





At present a building is being rented for our work in Garca. This is one of the finest buildings in town, there is none better constructed. The building will accomodate in the two floors a total of 600 people. Auditorium will seat 350. The building is going to be sold and naturally the first choice of buying is ours. The need is \$100 thousand dollars. Before you conclude that the price is too high it would be good to realize that were we to build a building for 180 people the cost per person that the building would cost, per person accomodated would be \$167, per person. In this State of 20 million people, one half of the counties do not have any baptist work. Garca is in the very center of the State. May God help you to see the need and realize the urgency to raise the money for this building. If the building is not purchased we will have to look for another building in a few months. In the twenty-two years as a missionary our decisions have tried to be made in the will of God and in good judgement. This building is desperately needed. We have begun to see a bit of sunshine again in the works, but would love to see more. All the works except for the Kyong Ban Ni Mission have had pro-fessions of faith and baptism this month. The Shinnae Church is looking much better; attendance is picking up, six were baptized and the spirit is basically good, the offerings are still down though. The Doo Mill Church attendance is still down, however, they had pro-fessions of faith this past month and two baptized. The Faith Louie Carver Baptist Mission here in Secul had several professions of faith, attendance is gradually climbing and I baptized three, one being an old Grandfather who was a professional writer. The attendance and attitude at Kyong Ban Ni Mission is good but no baptisms.

planning a series of meetings nightly at the two country works with the pastor of Shinnae doing the preaching at Doo Mill and my interpretor, who'll probably be in the States by the time you read this letter, doing the preaching at Kyong Ban Ni Mission. We'll report on these events next month. Please, pray with us about this interpretor problem. It's next to impossible, even if one knew the language, to do what we're trying to do without an interpretor. It takes a good interpretor for the Bible College and at the present I feel the school is one of the most important projects. Training the native preachers is a must if we're to have sound Baptists. We have one preacher 59 years old with another Baptist group, who is now attending our school and traveling nightly from a near by town approximately 30 miles away by bus. Besides not knowing what's going to take place, in the event troops are withdrawn from Korea our next problem as missionaries is financeially and not know where yot'll be living two months away. Rent where we now ...ve has gone up 300% since we've been back to Korea in only two years. It's expensive doing mission work in Korea & getting more expensive almost daily but the need is great here.
