I had my first time to be ordered out of a Korean's Home this past month. I mentioned a lady who had been saved and was beaten by her husband and forbidden to return to the Kyang Ban Ri Mission or be baptized. We visited this lady, and her husband (a buddhist), told me to leave, but I did not leave until I had told him of the blood of the Lord Jesus Christ and then warned him of the wrath of God to come. Pray for the man and especially for his poor sick and depressed wife. Also pray for a young lady who made a profession of faith at the mission here in Seoul whose boy friend forbids her to come to church. I went and got her last week and saw nothing of the boy friend.

Brother Chong Sy Hyon reports no professions, or baptisms at the Doo, Mill Baptist Church, Brother Chong Nam Sop from the Kwang Ban Ri Mission reported no professions and I baptized none there last month. Brother Choi baptized two at Shin Nae Baptist Church last month with several professions of faith. I also baptized three here at the Faith Baptist Mission and had several professions.

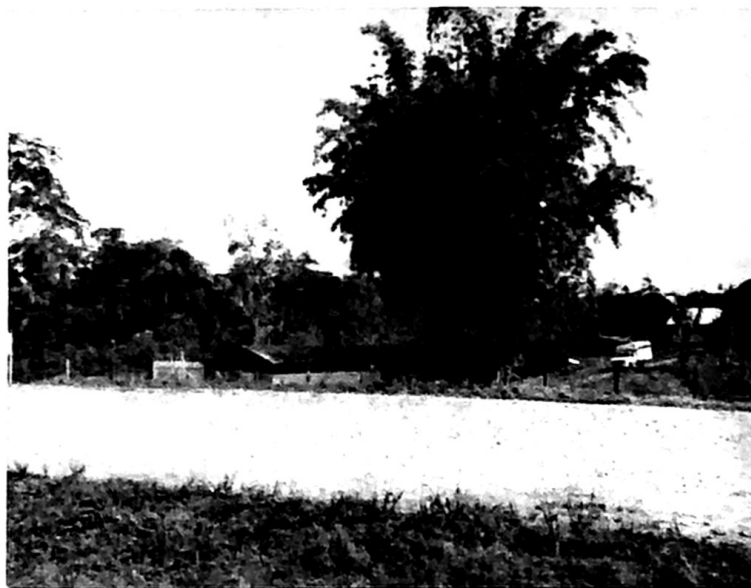

I think we will buy it as it is on the main street there in Anajatuba, and later try to get a building up. It is a big load for New Hope Baptist Church to buy a lot and build a building to meet in. Dear Brethren,
Brother Overbey requested - I'm fulfilling his request - that I present our need in connection with the building of the 14th of December Baptist Church, first, before I share with you the latest notices from the field. Brethren, to complete the building-windows doors, plastering, etc. and the building of a wall around the lot, we need at least \$8,500.00 and if the building is to be completed before we come home on furlough, we need it now. Only eight months of this our fourth term remains. As the money comes in, we'll continue the construction, which is almost at a standstill as we have already passed the safety limit not knowing exactly how much will be coming in neither here nor there in the States. Now, please read the rest of my letter as we have some good news to report.

The fifth Sunday of October was "Baptist Faith Mission's Day" in our church. All the offerings that

came in that day has been changed from cruzeiros to dollars and I trust the check is already in Brother Hamilton's hands. Rejoice with me that it was more than enough to liquidate the balance due on the "Bratcher Car" (see Financial report) and thus make it unnecessary for further pleas to be made for the "Bratcher Car fund."

I'm writing this letter as I travel homeward to Manaus. Since the third of this month I've been somewhere in the southwest interior of the Amazonas. For the first time I entered the waters of the Rio Madeiro, going beyond the town of Nova Olinda do Norte to a place called Olinda. The Lord gave us three professions of faith there. Except for two nights on the way back, the other days were spent in familiar places in the lower Amazonas between Itacoatiara and Manaus. The Lord gave us a total of 14 professions of faith and three new members received by baptism.

Brethren, we need your prayers as we have lengthened our cords, and strengthened our stakes. (See Isaiah 54:1-3). Pray that we will be used mightily of the Lord during the new year of 1977.

We are praying for the success of the Thanksgiving Conference.

A Good Encouraging Month . . . Five Professions In Galia . . . Aged Couple Profess Faith In Garca . . . Millions Who Do Not Know The Gospel

Dear Brethren,

This has been a good month and we praise God for His blessings. The number of persons attending our services remain about the same. Slight increase in the morning services in Garca. Mrs. Hatcher was visiting in the city of Galia. She went especially to visit to the mother of a young boy, 14 years old, who is crippled and who we bring to services. While Mrs. Hatcher explained the way of Salvation to the boy and His mother, the boy made a profession of faith. The next Sunday afternoon there were five children who made professions of faith, one being the sister of the crippled boy. Here in Garca, Mrs. Hatcher has been visiting an aged lady named dona Alice. Last week she went to see her. The lady had been sick and Mrs. Hatcher asked her how would it be if she were to die. When asked of her hope of eternity the lady replied that her hope was not very good, in fact, she had no hope. When Alta asked if she wanted to hear from the Bible how to be saved. She was most anxious and they

called her aged husband to hear also. He stood right at Alta's side and when his wife said to him, "Paulo, come over here and sit on the sofa." Mr. Paulo is a tottering old man. His reply was, "No, I want to stand right here where I will not miss a word." For almost two hours Alta showed the two old people the Saviour of the Bible. They had been Catholics but their hearts had never found peace. They became spiritualists and their hearts remained empty and alienated from God's peace. On this day the message of Jesus the Saviour was what they were waiting to hear. They had never read the Bible nor heard a Gospel sermon. God opened their hearts, and they trusted Christ. When Alta told us about their reception of the Saviour our hearts thrilled beyond measure. Does it really matter to you that there are millions who do not know the Gospel? Does it really matter? We could use 50 families just in the State of Sao Paulo where there are over 20 million inhabitants. Who will go? Who will send? May God move people in such a way that we would never have to receive another letter saying "expenses will have to be cut immediately in Garca or there will not be enough money to last until the Thanksgiving offerings."
