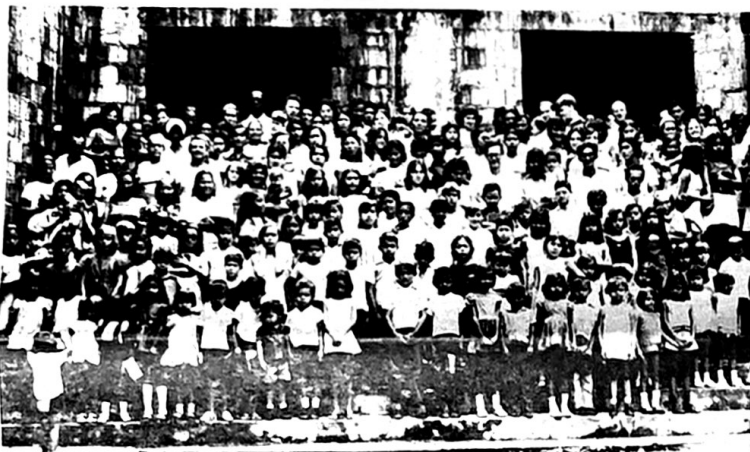

Dear Brethren,  
During the month of February, we initiated a Sunday School visitation drive for three departments, ages 6-14. The average attendance for the month of January was 39. In three weeks we hit a high of 102, with an average of 79 in the same three departments for the last four weeks. In a four-week period, fifty new visitors attended, and nine from those departments were saved and made public professions. During the same four weeks, we had a concentrated Sunday School teachers' course.

March 12 we assisted in the organization of another Baptist Church here in one of the large suburbs. It was my privilege to preach the charge message to the church. Another Baptist church in Brazil; Praise the Lord. Classes in the school started March 1. I am teaching two classes of Christian Psychology and one Religion class. Also, in the Seminary, I am teaching Personal Evangelism, Methods in Evangelism, and Expository Preaching.



This month we have been busy publishing three books for the schools and a variety of other jobs for the churches.

Wanda and I celebrated our fourth wedding anniversary this month.

## Surgery In Manaus With Three Lumps Removed . . . Await Lab Tests . . . Almost 800 Enrolled In Schools . . . Could Reach 1000 If We Had The Buildings . . . S.S. Up 20 % . . . Souls Saved And Baptized

Dear Brethren,  
Yesterday and today most of the time has been spent in bed recuperating from a minor operation yesterday morning which consisted of the removal of three lumps, two from the left chest and rib area and one from the right groin area. Tests have been sent off and the results should be known in a couple of weeks.

The schools and Seminary are back in full swing, this being the third week of the new school year. With almost 775 students plus the Seminary the total goes almost to 800. Never have we had such a great opportunity to reach so many older students with the truth of God's Word. From this number the power of the Gospel could be felt in all of Brazil and even unto the ends of the earth. Had we

had the room our enrollment could have gone to 1,000.

Our Sunday School average this month is up about 20%. Sunday, March 9, there were nine children who made professions of faith. The Sunday before two young people were baptized into our church. On Sunday afternoons I preach at one of our Missions points since the brother who was taking care of the work moved to the south.

Our plans were to go to the city of Garças, where new work is being opened, before now but the busy months of school preparation and health needs have prevented our trip. However, plans are to go soon. Our church has already voted to help in the expenses. The Lord willing we would like to drive if possible since the rainy season is almost over. To the first place the distance is about 1500 miles and about half of this distance is gravel road.

May God help us to be busy at the job.

It has not hurt us any other than the noise, in fact we have had a little increase this month. One Sunday we had 29 in S.S. and 28 that same night and yesterday we had 28 in Sunday School. We don't worry about this, but it would be nice if we could get our building finished to get away from the noise.

I forgot to tell what had been done on the building since my last letter. All of the walls are up except the front one that is only up to just above the door and we cannot go on up with this until we pour a concrete slab for the roof of the porch since part of the wall will sit on top of this slab. The forms for this slab are already up and we will wait for money to buy cement. The most expensive part is yet to do, the roof, the ceiling, the plastering, the floor and the electrical installation. As it looks now we are going to get a lot of work out of Bro. Turner soon after he gets here. I think I will buy some larger buckets for him to carry concrete in, because he is so big and strong.

We are looking forward to working near and with the Turners as when they return we plan to go across the river to a city called Varezza Grande and start a new work. It is about six miles from where we live now and the same bus that we catch to go to the city from here goes to Varezza Grande also. We trust you all will pray for and wish us that this work and the one we plan to start will be blessed of the Lord.

# Church Is Alive . . . 290 In S. S. 8 Baptized . . . Rains Pour Into Building . . . Need Funds To Finish Building . . . Church To Raise \$640.00 . . . Please Help

Permit me to share with you the main paragraph of a letter that I wrote to Pastor J. Douglas King on the 24th of last month:

I have before me a statement made by Pope Paul VI. He made his shocking statement to 207 world Catholic leaders, the night before the first session of the fourth world Synod of Bishops in the Vatican City, held a few months ago. "The church is in difficulty," he said. "It seems destined to die." I praise the Lord that this morning, remembering the events of yesterday in the service of the Lord, that I do not feel

about the 14th of December Baptist Church as the Pope feels about the Roman Catholic Church. Our church has its difficulties, yes. When it rains the water pours in through the open windows and doors and runs down the aisles due to the unfinished condition of our new building. We don't have the money for the continuation of the construction work. Be that as it may, our church is alive and due to the grace of God, growing. At the morning service, 290 (two hundred and ninety) were present for Sunday School. I baptized eight. In the afternoon some twenty of us visited Aleixo. Some held services in an isolation hospital, the rest of us with a group of ladies afflicted with leprosy. Last night I preached to 215 and six adults responded to the invitation-two professions of faith and four asking to be received by letter. There were

Dear Brethren,  
After returning from Bro. Mayfields Conference, in Pucallpa, last month, my wife became very ill and I had to take her to the hospital at three o'clock in the morning. It just happened that my car wouldn't run, so we had to go on my motorcycle. We got to the hospital, but there was no one to help, which is usually the case here. We then went to the home of a doctor, was willing to help. He had no shots to relieve her pain, but gave some capsules. The next day she had x-rays, which showed large gallstones. The doctor wanted to operate right away, as he said it was dangerous to wait, but knowing how they are in these hospitals, we went to Lima. She entered emergency and after more tests, they removed the gall-bladder and appendix. We thank the Lord that all went well and after six days, she was able to leave the hospital. We are now home and she seems to be getting along well.

The same day that he died, he had called his daughter and children together and told them when he was gone, she should continue to serve the Lord and keep going to Gods house. Seems he knew it was his time.

# 35 Days Trip Up River To Peru Border . . . 25 Places Preached At With 1312 Preached To With 33 Professions Of Faith

Cruzeiro do Sul, Acre  
February 21, 1975

Dear Brethren,  
Jose Odali and I are back home again after a great trip up the Jurua River. All went well here while we were gone. Bro. Rubenson Pereira went to Villa Rodrigues Alves almost every week end.

We left Cruzeiro in mid January. I arranged to take my boat pulled alongside a logging tug and for us to go on board, also. It took almost five days to Villa Taumaturgo. That was as far as the tug was going so we loosed from there and went on to the mouth of the Breu River in my boat. We started our work at the mouth of the Breu, which is the boundary line between Brazil and Peru. The whole trip was thirty-five days long. After holding three services at the Breu, I started down river holding services at every place where there were four or five houses. We visited twenty-five places, including the churches at Campo de Santana and Parana dos Mouras. I con-

ducted thirty-seven services in the thirty-five day trip. Sundays were our busiest days, since the folks here don't work on the Lord's day and they are at home the whole day. On one Sunday I had four services in four different villages. All told I was able to preach to 1,312 persons and best of all there were thirty-three professions of faith. It took seven hours and fifteen minutes to come back down stream at an average speed of thirty-eight miles per hour. Thus I figure the distance to be about 275 miles.

The two Jurua churches are doing pretty good. There were two saved at Campo de Santana while I was there. Brother Wilson is there now to spend a month with the brethren. I baptized one lady at Parana dos Mouras. Many of the folks are moving away from there, because of unchecked theft and vandalism in the homes and fields. Brother Sebastian, who takes care of the work there, is often away for three months at a time. Consequently many of the members are moving to town, where they can go to church. Bev and I are going there this week end to be with them.

way of the house where we have services in the home of one of the brethren. Tomorrow we will not be able to get to Aucayacu for Sunday services. The river has emptied into the town, three feet of water in the streets, houses along the river washed away. There has been three feet of water in the airport building which has cut off air service for over two weeks.

No damage was done here to the house or church as we had filled in all around the house so the rain could run off in all directions from the house.

But this is not a time for despair, defeat or despondency. It is the time for missionaries, pastors and churches to work harder at the task.

We hear so much from the States about the condition there, but, more Americans are traveling than ever before, they come to Peru by the plane load looking for butterflys, flowers and mushrooms.

We have been given about 70 acres with house, garage and church building by a missionary who has gone back to the US because of health and old age. The brother has given me the power of attorney to do something with it. We may lose it for lack of funds. We need \$1,000.00 to clear off the land. We do not want to lose it. There must be someone or some church who will give \$1,000.00. Mark your offering for "Crain to clear off land." A house, garage, church building and land free, if you will give the money to clean off the land and occupy it.

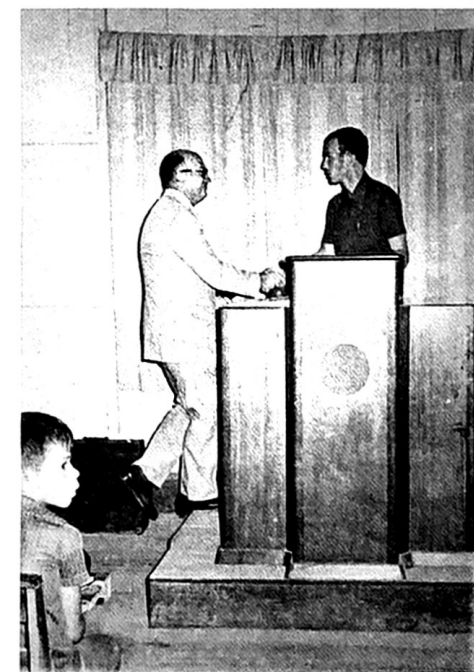
