Dear Brethren,

This month has been, as most, filled with blessings as well as sorrow. Our biggest heart break of the month was that one of our most faithful ladies at Faith Church died of a heart attack. She was only twenty seven (27) years old and had one little boy about one and a half (1½) years old. Please pray for her family and especially her baby and lost husband whom she often requested prayer for.

Yesterday we organized the Kyong Ban Baptist Mission into a local church and ordained Brother Yoon, their pastor, last night. This church was organized with, I believe, forty-seven (47) members, of course many of those were children. This new church and her pastor need your prayers.

The mission which was started last month is doing quite well. Brother Chang, their pastor, reported three baptized last month and two more professions of faith. Brother Chang pastors both this mission and the Doo Mill Church but the Doo Mill Church isn't doing so well so do pray that God will get

her revived. The Shinnae Church is doing well; Borthor Cheong and his wife have done a good job there. Their attendance is up some, they baptized and had professions last month. The Faith Church is also steady. We took two by statement, a young preacher and his wife and had the privilege of baptizing our two youngest children, Chanty and Rebecca. It's a real joy to see all your children saved and even at a very young age and have the privilege of baptizing them.

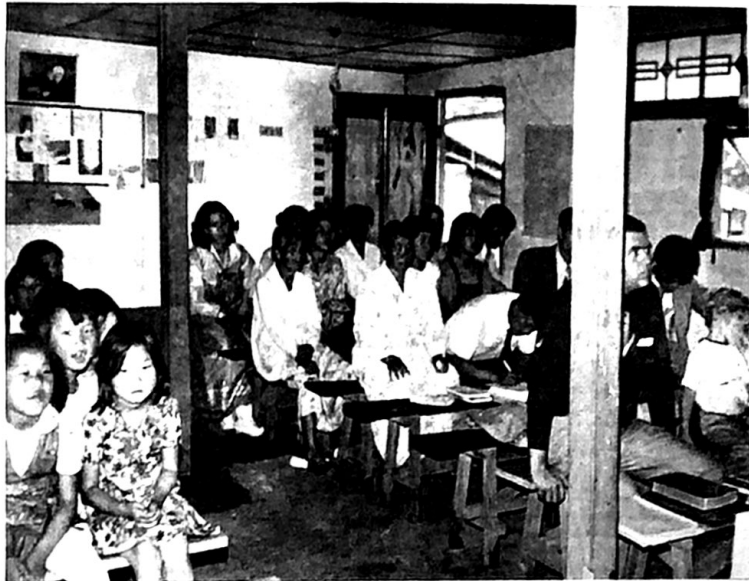

We painted the little temporary building and put a front on it so it would look fairly decent but we must have a building by 1981. It's sure it would now cost at least \$60,000 but if only ten church would give \$6,000 a piece it could be built, that really isn't a big sacrifice is it? Who would be willing ???

Our oldest children, Pam and Tim left Korea for my parents' home in N.C. June 12th and the remaining ones of us are scheduled to depart Korea July 31st and are to arrive in Asheville, N.C. the same day at 6:40 P.M. Once again we send you greetings from the great land of Brasil. We are enjoying the blessings of the Lord. Our lot is much better that we deserve through His grace. Much has happened this month. The Lord is blessing us in the language and we have had the opportunity to speak several times. At times it seems we are making great progress, and other times it seems we are going backwards. But we are so thankful that we can now communicate with the people without too much difficulty. We have been holding services in a home for the past four Sundays with 3 professions the first Sunday, and one the third Sunday. Also, the father and mother of the house have reconciled with the Lord. We have to bow our heads and give thanks in that the Lord will use our weakness to His glory.

Last week I had an experience that I won't forget. I was helping another American move and he accidentally backed over his one year old daughter. We stood for a moment in unbelief because we had just looked and saw nobody behind us. He and his wife

jumped in the car and started to the hospital with her while I stayed with their other small girl and started calling for help. On the way to the hospital he hit another car in the rear and the baby flew out of her mother's arms and began to breath. She is going to be alright. It seems that the car scuttled her and did not pass completely over her. We still are a little nervous over it, but are so thankful that the Lord performed a miracle in her behalf.

We only have around four months before we will be going to Cuiaba to relieve Brother Turner. We have much to do in order to get ready; and have yet much to learn. Pray for us in these matters. We are enjoying the presence of our daughter, who is now with us. She played the Auto-harp in the service yesterday. Everyone really enjoyed it. May the Lord bless each church and individual back there in the States.

Dear Brethren,

This has been a month of blessing for us but also a month of trouble. First, I shall report the blessings. We have continued going to Pocone and having services in the public praca (park) with Borthor Bean and the folks from his church. There was one profession of faith there this past month. Sunday night a week ago in our regular services here at the church two came forward accepting Jesus as Saviour. One is the mother to the girl I baptised the 20th of last month. We had been praying for this woman for almost a year. She was a pretty strong Catholic but now she is a child of the King. The other is a young lady about 18 or 19. She has already asked for baptism. Our attendance on Sundays have been averaging 34 for the month.

Now for the bad news. This past month we have been bothered with thieves here at the church.

Thursday, the 7th of June, someone entered the church and left the window unlocked. We think his plans were to return that night and steal the organ that the church bought back in Feb. of this year. However, a neighbor that is a member of the church, saw him leaving so he didn't come back. Then Friday night someone broke a window and then opened it. Nothing was missing. When I discovered the broken window I bought locks to go on all windows and made the building secure. This past Friday the 15th someone broke another window and threw burning paper or rags inside a Sunday school room. This set fire to new curtains that had just been put up. They completely burned up with some of the floor covering and 4 plastic chairs. The fire was discovered by a neighbor boy that is also a member of the church. They put the fire out before the fire could spread. The damage therefore was mostly to that one room but smoke blacked all the walls and ceilings. I would say that there was about \$1,500.00 damage done to the building. It could have been worse for the Grace and protection of God.

Our consumer coffee prices have risen and no doubt yours will also, so drink just a little less or make it with more water. Two other items of interest here in Garca this month. Mrs. Hatcher has passed her driver's tests and now has her license. Second item: Kathy is back in Brazil to visit with us after two years and a half in the States. Lord willing, she will be with us for about three months.

Brother Bud Fox continues to improve in the language. He is bringing the messages on Wednesday evenings during the month of June and preached two Sunday evenings in the month of May. He will certainly be missed when his tourist visa terminates in July.

Brother Dohn Bethel visited with us for two weeks during the month of May. He really worked

much more than visited. The electronic organ got a complete cleaning and readjustment, all of our electric equipment was repaired, our clothes dryer was repaired, and Dohn bought material, repaired and made equipment for our sound equipment. It was great having you with us, Dohn. Dohn is a member of the Morgan Ave. Baptist Church in Evansville.

All services continued as usual during the last month with the exception of Duartina. Due to cold weather the outside services had to be cancelled for a couple of weeks, and personal visits were made in the neighborhood. The man and wife who professed faith and opened their home for services, and then because of family pressures closed their home to us and quit attending advised us last week that they were repented of what they had done and invited us to return to their home for services.

After three years in Sao Paulo State we are especially thankful for two Scriptures: "I will never leave thee nor forsake thee," and "Be not weary in well doing, for in due season ye shall reap if ye faint not." We would be so happy to hear that some are gathering to pray especially for our new works.

Dear Brethren,

The past few weeks have been slow ones for the work. Since the anniversary service many aspects of the work have been sluggish. This is a phenomenon of the Lord's work that we all know happens. We even expect it sometimes, but we never are comfortable when things grow "chilly".

Here at First Baptist our attendance has been down some. We have had three professions of faith though. The construction of the new building has been at a complete standstill for two weeks now. We have spent all of our funds and are waiting to see what the Lord will provide. The walls are up and the top beam has been poured. The roofing has arrived, but isn't paid for. It will cost \$7,000.00. We also have to build up the gable sections and wait for the lumber to be able to start putting on the roof.

We just talked to the last family of believers who moved away from Campo de Santana this week. There is no longer a village there. There is only one family left in a place that years ago was a large settlement. That family lives right beside the little church building and they practice witchcraft. This is sad, but happens to some places.

The little boy we brought to Peru almost 9 years ago is now a young man. His Mom and I are proud of him and most thankful to the Lord who has made him to be what he is today.

The work is doing well in every place except the work in Kilometer 70 which I am sorry to say has gone off into such error that we have had to break fellowship with them due to their

acceptance of alien immersion and involvement in the charismatic movement.

I had never written about our services which we conduct in the jails both in Tingo Maria as well as here in Huanuco once a week. We also have services in a home for the aged here in Huanuco. We also have many professions of faith in these services. We also have a brother of one of our Pastors in Iquitos in jail here in Huanuco.
