

I held a Va cation Bible School of five days at Ressace de Pesqueira in the large front room of Sen-hor Henrique Vasco da Silva. We enrolled 77 and had an average attendance of 43. The attendance at the night services increased each night until the lars night

night until the last night

services increased each night until the last night when more than 100 peo-ple were present. Many had to remain standing. During the month of Feb-ruary, our mission there increased from three to eight. Three were bap-tized and two were re-ceived by statement. On February 19 I at-tended and participated in the organization service of the 23rd of November Baptist Church, Colonia de Franceses, here in the city of Manaus.
