The Lord is still blessing here in Cuiaba. I have baptized one young man 20 years old. Another man in his fifties came by letter from another church and last Sunday night a 15 year old girl made a profession of faith. We are

having good attendance in most services. Our services during the week are not attended nearly as good as the week-end services as many of our members are university students and the high schools here have classes at night. Some of our members even have classes Saturdays and Sundays. Brazil is a country hungry to learn. They are always full of questions and usually friendly when you go door to door. We try to sow the

seed knowing that it takes the Spirit to sprout it and give life. Brethren, help us to sow the precious seed. But don't forget to sow it there also. Our work has been hampered the last two months because of the lack of funds. We have spent more than we have received for the last two months. Since we don't get any more help for expenses because of the lack of funds in the regular fund, all of this must come out of our pocket or we must leave many visits unmade and things not done. This grieves our hearts. We pray and know the Lord will take care of us and are confident that with His help we will be able to go forward.

This has been a busy month and overall a good month. The mission here, The Open Book Baptist Mission, is already beginning to look

prospective. We've had several professions of faith both in the services and in homes "soulwinning". Last Wednesday night the Superintendent's wife of a large poultry farm (herself a school teacher) was saved as well as another younger lady. We had a home Bible study in the mission area with 30 present (Catholic home). I also preached in another mission and home Bible study where combined there were nine professions of faith. I spoke at the men's fellowship service at a sister Baptist Church and had a great time. On Saturdays Mrs. Adams and Teresa; my wife and Pam have been taking turns and having children's street services near the mission. This has

helped immensely in our children's S.S. attendance; in fact, last Sunday our children's S.S. was almost to the building capacity.

The work in Korea all seems to be doing well. I received a letter and pictures from Pastor Cheong this week. The Shinnae Church had baptized five last month, had good attendance, and good offerings. They also had a V.B.S. averaging 195 daily. He reported that all three country works were picking up and that the Kai Pyoung Mission was now in its own building. Too, the Bible College had begun a new Trimester. One sad note was that Pastor Cheong is temporarily resigning to go to the states, for how long, he didn't say. Please pray about this situation. Due to Brother Cheong's going to the states and the December graduation exercise of our Bible College, I need to go to Korea the latter part of the year for a couple of weeks but the mission (BFM) does not have the money to spare. Would someone like to meet this need of almost \$800.00 for me?

Brethren, I thank God for you who have so faithfully supported us. The needs are greater than ever. Would you help us even more to get the Gospel to those who've never heard?

Dear Brethren,

Several good reports have come in from the other churches around us and also from our missions. The church at Maita has had several saved and baptized as well as good crowds. One of our men went there this month and they had over 150 on a Sunday morning. They were there again this week and had over 80. Brother Rubenson, one of our evangelists, has been going to Mancio Lima every week for seven weeks. He reports that Calvary Baptist is perking up a little. Things are not well at Japiim though. The church there is having some bickering among members.

Several of us have been to Lagoinha this month. The mission there is growing quickly. Almost all of our neighbors there have been saved. One Sunday morning there were over 150 in services and nine were saved. Also Brother Wilson, the pastor of the

congregation, went on up the road to visit an Indian tribe and four Indians were saved. He and our boys have also been to the preaching point at Campinas twice with three saved. Lord willing there will be an independent church soon at Lagoinha.

Our men have been to Sacado, Guajara, and Floresta. There have been two professions of faith at Guajara. The work there is still very hard.

Friday night we had a special service here at First Baptist Church dedicated to our patriots. We had a nice crowd. We had a special offering for the construction of our new building. The Lord blessed us with Cr\$50,000.00 (\$925.00).

Although it doesn't seem quite possible, this week reminds me that it has been 20 years since I first came to Brazil with my parents. This month also completes 4 years since we left the United States the last time. We and our countries go through many changes in 20 years or even 4. It is hard for me to follow your life and vice versa, but let us give our lives to the One who changes not in the years and changes to come.

Brazil is having a nationwide polio vaccination campaign. Last week I took Brother Dearmore, in our largest boat, to give the vaccine at Ipixuna. We stayed with Brother Francisco and his wife Dones while there. The new church building they are putting up is just lacking the finishing touches.

Dear Brethren,

During the month of August we had a special visitation campaign to try to increase our attendance. Things went pretty well and during that four weeks we had a total of over 500 visitors to attend our services for the first time. We had set a goal of 200 first time visitors. As we expected most of these did not come back, but some have returned and our average attendance has been better. During the campaign our Sunday night services averaged well over 200. Two young men worked hard for several days to get permission to bring the night students to our Wednesday service. Our bus made two trips to that school and brought about two hundred of them for a total of 274, our highest for one service. From that school and through their effort we got an invitation to go to that school every Thursday night, at least for awhile, to go into each class for a fifteen minute Bible

Class. Three of us go and hold three classes each. There is a possibility that we will get into another for a forty-five minute class, but not on a regular basis.

We have had several professions of faith this month some of which are a result of the campaign. We plan to concentrate more on christian growth in these next few months trying to strengthen the brethren. We are very weak and could use a lot of help in this field.

On the first day of September Betty and I completed twenty years as Missionaries to Brazil. In a way these have passed very rapidly and in another way it seems like we have been here most of our lives. We have been here most of our christian lives having been saved for almost 25 years. I wonder how much of that time has really been used for His Glory.

Arlene and Arlete celebrated their fourteenth birthday on the fifteenth day of this month also.

We would like to ask you to pray that the Lord would raise up a faith-Brazilian already trained or that I could train to take over the pastorate of this church so that I could move on to start another work.

Dear Brethren,

This past month has brought us a mixture of joy and sorrow. It seems that every way we turned there was another mountain to climb. The month started good with me preaching in many of the churches here in Iquitos. I still have quite a bit to learn in the language but the people say that they can understand me pretty well. I also visited in Liberty Baptist Church in Pucallpa, San Juan Baptist Church, Gethsemane Baptist in Huanuco. I was allowed to preach in each of these churches. So as you can see, I am getting a lot of practice. It's not always easy, but GOD is blessing the efforts. As of last report we were about \$500.00 short to finishing paying for the motorcycle. We are trusting that someone will make up this deficit. In spare time I have started to rebuilding the motor on the Datsun pickup that we have been using. It is really in bad shape, but we will have it running good in just a few days. We are working each week with the mission that we have at Santo Tomas and the response really seems to be good. This past week we had

approximately 100 in attendance for the service that we held there. Some will not enter the building and I don't know what we would do if they did because we can only seat about 50 and many of these would have to be children. Some will just stand in the darkness outside to hear the singing and preaching of the WORD. We are praying that during this next month we will have special groups organized and begin the training for them to go out into the churches and missions to hold special services with singing, preaching and teaching of the WORD of GOD. Our joy is that souls are being saved and christians are working for the glory of GOD. Our sorrow is that we feel that much more could have been accomplished had we not been plagued with sickness. When I returned from my trip to Pucallpa Jan was sick and had to be taken to the hospital. She spent 8 days in the hospital with Typhoid Fever and has been terribly sick. She is home now and feeling much better. The doctor said she just needs to rest for a couple more weeks now and will be all right. Please remember us in your prayers that no matter what comes we will just work harder for the honor and glory of GOD. If you can give to help supply our needs here in Peru, please do so now that we might be able to move forward with the work each day.
