

In five years he has organized two churches and built two new church buildings which are paid for in full. He has a mission to be organized into a church soon the Lord willing and has bought a lot for the third church building. This trip to Honduras was not made at Baptist Faith Missions expense.

Seems like things have never been busier or more fruitful.

We are now well into the rainy season, but the Lord has been giving us beautiful weather for all of our services. We had one service with over 250 and never less than 165 on Sunday morning. During the last two weeks in December we had special services and activities every night. Most of this time was spent working with the young people. Much of my preaching time has been dedicated to the teaching of the doctrines and functions of the local church, since this has been neglected here of late. In our Sunday services, which are more evangelistic, there have been ten people saved. Five persons were brought back into the fellowship and two persons joined by letter.

During the daytime I have been building steps down the 125 foot river bank getting ready for the river travel. The river still hasn't come up this year, but I want to be ready for it when it does. I finished the steps and also have the boat serviced and ready to go.

On those evenings when we aren't at church I have been working with the young preachers. I have been doing some teaching and trying to encourage them.

This past Sunday I spent the day with the Church at Maita. We had a packed house both morning and evening. I baptized 12 for the church there.



Dear Brethren,
December 25, Christmas day, one of the church missions at Compensa I, was organized with 57 members. The average attendance for the mission has been 160 in Sunday School. On the same evening, Brother Mauri Melo, the evangelist, was ordained as pastor, and assumed the church.

The church was named Cenacle Baptist Church.

Tabernacle Baptist Church presently sponsors seven missions and our hope and prayer is that several shall be organized into churches this year.

We thank God for the great year he has given in the ministry of his word here in Brazil.

In January 1976 the average Sunday School attendance at Tabernacle Church was 288 persons, and in December our average reached 406 persons. Over 200 persons made public professions of faith in the church worship services. The high day for the year reached an all-time high among all the Sunday schools of the state, with 950 present. In the month of December, 29 persons made professions of faith. All of these records exclude the growth and average of missions of the church.

In December the schools graduated 71 students. The Secretary of Education brought the commencement address; and the Governor of our state of Amazonas, who is a Baptist layman, brought the baccalaureate message.

Our school buildings are in construction, which will practically double our present floor space.

In January, we were with Missionary John Hatcher and preached in the Missions in the towns of Galia and Garca, preaching 17 times between the two. Thirteen persons professed faith. On the way back, after 24 hours of bus travel from Bro. Hatcher's, we

had the privilege to visit the missionaries Creiglow and Turner at Varsia Grande and Cuiaaba.

Wanda, Leigh, and I wish each church, pastor, and supporter a progressive and joyous year of 1977.

I would like to send a beautiful school calendar as a remembrance of the schools to all who write and request them.

Eight were baptized during our watch-night service, Dec. 31st. Please permit me to insert a historical reference. I baptized for the first time in my ministry in 1947 - the year of my ordination to the Ministry. 1976 is the record year in my ministry for baptisms. Pray with me that, if the Lord tarries another year soon will take its place.

The work of the construction continues. The roof is back on. As I write this letter in my study at the church, I can see Stephen and three others paint-

ing one of the class rooms. This week some of the young people have donated some hours of labor. If you continue to give to the Bratcher Building fund we will continue the construction as rapidly as we can. I have been to our preaching point at Anajatuba two times this month and we have bought a lot 60ft. wide and about 1000 feet deep to build a building on. We had three to reconcile in one of the services, they had been saved some time before with another group. We now have four people to baptize here in the near future.

Perhaps you would like to help us with the building we are going to build there, if so, be sure and send the offering to BFM and every dime of it will be used for that purpose.

December 26, I went to Sao Mateus to the dedication of their new building, the building is beautiful made of bricks and plaster with a tile roof and they do not owe

one dime on it. I preached to a full house and after the preaching two made professions of faith.

December 31, we had a watch night service at New Hope Baptist Church and we also ordained Brother Satu to the Gospel Ministry. He is the pastor of Villa Maranhao Baptist Church, after that he gave satisfactory statement concerning his faith and practice, we laid our hands on him. Brother Sostenes the pastor from Sao Mateus Baptist Church preached the charge to him, and did a real good job. I have helped the Villa Maranhao Baptist Church in two special services in a new area near their building with good crowds and the precious seed sown. I have been to our Mission at Carema two times. There was one saved there this month with two coming for baptism in the service last night, January 13, I went to Portoro to be with the church there as Brother Abdou was dedicating his new drug store, also it was his grandson's birthday, a big crowd in front of the new drug store and after I preached one lady made a profession in Christ.

Last weekend we had the honor of having Brother Paul Hatcher and family with us. After preaching for Brother Turner on Sunday morning he preached for us at night. We had a great service and we hope they can come back when they can stay longer.

The roads become more impossible every day with landslides a daily occurrence. We are thankful that at last they are paving the road in between Huanuco and Tingo Maria. It is now approx. 1/3 paved.

I just received a letter from Bro. Overbey informing me that the Huanuco bldg. fund is almost \$2000.00 in the red. Please pray and give as the Lord should lead. May the Lord bless you all.

We also got to preach the Gospel to several in their homes, some who had never before heard the Gospel.

Bible College is now in full swing again and seemingly we have some sincere students this Trimester.

Thanks so much for your prayers, support and encouragement as we try to serve our Dear Lord in this much needed field of service.
