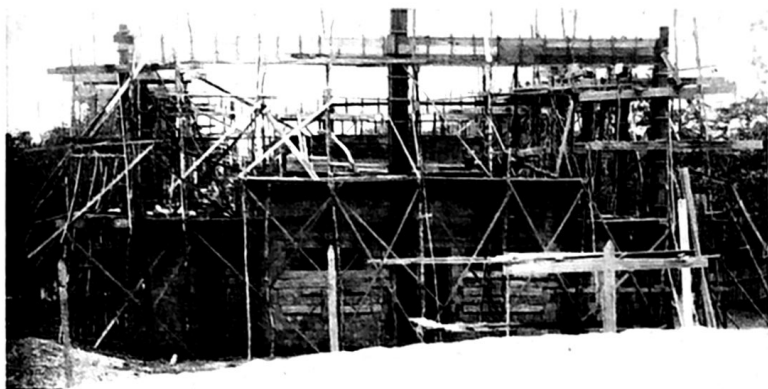

### Seven Days Revival At 25th Of Dec. Bap. Church Far Interior With 34 Professions And 12 Baptized . . . 101 In S. S. . . All Walked To Church . . . Pastor Is A Layman Who Farms For A Living . . . Requests Offerings To Finish Church And Buy A Car

Dear Brethren,  
The attendance at the 14th of December Baptist Church has been down these last few Sundays—only 230 in Sunday School yesterday. Pray for us that the attendance will increase.

Good news from the 25th of December Baptist Church. This church is an interior

church at the side of a creek some two days by boat from Manaus, near Codajás. Stephen and I visited the church and I held a revival there for 7 nights this month. The Lord gave me the blessing of baptizing 12. Besides the 12 baptized there were 34 professions of faith. There were 101 in Sunday School. Each night we fought the mosquitoes. The lights were poor but the Lord blessed. Everyone that came had to walk, some for almost an hour. The pastor of the church is a layman who farms for a living. His corn fields that are far from his house are often visited and raided by bands of monkeys. Remember that little church in your prayers. Four services were held away from the church—three in homes, one in the Codajás Baptist Church.

Please read carefully the following suggestion: I suggest and ask that each

reader of the Mission Sheets send in an offering for one of, or better still, both of our urgent needs—the completion of the building (we are now underway in the construction) of the 14th of December Baptist Church and a car for us. Since arriving home from the interior I have not driven the jeep. It lacks one license which would give me permission to drive it for another month or so. To obtain the license for the new year, several hundred dollars would have to be spent on it before it could be licensed for 1976. It is so old that it would not be wise to spend that much on it. I am going to do the following this month and, the Lord willing, for nine more I will send a check to the treasurer (you'll find his name and address in the Mission Sheet you are reading) for \$30.00 made to B.F.M. from Harold, Marie, and Stephen, designated for the "Bratcher Building." Will you do the same—send \$10.00 or more for one month or more? I'm going to pray for 97 of you to do so and for 100 more to send \$10.00 or more per month for the Bratcher car. In the name of the Lord we thank those of you who have already given and by faith we thank the 197 who will respond to our present plea.

Pray for us whether you send in an offering for us or not.

The Lord continues to bless. We certainly are not worthy of His many blessings. We have the new addition going again. Also getting the new baths hooked up and ready for the new school year. We only have another month of this year to go. We are glad in a way to see it finished, looking forward to a much better year next year.

The rains have started and that sure slows us down here. This mud is something else. It is just impossible to get around when it rains like it has the past 3 days. We really need the four-wheel drive pickup that is still sitting in New Orleans. Still don't have any word on the liberation to bring it into the country. Wish you would make this a matter

of prayer with us. We must do something soon. The work in San Fernando Mission is doing real good. We have had a new family come for baptism, but they first have to get married legally and that really takes time here. We still don't have anything done on the building. We have the lot cleaned off and have the word that we can build. So hope that next month we'll be able to report some progress.

Preached last Sunday afternoon for the brethren at Arenal in their open air service at the big plaza. Had a good service, two came professing faith in Christ. They have also asked me to teach the Trail of Blood, and I am really looking forward to being with them. Pastor Saurino at San Francisco has also asked me to come and teach it. I have the chart just about finished. Really have my work cut out for me, just need a few hundred books THE TRAIL OF BLOOD, or I should have said EL RASTRO DE LA SANGRE.

I forgot to write last month that we were praying for the Thanksgiving Conference and now it will be history when you get this letter. Anyway we're praying that it will be the greatest ever. Just wish I could be there and hear the brethren preach. May the Lord bless you all.

### Time, Manpower, Finances And Language Holds Us Down . . . Fifteen Are Now Tithers . . . Bought Ground And House For Another New Mission . . . Hard At Work Studying Korean Language

Dear Brethren,

The longer I live in Korea the more I see that the Truth has scarcely touched this country. I see so much needing to be done but as usual, time, man-power, finances and language holds us down.

God has given us another good and profitable month. Our attendance over all has been

good; the people who are saved seem to be growing in the Lord, but as usual one here and there is either backslidden or never been saved. At the church here in Seoul we've had several saved, but none baptized, however some are awaiting baptism. Our people here at the church after a couple of messages on tithing have begun to take hold. Last month we had about fifteen (15) tithers, which is the best number-wise of any month since the churches existence.

I wrote you a month or so back to pray about a lady who was to be baptized at our Too Mill Mission but because of all the family being Buddhist her husband would not permit it. Well, God heard your prayers and gave her courage and grace so Brother Chong baptized her and four more at the mission this month.

I also asked your prayers about starting another country mission. God also heard those prayers and we started a new work. I preached a week-end meeting with approximately forty (40) responding for salvation and after counseling with them fifteen (15) said they had been saved. We have bought ground and a dwelling house which we'll do some work on converting it into a church building.

Between the three works, the Bible School and Language School we're kept quite busy

but pray with me that by next summer the Lord will somehow open up a way so we can start another work here in Seoul; He has already given me the preachers; praise Him for that. Also continue to pray for my wife as she's teaching our two oldest children in our home and probably the three year old in kindergarten next year.

This past month I have received good reports, from the brethren in Peru. We thank God for faithful men who are carrying on the work. One of our pastors has resigned, to work in the mountains, as he feels that this is the Lord's will for his life. However, the Lord always raises up others to carry on. This month there will be two men ordained to the ministry. One will replace the pastor of the fourth church of Iquitos, the other to work in the mission of the fourth church of Iquitos, the other to work in the mission of the fourth church at a place called Atun Cano. This place could be organized, even now, as they have several baptized in this place. Then the 5th mission, a mission of the First Church of Iquitos, is to be organized the 2nd of December. This will mean that we will have five organized churches in the city of Iquitos. We also have another mission, a mission of the Second

Church, in the city, which is growing and one day, it too will be organized into a New Testament Church. This makes us rejoice, that God is still working, establishing His kind of churches, even in this place. How we thank and praise Him.

Since last writing, we have visited the mission from Bryan Station Church, located in Winchester, Ky., Brother Hancock is the pastor. Meadowthorpe Baptist, Brother Wayne Hart, pastor and the Bryan Station Baptist Church, Brother Gormley is pastor. We thank the Lord for each church and pastor, for the privilege of being invited to speak and present the work, and recount how God is working in Iquitos and on the rivers, in Peru. We have also visited friends in North Carolina and Arkansas this past month. We look forward to the conference, in interest of Baptist Faith Missions, this next week praying that it shall be the greatest yet, for the honor and glory of God, that the mission work might grow and we that labor will be able to carry the gospel to yet others who have never heard.

This has been a good month. God has answered many of our prayers. Satan is giving opposition to the new work. Although far from home the news of God's blessings in the schools and church has been wonderful. One lady, who has had leukemia, taking blood transfusions every week, seems to be cured. Her body is again producing red blood cells. Her doctors cannot believe it. Greater yet was the conversion of this woman's mother. Seventy-four years old and a "died in the wool" idolater. Mrs. Hatcher has visited many times and shown her the sin of her idolatry and pointed her to Christ. This month she was saved. Her daughter wrote us saying, "after mother publicly professed faith in Christ, it was an emotional experience to see her upon arriving home that morning, take her rosary, her idols, and her indulgences and destroy them. Then she took her pipe which she has smoked since a girl and broke it."

She is so happy with Jesus, her regret is not to have trusted him long ago."

After leaving Manaus, for about a month, a letter from Paul came telling us that sixty-students had professed faith in Christ. God is so good. Here in Garca we finally found a small Baptist Church, without pastor. While making plans and trying to get a building God has given us the opportunity to preach every Sunday except one. A building which will seat about 250 persons has been rented in a neighboring city, called Galia. A large bank building has been contracted right in the center of Garca, seating capacity 400-450 persons. However, Satan has caused the owner to seemingly want to back out of the deal. Cleaning up the building had already started. We will know today or tomorrow for sure about the building.

On the 20th the long trip back to Manaus will begin, about 2,500 miles. There plans will be made for conference in January and after the conference we will return here, the Lord willing. Out of 571 counties in this state, 300 have no Baptist work. What will we do about it?

A grandmother in her 70's came to live with her daughter in Manaus. She was a very devout Catholic and follower of "Our Lady" Virgin Mary. She was invited and witnessed to by her daughter Mrs. John Hatcher some weeks back. She became so upset and angry when hearing the gospel she would leave the room and later come back. She came one time to church, but the following week "Our Lady" revealed to her new truths in the Catholic Church??? The Grandmother then

declared that the Bible must be wrong because it conflicted with the Virgin Mary's revelation. For two months she would not come to any church service.
