Dear Brethren,
Another good month. In the Woodland Church, 2 professions, 1 baptised 3 for them. Average attendance up again to the 40's. In the Ayestas Church they had 5 professions, 8 baptised and attendance up to the 70's. In the new mission in Pradera we had 2 professions, 3 baptised, two waiting baptism and 3 by letter from other Baptist Churches. Our attendance out there is a steady 50 in all services. \$29.00 offerings for month (none of me or my family). That is real good offerings for here in a new work. We are teaching articles of faith in S.S. and I have been teaching "Trail of Blood" on Thursdays with a big chart I



had made. Hope to finish in 2 more Thursdays. Work all over is looking up.

I visit 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. Tuesdays and Wednesdays for Woodland Church, and Fridays at Pradera same hours and one morning in Ayestas weekly. My wife helps me in Pradera with this. She also has visited and has several interested in the area we live in. She works also. Mary, our daughter, plays for the services and Kathy teaches the small children and my wife teaches the women and I the men in Pradera. I still preach Wednesdays at Woodland Church. My wife also does so much of the business when I am busy now that she drives. She drives wonderfully.

In closing, would you pray very much with us about starting a new work here in the area we live in. There are no houses to rent at present and if there was they would not be suitable for preaching, etc. One would

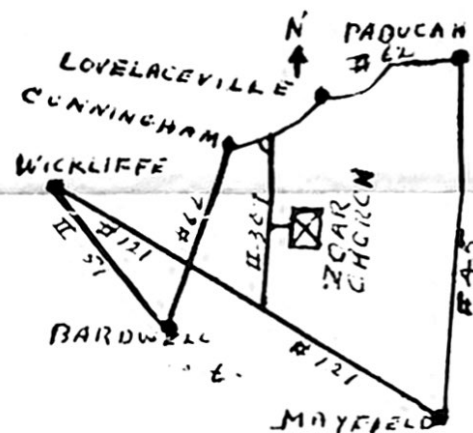

Dear Brethren,
We have just finished two weeks of the new school year, and with all the paper work it is a time of hard work. We have less students this year and a real financial burden, but we are praying that the Lord will see us through the year. Pray with us about the work, and help us. Teachers' salaries raised almost 30% and the tuition has to stay the same, so you can figure out the rest.

The Lord has blessed the work here this past month. We have baptized every Sunday night but one. The Liberty Baptist Church also used our baptistry, and we have baptised several for our mission in San Fernando. We have a family who will be getting married Friday and others to baptise Sunday night. There was a young man came to me after the service Wednesday night and asked what he had to do to be saved. It was a joy to show him the Scripture and show him Christ. He also asked when he could be baptized.

Our work at the mission is doing very good. The brother that surrendered to preach during our teaching on the Trail of Blood, Brother Sauturno Matos, has been doing the preaching the past few weeks, and the Lord has blessed in the work. We have been hauling dirt to fill the floor for the new building, and the brethren have been helping on Monday and Friday nights. We hope that we can finish the building by just using the help of the brethren. It will take a little longer this way, but we believe they will appreciate it much more. The ladies have been taking food and something

to drink, and we have made it more than just a worknight. A good time of fellowship. We thank the Lord for the people He has given us. We are happy in the work and only hope that we'll be able to continue here. Things sure don't look too good at the present, politically speaking.

We still don't have any worker for the New Mission in San Juan. We pray the Lord will give us someone soon. We like to close by saying, Brethren, pray and give while the door is open. It may be later than you think. May the Lord bless and use you, is our prayer.

Weather Much Cooler Than In Manaus . . . Attendance Up And Down In New Missions . . . Five Minute Daily Radio Broadcast

Dear Brethren,

After living in Manaus for over twenty years, it is strange to live in a place where you get chilled enough to shiver. The temperatures have gotten down to 58 degrees and our highs have been around 80 degrees. Alta has had her side of the electric blanket on several nights. Interesting enough none of the houses have heating systems of any kind. The cold weather does not stay long so everyone just bundles up in their sweaters and coats. Our coldest time of the year is in June and July when the temperatures are the hottest in the United States. This is because the north pole tilts more toward the sun which makes it warmer to the north of the equator and that puts us farther away or makes our sun rays more indirect and so while we sweat we shiver. Our attendances have been like the temperatures, up and down. Our attendance in the city of Galia

has had a high of 34 and a low of zero, and that is cold in anybody's Baptist service. In Garca there has not been any service without someone attending. Sunday there were five visitors for the first time. One couple had a little boy about two and one-half years old who just about took over. Our auditorium almost looked like one of those saloon scenes when all of the chairs are broken and the tables are up set. That is a slight exaggeration, but very slight. One five-minute-a-day radio broadcast seems to have a very favorable reception. The other day while paying for material in a lumber-yard office, the girl had her radio on and I asked if she had ever heard our program and she replies, "Every day, I never miss it." We, my family and I, are in the process of distributing, from house to house in Garca and Galia, 6,000 tracts with information about our services and an invitation to attend. Remember to pray for us in a State where there are 300 counties which do not have any Baptist work. The population of the State of Sao Paulo is 20,000,000, almost one-fifth the of population Brazil.

The pastor of the Third Church made two trips this month. One to San Pedro, where there were two professions of faith and three were baptized. We once had a church there and the people are wanting to begin to have regular services. The pastor of Tamshayacu Church reports one baptized into that church. I baptized one into the Second Church from their mission of Tupac Amaro.

The needs here are so many, there are so many places to go. I am interim pastor

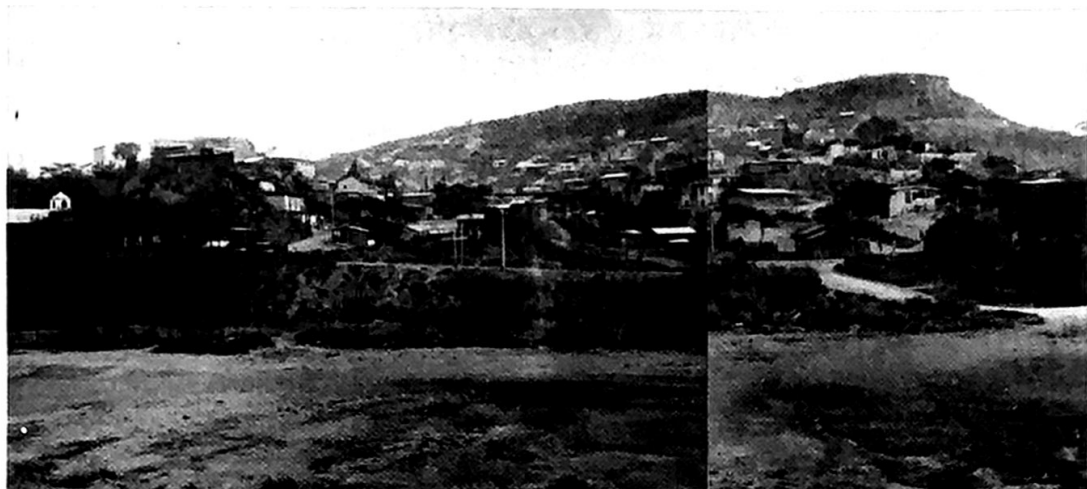

of the Second Church until their pastor is able to again take over. He had an operation in Lima in April and had been sick a long time. The electricity in the city is getting worse instead of better. We have had to go back to kerosene lanterns in the Second and the Fifth Churches. Before, a lantern cost about \$25.00 but now they cost \$150.00 and are not good. This week I had to buy one myself, in order to have some kind of light. We need a portable generator, which costs around \$300.00. These churches just don't have that kind of money. While I was home, thieves broke into the Fifth Church and took the organ. The termites have about destroyed the organ in the First Church, so that it doesn't play. Many of our buildings need repairs, but we lack money to do repairs on them. Money is hard to come by, as most companies have left and the oil boom is about over, with little oil.

We hope that each one will pray with us about these needs and give accordingly. May the Lord bless, each one.

As he sat down on our sofa he asked me what kind of work I did which gave me a good chance to witness to him. After about half an hour he said he would like to have a Bible. I did not have one at that time I could give him, so I told him that I would get him one and take it to his home at which time I would explain things better to him and his wife. I thought since they live on the other side of town perhaps it would be a little easier for them to get to Brother Turner's church, so I asked Brother Turner to make the visit with me. We made the visit and the Lord saved both of them. And the Lord did it all. They have been going to church with us and last Sunday night they took some friends with them. We thank the Lord for his mercy.

Dear Brethren,
This has, as usual, been a busy and overall very rewarding month. Our services here at the Shin-Nae Baptist Church have been steady. We've baptized five and several others have submitted for baptism.

The Bible College's new Trimester has started again but our attendance is off some. This time of the year is a very busy time for most Koreans working from early till late and one big factor is that Satan doesn't want strong Baptists in Korea and naturally is giving opposition in the school.

The Doo Mill Church is doing fine with seemingly spiritual growth; but being way back in the country one day is the same as another, so since this is a busy time of year for farmers, the attendance is down some, especially on Sunday A.M.

The Kwon Ba Ri mission is doing great. I've baptized nine there this month, took one man, a middle aged, by letter and one lady says she too has been a Baptist for some 20 years and wants to join. Others were saved during a week-end meeting there. Looks like this is going to be a good country work. One of our preach-boys is going up and taking care of the services

and one of our young ladies from Seoul is going up and teaching the children's Sunday School. We are having to move again next month with the rent going up and yet having to move into a smaller apartment also. In Korea unless one owns his own house he usually has to move every six months to one year. So we are getting a one year contract next time.

I mentioned before that I'd like to start another mission in Seoul but the factor is money. I know you brethren get tired of us missionaries wanting money, but with seven million people here in Seoul and I only have one church, the other church and mission are in the country. Some told me they would like to have a personal part in our mission work, even some who don't care for the way we're financed; Brethren, this is your opportunity, either monthly rent, or a good lump sum called K.E.Y. Money which is all refunded upon vacating the building. Pray about the Great Opportunity and do as God leads you.

Space is too short to give you our heart but we do thank you for your prayers, concern and support as we try to give of ourselves to our Dear Lord's Work.
