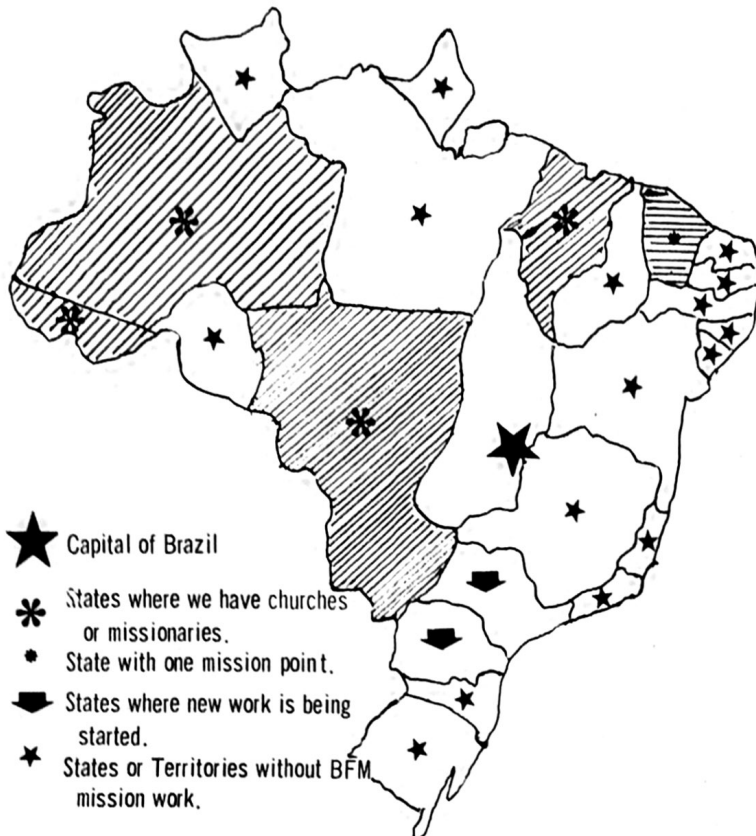

I have been real busy buying the material and building the septic tank, installing the plumbing, installing the roof. We have stopped now as our funds have run out. We thought we would have enough money to do the addition but we soon discovered that everything in material has doubled or tripled in price. We are taking special offerings now to finish the floor and plaster the brick walls. We are to have a special Thanksgiving supper with preaching that night on Thanks-

Great Report Of Offerings And Work Of Tabernacle Baptist Church In Manaus Brazil . . . The Lord Is Greatly Blessing

Dear Brethren,

Last month the offerings at Tabernacle were over \$1,000.00 and less than \$100.00 was given by the Hatchers. God is blessing and I hope that our church will be able to finance the properties of at least two works in other States. Last Sunday we had 190 in S.S. During the last ten years Tabernacle Church has built about six mission buildings, Chapada, Av. Martins, V-8, Campinas, Boa Fe and about half the cost of the building in Manacapuru. The church supports one man full time and two men part time and gives the largest offering of any to the home mission work among the churches here. When you stop to realize that the

average salary in our church is less than \$100.00, a thousand dollar offering is a big one. A widow and her daughter, who is one of our teachers, and earns less than \$100.00 and that is all they have to live on, sold their house and tithed the entire amount, not just the profit.

The offerings to BFM have been on my mind a lot and certainly it is a work of faith, but maybe if more would remember that faith comes by hearing, and it is going to be hard to see increased offerings if more do not seek to get the work of BFM before new churches. If each pastor really interested about the work would seek to tell other pastors and churches about the work I believe it would pay off. When Paul the Apostle sought the offerings for the saints in Jerusalem he took the cause and presented it to the churches, for there was no other way for them to know about it. The same goes for the work of Baptist Faith Missions.

Monday we plan to go to Aucayacu to start the work on the walls around the building and to replace several sheets of roofing that have been damaged by wind storm and vandalism. Yesterday I went to Aucayacu and ordered the gravel, sand and the materials that we could buy there. The cement, sheets of roofing, nails, etc. we will have to haul in the Land Rover as they do not sell these things there.

Also, we plan to install electric lights if everything goes well. We had to go to the mountains and cut down trees for light posts and believe me that is some experience. The posts are all installed and now we need to connect the electric wires, which must be brought from the main highway. All of this will cost money as we have to buy the wire and do all the work ourselves.

Before coming to Honduras I read that it was the most underdeveloped country in Latin America in agriculture, in industry, in economy and culture and after 3 years I know just what the writer meant. Everything just does not turn out anything like the normal, but we count it as God's will here for our lives. When you least expect something that's when it happens here.

We had an 83 average in S.S. here at our church (Woodland) no professions and no baptisms. Good attendance at nights and interest at the best we have seen it. Several visitors always come. At Ayestas: 38 average S.S., 25 to 30 at night services. Two professions and 3 we hope to baptize next Sunday, Nov. 24, the Lord willing. That will make 9 over there. Juan Linares, our

preacher over there lost their 1 year old son. He died Nov. 15 and was buried yesterday (16). This man and wife are young and took the death very hard. We will start building in January 1975 on the lot in Ayestas and hope to finish without stopping. We will need about \$6,000.00 total. We are cutting the corners as always and not have anything fancy but nice, etc. Pray with us about this and ask the Lord what he would have you to do.

Our daughter Deborah has returned to Lexington, Ky. She is working, hoping to enter nurse's training next year. We observed the Lord's Supper for the first time last week and all but 1 of our members were present. After so long a time we felt the church was ready for this. We are all well at this writing and thank God for all of you. Prices have doubled since hurricane Fifi hit here but all else is about the same. May the Lord bless you all for HIS glory and we thank God for you all. We are praying for the conference in Warren.

Dear Brethren,
We have had another good month and the rain has not hurt us too much yet. We had our best attendance last Sunday since Brother Hatcher was here a little over a month ago. Last Sunday we had twenty-two in Sunday School and thirty-eight in the night service. We had more adults in the night service and we were glad to see that. A young lady was saved Sunday night, Nov. 17.

I drew some plans for our building only to find out they weren't worth the paper they were drawn on. They didn't cost the Mission anything was the only good thing about them. I had talked to an engineering student that told me that plans would cost me about two thousand dollars for a building like we were going to build; my heart sunk. At last, I did get some good plans drawn and signed an architect for

five hundred dollars and several have told me since that I got off cheap. After this I had to get the project signed by a civil engineer who will be responsible to see that it is built according to the plans. His fee is about forty-five dollars per month for as long as it takes me to get it built, so I would like to see you brethren get behind us so that we can get it finished as soon as possible for several reasons. All the documents have been submitted to city hall and we should have the building permit this week. I have bought most of the materials for the foundation and have enough money on hand to buy the rest for the foundation and to get the electric hooked up, I think. I believe I could get the building finished in about four months, if we have the funds.

I have spent a day and a half cleaning the lots and moving our tool shed getting ready to build and should be ready to start digging next Monday or Tuesday.

May the Lord bless each of you as you pray and serve Him.

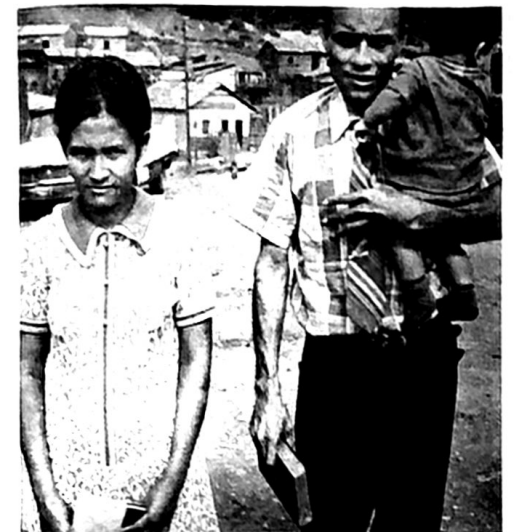

May the Lord bless you during the coming Holiday Season and throughout the New Year of 1975.

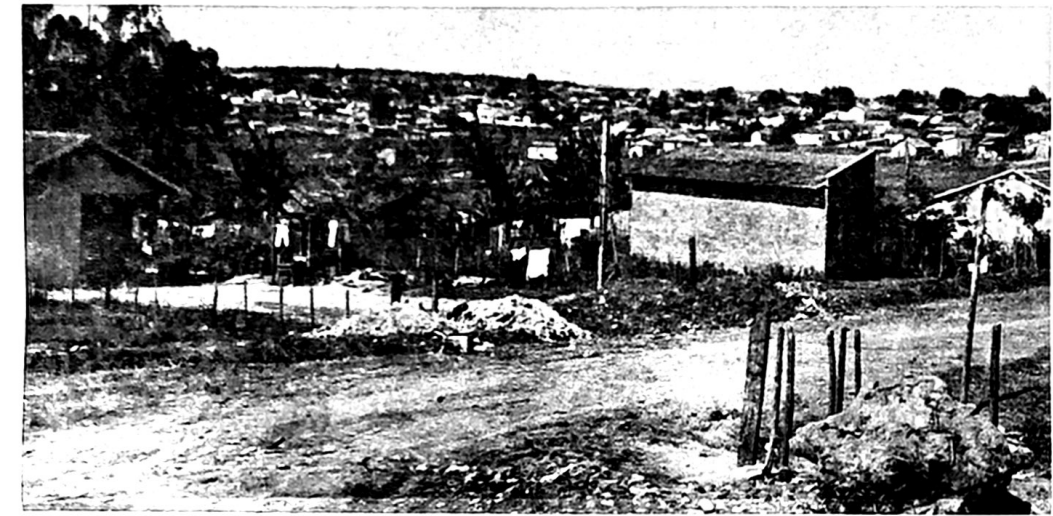
