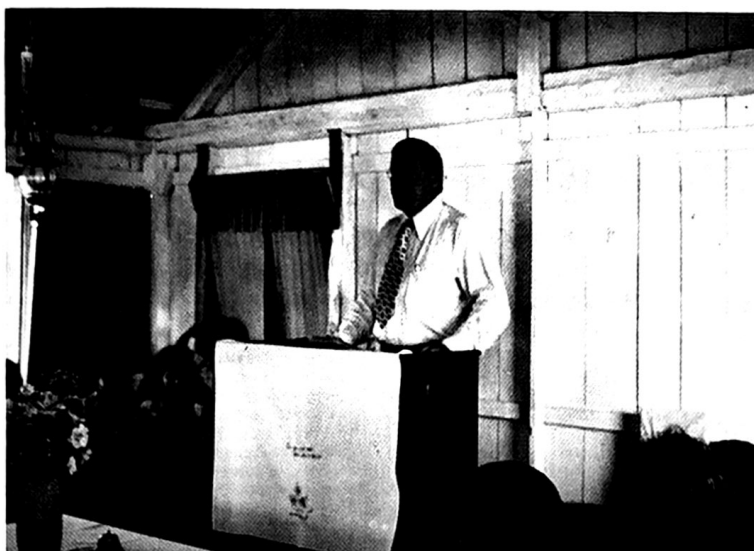

On September 10th I left Manaus on board a rented boat with the pilot and Francisco Assis Santos-a licensed preacher of the 14th of December Baptist Church. We arrived in Manaus at noon on the 26th of September. We visited and held services at Nova Remanso twice, Marcelo once, Costa de Sao Jose de Amajari once, besides the nine day revival at Cana on the Buzzard River (Rio Urubu). The Lord blessed us with 5 professions of faith, 4 rededications and three baptized during the revival on the Buzzard River. Pray for the Baptists of the Buzzard River in Brasil! Pray that they'll be able soon to build a larger and better building

there! Several times during the revival everyone couldn't get inside.

The work at the church goes well. We are preparing to begin the construction to go at "full-speed ahead" just as soon as we get the o.k. of the city government to do so. We are now in a campaign in the church to raise Cr\$150,000.00 (more than \$15,000.00) during the next ten months. The Lord willing, the members of the 14th of December Baptist Church will be hearing much during the next ten months about stewardship. Pray for the success of the campaign. Pray that the church will give more so that we'll not have to depend so much on the Mission.

Since returning from the trip, 284 has been the highest attendance in Sunday School. We thank each one of you that has already given to our building or car fund.

Garca, San Paulo
Oct. 16, 1975
The 3rd day of October marked a new day in our lives. For years our dream, desire, and prayer to God has been to go to other States of Brazil to open new works. As the plane carried us to Cuiaba the words of the Psalmist were vivid, "When the Lord brought from captivity those which returned to Zion we were as those who dream. And our mouth was full of laughter and our tongue with songs."

The families Creiglow and Turner met us at the airport of Cuiaba on Friday. The fellowship and services were wonderful with good crowds every service. What a blessing to see the new building almost finished enough to use. You who have had a part in this new work can certainly praise God.

The burning desire felt is to see the same done in every State in this great country. From Cuiaba the journey to the city of Sao Paulo was made by bus, 1200 miles. Here Brother Bill Barkley & wife met us and kept us for two days and three nights. In Sao Paulo we purchased a 1975 Volks Kombi for the church and school in Manaus, and paid for by them, which will be used here until our return there in December. Time and space do not permit us to tell how providence gave us this car in a city the size of New York. On Friday good-byes were said to the Barkleys and on Saturday morning our arrival was made in Garca, after traveling 2,700 miles.

To economize we rented one room in a 2nd rate hotel for five days while a house to rent was found. On Thursday, 16th, our empty house was occupied. Furniture: two beds, table & chairs. From Garca, in a radius of two hours trip 10 cities can be reached, several with populations of over 100,000.

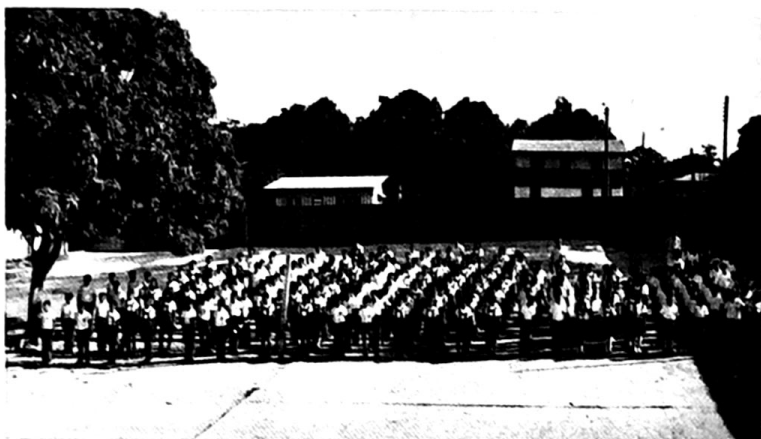

The work here is doing much better. We are just about back to normal. Our attendance is coming back up, and the Lord is blessing. Today school is in its last trimester, and we will be glad to see this year finished. Looking forward to the new year and many more students and a better teaching staff. We hope to start a kindergarten next year.

We have the lot cleaned off again, and hope to start the building in San Fernando soon. We've been putting it off, thinking we would get the truck in to help with the hauling material and men. We also had lamps stolen last Sunday afternoon. We sure

didn't expect that to happen in the middle of the afternoon. New lamps cost \$95.00 a piece, which means almost two hundred dollars for lamps.

The Liberty Baptist Church is doing real good. I preached for them at their open air service yesterday. Several saved. Our choir also presented a special number in song. They sure looked nice with their uniforms on, and they sing. Thank the Lord for them.

Bro. Saurino says that the work is coming along very good in San Francisco. I am hoping to visit them soon. I am working on a large chart, "The Trail of Blood," and hope to teach it here a week, and then in San Francisco a week. Hope that the Liberty Baptist will ask me to teach it there also. We are going to ask for copies of the Trail of Blood, you might like to help with the expense of these.

My brother Ira is to have open heart surgery the 17th of October. Would like to ask each of you to pray for him, and especially his family. Thanks.

The construction of our new building is virtually at a standstill as we are forced to wait for the delivery of the 1" steel rods



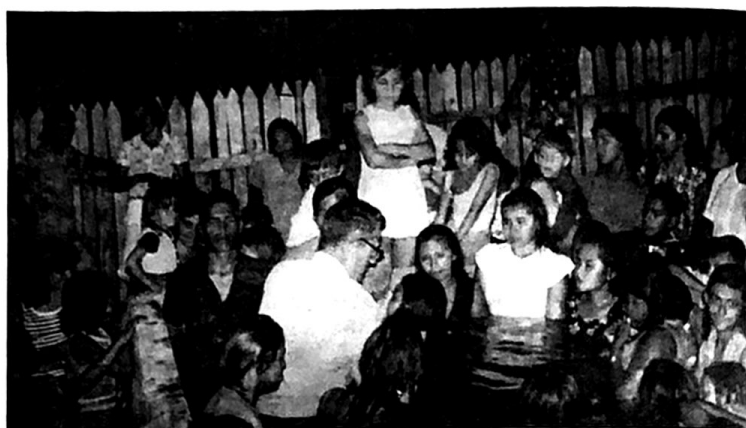

Time continues to rush into eternity and yet thousands here in Korea have never heard the saving Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ; and many who have heard have never heard the truth on the Local N.T. Baptist Church as well as many other precious truths. Sometimes I wish I were many persons rather than one because there's so much to do over here and so few that really take a real stand on the doctrines of the Word of God to get the job done. I many times wonder if some who read our letters monthly have not received the call to come but haven't said; "Here am I Lord, send me". The fields are white and ready for harvest, who will help us harvest these precious souls? We've had another good month in the Lord's work. In fact we've been so busy it hardly seems possible that another month has gone.

By the time you read this M.S. letter it will be time for the Thanksgiving Conference and how I pray it will be used of the Lord to encourage, call others, and bring in more

finances so God's work won't go lacking.

My wife is busy teaching our two oldest children at home. Having had no previous experience at such she seems to be doing a good job and they seem to be learning well. Pam, our oldest child is allergic to several different things so we are having to send to England and get medication. She will have to have shot once a week for a year.

Language school is O.K. I'm studying five days a week. Brethren, you don't get this language as easy as other languages.

The church continues to grow both in number & spiritually. We baptized two men and a 19 year old young man last month. The mission has been down some but is going well. The Bible College is coming right along. Some students have already dropped out but the others are really learning, which thrills my heart. I checked on another village with 175 houses and no work of any kind, pray with me about this village that if it is of God we'll start a work there within the next month. Pray for Bro. Choi's wife, she was struck by a Korean Army Jeep, breaking her arm, cracking the bone in her leg & possibly losing her baby, as yet, they are not sure if she lost the baby.

We thank God almost daily for you who pray and give toward our efforts here in Korea.

Dear Brethren,

We had six days of special preaching Sept. 15-20. We had good crowds but no moves made, however the 21 of Sept. we had four professions of faith. We are finishing the S.S. rooms that we built last year (plastering, new floor and painting). One man from the church did a job for a company in Sao Luis, and they paid him good and he gave all that he received to building fund and this is what we are buying material with. To God be all the glory. The days are so busy as I have trips into the interior and also working on the church. I have learned to plaster walls, something I had never done before.

We have some bad news to report and that is gasoline went up to \$1.50 per gallon and will rise in Dec. again. This makes it hard as we need gasoline to travel to make trips to preach the gospel to the poor. We

may return to the horse and buggy before it is over, but I am ready to preach the Gospel as much as in me is, even if it means walking or by any means that I may be able to travel.

I believe this has been the busiest month that I have ever seen since being here in Brazil.

Mary Ellen and Jonathan are home this week from The Fortaleza Academy where they live and study, and as always we are glad for them to be home as they are away for two months at a time and we get to wanting to see them by the end of two months.

June is some better and she is busy losing some weight that she needs to lose.

May God bless each one is our prayer, and we need your help more than any time.
