Another Baptist Church Organized In Iquitos, Peru

The FIFTH BAPTIST CHURCH, IQUITOS, PERU, has been organized in Iquitos, Peru. This new church has her own building, built by James Kissel, and her own native pastor. This makes a total of ten Baptist Churches of Baptist Faith Missions in this area under the care of Missionary James Kissel. Read his letter in this issue.

The Compensa II Baptist Church

The COMPENSA II BAPTIST CHURCH has been organized in Manaus, Amazonas, Brazil. This new church has her own building and native pastor. This makes a total of eleven Baptist Churches of Baptist Faith Missions in this city. Baptist Faith Missions now has a total of 50 Baptist Churches, 1 in Honduras, 1 in Korea, 16 in Peru and 32 in Brazil. There has been twenty or more churches, some taken by the convention and some died over the years. But the work of Baptist Faith Missions continues to Go, and Grow and Glow. It is not a sin to be efficient in mission work. To God be all the glory.

Sunday JAN. 25, 1976 In Manaus, Amazonas, Brazil

James Hamilton preached to Tabernacle Baptist Church, Manaus, Amazonas, Brazil (Paul Hatcher, pastor) and they had 337 in Sunday School. Wayne Brickner preached to Fourteenth of December Baptist Church, Manaus, Amazonas, Brazil (Harold Bratcher, pastor) and they had 340 in Sunday School. Edward Overbey preached to Peniel Baptist Church, Manaus, Amazonas, Brazil (Julio Dantas, pastor) and they had 163 in Sunday School. A total of 840 in Sunday School in three churches.

Janauaca Baptist Church, Amazonas, Brazil

The ten who went from the U.S. to the Manaus Conference, on Monday, January 26, went by boat seven hours up the Amazon River and inland to Janauaca Baptist Church on the bank of a beautiful lake, Miguel Ibernson, pastor. Pastor Ibernson baptized nine in the lake and Hafford Overbey preached to about 400 people inside and outside the building. Nine large boats, like busses, and many canoes tied up in front of the church. One man made profession of faith. The work of Baptist Faith Missions goes on. To God be all the glory.

900 Students In Baptist School, Manaus, Amazonas, Brazil

900 boys and girls heard the gospel every day, five days a week, and 150 made professions of faith and many of those were baptized and are now members of the Baptist Churches in Manaus. To God be all the Glory.

Tabernacle Baptist Church, Manaus, Amazonas, Brazil

The concrete ceiling of the second story of this church has been poured. This church when finished will seat about 500 people and Harold Bratcher hopes to have more than 500 in Sunday School. It is estimated that it will take about \$15,000.00 to finish this building and put a wall around the lot. May the Lord lay it on the hearts of pastors and churches to take this on as a regular monthly project and give so that Brother Bratcher can get this church building this year.

Gibb's Church Building, Huanuco, Peru

The pastor and Twelve-Ryan Baptist Church, Warren, Michigan, have taken this on as a regular monthly project and have been giving \$1,000.00 a month (some months more) for the past eleven months, and plan to continue to do so, the Lord willing, until this building is finished. We pray that many other pastors and churches will take on one or more of the building projects and give special offerings towards them till they are finished. This will pay great dividends in rewards.

Turner's Building, Cuiaba, Brazil

Several thousand dollars are needed to finish this new church building. Please pray and give till it is finished. Richard Turner also needs a car. Picture yourself as a pastor without a car. There is, as of now, \$1,147.17 in this fund. It will take about \$5,000.00 to buy a nine passenger VW van type car. Take this on as a project and give so that he can have a car.

A Car For Paul Hatcher

Paul Hatcher is pastor of Tabernacle Baptist Church, director of the Baptist Schools and Seminary and the printing ministry, in Manaus, Brazil. Like his father he never asks for anything for himself. He is paying stiff monthly payments on a used VW "bug". With about \$1,000.00 down and about \$200.00 a month he could buy a new VW "bug". Please pray and take this on as a project so he can have a car.

New Work In Other States Of Brazil

John Hatcher is moving 2700 miles south of Manaus, and starting from scratch a new work in two cities. He has rented a house to live in, and two buildings for missions and after 20 years in Manaus, Brazil he plans his greatest work yet in starting new churches in other States of Brazil. Take this work on and give regularly to it each month. There is no end to carrying out the great Commissions, til Jesus comes.

Things To Remember

Remember all the mission work of Baptist Faith Missions is by church authority. All offerings are used 100% in mission work. No directors of Baptist Faith Missions get any pay out of mission offerings. No cars, boats, nor supplies of any kind are bought and given to missionaries for them to sell and pocket the money when they quit as a missionary. If a missionary quits then the things are used by another missionary, or if sold, the money is put back in the mission treasury to buy for others to use. No time (18 months more or less on the average) is spent doing debutation work at an average cost of ten thousand dollars, more or less, to raise salary and expenses. Missionaries of BFM go out on faith and start learning the language and doing mission work and in some cases have a church organized, by the time they would have spent in doing debutation work. We believe the Faith way is the best way. Romans 4:16 says: "It is of faith, that it might be by grace, to the end the promise might be sure--".

A Suggestion By A Missionary

While we were in Brazil at the Manaus Conference, one missionary said: "If each pastor whose church supports the mission work of Baptist Faith Missions would tell other pastor of the work and get him to lead his church to support the mission work of Baptist Faith Missions, we would have enough money to finish the projects now in progress and to spread out and do more mission work, etc."

I am wondering how many of you individual readers joined us in the month of December and sent in \$10.00 or more for at least one of our two urgent needs.



For the first time in the nine years we've made trips to Manacapuru, we went by car in the new car. Brother John Hatcher made the trip with us, going on the next day to Campinas, and preached that night (Dec. 16) in the service. We (Marie, Stephen & I) spent the rest of the week (returning Saturday morning) in Manacapuru. I preached Wednesday & Thursday nights and then Friday performed the wedding for a young couple of the Mission.

We had a good day last Sunday with more than one victory: Once again may it please the Lord to touch your heart to help us heartily in the Lord throughout this new year.

The Manaus Bible Conference has come and gone. May it please the Lord to bless the messages and the fellowship of the conference to His honor. During the Conference there were about 30 preachers who attended some or all of the conference.

The students were good with about 400 to 450 at the night services. The visitors from the States were with us for six days. Their visit was a blessing and our regret is that due to the time and activities we were not able to care for them as they deserve. During the conference, on the second night the Seminary had its graduation service and there were six persons who received their diplomas. On Monday after the conference the visitors were taken on a trip into the interior for a visit to the Janauaca Baptist Church where Miguel Thomson is pastor. There nine persons were baptized, there were about

400 persons in the night service and Brother George Dean kidnapped about 500 "Ligados". At the airport he was well having an "accident". On Tuesday the brethren were able to visit many of our mission points and see the church buildings here in Manaus and then in the afternoon see some of the sights of the city. On Tuesday night an added blessing was given us in having part in and witnessing the organization of a new Baptist church, the (Congregação) 21 Baptist Church. The church was a mission and organized out of the beautiful catholic Baptist Church. The pastor of the beautiful catholic church is a teacher in the schools and a graduate of the Seminary and the new pastor of the new church received his diploma from the Seminary during the conference. The new trimester of Bible College started again Jan. 12 with some 300 students who are eager to learn, pray with us that we shall be able to give them what they really need in the service of the Lord.

The church here in Seoul is doing well, our attendance is steady and a good attitude in the work. We have church till the last Sunday night of June and the last Sunday night of December, persons not having

attended, unless providentially hindered, are disciplined so we had to discipline five for non-attendance. We also had several professions of faith for the month and several moves for other reasons and baptized four, one being Bro. Chong's mother, our country pastor she had been a Buddhist all her life.

The Doi Mill Mission is about the same, our grandmother who has never heard the gospel came to the mission, was saved, and now is awaiting baptism.

The Kwang Han Ri Mission (the last country mission) is showing signs of concern and interest. We re-worked the house which we had purchased. Bro. Chong and another young man from the Doi Mill Mission built some benches so things are going quite well there. The 12 prong (1 prong is 6 x 6 ft.) room is packed almost every Sunday for Children's Services and interest is being shown for the adult service also. Several have made professions of faith here, pray that they will soon submit for baptism.

Thanks to those of you who gave so we could purchase this last mission property and especially we thank Bro. Art France and the First Baptist of Algonac, Mich. and the Faith Baptist Church of Wauseon, Ohio. These two churches gave most the money to buy this last property.

We thank God for all you who pray, give and stand with us as we try to serve our dear Lord, but you know, a note from you once in a while sure would encourage us.

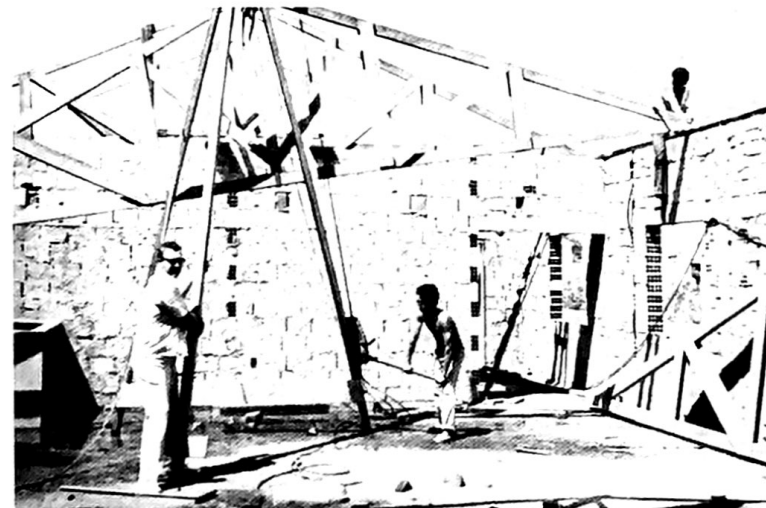

Ricardo, who is pastor of The Baptist Church at Peritoro, preached a six day meeting at The Villa Maranhao Baptist Church. Bro. Satu is the pastor. I led the singing and Bro. Ricardo did a good job preaching and the crowds were real good but no moves were made. This church has suffered much as the former pastor fell into sin, and later he died, probably as a result of the sin in his life. Brother Satu has studied three years in our Bible Institute and is a good sound Baptist and the Lord has given him a good faithful wife to help him.
