### Doctor And Hospital Bills

### Manaus, Brazil Conference In 1976

Cost for plane fare for one person round trip, excursion rate for 14 to 28 days from Detroit, Michigan about \$635.00. To leave from Cincinnati, Ohio or from Lexington, Ky. or from Charleston, W. Va. or from Nashville, Tenn. The fares would be less than leaving from Detroit. Each person should carry travelers checks in amount of about \$150.00 to \$200.00 for expenses and emergencies. Each person must have:

1. Vaccination or revaccination for smallpox.
2. Shot for tetanus.
3. Shot yellow fever.
4. Shots for typhus
5. Shots for typhoid fever.

Each person must have a passport. You can apply for one at any post office. To make application you must have two pictures of yourself passport size and your original birth certificate.

The vaccinations and shots must be listed on the Yellow International Health card and certified by the health department in the city where you live or near where you live. You do not need a visa, only the passport and the vaccinations on the health card. You cannot get the yellow fever shot from your doctor. Check at a nearby army base or U.S. Hospital. Those planning on going on to Peru, the added cost will be about three hundred dollars more (Estimated). To date nine personal have said they plan to go. If you plan to go write and tell us. 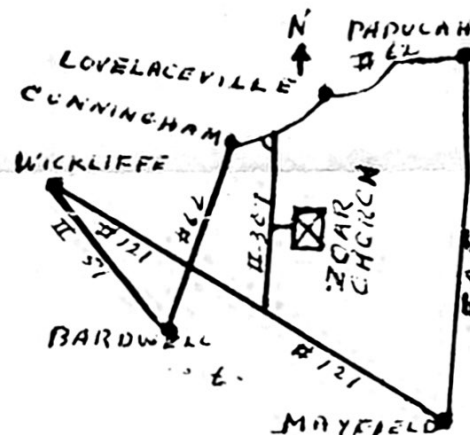

## S.S. 50 To 290 . . . Professions Of Faith . . . A Week In The Interior Preached 8 Times . . . Sick Since March 31 . . . Doctor Says It Is Worms . . . Difficulties In Traveling

Dear Brethren,  
Manaus, Amazonas  
April 18, 1975  
Our attendance at the 14th of December Baptist Church during the last five Sundays has varied from a low of 50 (a very stormy Sunday) to a high of 290. We've had four professions of faith, two asking for baptism and one asking to be received by letter.

I spent a week in the interior working with Pastor Moises Ferreira Lima of Manacapuru. I preached eight times at three different places. I went by bus from Manaus to Manacapuru on Monday afternoon the 17th of March. I preached that night to 39. Tuesday the difficulties began. We planned to leave at 9:00 a.m. on a comfortable, dependable boat. Bro. Moises thought he had rented. We didn't leave until 12:30 p.m. It was on a much smaller boat and as we discovered before the day was gone, an undependable boat. The boat broke down just before we got to our destination. We were still able to hold a late service but with only the family of the

house, besides us present. The next day we didn't get away until 12:30 p.m. We arrived in time for prayer meeting at Manacapuru. Thursday (we had promised to be there Wednesday) we arrived in Ressaço de Pesqueiro. I preached to 69 that night. The rest of the week the attendance was small - rain! Moises went back to Manacapuru Saturday afternoon. I stayed, planning to go by the small boat on Sunday afternoon to preach at Manacapuru that night. I waited for hours in vain and didn't arrive in Manacapuru until Monday morning. I arrived home Monday afternoon. That night I celebrated my 48th birthday with 230 others at the church. Pastor Ranulfo Tobar preached.

Since the 31st of March I have been sick. The doctor tells me it's worms. I had stomach pains at first. They left but a shortness of breath and a hacking cough took their place. When the cough left the stomach pains returned and are still with me.

Mrs. Bratcher, Stephen and I are anxiously awaiting Asa Mark's visit. He is to arrive on the 8th of May.

Pray for us and if the Lord leads you to do so help us.

All this makes things a little more difficult. I had planned to organize the 5th mission in Iquitos before coming home but due to the pastor having to enter the military service, I think it best to wait until I return next year.

This past month we have made several trips on the river. I and two of the native pastors visited some new places about six hours by boat from Iquitos. We spent four days preaching and visiting. In one village we had ten professions of faith. The governor of the village wants us to send a pastor to live there. He said if someone would come the people would build a building for ser-

vices. There are many places as this one, but as of now we do not have the workers to go, and many times lack funds to make such trips. Pray for the work that the Lord will raise up more workers who are willing to go. We also dedicated a new building last night during our monthly meeting of the churches. This is a mission of the 2nd church, called Tupac Aramu, which we trust one day will also be an organized church. They did the labor and the First Church paid for the materials. It is a well-populated area and with some effort I am sure could soon be a strong church.

Since my wife's operation she seems to be getting along quite well. This was another great expense for the Mission. But we pray that the Lord will lead some churches to help in this expense. The total hospital and doctor bill was \$1,200.00, which is small in comparison to what the cost would be in the States. Pray for us and the work here as we prepare to leave it for one year.
