1976 A Great Year In The Mission Work

Six churches organized, two in Brazil, two in Peru, one in Honduras and one in Korea. Work started in other States with two missions in the far south of Brazil. Bible Conference in Manaus, Brazil with several from the U.S. in attendance. New record set in Manaus, Brazil school enrollment. New records set in Sunday School and church attendance. Turner, Bratcher and Gibbs church buildings nearing completion. New Missions started. Times of heartaches and times of testings. As of now we have thirty four churches in Brazil, seventeen churches in Peru, two churches in Honduras and two churches in Korea making a total of 54 churches. We thank God and take courage.

Bratcher's Church Building Damaged In Storm

Brother Bratcher's last estimate with a list of things to finish the church building and build wall around the lot was about \$11,800.00. A storm tore the roof off the new building and other damage adding to the cost to finish. Pray and give to finish by his furlough time in July.

Needs To Finish Gibbs Building

Brother Gibbs last report estimated that it will take about \$7,215.00 to finish the building. Pray and give as the Lord leads, so that he can finish this building and then move to Tingo Maria and be in the center of his work.

Turner Building Nearing Completion

Brother Turner reported that it will take about \$2,000.00 to finish his building and build a shed to hold tools, car, and furniture while on furlough. As the Lord leads, give to finish.

John Hatcher Wants To Buy Two Buildings For New Work In South Brazil

John Hatcher wants to buy the two buildings now rented for missions in Garca and Galia in South Brazil. Buildings will be costly, but no lots to buy and no buildings to build. God is able and has supplied some of his sheep with the money to buy these two buildings. Who will be the first?

George Bean Wants To Buy Lot And Build A Building For New Mission

He estimates that this can be done for about \$2,500.00. Pray and give for it.

December is the month when all goes down here. Cool weather and Christmas are the main reasons and perhaps sickness because of the cold. Woodland Church with its new pastor is the only one that shows increase. When he gets on the field (no house to rent) all will be better. In Ayestas even the attendance and offerings both down some, but there were 3 professions of faith and 2 baptized. I go out there one service a month now for four months. In Pradera we had a so-so month, down and up. Low of 37 in S.S. to high of 63. Nights up and down also. We had 2 professions. I was to baptize 2 Sunday but they forgot to fill the baptismity until



the water off, as is done here so often. I filled it on Saturday when I was up there in Woodland Church. I am to baptize now December 15 after the services there. So we wait on the Lord and am satisfied HE will take care of the results if we are faithful in preaching.

We would like to build as soon as possible in Pradera and we pray you all are praying with us about it. I now have a class on Fridays and we have Wednesday service now that I am out here and not all over in other places. Would you believe? It rained for our fellowship meeting even though December is not a rainy month. Deloris learned to drive a car (and good) at the age of 43 and now has learned to play the accordion at 46 and is good at it in just a few months. Pray for us as we do for you and may the Lord bless you all always.

Some of the work here continues to grow, while others have had reverses. For us, this has been the most difficult and trying, months on the field, yet the Lord has blessed in many ways.

The church at Tamshayacu continues to grow, more additions and do not have room to put the people. They have the poorest building of all the churches, but a good and faithful pastor, who works at the job. He not only pastors but does mission work as well. Our new mission at Santa Tomas reports five professions of faith this month. I baptized six into the Fifth Church, which continues to prosper. The mission at Atun Cano reports six professions of faith. There have been many problems with the pastor of the First Church, who fell into sin, but the church voted him out about two weeks ago, so they have called me to be their pastor. I am also pastor of the Second Church, but it is impossible to do justice to either place. We have had two saved and three reinstated in the Second Church this month.

I have been making repairs on several of the buildings and have hopes to build a new building for the First Church the Lord willing. This coming February will be the 40th anniversary of this church, which was organized by our first missionary here in Peru, Brother R. P. Hallum. We had planned to have special services, but plan to postpone them until a future date. We are thankful for each one who prays

for us and continues to help in the work here. May the Lord richly bless each one, is our prayer.

Dear Brethren,
As this year comes to a close we see that we have come far too short of what we would like to have accomplished this year. We set a goal of a fifty in all services by the end of the year and I am sorry to report that for the month of November we had the lowest average since way back in June. Last week I got to do a little visiting and Sunday morning we had 23 in a downpour of rain and then that night with good weather we had 43.

We had been hauling as many as twelve people at a time in our little subcompact, five passenger car, and that was just too many in a small very used car. As could be expected the repairs were constant. I wrote asking if the Mission would loan me \$2,250.00 to buy a new VW (Kombi) van. The Mission authorized the buying of the new car trusting that when you brethren heard about it the

money could be raised to pay for it. We have already bought the new one and it has been a blessing already. We can haul twenty without overloading it. I got \$1,100.00 for my old car and our congregation paid almost \$800 more still leaving a deficit of the \$2,250. Perhaps some of you would like to have a part in this, now is your chance.

We have not bought any property yet because a business man here told us that prices would be better after the first of the year. I still have a lot to do to help Brother Turner finish his building, so we hope by the time we get started there will have been enough money come in that we can go ahead and not have to stop until finished.

Betty is improved some in her health, but still has her bad days if she tries to do too much. She had a maid for a short time, but she didn't want to work although she was having to work only about a half day each day with no work on Sundays. She lasted only a little over two weeks. We would like to thank each of you that have remembered Betty in your prayers and for the cards wishing her a fast recovery.

After spending five weeks in Manaus I am good to be back in Cruzeiro do Sul. Although we ran a complete customs process for the boat trailer and motor, these have not been freed yet. We must await a legislative interpretation of donation law by the body that regulates importation. All is in the Lord's power and hands.

While in Manaus I preached at some of the churches several times and was able to help out on some special projects around the school. I stayed pretty busy, but it was still a long month. My flight from Manaus

was held over one night in Rio Branco. On take-off the next morning the jet's landing gear hit some cattle on the runway. This made it necessary for us to make an emergency landing. The landing was rough, but no one was hurt. I managed to get on a small single engine plane to Cruzeiro some eight hours later.

It wasn't difficult for any of the 60 people on that flight to decide who had protected us. I was seated with one of the more influential merchants and his wife. They asked me to pray and after we were safely on the ground it gave me a great time to witness to them and others. All said and done it was a profitable experience.

Roof Blown Off Building . . . 305 In S.S. . . Trip Up Amazon River To 25th December Baptist Church . . . 8 Days Revival With 13 Baptized

Manaus, Amazonas December 18, 1976

Dear Brethren,
Little did I realize that two days after writing the November Mission Sheet Letter in which I made the usual plea for offerings for the "Bratcher Building" that the roof of the "Bratcher Building" would be blown off by the wind. At about 10:00 a.m.

on November 20th during a rain storm, the roof was completely blown off. We estimate the damage to the building at about \$2,000.00. So we share with you the information and continue to ask you to pray for us and help us with your offerings designated for the "roofless" Bratcher Building.

The work at the church continues to go forward. We have at least eight waiting for baptism. The best attendance during the month was last Sunday - 305. That is a record for a Sunday when I was away. I asked the church to make a special effort in my absence to keep the attendance up, and praise the Lord, they did.

Mrs. Bratcher and I left Manaus at 6:00 a.m. Monday December 6th on a passenger boat. Our destiny was Codajas. We arrived there at 3:00 p.m. the following day. Tuesday night we visited and at the invitation of the pastor, preached at the Codajas Baptist Church. Wednesday we began an eight day revival with the 25th of December Baptist Church across the river from Codajas. The Lord gave us a good revival with 13 baptized and some 10 or 12 other decisions made during the revival. On Thursday after the meeting closed, we visited some of the members

who live some three hours on up the river and preached to 106 that night in the home of one of the members. That was the first time during the trip that we had preached to more than 100 people. This morning we arrived back in Manaus, safe and sound.

We pray the Lord's richest blessings to be upon you throughout the New Year. We thank the Lord for each of you who have been a blessing to us during 1976. Remember we just have some seven more months to go before furlough time. Pray for us that we'll be able to complete the building as well as other projects etc. that we want to do for the Lord during these days.

Dear Brethren,

Praise the Lord I'm out of the hospital and up working again. After 3 days of pain like I never felt before, I finally passed the kidney-stone that was blocking my urinary tract.

I got out of the hospital just on time to begin preaching a week long conference which was high-lighted by the ordination of Brother Pedro Aquino, pastor in Aucayacu; and Bro. Honorio Barreto, co-pastor with me here in Huanuco. Both men are married and each has 1 daughter.

After the meeting I went to Lima for more complete medical exams. X-rays confirmed earlier diagnosis of kidney-stones and revealed that I still have another large stone. The doctor is hopeful that it will pass and that surgery will not be necessary.

Brother Alberto Favian, pastor in Tingo Maria was blessed with his first child, a baby boy born the first part of December. Brother Honorio's baby girl was born today. Our 3 girls; Mary, Anna and Grace also had birthdays today.

We have had 3 professions of faith here in Huanuco, 5 in the new work in Huacar, and several

also in Aucayacu. Brother Pedro Oliva just preached a weeks meeting in Aucayacu. Attendance between 30 and 70.

The brethren in kilometer 70 still meeting in homes are quite discouraged due to lack of growth. Please pray for them.

Thanks to the Lord and also to the brethren of Ashland Ave. Baptist the roof in Aucayacu is now repaired and we are presently closing in the walls with the roof. We have been robbed several times by thieves who crawled in over the walls. The last time threatening to kill Brother Pedro and his wife.

The building here in Huanuco is at a standstill due to the need for special offerings. Please pray that we might be able to finish.
