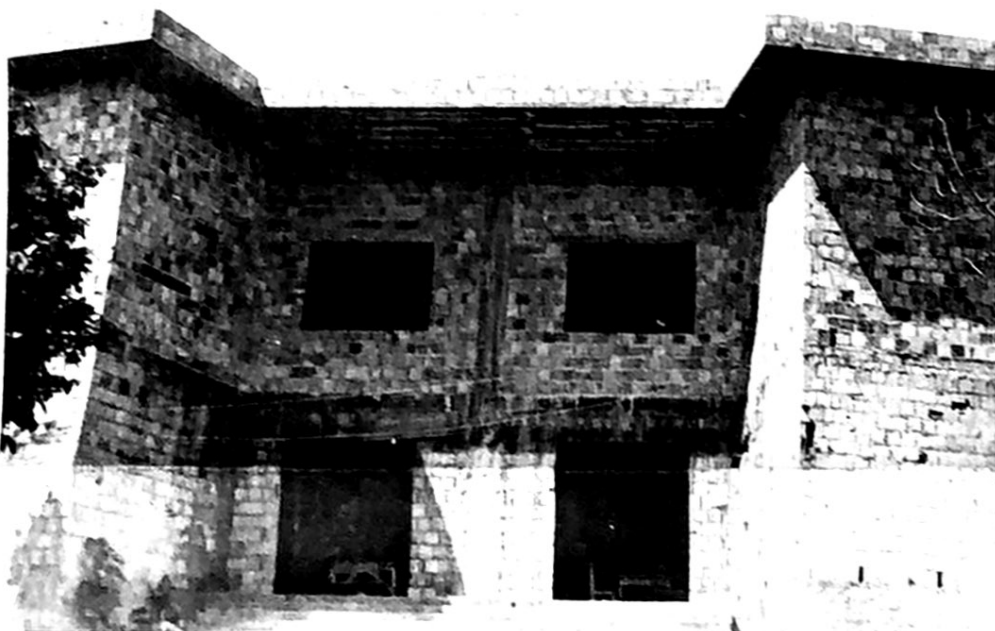

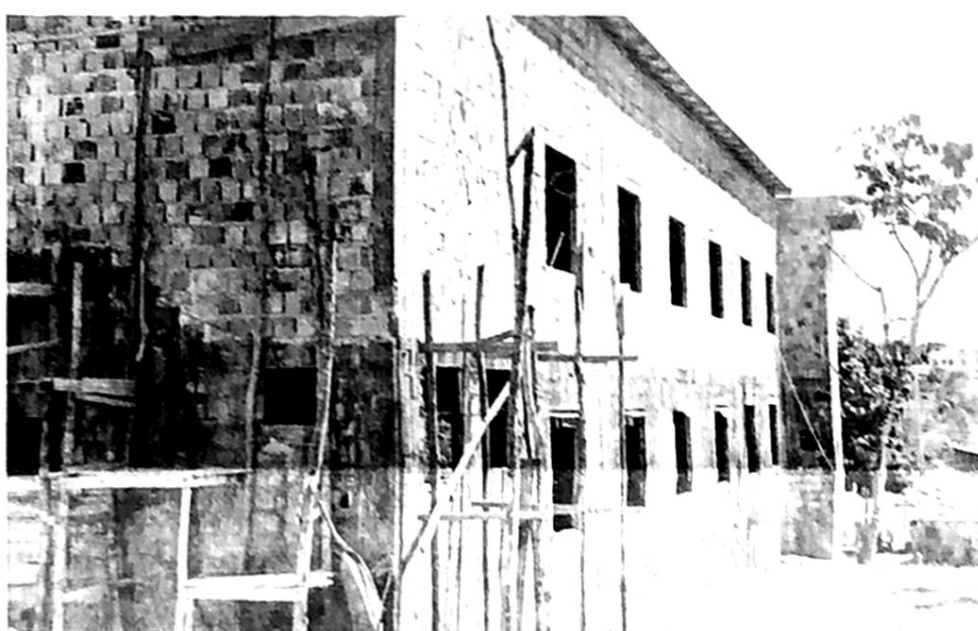

Dear Brethren,

On the morning of May 16 I preached for the last time for the congregation of Bro. Turner's and that night we listened to Bro. Turner as he brought the message. After the message Bro. Turner expressed his and the congregation's appreciation for the work that we had done there, after which they presented me with a very beautiful watch and for the first time in over a year in that congregation I was speechless. I have never been any more surprised in my life.

On that same weekend we handed out one thousand printed invitations in Varzea Grande announcing the week meeting to start off our new work there. I had had enough benches made to seat 150 people and asked Bro. Turner if we could borrow their chairs if we needed them. Well, we were in for another surprise. Besides all of those invitations I visited from house to house for four days and still almost no one came to our services. When the week came to a close we were glad it was over and were trying very hard not to be discouraged. On the last night we did have one lady come wanting to unite with us. She has moved here from another state. That same last night there was a family of five that attended that had seen our sign and came to hear. The lady of this family was saved and baptized just before moving

here from another state, so I took them home that night so that I would know where to visit them the next day or two. When I went to visit them they had moved and I could not find them. The next Sunday it rained and was cold and they did not come, but the following week three of the children were in Sunday School. I took them home again to find out where they had moved to. They have been coming ever since and almost always bring a visitor with them. Last night they brought a young lady with them that lives with them and although she had told them that she would never attend our services she did come and the Lord saved her that first night. The Lord also saved the two teenaged daughters of the family, so although almost no one came that I have visited the Lord has blessed our effort. Yesterday we had 18 in the morning service and 19 in the night service.

We have felt since starting the work in Varzea Grande that although we live only fifteen minutes away we could do a better job if we lived there in that city. We began to pray that the Lord would show us a house that we could rent there and soon there after without even looking, a very nice house was offered to us, but at a price we could not afford. We asked the owner if he would not come down on the rent, and believe it or not he did come down, so unless he changes his mind we will be moving within a month.

We surely could use a bus to good advantage in this work.

We finally got enough dirt hauled for the floor at San Fernando and now will be able to pour the floor. There were some 19 men and many children helping us on Monday and Friday nights. The building goes much slower this way, but we believe they will appreciate it just a little more. We enjoy working with the brethren. The Lord has given us some good members at the mission, and we hope to organize as soon as we have the new building done.

Here at the church we have baptized about every Sunday night, and have at least 4 to baptize tomorrow night. Hoping that we will have others. We thank the Lord that He is saving, and adding to the church. Continue to pray for us.

This is the best school year, even though we don't have as many students as last year, but our teachers are all faithful in attendance. I not only prepare the lessons for religion class but one Saturday each month I teach the teachers the lessons. Then I have been making out the examinations for the students I also get to preach to them all on Friday from 8 to 9. Would you mark this time and, if the Lord leads, pray for us at that hour. We are praying that the Lord will give us a great harvest of souls this year. So far it

 A young boy named Mark sat in our home and told us how he, by spiritism, broke up a young couple who was dating. A lady about fifty years old, whose husband is a retired bank manager, told us how she and her family talk with the dead. This lady has the highest ideals, morally, that one would expect to find.

There are three hospitals in the city of Garca, all of them are sponsored by spiritists' religion and organizations. On our way to Galia there is a voodoo work in front of one of the farms, no doubt an enemy is trying to bring a curse on the owner. Talking to neighbor, while working on the pick-up, (he was helping me) the conversation somehow got around to bees. He told me that some years back he had several hives with which he worked. The bees never stung him even though working many times with bare arms and no protection on his face.

"But," he said, "when my brother would come near they would attack him fiercely. It seemed as if they knew him." This statement was the result of believing that people, when they die came back in other forms of life, either to suffer or to bring vengeance on former enemies. While visiting the other day I was attended at one house by an elderly lady. Trying to impress on her the need of being saved, I remarked that if a person was wrong as how to be saved when they died, there was no more chance. She replied, "That is where I differ with you. God will send me back three, four, five, six, or seven times if necessary in order to purify me." My brethren, many of you have no idea what it is like to live among a people where there is no influence of the Holy Spirit and of the Gospel. Such a place is ruled by Satan and his demons. Will you remember to pray and supply as God gives us grace to invade the strongholds of Satan. The greatest challenge is before us. This is still part of the Holy War and the souls of men are in the balance.

The work in Tingo continues to do well. Dear brethren please pray earnestly that the Lord will raise up someone to begin a new work in Aucayaco. We will begin services there again within a few weeks but oh how badly we need someone with a pastor's heart to go there to labor.

The work in kilometer 70 continues to hold its own, but I am told that both Pastor Silvio and his people are discouraged in that they have not yet been able to build a building on their new property. At present they are meeting in one of the member's house.

Interest seems high and as I said before, I have never worked with any group anywhere that cooperates better. We have about \$300.00 saved from the offerings there toward buying a lot. The Woodland Church gave us the authority to use our own money as we were taking in more than we spent. Pray with us about buying a lot. In Ayestas they upped the attendance to the 70's and 80's and had 11 professions of faith this month and 5 baptized and 4 more to be baptized this Sunday. The pastor, Juan Linares really visits. In the Woodland Church, there were 2 professions of faith and I baptized 3 for them. So all is going along fine it seems for the moment. We thank God for it all. I visit some place everyday and preach most of the

nights. I have to always give thanks to God for my wife that helps me so much, more now than ever.

Deloris was very sick 2 days but is well again. All of us had a little flu I guess this month. I forgot to mention last month, we had our monthly fellowship meeting in Pradera and 113 present and then this month we had it in Ayestas and in spite of all day down pour and mud we had 87. We had rain here for 15 straight days and almost night and day, every day of it. Pray with us about the things we mention in these letters and I am sure God will bless us both for it. Thanks again for your support in anyway you do. May the Lord bless you all much.
