 month here. We had 5 saved and 1 baptized 7 last  
 Sunday night. This Sunday there were three from San  
 Fernando and one from Arenal, and one from here. I  
 preached last Sunday at San Fernando, and there  
 were two families who came for baptism, but they  
 have to get married legally. This takes several weeks  
 and now is very expensive. That is the reason many  
 live in fornication. We are glad that the church is back  
 in fellowship, after much trouble out of the other  
 pastor. He is back in Iquitos, and I'm sure will give the  
 brethren there a lot of trouble.

Our buildings are all done and painted, and look  
 very nice. The brethren are painting the church, and it  
 is going to take a while. Glad that all the repair work is  
 done.

We also have all the paper work done for the  
 school. Also have appointed 4 of our members to run  
 the school while we are on furlough. One of them as  
 director. We think that the work will go well while  
 we're away. The problem here is the high inflation,  
 things seem to double in price every day. Many  
 cannot afford to send their children to private school,  
 and pay tuition. There are many that suffer here, as  
 there are no jobs, and the cost of living is very high.

Our next mission letter we'll write in the States if  
 all goes well. We hope to see many of you at the  
 Spring conference. We are looking forward to it.

## Winter In Korea . . . Prices Of Everything Up . . . Need To Buy Building For Mission . . . Works All Doing Well . . . Professions And Baptisms

Dear Brethren,

Sounds like Mr. Winter is really visiting many of you there in America. If it's any consolation to you, though we haven't had as much snow as you, it was 9 at 8 am with a chill factor of approx. -20 here in Seoul.

I had a new experience this month, had to help wash and dress a 93 yr. old lady for burial after eating Kimchi and rice in the room where the body lay awaiting preparation for burial.

Prices have soared again here and more coming: Gas, oil, meats, salaries, land prices jumped. Our mission bldg. sold twice in the same week, once it sold for approx. \$27,000.00 and within a few days it sold again for over \$33,000.00. We're still in the bldg. for K.E.Y. Money but don't know for how long.

The land prices where our mission is located jumped approx. 100% and since a street in front of our building is to be widened and paved, prices are to jump again within the next two months. I hardly

know how to say it, but Brethren, we must have our own building there soon or else we'll not be able to touch property in a matter of months; God always supplies but He uses His churches and His People to do so.

We continue to ask your prayers concerning interpreters. One man was to have started to work with me the first of Feb. but changed his mind and I now have a pastor of another Baptist Church helping me as an interpreter in the school, only temporarily and Brother Yoon who works with me at the Faith Mission is to leave any time for one of the Mid-Eastern Countries and has already moved his family back to live with his parents.

The works are all doing well. The two country works reported no professions for the month, the Shin Nae Church had several professions and baptized five and we had several professions at the Faith Mission and baptized two. One who made a profession at the Faith Mission used to work in Pastor Ellis's home and later in our home, a Miss Kang, we rejoiced to see her saved; some of the Brethren who were here in Dec. will remember her.

Thanks for your support in prayer, letters and finances and may God richly bless you for them.

## Back In Brazil With 95° Weather . . . Work In Good Shape . . . Restoration And Professions Of Faith . . . Working On Papers To Get Visa For Harold Draper

Dear Brethren,

We left Clarksville at 9 am Jan. 26 with about 8 inches of snow and ice on the ground not knowing whether we would be able to get a flight Nashville-Miami or not. 12 noon we got a flight to Atlanta and we arrived at Miami 7 pm and 8 pm we were on the plane to Brazil. We left Clarksville the temperature was 6 above 0, when we got to Sao Luis it was about 95 degrees, it took a couple of days to get adjusted to the nice warm weather. I took Jonathan to Fortaleza Academy where he stayed and is studying. He will be home tomorrow for three weeks.

Our work here is in good shape, the New Hope Baptist Church as far as I know did not have one major problem, some fell into sin and one young lady came Sunday night repenting and asking the church to forgive her, after that a young lady we have been praying for about five years made a profession of faith

and there were about half a dozen of our members that were really in tears of rejoicing, including the pastor.

The preacher that was at our mission at Anajutuba has already moved back to Sao Luis, and left things in a mess there, although Brother Benedito was there Sat.-Sun., Feb. 11-12 and he reports one profession of faith. I have been there one time this month. That was Tuesday, Feb. 7, there was a good crowd although the people did not know we were coming.

We have been able to buy a new refrigerator with the money that Faith Baptist Church, Lynn, Ark., Brother Roger Jones is pastor, (our old one was worn and rusted out) gave us. Our greatest needs and prayer request are that the Lord will raise up faithful workers that Love Him and will faithfully proclaim the OLD-OLD STORY. This is a great need. Brother Sostenes and I have been busy trying to get Brother Draper's papers in order that they may be sent to Brasilia. We have them just about ready. At least we think so anyway.

## Seven Years In Honduras . . . Three Churches Organized And Three Buildings Built . . . All Churches Had An Increase For The Month . . . Still Need Special Offerings For Third Building

Dear Brethren,

Time flies. We are now in our seventh year in Honduras. Very little done it seems. We still leave that with the Lord. All 3 churches have had increases this month. The Woodland Church has come from a low of 1 to high of 28 last night. Offerings up to \$20.00 (from nothing) and 1 profession of faith. The new pastor is to move on the field Tuesday. He could not find a home before. In Ajestas they have changed pastors also. This young man (23) is only saved 2 years, so we shall see. He is sort of on trial. They have had 4 professions and now have 3 for baptism. I am to baptize these the 3rd of March, the Lord willing. Pradera (let's use the English

word from now on, Prairie) Church had another good month. Up in the 80's and 90's. Offerings still good, and 1 profession of faith and 2 claiming to be called to preach. That's 3 now here at Prairie.

One of our members was in a bus wreck and almost died from bleeding from the ears. He is better now. I visit daily in one of our 3 churches. I still think that visiting house to house is one of the main jobs of a missionary.

We still owe over \$3,600 to regular fund for our building. Would you pray and give toward this? Small or large, but as the Lord leads. Preachers' classes are doing good.
