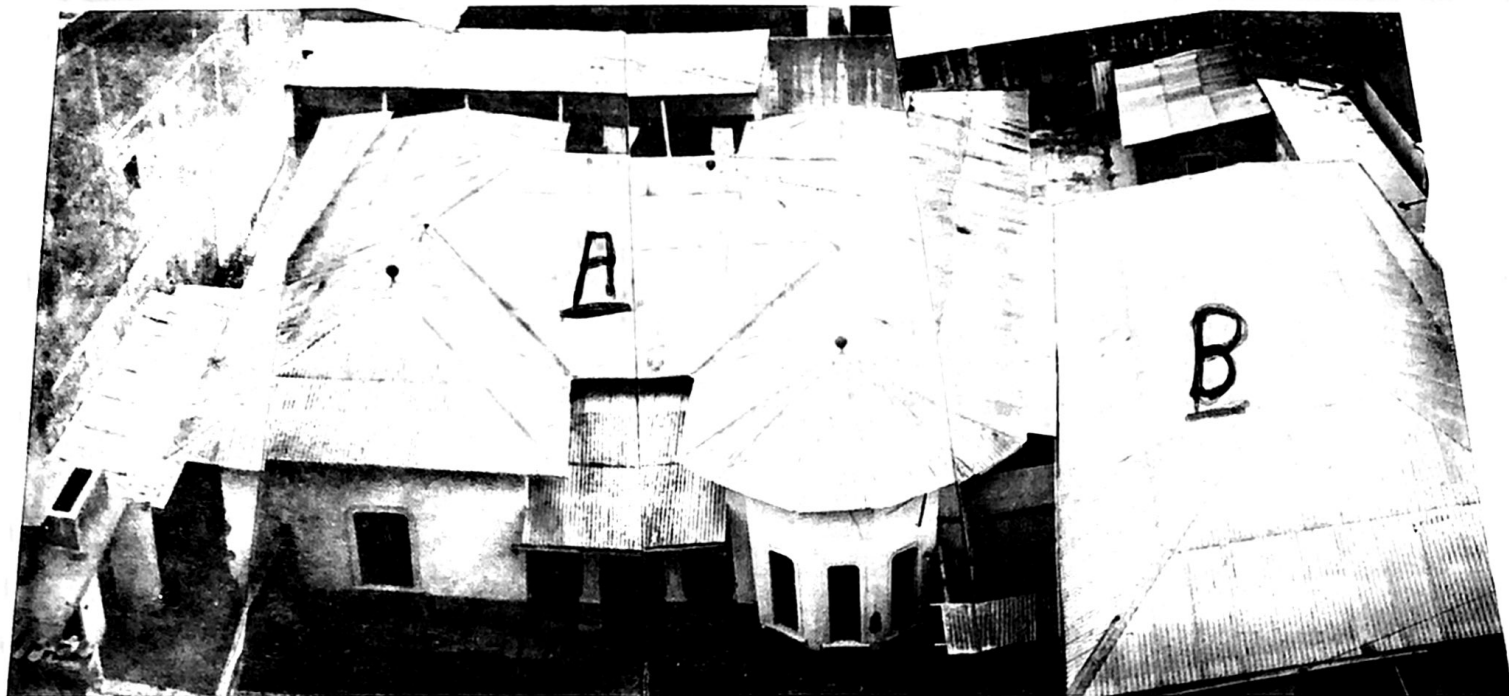

 Here on the mission field we are in the rainy season and the rain has caused many land-slides that has cut off all transportation in and out of the country. We have not had gasoline, gas for cooking or vegetables for two weeks. I waited in line four hours to buy gasoline and did not get any because when I got to the pumps they were sold out. I bought 10 gallons of gasoline by waiting in line 27 hours.

The work in Tingo Maria continues to do very well with 80 and 90 in the night services. It has been two weeks since we have been to Aucayacu because of the gas

shortage. With the ten gallons of gasoline I bought I will be able to go to Aucayacu this Sunday afternoon.

I baptized three in Tingo Maria this month and we have more to baptize when we can get them legally married.

Michael has been a very sick boy since December 22 with a very bad case of typhoid fever. He has not been able to return to school yet, but we hope that he will be well enough to go next week.

January 8th Wanda and Nora left for the U.S.A. to study. They will be studying at the Mountain State Baptist High School in Alderson, W. Va. We will surely miss them here in the work, as they taught a class, played and sang specials and helped in visiting.

Again we want to say thank you to all who remember us in prayer and support us to make our ministry possible here in Peru.

 Time surely does fly by and how we need to redeem every minute of it for the Glory of God. This has been another month that as a whole has been filled with the blessings of God. Even though the temperature dropped to 0 degrees with a chill factor of -30 degrees we got a little cool but God still gave us enough oil and warm clothes to meet the needs.

The Lord has blessed the church here in Seoul this month. We had a great Watch-night service having another Baptist missionary preach and some of his members came with him and several people responded during the invitation for various reasons. For our regular services our adult services have been steady but the children's S.S. for the past two weeks has dropped some; yet we've had several professions of faith and baptized seven for the month; one being my daughter Pamela, who had made a profession about three years ago but came one Wednesday night trusting Christ and recognizing that not having been truly saved before that she needed Scriptural Baptism. Our son Timothy only seven, came forward saying God had called him to preach and nothing would sat-

isfy him until I let him preach; and believe it or not he stood in a chair behind the pulpit for Sunday a.m. service and preached about 10 minutes; he's only seven but only God knows what's in store, pray for him that God's will will be done.

Be blessed by boosting the Bratcher Baptist Building in Brasil! We want to express our thanks to each individual and church that has thus far helped us in any way, by praying for us or by writing us or by sending a special offering to the Mission designated for the "Bratcher Building".

Some 140 of us were in prayer at the 14th of December Baptist Church when 1973 came to a close. We began the New Year with 217 in Sunday School on January 6th. I asked the church to pray that we might be able to stay above the 200 mark each Sunday. Last Sunday, we didn't! It rained! Rain affects our attendance here like snow and slick roads does in the States. We only had 65! However, Sunday night our sadness was changed to joy when 248 people filled to overflowing our building. I baptized six.

We have not yet begun the actual construction of our new building. The man who has drawn up the blue-prints has begun the sometimes long and slow process of obtaining our building permit. Good news comes for another State for us. Before the end of the month (January) Pastor Sostenes Nunes de Melo will arrive in Manaus. He is a builder as well as a preacher. He has agreed to take charge of the construction of the new building. The church will pay his transportation costs both ways and take care of his expenses while he's in our midst. Pray for him!

We finally got home (to Iquitos), got all our mail along with a surprise. We got a letter from the Banco de Credito marked URGENT. I went to the bank and they had a check for us for \$1,000.00 from my brother Leonard Underwood and the church he pastors near Charleston, W. Virginia, Leon Baptist Church, towards my husband's hospital bill. My husband feels pretty good but gets tired so easily. He promised before leaving Lima that he would abide by the doctor's orders. He preached twice Jan. 13, but it was almost too much. He says next Sunday he plans to have someone preach one

of the services. He eats good and feels good when he gets his rest, but today all the preachers have been coming in from all the churches and he is tired. He is supposed to go to the doctor in Lima in about three weeks.

We found the work in good shape. Things are really high here now, and much hard to get. Gas will be rationed in February, but is hard to get now.

They tell me that my new boat and new motor will arrive the end of the month. I hope this is true. I was to go to Maipuco February 20 but thought I will go now as it would be hard to eat there as I need to watch what I eat. Finally got the papers completed for our "Carnets" (identification cards). They are making it more difficult each day here. The government is taking over everything.

Despite a multitude of problems, we are most thankful for the privilege of serving the Lord here in Peru and we thank God for each one who helps to make our ministry here possible.

Our gas shortage is so critical that I bought a bicycle. We go more than a week at a time without any gas whatsoever. When gas arrives the lines are incredible and sales are often limited to 5 gals.

This is the worst rainy season in many years. All the roads to Lima have been closed. Bridges washed out, telephone lines washed out or buried, landslides, and flooding have isolated Huanuco. There is little hope that the highway will be open for the next 3 weeks. The city of San Rafael is all but washed away. Plane service is limited due to the rains and low hanging clouds. Food short-

ages are getting critical. There is no sugar, and it is difficult to buy shortening, rice, canned milk. Our electric plant which already is rationing electricity is running out of fuel and in a few days we will not have any power. This also means no water. We have a portable power generator, but only enough gas to run it for a few hours.

Despite our problems, there isn't any place on earth that we would rather be. God has blessed our unworthy efforts so marvelously this past month that we are driven to our knees with prayers of gratitude and praise. We had 8 professions of faith this month, one who came in a spirit of renewed dedication, and many others manifesting real spiritual growth. Among those saved and asking to be baptized was one of the Judges for the Department (state) of Huanuco. Attendance in Ambo continues to improve and all the brethren seem to be very much encouraged.

Remember, we need your prayers for our brethren, for our building needs and for our own ministry.

The last time I had the pleasure of talking with Brother Arnold Leach was at the Thanksgiving Conference at Twelve-Ryan Baptist Church. He told how the Lord had blessed and increased year by year their mission offerings and how their church was planning to increase their giving. Neither he nor I had any idea that would be our last conversation as a date was set for me to visit their church. One month later he was in heaven.

The letters from Brazil this month have been good. There were 18 who graduated from the high school and two who received diplomas from the seminary. One letter is from a new seminary student who is pastoring a mission point of the Tabernacle Baptist Church. Their attendance is up to 45 and there were 5 professions of faith last month and 2 this month. They are getting ready to add on to the building. Another letter said that they already have 70 students enrolled for the next school year even though the classes do not start until March. Brother Julio Dantas, pastor and teacher says that the school year ended well and they are hoping to have more in the seminary next year.

Brethren, we have just purchased a new electronic organ to be used in the starting of new works and the price for organ and speaker was \$2,600.00 (The selling price was \$4,300.00 but the dealer gave it to us for the cost price, plus 10%). The money

must be paid within 90 days so if you would like to have a part we will thank you. This is an approved "Mission Project". The organ comes with two special airline carrying cases and covers which the dealer gave us. This is not being bought for our own personal property but will be used in the mission work and if anything happens to us the organ will stay with and be used by some other missionary.

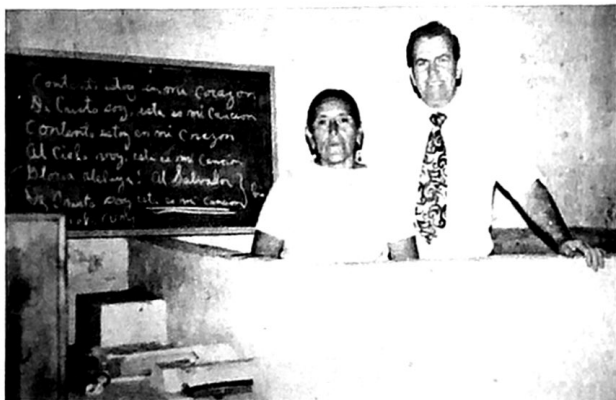
