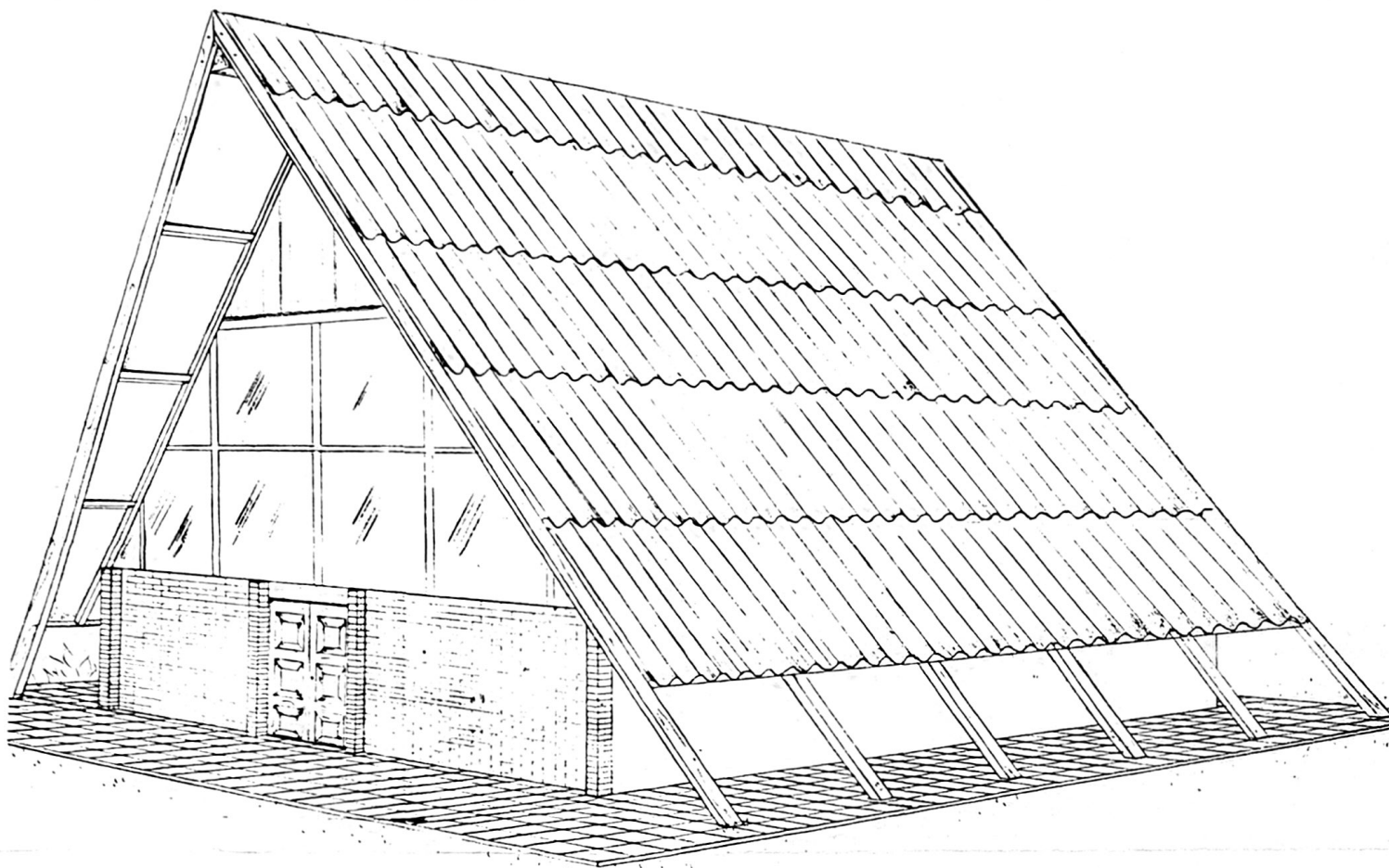

Dear Brethren,
October 17, 1980
I have before me the carbon copy of my September Mission Sheet letter which, Brother Overbey wrote me, did not reach him in time to be published in this month's Mission Sheets. It was written and mailed Sept. 16th. I am sending it with this letter. I have just finished reading my diary since Sept. 16th. I do not have any outstanding news to report. We have carried on the work as usual - two weddings, visits, preaching, counseling more than usual, etc. The Sunday School attendance at the 14th of December Baptist Church is staying around 400. It dropped to 385 last Sunday.

Tuesday of this week, Mrs. Bratcher and I made a trip by car to a preaching point of our church. We arrived after dinner at Boa Vista at Kilometer 180 on the Manaus - Itachatiara Highway. We have 7 members there but were able to only find two of them to attend the service that night. We held services in the home of an unsaved couple. The next morning I left early in a small boat with an outboard motor. I went with a school teacher and one of his students. I visited the home of one of our members and then visited the

school of the teacher whose boat I was using. At his request I conducted a short service in the little, open, one room school house for the 10 of us present. That afternoon we drove back toward Manaus for more than an hour. That night we held services in a home close to Rio Preto. We had around 40 present. Most of the visitors were Adventists. One of the Adventists present, we learned after the service, is a major in the Brazilian Army. I'm glad I had the opportunity to preach to them concerning the grace of the Lord. May the Lord help us who are saved by the grace of the Lord to be zealous of good works! Giving to Baptist Faith Missions is a good work and enables us to do more for the Lord.

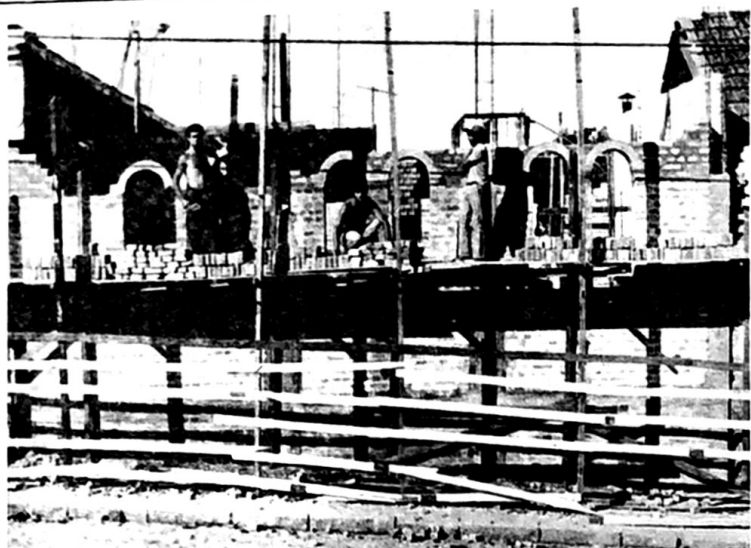

We have had some minor problems with our health, but are now all feeling better. Ursula had a tooth swell up and get infected which required dental surgery. The hot weather has intensified which makes a person feel tired easily but in spite of this our attendance at the church has held up well. There were three professions of faith this month. We baptized a young man in his 20's and a lady in her 40's. There are still three who have made professions of faith who have not yet requested scriptural baptism. We hope they will not delay as some do here in obeying the Lord in baptism.

One of the oldest families in the church plans to leave in a couple of months to move to another state. This will be a loss to the church, but we are praying some of the newer members will step in and become more active and fill the gap. morning we had 106 in Sunday School and services. While we do not base everything on numbers, each one represents a soul who heard the precious word; for which we rejoice. In 8 more weeks we will be leaving the work here for the long journey to Sao Luis, which is 4 day journey by car from here. There we will have a lot to do in order to get resettled. We have rented a house to live in while we do some work on the house that belongs to the mission. Also, we must get our belongings which are in Fortaleza, as we came to Curitiba with only our suitcases.

Dear Brethren,

Once again we find ourselves trying to share with you just a little of the joys and sorrows that we have experienced here in Peru. The month has been filled with blessings and testings. It seems at times that we are so tired that we just cannot go on, but our blessed Lord smiles upon us with His love and gives the strength and courage to go on. I have now completely overhauled the engine on the Datsun pickup that we have and it really runs good. I have ordered some tires for it and when these come in it will be in pretty fair shape and should last until we can get the money to buy a new one.

This past Sunday morning we got up early to go to the mission at Santo Tomas and had two flats before we could leave home. We got the tires straightened out and the gasoline filter started clogging up. The gasoline here is not real expensive but is very dirty. We still need your prayers and offerings to help pay for these repairs, salaries for all missionaries and daily expenses.

We also request your prayers for the family of pastor Enriquez. He is pastor of the Fourth Baptist Church here in Iquitos. His youngest son, 16 years old, has been stricken with Leukemia and is in very bad shape at this time. An older brother has just recently began preaching and has been very much help to me in the work here. Due to much sickness we have not got our groups organized and trained yet that will be going into all the churches and missions with preaching, teaching and singing. Several young preachers are now taking a greater interest in the work and are expressing a desire to learn more of God's word. Please pray for us that we would continue to be used by God to teach and preach the word here in Peru. My daily prayer is that God would send other laborers to help proclaim the Gospel in Peru. I have been invited to be one of the speakers for a special conference to be held in Huanuco November 15-18. The conference is titled "Conferencia de Accion de Gracia". All our churches in Peru are to be represented in these meetings. Please pray that God will richly bless in these services and souls will be saved. All offerings that are received over the amount needed to pay for the motorcycle will apply towards a car for us.

I often think as I begin a new letter; "Well another month closer to eternity and so much needing to be done." God has been gracious to us again this month but I have not seen all the things accomplished that I would like, yet, God is the one Who must bring the increase.

We have had several professions of faith. I baptized two, one lady came by letter from another Baptist Church and another lady has submitted for baptism. We have a young preacher, his wife and three small girls living in the upstairs of the mission building. I believe we shall see things begin to move by his being on the field full time. In fact, I want to get works started and work in qualified native pastors. I believe Paul operated that way. If it be of our Lord, I would like to start another work in the near future. Will you pray with me about this and then help supply the need, rent money for

building, etc.? The field is certainly ripe unto harvest throughout the Philippines. Metro-Manila with a population of 8.2 million and only a few Baptist Churches, not to speak of the many areas with no Baptist Witness. I was privileged to be the speaker of a Baptist Church's twenty-sixth anniversary, here in Metro-Manila. This church building was packed, over 700. In their report, they reported as having started 23 works during their 26 years. How many of our American Churches can match that record? I was also speaker for four nights, on prophecy at a Baptist Church in Quezon City; being their tenth anniversary. I received a report yesterday from four of the five works in Korea. All seem to be doing fine. The Doo Mill Church that I was afraid we might have to close had four professions of faith and attendance beginning to grow. We have one young man to graduate from our school there in December and has asked that I be there to bring the message but as of now there is no money for me to make this trip. Brother Wayne Howard is teaching two nights weekly in the school for which I thank God and him.

Thanks so much for you financial and prayer supporters; if it were not for you we could not be here.

Dear Brethren,
It is rather difficult to write a Mission Sheet letter that would be of much interest since our life isn't much different than any other pastor anywhere.

Some may be saying by now, isn't he supposed to be doing mission work and not just pastoring? No one will agree with you more than I, but someone must do the job at least until the church is strong enough or until the Lord sends us one that can take over to carry the work forward so that I can move on to start another work. For the past several months we have had a 40 year old man attending who is the son and grandson of preachers. He told me some time ago that he has been out of fellowship with the Lord for a long time and wanted to return. Last Monday I felt impressed all day to go talk to him about his baptism. When I got to his house late that evening he had not gotten home yet, so I had a little chance to talk to his wife a while before he came. She had not yet been saved. When he came home he said, "Pastor, I am glad you came, I want to

talk to you about being baptized." Yesterday he came for baptism and his wife made profession of faith. Although he has been out of fellowship for a long time he never did stop studying and seems to have a pretty good grasp of the Word. Perhaps he will be the answer to our prayers.

Our attendance is down some as I expected it would be since we are now concentrating on christian growth, but we still average over 100 in all services with souls still being saved from time to time. I have baptized almost every Sunday night for the past six weeks and would have baptized again last night, but we did not have any water. Those who were to be baptized last night will be next Sunday morning.

I have not been back to Cruzeiro do Sul for over five years and it has been over six years for Betty and the girls, so next Sunday after the baptism we plan to leave Cuiaba to spend two weeks with the churches, Mike, Bev and the grandchildren. We were able to visit with Mike in Manaus almost a year ago, but have not seen Beverly and the grandchildren for almost three years. The First Baptist Church there will be paying most of our passage and I will be preaching an eight night meeting for them. We are looking forward to this with great joy. Pray for us.

Interpreter One Week For 50 Baptists Who Come From Texas . . . Thousands Of Visits Made And Hundreds Of Professions Of Faith, One Being A Catholic Nun . . . Attendance Up In Garca With 17 Professions Of Faith . . . Plans Drawn For New Building To Be Completed In Three Months In Duartina With Funds Short \$5,000.00 To Build . . . Dear Brethren,

Sorry a letter did not get to you last month. You won't believe it -- but the month was so busy, I forgot all about you. Now you know how we feel at times.

Last month there was a group of Baptist pastors and laymen from Texas who came to Sao Paulo State for evangelistic work among 12 churches and missions. I spent one week as an interpreter for pastor Lowell Skaggs and several of his laymen. It was a blessed week of work. Each night he preached and I translated into Portuguese. During the days thousands of visits were made by the 50 Texans and helpers and there were hundreds of professions of faith. At one children's home there were seventeen children who made professions of faith and one nun.

During the month of September our attendance averages were up for all services in Garca. There were seven professions of faith during the month.

The Galia building is progressing. Sorry the pictures sent do not show the progress very well since it is a combination of demolition and reconstruction at the same time. There have been 200 linear feet of

wide footing laid with concrete pillars every two and one-half yards which go down 15' - 18' each. The footings and foundations are being prepared for two stories. Walls are going up.

Monday, the constructor-architect gave me the cost of the building the structure in the city of Duartina. \$19,000.00 was the cost. There was only \$18,000.00 left in Building Fund for new works. It seemed the building contract must be let as our money is losing its value much faster than the exchange rates. "God, if we should build, please give me a Scripture to strengthen my heart."

"Open the mouth and I will fill it," was His reply. Wednesday, the contract was agreed on and there was \$5,000 lacking to see the building completed because of needs on Galia building. But, Wednesday night I called Brother Edward Overbey to have \$10,000 deposited. On Thursday morning there was a letter saying that a gift of \$5,000 had come in for the new works. Pray that the new building will be finished in three months.

Brethren, the surface has not been scratched. There is Cabralia and 270 other county areas in this State without Baptist Churches. Men are needed. Financial help is needed. One day we will be sorrowful that we invested so little.
