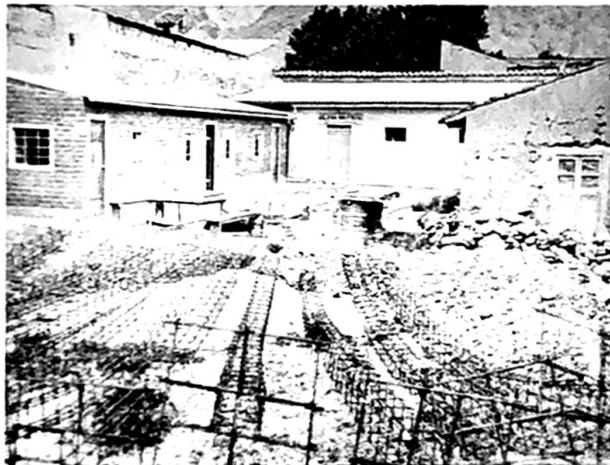

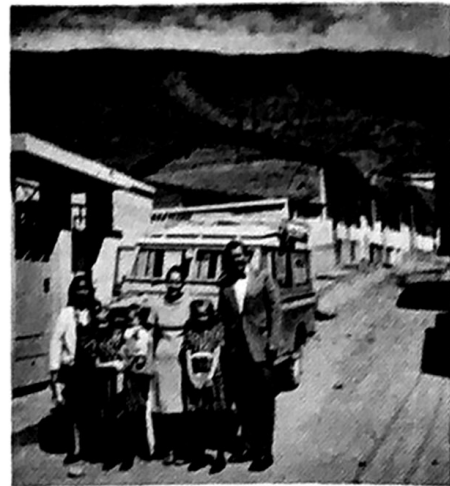

Dear Brethren,

The complete cost for Ayestas building was \$4,335.15 and with the lot included the total cost was \$6,236.15. That's a cheap investment if I have to say so myself and look at the eternal rewards. All is paid for and there is no deficit. Thanks so much to those that prayed and gave to both our buildings here. Again we say THANKS. Brother Kissel was here with us for 13 days and he preached 11 times. There were 3 professions in Ayestas and 5 for baptism while he preached there. When he preached in the church we had 3 professions and 3 for baptism. I baptized 5 from Ayestas and 1 for the church here the Sunday after

he left. Brother Kissel did some real heart searching messages and really seems to have revived our church. We have had 7 saved since he left and at least one in all but 2 services since he left. Great revival, huh? I hope to baptize at least 6 more this month. Now rejoice with us all. We have had from 87 to 108 in S.S. for the last 2 months also. We have 2 families working on their papers to marry in order to be baptized. It is a very strict thing here to married. Ayestas had in the 60's in S.S. and about the same at nights since Brother Kissel was here and it seems all is well there as of now. Ayestas is a good field and much better than up here where our church is.

The Lord willing we plan to go to US for 6 months stay on July 1st. After much prayer about this we feel it is the Lord's will. We will tell more about that next month.

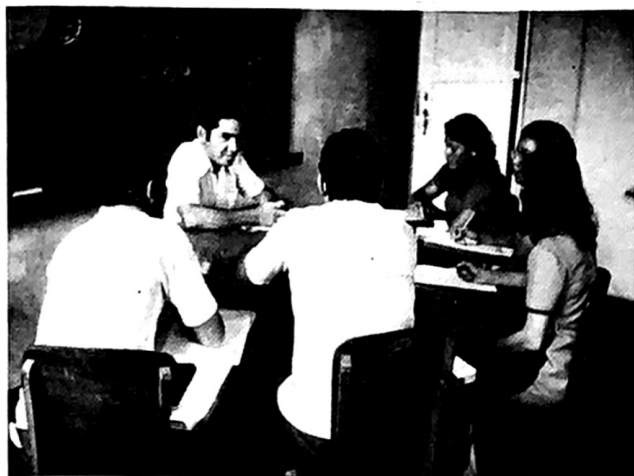

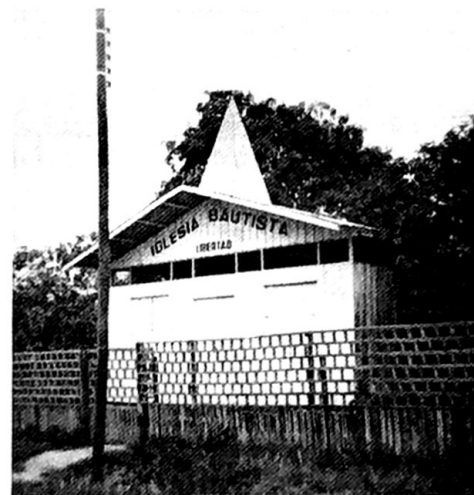
