Monday night the 13th, we had the fellowship of all the churches with the Second Church. This was one of the best we have had for awhile, as the devil is busy here also. Tuesday night, the 14th, we organized a new church, a mission of the First Church, called "Hope Baptist Church", with twenty adult members. We have also finished a small building for this new church, paid for by the First Church.

The Church at Tamshayacu has had the highest attendance and the largest offerings in its history. This church also has a mission in a place called Magdalena, where there were three saved and two rededications. The new church organized, "Hope Baptist" had one saved and baptized. The Second Church had one saved and baptized. Five professions at Astoria. The First Church had two additions by letter, and one young man surrendered to preach. He is the grandson of Simon Gaima, the old Indian who preached here for many years. So we have had many blessings during this month, regardless of the working of the devil in our midst, that would hinder the work.

OUR TRIP TO BRAZIL - By Edward H. Overbey

Brother James Hamilton and myself have just returned from a trip to Brazil in which we visited all of the fields of our missionaries there. We couldn't see every church and mission point in each field for there are many and our trip was for only sixteen days. We did see each field though.

BROTHER BEAN'S WORK

We went first Sao Luis to visit Brother Bean. Sao Luis is on the east coast of Brazil. He has five churches, two of them many miles away. He also has two mission points several miles away. He took us to see the new church building at Sao Mateus. That night we went to the mission at Anajatuba (they have a new building) and had a service there. We were also able to go and see the church at Vila Maranhao before we had to leave Brother Bean.

BROTHER JOHN HATCHER'S WORK

Next we travelled to South Brazil more than a 1,000 miles from Sao Luis. We went to Sao Paulo perhaps the largest city in the world. Its population is about 13,000,000. It is a modern industrial city. From there we

Mission Organized Into A Church In Cuiaba, Brazil . . . Seminar A Great Blessing With 220 Present . . . J. Hamilton And E. Overbey Come To Visit

Dear Brethren,

This has been a very busy month in the work here. We have seen the hand of God in blessing. First, we had the seminar which was a great blessing to our work. As a result of what we learned there our attendance has increased double in our Sunday School.

We have had a high of 45 in S.S. and a high in our Sunday night services of 57. So far we are averaging 41.7 for this month. Second, Feb. 27, we organized our work into a church with 14 founding members. There were three churches represented by their pastors and two congregations represented by their pastors. I read the church covenant which was accepted by the members. Bro. Asa Mark Bratcher served as the moderator while the church called a pastor. I was called pastor and I accepted.

Afterward, the church voted to continue with the name "Igreja Batista Boa Esperanca" Good Hope Baptist Church. Third, in the closing service of the seminar, which was in our building, there were 220 people present, which was the result of 4 teams visiting on Saturday and then returning on Sunday before the service and bringing them in. This is the record attendance for my work here. Fourth, there were 3 people received into the membership this month by letter from other Baptist Churches. There were included in the number of founding members.

I want to thank Brothers John Hatcher, Paul Hatcher, Mike Creiglow, Asa M. Bratcher and Bob Creiglow for their presence at our organization.

We were also blessed with the visit of Brothers James Hamilton and Edward Overbey. We had a special service Saturday night in which Brother Overbey brought the message and I translated. Then again on Sunday morning he brought the message and I translated. Right after the service we took him to the airport to meet with Brother Hamilton to continue their trip to Manaus.

caught a bus and travelled inland six hours to see the new work Brother John Hatcher started two years ago. He has two preaching points at Garca and Galia. We had a service at Galia that night. The building at Garca is a fine building and ideal for the work there. It was easy to see the importance of buying it for the work. We need to pray and give to get that building.

BROTHER TURNER'S WORK

Leaving Brother Hatcher, we travelled back to Sao Paulo and caught a plane for Cuiaba which is in central Brazil. It was another trip of over a 1,000 miles. Brother Turner's new building looked very nice. We had two services there. Recently several had made professions of faith. The Sunday morning we were there we had a good number in the service. Some new people came as a result of visitaion. The work looks encouraging.

BROTHER BOBBY CREIGLOW'S WORK

Brother Creiglow's work is across the river from Cuiaba in the city of Varzea Grande. He is finishing a new building there which looked very good. A large crowd came Sunday morning and Brother Hamilton preached while I was across the river preaching at Cuiaba. We also went with Brother Creiglow to see two new believers get married. His work has done very well. It is less than two years old but it has grown well.

BROTHER PAUL HATCHER'S WORK

We had planned to go to Cruzeiro do Sul from Cuiaba to see the work of Mike Creiglow but the flight had been cancelled and we couldn't get there from Cuiaba. We decided to go to Manaus and see Brother Paul and see if we could get to Cruzeiro do Sul from there. When we arrived at Manaus we saw the Tabernacle Baptist Church. It is a strong and growing church.

The church has been led by Paul Hatcher to go out and witness faithfully. The church spends more than 100 hours a week visiting. Lost people are being saved. This church under Paul's leadership has a school that teaches about 1,200 students. They are taught the Bible and the gospel is preached to them. They are praying that God will enable them to train many young men for the ministry that they might go into every State of Brazil to start new churches.

BROTHER BRATCHER'S WORK

Brother Bratcher is home on furlough but his church in Manaus has called his son, Asa Mark to pastor the church in his absence. Brother Asa Mark showed us the new building. It is very large and nearing completion. Asa Mark has done a good job in completing the building. He has been working very hard and God has blessed with large crowds in their services. Many souls have been saved in these last few months. He is also going to preaching points outside of Manaus.

BROTHER MIKE CREIGLOW'S WORK

Ada will be going into the Springfield Hospital as soon as her doctor can get it set up. After the Spring Conference I will go to the Ford Clinic in Detroit. We would like for you to pray with us about this. We would like to make one thing very clear, as there have been rumors of our not returning to Pucallpa. That is not true. We will be returning, the Lord willing.

On Saturday afternoon our teachers took us out on the field to show us how to invite people to services. Some went to Brother Turner's area and another crew went to our area and the following day we saw our S.S. attendance jump from the previous high of 58 to 130. Needless to say if we had not the help of the brethren to teach Sunday School we would not have been able to take care of all of them. We have been for some time now trying to prepare S.S. teachers to take care of the growth we expect to have. The following Sunday, with the same visitation system in action we started two new S.S. classes and were blessed with 70

present that morning. Last Sunday we had 85 and plan to have 100 in the near future and that will be about all we can take care of until we get some more teachers taught. We also have had several children make professions of faith this month.

We were very happy to have Brethren James Hamilton and Edward Overbey in our home for a couple of days. Brother Hamilton taught our adult S.S. class and preached a short message before we had to rush them off to the airport to catch their plane to Manaus. It was a blessing to have them and to discuss some things about the mission work with them. We trust they enjoyed their short stay in Cuiaba also and that they along with others will come from time to time to visit the work.

Just before the seminar Betty had another spell with her heart that lasted for seven hours, so we made another fast trip to Mineiros and while there the doctor did everything to try to bring on one of these spells, but without success. He changed all of her medicine, sent us back home and asked me to call him the following Saturday. Since then she has done very much better, so we hope he has found her trouble. Continue to pray for us and the work here.

Dear Brethren,

We were just thinking what great things God has done and will share them with you.

During the last two months 81 persons have publicly professed faith in Jesus Christ as Saviour, and in the last four weeks 27 have been baptized, 9 persons received by letter, 6 persons reconciliated and 7 youth have dedicated their lives to be pastors or missionaries. The past two Sundays we have had 672 and 625 persons in Sunday School. In order to reach these folks, over 1,000 visits are made weekly and some one hundred man hours are involved. On Saturday the teams go house-to-house, explain where the church is, and that we would like them to come and attend our service the following day. Then we explain we will come by on Sunday, and set

the hour so they can go with us. And praise God, on Sunday, rain or shine, members are out getting their visitors and bringing them with them.

One young man, Raimundo (Raymond), was led to Christ by a teacher from the church. On Sunday he came forward making that public; the next Sunday when he was baptized, he brought two friends - both were saved that night. The third Sunday these two were baptized; and they each brought another, one of which, going out the door, said, "Pastor, I am going to profess Christ, too."

On the 17th and 18th the church had a 24-hour prayer service asking God's blessing on His work. We hope to reach 1,000 in Sunday School in April; and are asking God to raise 24 young preachers from the church in 1978. Pray with us, rejoice and be thankful.

Bro. Hamilton and Bro. Overbey have been with us several days, visiting and seeing what God has done. We thank God for their dear fellowship and encouragement.

As usual this has been a busy, tiring, and overall a very good month. A former member of the Jordan Baptist Church of Sanford, Fla., Bruce Gibson, has been with us on several different occasions. Bruce is stationed near the 38th parallel. While with us, he sang specials at both the Faith Mission and the Shin Nae Church. These G.I.'s who are saved and visit with us are a blessing.

I signed a contract on 70 Pyoung of land about two blocks away from our present K.E.Y. money bldg. and we're trying to get all the red tape taken care of on it now. Anyway, hopefully, we can use an old house on the property for church use until I return from furlough time by doing some repairs. This lot in round figures with repairs on the small house is \$20,000.00 and I know that's a lot of money but at the rate prices are going now this time next year the same plot will be worth approx. \$30,000.00. Brethren, I'd hoped never to ask you for help on a bldg. again because having been a pastor I know you don't like to hear: money, money, money, from your missionaries. However, it's purchase land and bldg. or else do nothing as far as progress in

The works are all doing fine. The two country works reported no professions but seemingly good services and attendance about average. The Shin Nae Church had several moves for various reasons and I believe Bro. Chong said they baptized two. We had several professions here at the Faith Mission and I baptized three.

Missionaries In Brazil Meet Three Days To Pray, Analyze And Plan . . . A Workshop Seminary Planned And Then Tried Out In The Two Missions In Cuiaba With Great Results

Garca, Sao Paulo, Brazil
March 16, 1978

On the 8th, 9th, and 10th of November five missionaries met together in the city of Garca for the purpose of praying, analyzing, and planning. It was the first meeting of its kind since I have been in Brazil, due perhaps, to the great distances between missionaries and the expenses of traveling. Those present were Mike Creiglow, Richard Turner, Paul Hatcher, Bobby Creiglow, and John Hatcher. Brother Bratcher and George Bean were in the States at the time.

Most people do not realize the problems that exist in mission work. Legal problems of entering and leaving a country, of owning property, of strong nationalistic tendencies, of mission owned property among national churches, of misunderstandings, of lack of labourers, of financial difficulties, of runaway inflation prices, of education and training of national workers and the transition of physical properties are a few of the difficult situations facing missionaries that demand solutions. For three days, morning and afternoon, these problems were discussed. Here are some of the items considered during the three days: definition of objectives, philosophy of work, analysis of work, statistical evaluation, criteria of future evaluation, methods of execution, evaluation of financial status, projection of finances, education and preparation of manpower, legal problems, transition

of physical properties, means of economical autonomy for native churches. My reaction to it all was - we should have done this 15 years ago.

Mike Creiglow came a distance of about 1,500 miles. Paul Hatcher came about the same distance. Brother Bobby Creiglow and Richard Turner came about 1,000 miles, and Mrs. Hatcher did all the cooking, washing and ironing.

It was discovered that the basic problem of one was the basic problem of the others, and that the problems of needs could be solved better and more efficiently by combined effort.

To test this idea a workshop seminar was planned for the month of February in Cuiaba at the invitation of Bobby Creiglow and Richard Turner. There was planning, projection, and preparation in three phases of the work: Spiritual life growth, How to reach people and bring them in, and Methods and Materials for teaching in the churches and Sunday Schools. Results: Attendances for the four nights of training were 104, 108, 120, and 142. 85 persons received attendance certificates. 12 churches were represented among those attending, 9 pastors attended.

The attendance on Sunday morning in Brother Creiglow's mission was 128, the attendance at the service at Brother Turner's mission was 220. There were 32 professions of faith in the two missions and one church - 16 at Brother Creiglow's mission and 14 at Brother Turner's mission. It was perhaps the greatest experience I have witnessed since being in Brazil.

This new year has started out as a real challenge. There have been more jobs to do than usual and we have had more than enough barriers, it seems. Just after getting over the flu I had some torn ligaments in my neck. The doctor tried to put me in bed. The Lord healed me quickly though and I only lost three days.

I have visited the mission at Sacado twice. People are still being saved there all along. There are over twenty candidates for baptism. They are receiving money from each member of the congregation for the building they plan to build soon.

The church at Rodrigues Alves is still doing fine. Our little building has been packed almost every service. Six

brethren went with me to the Vila yesterday. They helped with some more visitation. We had many new visitors last night. Four of these young men gave their testimonies. The service was exceptional.

One group of folks from here in town went to Sacado during carnival. They had three services with over 100 persons each. Ten were saved on the last night. Brother Enock and I took over forty to visit the church at Maita during this holiday. We were there for three days and three nights. Over half of the folks we took were lost. We even took a lawyer and two army officials. We divided all of our people into seven teams with a captain each. We had chapel each morning and special services each night. Each team had its own morning and evening devotions and did evangelism together. All Bible contests and sports were done by team, too. These camps offer us extraordinary opportunities to preach. They also help the churches and missions where they are held, besides strengthening our young people.

The treasurer of the church there lost a son to a sudden illness and death three weeks ago. I went to be with them as soon as I heard. They had me take care of all the arrangements. Brother Amadeu and his wife have given a tremendous testimony in

After teaching at Faith and Boa Esperanca, I preached on Sunday night at Third Baptist Church. A very refreshing week it was.

make arrangements to get us there after much effort on his part. We flew by an airline to Tabatinga on the West border of Brazil and then chartered a single engine plane to take us about 250 miles across the jungle to Cruzeiro do Sul in the far West of Brazil. This flight was made at a low altitude so that we had a wonderful view of the jungle. The pilot on his way flew low over a primitive Indian village and dropped off mail to some missionaries in an onion sack. These Indians had a small clearing in the jungle. It was a three week trip by boat to get to them. When we reached Brother Mike we changed clothes and left by boat to go up the Jurua River for a service at Villa Rodrigues Alves. We had a good service there. Over 100 people attended the outdoor service. The next day we went up the Moa River where we had a service at the church in a small place called Matai. We stayed over night in a tent and then came back to Cruzeiro do Sul the next day. That night Mike took us to a workers' meeting he has every Friday night. They have prayer and then plan their services for the week. There are ten churches and many, many preaching points. Brother Mike is training a number of young preachers who are going to various places each week to preach and teach the Word of God. Saturday we left again by boat to go to a mission in a little village, Guajara. We had a service there and then stayed again overnight in a tent. The next morning we got up and travelled to the mission at Sacado where we had a service. That afternoon we travelled back to have a service at Cruzeiro do Sul. Brother Mike has many preaching points along the river and lakes for many miles around Cruzeiro do Sul. These places are just clearings along the rivers and lakes on the edge of the jungle. Mike and the native preachers work very hard all the time to reach these people with God's Word and to start new works.

Every place I went I was impressed with the good and Scriptural work that was being done. I was thankful to God for all our missionaries and their families. Their wives work very hard helping their husbands. They were all very kind to us and showed us great hospitality for which we were grateful.
