Baptist Faith Missions And Church Authority

The work of Baptist Faith Missions has always been carried on by church authority. In the latter part of 1944 an official of the INTERNAL REVENUE SERVICE called on Brother Z.E. Clark and advised him that the mission work should be incorporated and have a TAX IDENTIFICATION NUMBER so that all who give to the support of this mission work could get exemption on their income tax for their mission offerings. At that time there was the DETROIT RIVER ASSOCIATION of ten churches in Michigan. Each church voted to have a messenger, with authority to represent their church at the regular monthly meetings. At a regular meeting these messengers of the ten churches of the Detroit River Association voted to have a constitution drawn up and the mission work incorporated as a non profit Corporation of the State of Michigan and elected the pastors of the ten churches and Z.E. Clark, Association Missionary, as the first directors, and to name the corporation BAPTIST FAITH MISSIONS; and it was incorporated on January 23, 1945. Thus, Baptist Faith Missions came into being as a Non-Profit corporation with church authority. Now, when a church votes to support the work of Baptist Faith Missions, and sends offerings, that church is giving Baptist Faith Mission the authority to use their offerings according to the policy of the mission and as given by the church. Churches who support the mission work of Baptist Faith Missions are using the services of the Mission exactly the same way as they use the services of a bank or a building contractor. exactly so. Now a word about a missionary visiting churches doing debutation work to raise his support as a missionary There is not one word in the Bible for doing this. Barnabas and Paul went out on faith, Acts 13:1-3. Paul and Silas also went out on faith, Acts 15:36-41. They did not do debutation work to raise their support. BUT, when a church votes to send out a missionary to visit churches and do debutation work to raise his support is IS NOT unscriptural, and we have no objection. Each missionary of Baptist Faith Missions does his mission work on the authority of the church that he is a member of. Sometimes a church votes to give the missionary authority to baptize for them when they do not have an ordained pastor, etc.

Approved Projects

The first Baptist Church, Cruzeiro do Sul, Acre, Brazil was organized May 12, 1929. This was the first Baptist Church organized in the State of Acre. This church has called Mike Creiglow as pastor and they are planning a 50th Anniversary service of the church May 12, 1979, and want to have a new church building for the occasion. The church owns the present bld church building and a new church parsonage and two lots for the new church building. The church wants "loans" (not gifts) to build the new church building. When the loans are repaid they will go in to the mission treasury for future buildings etc. Pray about this and mark your special offerings for FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH LOAN, CRUZEIRO DO SUL. Let's send the money so that Mike Creiglow can get the new church built by May 12, 1979.

Dear Brethren:

Praise the Lord for another great month. This was the month for the celebration of the independence of Brazil, a month of celebration in the schools and city. During the holidays the church chorale went to a new city on the Amazonic highway to inaugurate the church building just built by Tabernacle Baptist Church and to evangelize the town. The chorale split up into evangelism teams and made tract distribution and invitations to the entire town twice. In the afternoons, the young people had Vacation Bible School, with a kick-off attendance of 215. At night they sung at the mission and in the city square. The last night was the inauguration of the finished building. We praise the Lord, and it is truly amazing what twenty teens sold out to Jesus, living lives separate from the world, can accomplish through visitation, and house-to-house evangelism.

We praise God for the many people he has given who are so deeply concerned for seeing the lost saved that over one thousand visits are made for each Sunday service.

While the teens were building benches, a young man stopped by to get a tract that he knew we had been distributing. One of the chorale components, Sullivan, selected two different tracts and took them out to the man who was waiting in the yard. Right there in the heat of the noon-day sun for twenty minutes he showed the man his need and presented Christ as the solution. When he concluded, the young man made a profession of faith in Jesus Christ. My heart was filled with praise as not mosquitos, uncomfortable sleeping conditions, rain, or the heat of the day could keep these kids from paying all their expenses to go tell a lost and dying world about Jesus. May God help each of you to sell out to Jesus Christ also and together meet the challenge of the billions of sinners who are born, live, and die and go to hell and never hear the message of God's saving grace. God help us to pray, give, and "burn out" for Jesus Christ.

We had a great visit with Bro. Overbey and Bro. Fisher who were both a blessing as they preached to the church. Bro. and Sister John Hatcher, our parents, spent six days catching up with the grandchildren and vice-versa.

A Word To Those Who Would Cut Off Offerings For Support Of Missionaries . . . Report On Churches And Mission . . . Thief Steals P.A. System . . . Need Offerings For New Church Building

Dear Brethren,

I recently received a letter stating: "all missionaries must get and keep their finances in order at all times and be ready to miss a full month of salary if necessary." Thus far we've never missed any salary in the seven years that I've been on the mission field, that's because of God's sustaining Grace and His people's concern. Brethren, we missionaries, I know, come up far short at times but who of you will leave all and go to the foreign field where: customs, thinking, language etc. is far different and your wife teaches your four children at home because of lack of finances to send them to school and other missionaries' children laughing at them because they must study at home. Yes, we must operate and do God's work by faith, but most pastors get paid by the week, 52 checks a year, missionaries get paid by the month, 48 weeks; they've already lost four weeks; what would you say if your church said you may have to lose eight weeks pay out of a year? That's what it amounts to if we aren't paid. Of course, you can usually get a part time job, we missionaries can't and even if we could we're usually doing the work of two men and there's

no time left. I'm not complaining; God's been good to us but I'm simply trying to let you stand in our shoes for a few minutes.

Our month has been fairly normal month with blessings as well as disappointments. The Shinnae Church had a very poor month financially so I met with the brethren and tried to give them some pointers concerning promotion in finances. Bro. Cheong, pastor at Shinnae Church asked me to preach the last Sunday a.m. of September at Shinnae on Financial Responsibilities to the church. Also a few months ago one of the Shinnae members gave a P.A. System to the church and last month someone got in the church and stole the system so they are quite discouraged. Bro. Chang, who pastors the Doo Mill Church was rejoicing that two girls had earned their first money, one earned approx. \$20.00 by picking and selling greens, and they tithed their money approx. \$6.00 between them which shows a step of faith. Attendance is down some at the Kyong Ban Mission but I baptized one man and eight children who were saved in their V.B.S. The crippled grandmother whom I baptized at Kyong Ban in July is extremely poor but was rejoicing in the Lord. The Faith mission is doing quite well, the temporary building is full to capacity on Sunday a.m. and we've had several saved of whom I'm to baptize two next Sunday.

Some have given toward the building and we thank God for you.

The people here in Iquitos were somewhat disappointed, as they were here such a short time, that we could not have any special services. We were happy to have them in our home and wish that more would come to see the work. It would be a blessing.

It seems that we have been very busy since last writing. We made a trip to Pucallpa to help with the work there and to help sister Ada Mayfield dispose of her personal things. The Faith Church had a business

meeting, while we were there, to accept the resignation of Bro. Abel, as their temporary pastor. Then the church voted to call him as their pastor. The church has prospered under his leadership, during the absence of the missionary. They also voted to give me authority to baptize 6 while I was there. We also had a good time preaching every night there.

Tonight is our monthly fellowship meeting, where the pastor of the Fifth church is to be ordained. He is a young man from Pacallupa but the church seems to have prospered under his leadership. Also the church at Astoria reports 3 saved, the Second church, one of these a young woman that had professed salvation for years, but finally realizing that she was not saved.

At this writing both my wife and I are sick with stomach and intestinal infection. Remember us in your prayers, that God will use us in His service.

Exemption Of Large Deposit To Leave Brazil For Furlough Denied . . . Delays And More Delays . . . Interesting Experience In Salvation Of Young Man . . . Hope To Leave For Furlough By September 28

Dear Brethren,

After writing my letter last month we did get a notice from the Justice department that we were denied the exemption of the large deposit required by law to travel outside of the country and at the same time got another notice from the American consulate that there would not be a waiting time for us with them.

After the deposit was made (Over four thousand dollars) we sent for the girls' passports through the federal police here and although they took about three hours filling out forms and checking to see that all was correct the applications came back after two weeks saying he had had the girls sign the application instead of me. The time would not be enough to send them by mail again for us to meet our appointment with the American consulate, so last Sunday night after services we left by bus for Campo Grande to see if we could get them. We were in that city seven hours before getting them, but at least we did get them and then took the twelve hour bus trip back home. We think we now have all the documents we will need to go before the American consulate in Rio de Janeiro. We will leave Cuiaba on Sept. 25 to give time for the girls to get medical exams

before going to the consulate on Sept. 28 and then if all goes well we will leave that same night for Miami.

Last Saturday night Bro. Turner's church had a Bar-B-Que for us and I preached for them in both services on Sunday. We had very good services and good crowds out for both services. We also ate dinner with one of his members that Sunday. I believe this was the first time I had preached for them since we started the work here in Varzea Grande.

About two years ago I invited a young man to our services who promised to come and about two months ago showed up for the first time. He and his wife along with their two young daughters have been coming quite often ever since. I went to their home just after they came the first time to witness Bro. Turner's church I asked him if he would take our Kombi and pick up the people that we haul to church. He was glad to do this and this morning just after we got back from Campo Grande he came to my home saying that he was troubled and could not go on that way. About thirty minutes later the tears were gone and he left with a light heart because the Lord had saved him. We now understand why the delay in our travel plans and thank the Lord for it. We will baptize him along with another young man that was saved nine days ago, the last Sunday night we are here, which will be this Sunday. We are very happy.

Dear Brethren:

In a few hours we'll be saying "good-bye" to two of the Lord's servants, Bro. Hafford Overbey and Bro. Sidney Fisher, directors of B.F.M. who have been visiting us these past few days. They arrived yesterday from Cruzeiro do Sul. It was my privilege to translate for Bro. Fisher Wednesday night, Sept. 13th at the 14th of December Baptist Church then on the following Sunday morning for Bro. Overbey at Chapada Baptist Church, Miguel Ibernion, pastor, Sunday morning and again for Bro. Overbey on Sunday night at the 14th Church. We have enjoyed the presence of the brethren among us.

Mrs. Bratcher and I spent from Thursday, August 31st to Tuesday, September 12th on the Urubu (Buzard) River with our mission there. The Lord blessed us during our revival there with nine conversions, ten rededications and four asking for and two receiving baptism. We trust that the seed sowed will still bring forth fruit.

We set Tuesday, October 24th (pray for us on that day) as the day for those of the mission on the Urubu River, whose marriages are not according to the laws of Brazil to meet us at the Clerk's office in

Itacoatiara to apply for marriage licenses. There exists the possibility that six couples will be present. If we can get the six couples legally married, some can be baptized and others received into full fellowship with the church again.

Our average attendance in Sunday School for the month of September (14th Church) was 461. Asa Mark Bratcher did an excellent job in taking care of the work during the two Sundays we were absent. We had 72 the first Sunday and 92 the second Sunday of the revival on the Urubu River. We only have some 30 baptized believers there.

On the 4th Sunday in August I baptized six and then sat at the Lord's table with my brethren. The following Sunday, Asa Mark baptized seven. We praise the Lord!

Brethren, continue to pray for us and give to our support—either to the regular fund or designated for the "Bratcher Building" or the both. "The Lord has been so good to me" that I feel I must continue to work in His harvest field here in Brazil. We are thankful to all of you who make it possible for us to do so.

May the Lord bless you and pray for us, please.

The purpose was to motivate those people and give them some know how. We left Cruzeiro on August 25th. Four men, Ciero, David, Carlos, and Rosemato, went with me. These men did all of the work with the folks from Eirunepe by their sides. They held classes each morning, covering visitation, open air services, mission procedures, counselling and other practical subjects. There was all kinds of visitation in the

afternoons. There were open air services three nights in different sections of the city. The average attendance was 250 persons. On the weekend there was a meeting held at the Church. The ten days we spent there were too full to get a full report in here. Our men learned a good deal as well as giving the church a good boost.

Brother Hafford Overbey and Brother Sidney Fisher have been with us this past week. They came to share a quick visit with us and to see some of the Lord's work here. We took them to the following places: Vila Rodrigues Alves, Colonia, Mancio Lima, Humaita, Mourapiranga, Lagoinha, and Sacado. It was not possible to hold services at many of these places, but they got to preach quite a bit anyway. Yesterday was a full day for us all. Brother Overbey preached at Faith Baptist before Sunday school then we ran over to First Baptist where Brother Fisher preached after Sunday school. We did the same for evening services. We had to do it this way since I am the only one who could interpret. The time has gone too quickly. Their visit has been a real blessing.

The privilege of visiting with our children and knowing they are busy in the work of the Lord is an unspeakable joy. Having Kathy to visit and travel with us during the summer was great. The seeing of many old friends, the visiting of several churches who have supported us for many years, and the visiting of several new churches have encouraged us. God also granted us the blessing of embracing and kissing our parents one more time this side of Eternity. What a blessing of God to have parents who have led us in the paths of God.
