The Raanah Paul Hatcher New Missionaries To Brazil

Paul Hatcher grew up in Brazil. He knows the Portuguese Language and is ready to start doing mission work as soon as he arrives in Brazil. He and his wife, Wanda are both University graduates. He has been the successful pastor of Morgan Avenue Baptist Church, Evansville, Indiana and is being sent to Brazil under the authority of that church. When he arrives in Brazil he will unite with a Baptist Church in Brazil and do his mission work under the authority of that church. They will be going to Brazil as soon as they receive their permanent visas, (the Lord willing), which are expected anytime. Paul Hatcher has not visited churches doing debutation work to raise his salary. He is going out on faith and his salary will not start until they get the permanent visas. Salary and expenses will run about \$1,000.00 a month on the average plus the cost for plane passage. If each church will increase their mission offering as the Lord shall lead you their support will be raised. This is the way Paul Hatcher is doing his debutation work. May the Lord be pleased to lead each pastor and church to increase their monthly offerings to pay for their support. Remember that all offerings sent to Baptist Faith Missions are used 100% for mission work, and no one supports a board. All directors of the mission serve without any pay from mission offerings, and all mission work is done by the authority of the church of which the missionary is a member of. Don't let any enemies of Baptist Faith Missions deceive you.

We were sorry that she had to be rushed to the hospital and we thought for a while that she was going to have to have an operation, but her blood test turned out negative, for which we were so thankful. We made my study into a hospital room, and she was OK in a couple of days. She helped my wife with her English classes and our students really went for that. She also helped in our services, playing the piano and helping with our choir. Thanks, Lydia, so much for coming.

About 600 At Anniversary Service In New Building . . . July Largest S. S. Attendance In History . . . Now Meeting In First Floor Of Unfinished Building

Dear Brethren,
The 14th of December Baptist Church has moved! Since the 23rd of July we are meeting on the first floor of the new building under construction. The first service held in the new building was our anniversary service - the church was organized on July 24, 1960. An estimated 600 people were present. We had enough space but not enough benches to seat everyone. On the following Sunday we let the young people of the church be in charge of the services. Sunday morning Romualdo Nogueira do Nascimento preached. On Sunday night Asa Mark Bratcher brought the message. The Lord blessed throughout the day with eleven decisions being made. 226 were present Sunday morning and 378 were counted Sunday night. Our Sunday School attendance during July reached an all time high with an average attendance of 218.

We now have our old building up for sale. Pray for us that we will soon be able to sell it. We need the money to continue the construction. We are not only now the church of the open door but of the open windows as well. We need to put the doors and windows in as well as plaster the walls, put in bathrooms and continue the construction of the walls of the second floor. Only with borrowed money have we been able to get the first floor in condition to use. I'm hoping that we won't have a hard rain during a service for if we were to, several people would have to move or get wet.

On the 25th of July we went to the airport to welcome the John A. Hatchers back to Brazil. On the 7th of August we went to the airport to see Asa Mark off to the States. Pray for him as he is now back in the U.S.

to continue his college studies. Pray for us and give for the continuation of the construction of our new church building as the Lord leads you to do so. Our prayers are that the Lord will touch many hearts.

The Lord willing, the three of us (Harold, Marie and Stephen) tomorrow will be going to the interior for an eighteen day trip, visiting more than one of the church's missions, spending most of the time with the Rio Urubu Mission.

Dear Brethren,
At this time we are in a meeting in Aucayacu, which is the first week long meeting we have had there. I now have a full time native worker there who is taking care of the building, visiting and preaching. We now have regular services there, with services Sunday morning and night and Wednesday night also.

We have really had our problems with getting in the new house but we plan to move in the house Aug. 26. The house will not be completely finished, but we can finish it after we move in.

The Lord continues to bless here in the work in Tingo Maria, saving souls and changing lives. Our new helper here is doing a good job especially with the music. He will be helping Brother Mayfield next month directing the music during their revival meeting. Then he will go to Huanuco and be with Brother Gibbs a week and then back to Tingo for our first anniversary of our church here.

As I now have some help I plan to spend some more time with the new mission on the road to Pucallpa. Also I have my eye on some other towns further into the jungle. I recently visited Tarapoto, a growing town of over 50,000 people without a Baptist work. Another town called Yurimagus has 25,000 and no Baptist work. We are praying that someone will come and help us. May the Lord raise up men who will be willing to go. The field is very large here and it is certainly ripe to harvest.

Again we plead for help on the house. Each one could help with the expense and all would soon be paid for. The steel windows and doors cost about \$800.00 without the glass. The tile about \$700.00. We will move in without tile on the floors, painting the house about \$350.00. Why not pick out one of these and send your check to Baptist Faith Missions for "Crain House" in Tingo Maria.

Last month I was in the hospital with my back. I am now able to go again, but I have to rest each day and take pain relievers each day. I am supposed to go back in 6 months. Thank you for your letters and cards.

Each month passes by with so many things that need to be done, yet left undone. The way things are here, it takes us about seventy-five percent of our time, just to survive, with all the paperwork plus the shortages, we stand in line most of the time. We line up to buy gas, sugar, rice, and as of now there is no flour in the city. All keep saying things are getting better, but it is difficult to see. But regardless, the Lord supplies our needs.

This month has been busy, with classes for anyone that wishes to study the Bible, one night per week, in addition to the other services. We have about 20 students, mostly young people. Also my wife and I took a trip to our church at Maipuco, which is about 300 miles up the Marañon River. It

was quite an experience, as this was our first long trip in our new boat. It took eleven hours to get there, where we spent one week with the church, preaching and teaching, mostly to the church, although many unsaved were also in attendance. We had one profession of faith, two couples got legally married and four were baptized. We spent eight hours to return home, but that is too much distance in a speed boat for one day. Neither of us could walk straight when we returned home, and did not feel well for several days. We have not received reports from the other churches this month, as our reunion of the churches will be later.

We had two professions of faith in the First Church, with one being baptized. We have had to exclude some, others, who at one time were our best help, have also fallen by the wayside. But we have some faithful ones, for which we thank God. The oil wealth has not been good for people spiritually. May the Lord bless each one.
