New Church Building Finished In Santo Tomas . . . Need Two More Buildings Like It Elsewhere . . . Pleas For Offerings To Build Them . . . Professions Of Faith And Baptisms . . . Prospects Of Another Church Organized Soon

Dear Brethren,
This past week we completed a small building, in a village, called Santo Tomas, with help from some of the brethren. On Monday of this week I began a week of meetings in the new building. We have had very good attendance, perhaps 100 to 150 each night.

We have had seven professions of faith. We realize that in a new mission we have large crowds and later it drops off, but we believe this place has great possibilities to have a sound church in the future. We had planned to paint the building, although it is rough cut lumber, but were unable to buy paint, due to a national holiday, when almost everyone paints their homes. This building was built mostly with our own money, which cost us about \$900.00. We

need at least two more of this type of building, at two places on the river. We pray that the Lord will lay it on the heart of some to give for this purpose, as it is a great investment, which will pay great dividends.

There have been two professions in the Fifth Church. I also baptized one into this church, as the young pastor is not ordained. There were two professions in Tamshayacu Church and one rededication.

This next week I am to go to a mission of the Fourth Church, at a place called Atun Cano, for a two day meeting. They also have some to be baptized. We hope to organize this mission into a church soon, also the mission at Santa Rita. The mission at Santa Rita has been a mission for some four years, but lacked a faithful leader, has not grown as it should have, but now they have more than 25 faithful members. We have a great need for a small generator. We trust that you will pray with us about this and give, if the Lord leads. May He bless each one richly.

This has been another exciting month. It has been wonderful to see God bless.

Here in the Tabernacle Baptist Church, a good portion of the month has been used preparing for an evangelism thrust in which my brother, John Hatcher, pastor of the Morgan Avenue Baptist Church, Evansville, Indiana, was the evangelist. The members of the church made the distribution of 14,000 personal invitations in our city in a two-week period. The results were heartwarming on the 14th and 15th-32 professions

of faith. During the week in the daily chapel hour 18 students also made professions of faith. This past Sunday there were 10 more professions, 4 for baptism, and 3 by letter. We have a total of 20, so far, to baptize Sunday. You can probably imagine the excitement generated by 60 brand new brothers eager to learn and grow. Some of the folks in the church who work eight hours a day and study in night school, turn out after 10:30 p.m. to work and prepare materials.

This month also was the kick-off for the preparation of Christian textbooks for the schools- something that is non-existent in schools in Brazil.

Rejoice with me! This month the 14th of December Baptist Church has received from the Lord not only "showers of blessings" but a downpour of blessings! Praise the Lord! On the 11th we reached a new high in Sunday School - 420. The average attendance for the month in S.S. also broke all previous averages - 341.

On Friday night, July 23rd (celebration of the 16th anniversary of the church) we held the first service in the auditorium or sanctuary on 2nd story of our new building. This will be our main auditorium from now on. One Thousand and thirty-six people filled the building! (Just a few had to remain standing during the service). I baptized 22 that night! I was

already in the baptism when a young married man of the church handed me two envelopes containing Cr \$2,070.00. In dollars this would be a little less than \$200.00 but for the young man I dare say it represents almost two month's wages. He explained that he promised the Lord he would give a special offering to the church if his little boy got well of a rare disease. Praise the Lord that the boy got well! Sunday night we finished an 8 day revival with some 32 decisions that were made.

We want to be able to finish the building and build a wall around the lot in the next eleven months, the Lord willing.

300 Homes Visited And One Came . . . 600 Tracts Distributed Weekly . . . High Of 36 In Attendance . . . Request For Earnest Prayer

Dear Brethren,
The weather here has been cold and dry. It has been three months since it has rained and most of the vegetation has dried up until it looks like fall and our services in our new work will just about match all of this. The soil here is dry and stoney and I doubt that it would produce anything. So far the soil in which we have planted the seed, the word of God, appears to be about the same.

I visited over three hundred homes before I got the first person to come but since then we have had a few new ones to come from time to time. We distribute around six hundred tracts per week in our house to house visitation and when a new one comes we try to find out where they live so we can visit them in their home. For the month of July we averaged 23.8 in all ser-

vices and so far this month we are down to 23.6 with most of these being adults. We would like to be able to report that several souls have been saved but this just has not been the case.

We still have not gotten moved to Vazzea Grande but at least the house is now empty and as soon as the repairs are finished along with the painting we will move, perhaps three more weeks.

I told the congregation on Wednesday night before my fiftieth birthday on Sunday that I wanted to see fifty people in services that day, one for each year that I had lived but, I had to settle for one for each year of how old I look, 36. We were glad to have that many.

We have set a goal for ourselves to be averaging fifty in attendance by the end of the year. We have a long way to go and in such a few months but, if you will make it a matter of earnest prayer we will be able to reach our goal.

Dear Brethren,

By the time you shall have read this letter, we shall have been on the field in Korea five years and my wife and I shall have been married fifteen (15) years. Five years in Korea and yet the surface has hardly been scratched; yet, we've seen several hundred professions of faith as well as approximately 300 baptized with two churches organized and buildings built and another mission with about 25 members and have a four night weekly college extension from Teay's Valley Baptist College of Hurricane, W. Va. Oh! there is so much to do and even though a lot of missionaries are here, few really take a Biblical stand in belief and practice. Despite all the pressures, this

past month has been a full and rewarding one. We had V.B.S. at all three works. Here at Shin Nae we averaged approximately 270 children; at the Doo Mill Church we averaged approximately 70 and at the Kyong Ba Ni Mission we averaged approximately 100 per day. Professions were made at all three works but I don't know just how many. I baptized eleven (11) at the Kyong Ba Ni Mission by flashlight this last month and three were baptized at the church here in Seoul. We also closed this Trimester at the Bible College with a Seminar on the Church and her ordinances which seemed to have been a real blessing to the church as well as the Bible College students.

Be much in prayer for us as we begin to get prepared for another Trimester. When school starts again I shall be teaching and preaching six (6) nights a week and sometimes seven.

Thanks for your prayers, concern, and support as we try to labor for our Saviour here in Korea.

This has been one of the hottest, driest months of all times here in Pucallpa. There has been a record in deaths also. We had a triple funeral yesterday. Two here and one in San Francisco. They still are expecting more as there were no less than 25 graves open, waiting for others.

We praise the Lord for good health, and the opportunity of preaching Christ, who is the only hope, and our salvation.

We have the roof on the new building in San Fernando, and are waiting the doors and windows. Two mornings we were on the job at daybreak to finish the roof. That is really a hot job. Soon as the sun hits the sheets of tin you can sure feel it. Thank the Lord that is past. Looking forward to preaching in the new building as soon as the windows and doors are done. We will paint the building and the finishing touches later. The brethren seem very pleased, and that makes it worthwhile. The Lord has blessed in our regular services. Three saved last Tuesday night, and Brother Roberto Bergerman preached last

Sunday night and two others. So the Lord continues to bless.

Here at the church the attendance is down, but I believe it is because we have put all our time in the Mission at San Fernando. Now that the building is about done we can work more here on the field. Our day school is better this year than it has been for several years. We have almost 300 students now, and others still coming. We have had to turn several away, because the classrooms are full. We now have city water, and that makes life just a little easier here. We thank the Lord for that. Many wells are going dry, and our well is very low. Before we got city water we had to pump two and three times a day, and many times no electric current to pump with. We appreciate you helping with the cost of the water lines and connections.

We have spent some time at San Juan this month. We are making a new sign and hope to put it up the next time. We have also asked the church in Tingo to give us authority to carry on the work through the church here. The church here voted to take on the work, and we're glad they are in accord.

Pray for us, as we pray for you, and may the Lord bless you all.

Annual Church Report . . . 433 Members Seven Days At Mission On River Urubu . . . Ten Professions And 4 Baptized . . . Three Weddings . . . Mission To Build Larger Building . . . Son Asa Mark Leaves For U. S.

Dear Brethren,

After writing the regular Mission Sheet letter on July 16th I wrote a special report letter which you can see in this issue of the MISSION SHEETS. We are still rejoicing in the Lord.

We share with you some excerpts from the Church's annual report (July 1, 1975 to June 30, 1976): Gains: Baptisms - 53, letter of statement - 9, restored - 3. Losses: letter - 11, exclusion - 17, by death - 3. Total members 433. Enrolled in Sunday School - Manaus only - 448. Average attendance - 268.

This month from the 7th to the 12th was spent with our Rio Urubu mission. I preached there 7 nights and then Asa Mark came from Manaus (four hours by car and then five by boat) and preached the last night. The Lord gave us some 10 decisions during the days spent there. Four of the ten were baptized and one was restored to fellowship. We were unable to baptize one dear brother because of his lack of being legally married. The last day of the meeting before the baptism, I performed three wedding ceremonies. After the baptism we held a business meeting. The mission voted to build a new building much larger than the present one. When the new building is built, I requested that the old building be kept for us to live in when we are visiting there. By faith we did so. Please keep sending the offerings designated for the Bratcher building in Manaus - the 14th of December Baptist Church - and we'll trust the Lord to give us the money here for the building on the Buzzard River.

Asa Mark is preparing to leave us at 2:00 a.m. tomorrow. He has been a blessing

to all of us in the work of the Lord this summer. He will be beginning his last year at the University of Kentucky. We ask your prayers on his behalf.

The work on the building continues at a slow rate. It would cause us to rejoice if enough offerings for the building would come in to enable us to give the order: "Full speed ahead."
