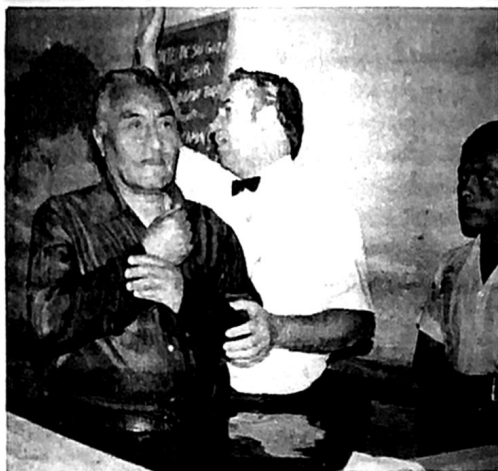

Dear Brethren,

Despite many blessings from the Lord, our church here in Huanuco has never been so threatened as at present. Our old rented building with all its handicaps and the innumerable holes in the roof has been awarded to its original owner and we have been served notice that we have a maximum of five months before we will be forced to leave. Our old building has so many handicaps that we had already been looking for another building for almost a year without any success. We have not been able to find a building large enough to seat the people we already have in attendance. Last Sunday night we had about 120 seated and another 30 standing due to lack of seating.

We must have help if the work in Huanuco is to continue without falling into a most disgraceful condition. We are most thankful for those who have already given, for those

who continue to give, but more help is urgently needed now. Those who are already giving, please pray with me that God will burden others to help our poor people of Huanuco.

The Lord continues to bless as we preached to full houses both in Huanuco and Ambo last week. We had one saved and four for baptism this month. It has been wonderful this past month to see miraculous power of the word of God among us. Last month a most catholic family started reading the Bible for the first time. This month they threw away their idols and have started to attend our services. What a joy it has been as they come and share with me their discoveries and delights as they read together the Bible. We look soon to see them make a public profession of faith despite the most certain persecution which will follow. Judge Ramirez who was saved and baptized last month is proving to be one of our most humble members and a blessing to all.

Dear Brethren,

First of all about our services. We had two children to come to our Sunday morning service. This was the first time anyone had come on Sunday morning. Then in our other services we had as high as 14.

After a delay of about 5 days, work has started again on the wall and the Lord willing, should be finished by this time next month. At this time material is short because of so much construction. We were promised brick on a Monday but when they did not come I went to see what had happened. The man said that we would have to wait at least three days. I tried to find another company from which to buy but no one had any. That afternoon after lunch I went to tell the workers

that I couldn't get the bricks and when I got to the land the brick was there being unloaded. I don't know what happened except the Lord worked in our behalf.

Most of my time has been spent in connection with the wall. One afternoon I spent the whole afternoon trying to pay the workers' benefits in the bank. It seems to get anything done here it takes about twice or three times as long as in the States.

March is the month of the most rain here in Cuiaba. Many people have had to leave their homes as the river has flooded. Also, this month there was a windstorm which blew the roofs off houses and many trees down. I thought that the roof was going to come off our house but didn't. This was the worst storm I've seen here in Brazil.

We are thankful for your faithful support and Brethren, forget not our great need of a building in which to have services. Pray that the Lord will give us one and give as He leads you to give.

I held a Vacation Bible School of five days at Ressaco de Pesqueira in the large front room of Senhor Henrique Vasco da Silva. We enrolled 77 and had an average attendance of 43. The attendance at the night services increased each night until the last night when more than 100 people were present. Many had to remain standing. During the month of February, our mission there increased from three to eight. Three were baptized and two were received by statement.

On February 19 I attended and participated in the organization service of the 23rd of November Baptist Church, Colonia de Franceses, here in the city of Manaus. The pastor, Manuel Vieira Peixoto, is from Rio de Janeiro. The church indicated that they wish to cooperate with Baptist Faith Missions.

On February 27th and 28th the annual meeting of our churches in Manaus was held. Large crowds attended both nights.

I had to go to Huanuco to buy steel rods and finally they arrived last week. The men will start the walls for the fence today if the rain stops.

We are waiting for the people to move out of the before we pay the owner. They are to move out tomorrow and if so I will sign the contract and finish paying for the lot and building so we can start to work on the house.

I now have another work started and the Lord is really blessing. We have 20 adults ready to be baptized and I hope to organize them into a Baptist Church in the near future. We plan to have a meeting there with Brother Gibbs doing the preaching starting April 1st. The new mission is on the road that goes toward Pucallpa.

This week I had to take Elizabeth to Lima for x-rays and she saw three specialists. She still has a lot of pain and some infection please pray for her.

We are both happier in the work than we have ever been. Last night (Wed.) we had 5 professions of faith.
