## Labor Day Speakers

### Our Trip To Peru

James Hamilton, Edward Overbey and Halford Overbey arrived in Huanuco, Peru, Monday afternoon July 11, 1977. Brother Art Gibbs met us at the airport. We went to the mission in Ambo and James Hamilton preached at the 8:00 P.M. service to a large crowd. We were entertained in Art Gibbs' home and had a good time of fellowship. Tuesday night, July 12, 1977, at 8:00 p.m. was the first service in Brother Gibbs' new church building in Huanuco, Peru. This is a beautiful, well built building. Halford Overbey preached the dedication message. All seats were filled and many standing. One woman made a profession of faith. Wednesday, July 13, Brother Gibbs took us in his car to Tingo Maria and Aucayacu. Brother Edward Overbey preached at the Church in Tingo Maria at 8:00 p.m. We slept in the mission house. Thursday, July 14 Brother Gibbs drove us to the church at KM 70, and on to San Juan, where we were met by the Del Mayfields. Edward Overbey preached in the mission at 8:00 p.m. We slept in the mission house and Thursday morning July 15 Brother Mayfield took us in his Dodge pickup truck to Pacallpa. We visited the school, and at 8:00 p.m. J. Hamilton, E. Overbey and H. Overbey each preached and Del Mayfield interpreted. A large crowd with members of other churches were present. We stayed in the Mayfield home and had a good time of fellowship. Saturday, July 16 we were taken to see the other churches and places. We took pictures of all the places we visited in Peru. At 8:00 p.m. members came with food and we had a time of food and fellowship on the school ground under the lights.

We left Pacallpa, Peru by plane Sunday morning, July 17 and arrived at Iquitos, Peru about noon. We took a taxi to the James Kessel house. He was not expecting us until the next day. The new First Baptist Church building is beautiful and well built. Edward Overbey preached in the new building at 8:00 p.m. and one woman came to unite by letter. Monday, July 18, 1977 Brother Kessel took us to see the other four churches in Iquitos and to take pictures and to see the old First Baptist Church building, built by R. P. Hallum 40 years ago. The dedication service in the new building was at 8:00 p.m. The building was full with many standing. Many came from on the rivers and there were 19 Baptist preachers present. We stayed in the James Kessel home and had a good time of fellowship. Tuesday, July 19, 1977 We went in Kessel's Datsun Pickup to see the mission at Santo Tomas. We left Iquitos at 3:00 p.m. in Kessel's Aluminum boat, pushed by two 55 HP outboard motors, down the Nanay River into the mighty Amazon River and up this river to Tamshayacu. A village of about 3,000.00 people. Service in the church at 8:00 p.m. and James Hamilton preached. One girl came before the church to make things right. The building was full with people standing. Kessel and H. Overbey slept in the church on benches under a mosquito net and J. Hamilton and E. Overbey slept in the boat. On Wednesday, July 20, 1977 we went across the Amazon River and walked inland about 40 minutes and came to Arun Canon, a clearing in the jungle to the partially built church building with a tin roof on it. About 26 members in the mission which is ready to be organized into a church soon, the Lord willing. Down the Amazon River in Kessel's boat and up a small stream to the Hojeal Baptist Church to see and take pictures. Back to Iquitos in the boat. Wednesday night prayer meeting in the new First Baptist Church building, with 66 present. James Hamilton preached and two made professions of faith. Thursday, July 21, 1977, to Santa Clara by car to see the church and take pictures. There are 17 churches in Peru and we were in services in 5 of them and saw and took pictures of 14 of them. There are 13 missions and we were in services in two of them and saw and took pictures of one other. Art Gibbs, Del Mayfield and James Kessel are hard working missionaries. The work is there to see, and it is truly great. They have problems, too many to mention, but "grace for grace", greater than the problems. The needs are always great. Millions need to hear the Gospel. We left Iquitos by plane Thursday night for Lima, Panama, Miami and home Friday July 22, 1977. A truly great trip.

From the north on I-75 to I-70. Go east on I-70 9 1/2 miles to I-675 (the only way you can go) six miles to exit 20 which is Dayton-Yellow Springs Road (well marked on large signs) at end of exit ramp turn left and go one mile to Beaver Valley Road. Turn left on Beaver Valley Road one mile to the church's driveway and turn left and up the hill to church parking lot.

From the north on I-71 to I-70. Go west on I-70 to I-675 and south on I-675 the same as above directions.

From east to west on I-70, exit onto I-675 and then same as directions above.

From the south on I-75 take Route 4 Exit in Dayton.

From Route 4 take Route 444 Exit.

From Route 444 turn right on Dayton-Yellow Springs Road.

From Dayton-Yellow Springs Road turn right on Beaver Valley Road.

From Beaver Valley Road turn left at the church sign and mailbox.

Proceed up the hill on the gravel drive to the Church Building.

From U.S. - 35 (Going west) Take Route 68 in Xenia toward Yellow Springs.

From Route 68 make a slight left on Route 235 to Fairborn.

From Route 235 make a left turn at the first traffic light. (This is

Dayton-Yellow Springs Road but is not marked.)

From Dayton-Yellow Springs Road turn left on Beaver Valley Road.

From Beaver Valley Road turn left at the church sign and mailbox.

Pray for us, that we will be content. We appreciate your prayers in behalf of my wife Ada. She is doing fine at present. We would like to ask you to remember her mother in prayer, as she is very ill. ## Three Day Conference In Garca And Galia . . . Many Influential People Attended . . . Greatest Opportunity To Have A Really Strong Church . . . Greatest Request In 22 Years As A Missionary In Brazil . . . Need \$100,000.00 To Buy A Large Good Building For A Church

Dear Brethren,

This is Tuesday afternoon, July 19. Sunday night was the last service of a three day conference in Garca. Average attendance per service was 88 and high night was 120. This is the highest average of any conference here. In Galia tonight is the third service in a three day conference. Many people out for the first time in both places. Among some of the people who attended the services in Garca was the President of the State Savings and Loan in this area, the manager of the Telephone Company here, several bank workers, dentists, business men. We have never had an opportunity to reach as many influential people in a new work as have shown interest here in Garca. The Garca area in the center of coffee production here in Brazil. For this reason the traditional religious system is the most active possible. Here is the greatest opportunity to have a really strong church for reaching other areas and cities in this section of the country. Your help is

urgently needed. After twenty-two years in Brazil working with the churches which support missions through Baptist Faith Missions the greatest request is made of you. At present a building is being rented for our work in Garca. This is one of the finest buildings in town, there is none better constructed. The building will accommodate in the two floors a total of 600 people. Auditorium will seat 350. The building is going to be sold and naturally the first choice of buying is ours. The need is \$100 thousand dollars. Before you conclude that the price is too high it would be good to realize that were we to build a building for 180 people the cost per person that the building would cost, per person accommodated would be \$175, while the cost of this building would be \$167 per person. In this State of 20 million people, one half of the counties do not have any baptist work. Garca is in the very center of the State. May God help you to see the need and realize the urgency to raise the money for this building. If the building is not purchased we will have to look for another building in a few months. In the twenty-two years as a missionary our decisions have tried to be made in the will of God and in good judgement. This building is desperately needed. Will you, our brethren, raise the money for its purchase?

planning a series of meetings nightly at the two country works with the pastor of Shinnae doing the preaching at Doo Mill and my interpreter, who'll probably be in the States by the time you read this letter, doing the preaching at Kyong Ban Ni Mission. We'll report on these events next month.

Please, pray with us about this interpreter problem. It's next to impossible, even if one knew the language, to do what we're trying to do without an interpreter. It takes a good interpreter for the Bible College and at the present I feel the school is one of the most important projects. Training the native preachers is a must if we're to have sound Baptists. We have one preacher 59 years old with another Baptist group, who is now attending our school and traveling nightly from a near by town approximately 30 miles away by bus.

Besides not knowing what's going to take place, in the event troops are withdrawn from Korea our next problem as missionaries is finances. 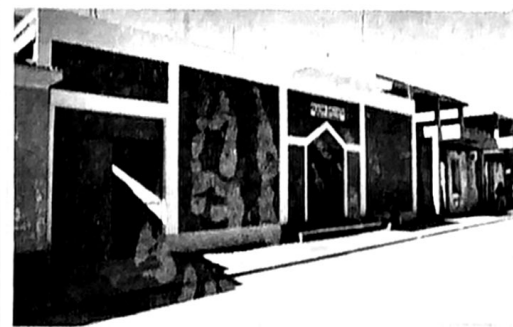
