Dear Brethren,

The month of November is closing for the school year. Final examinations are now being given and the year will then conclude. The school enrollment for 1977 was 1120 students. Centro Educacional Batista da Americas (Baptist Educational Center of the Americas) maintains kindergarten through high school. The school is the only Baptist school in Brazil, to my knowledge, that maintains a strict all Baptist staff (approx. 65 persons); thus the school is making an impact on the entire community of 500,000 inhabitants by infusing Christian principles into all walks of life. We are presently planning a Baptist university, which will

be the first Baptist university in Brazil. The cost of implantation and approval by the Federal Education Board (university and any kind of school must be approved to function) is figured at \$500,000 (five hundred thousand dollars). Pray with us that God will open each door as we approach.

The Tabernacle Baptist Church is doing well. Bro. Mike Creiglow was with us in a weekend meeting, speaking on the subject of prophecy.

This month we had the privilege of preaching for Bro. Richard Turner in Curitiba, Mato Grosso, and for Bro. John Hatcher in Garca, Sao Paulo.

Dear Brethren,

We want to thank the Liberty Baptist Church, Burton, Michigan for their offering for Mayfield's Building. Looking back through the Mission Sheets, we see that this is the first for a long, long time, even though there is a deficit on the four lots and the wall around them that was finished in 1973 and a deficit on church and buildings, making a total deficit of \$2,276.24. There may be some churches who would like to help us get this cleared up. This is by no means that we have quit building buildings. Our large school building, 35x100, which now houses all our classes, has been built from donations from parents of our students. Our church school building is being used only for Sunday school classes. Our new kindergarten building was built and paid for by our church. Our church also built the new church building in San Fernando. Now we are waiting for enough money to repair our church building, and put a new sidewalk completely around the buildings. This will be a large expense. There may be some churches who would like to help with this, and if so, please mark your offering "REPAIR FOR MAYFIELD'S BUILDING."

We would like to thank all who have given for Medical expense for my wife Ada. This is greatly appreciated. We have both been sick this month with flu, and my stomach infection is some better. We are both now under medication. As soon as the school year is over we plan to come home for furlough and get a complete check-up. Pray for us that we will be able to finish out the year.

Had to make the trip to San Juan Mission alone, as Ada was unable to go. We now plan to go the 27th of Nov. and hope to baptize those who are waiting. We had a young man who dedicated his life to the Lord a couple weeks ago. He has a lovely wife and two children. We are praying and hoping that he will

move to San Juan and help us there. May the Lord's will be done. Pray for them.

Dear Brethren,

The Lord has blessed us with a good month. Attendance has been constant even though no attendance records have been broken. We are interested in breaking our attendance records because every person is a soul that will spend eternity in heaven or in hell. Our average this month for morning services in Garca has been 30 and in Galia about 10. Our larger crowds (they can hardly be called crowds) in the Galia mission are in the afternoon services, an average of about 20.

One of the most interesting services is the Friday night Bible study. There is a lot of interest, and hopefully many who do not attend the other services will come.

Last Bible study Pastor Jose Maria brought our study. Being an ex-priest he was well qualified to bring a message on how he was freed from the slavery of Roman Catholicism. He is now the pastor of a Baptist church not far from here.

Our needs are great, but the greatest need of all is faithful men (both missionaries and pastors), and an effective way of training them. Your help is needed, your prayers are needed, your financial support is needed, your lives are needed. There are two things that a successful and growing mission work needs: (1) There must be commitment on the part of those who are called to go. (2) There must be moral and responsible commitment on the part of those who send, if the work is to increase. "How shall they hear without a preacher, how shall they preach except they be sent?" If you would feel the urgency of the matter, please take a world map and see how few doors are yet open to the Gospel.

Dear Brethren,

We have much reason for rejoicing as we finally got our new visas for the next 2 years. We are also rejoicing in that they are once again issuing new visas for new missionaries. With the constantly dwindling missionary force this is great news. Pray with us that the Lord will send forth laborers into this land of piteous harvest.

We are also rejoicing in that we have had 2 professions of faith here in Huanuco and several in Ambo after several weeks of drought.

We continue to put the finishing touches on our building in Huanuco as we have just finished plastering the walls of the garage and passage way. It has really improved the appearance over what was previously a mud brick wall. I just received a letter from Bro. Overbey concerning the Huanuco building

fund. We are approx. \$11,000.00 in the red. Won't you help us to cancel this debt. We are most thankful to the Mission for advancing us these funds by faith in order that the building could be finished without stopping.

We also have much other work that needs to be done. Due to the widening of the road in front of the church building and house in Tingo Maria, we are having to tear out the front fences and put in new ones some 3 meters further in. We also need water wells, both in Tingo and Aucayacu. We need to refill the property and finish the walls around the property in Aucayacu. All these things cost money to do. We need your help.

All the reports from the jungle Churches are good, especially the reports from Aucayacu. Bro. Pedro recently began to preach in a home of one of the believers in a place called Alto Pucato. It is about 5 hours by boat and foot further into the jungle from Aucayacu. We now have 4 baptized believers in this place.

Attendance up to 80's and nights at 50 even with the cold rainy nights this month. Offerings are real good for this small work. They go up every month more. We now have 25 members.

We are going hard at the classes and after 2 months I see a little light from them. Deloris teaches the women on their duties on Friday nights. Staying

at this and visiting for the next year I feel the Lord will have some to work with. I guess I ought to do as another Baptist missionary does here. He said he has 50 churches in 7 years. In some respects this month has not been so good in our work here in Varzea Grande. We once again had a drastic drop in our attendance. We had an average of only 38.1 in all services, the lowest for over five months. Just yesterday a young couple, members, moved to another state leaving us with just seventeen members, but it isn't all bad, we did have one profession of faith and another come for baptism. We now have several that should be baptized in the near future. Over a period of several months the congregation, through their tithes and offerings have accumulated enough to pay for the carpet for the floor of the auditorium.

The building is coming along very well and it looks like we should be moved into it by this time next month. I went to Sao Paulo last week to take care of

some business and to buy the carpet, but due to the shortage of time I did not get to buy some other things for the building on which I had hoped to save some money by buying them there. I did buy the carpet for almost half the price that I could buy it here in Cuiaba. Just in case someone might think we are being extravagant, carpet is the cheapest floor covering that we can buy. We still have the painting and the installation of the lights before we can install the carpet. We have almost all of the ceiling in already. We still lack about ten thousand dollars of having enough to pay for what we have already built, so there is still time to get in on the blessings. We would like to see it all paid for at least by the time we come to the States for furlough in July, 1978.

As I mentioned above, furlough time is coming up in July and as yet we do not have anyone to take care of the work while we are gone, so we ask you to pray that the Lord will either raise up someone here or send one from elsewhere.
