Once again we are back in Brazil. We left the
States about 8 P.M. the 15th of April and we arrived
in Manaus the 16th. We were in Manaus just long

enough to get our baggage clear of customs and catch the next plane for Cuiaba. The Lord blessed us as we went through customs in that not a bag had to

be opened.

When we arrived in Cuiba, the Creiglows and most of the young people were at the airport to greet us. As we got off the plane and started for the December 2018.

the plane and started for the gate the Brazilians began to clap their hands. It sure felt good to be back with our

We were not able to get the same house that the Drapers had lived in before they went to Sao Luis but

we were able to rent another house in the same area.
However, we were told that we can only have it for six
months. After that I don't know what we'll do as there
are almost no houses to rent. Pray about this with us.
We stayed with the Creiglows for about four
days until we could get moved in to our house. We are

about settled in and getting back into our routine

of work.

We found the church in pretty fair shape after being without a pastor for about 4 months. The attendance has fallen off some during these months but most have been faithful and continued to serve the Lord. We are encouraged by the growth in some of the members. We have one awaiting baptism at this time.

Lord. Taberncale Baptist Church is now on a

an average attendance of 1500 for a ten week period.

an average attendance of 1500 fc During the first three weeks Sunday School has averaged 1581 persons with a high attendance of 2047.

This month I was privileg-ed to visit the First Baptist Church in Cruzeiro do Sul, Acre where Brother Mike Creiglow is pastor. I preached the first service in their new building. The weather was not co-operative, nevertheless,

co-operative, nevertheless, an estimated 1300 persons were present. The design of the building was done by Brother Mike and is beautiful and practical (the most

beautiful in his town).

The most pressing need among missionaries and works is trained pastors and evangelists. Each month requests are coming in for trained men. Thank the Lord we have approximately 40 men working on their degrees in the Baptist Theological Seminary of Manaus. Just this month through the ministry of these students and their professors over 100 souls have been saved. The endeavor, however, is an expensive one. The students' tuition are not nearly enough to cover the expenses of such a ministry. By supporting the training of these men you will have a more direct influence in the spread of the gospel and establishment of churches in new towns and villages than any other missionary endavour you support.

We need your help now. I, personally, want to ask you to help these students get their education so they can get on the field. I want you to consider asking your church to give \$25.00 per month towards helping these students. Designate your offerings to the Brasil Seminary.

These past weeks, since the last Missions letter, have been extremely busy, however, overall, rewarding. I find the trials most generally being more than off-set with blessings in God's work.

Since the last letter we were able to renovate the building at Open "Bible", Baptist Church's property to the extent of using it. Our people are very proud of it. We had an evangelistic meeting in the building with seventeen professions of faith of whom I've baptized four. In addition to this, we ordained my associate (Bro. James Escrupold) into the Gospel Ministry on April the twenty-sixth. Then the first week of May the church had a V.B.S. for the children, which also was good, especially being in a city that is Catholic dominated. This next ment we have had

which also was good, especially being in a city that is Catholic dominated. This past month we have had four additions by baptism and eight by letter.

In addition to these mentioned blessings, I was also privileged to lecture four nights in a seminar at Bro. Adam's mission (Victory Baptist Mission). I was

truly blessed in seeing the hunger of his people for the truth. I was only able to touch a bit on the church and her ordinances but I feel the time was well spent.

Our last Sunday with the Open "Bible", Baptist Church was great. We saw twenty-three persons respond during the services for the day for various reasons, two of them upon professing Jesus Christ as their Saviour. The church really gave us a wonderful send-off fellowship dinner and gifts. About fifteen of our people came approximately two hrs. one way to the airport to see us off.

Our week in Korea was also great. My father had come to the Philippines on May 20, and went with us through Korea and on to the States. He enjoyed it and the people enjoyed him. We were met by members, pastors, and deacons from at least three churches upon our arrival in Korea, May twelveth. Hectured in a seminar four nights and preached the ordination message for the ordination of two deacons at the Shin Nae Baptist Church on Sunday Afternoon of May 17. The works are doing well in Korea and we surely enjoyed being with our brothers and sisters there. We are now back in the States and I am now open for conferences, Faith Promise or other wise, or just to preach, lecture, show slides, whatever as a representative of the mission works. Let us get stirred up for the lost around the world.

I have preached in several churches in Alabama and God has richly blessed. Also, I was guest speaker for a high school group here in Alabama. God is continually opening new doors. Let's don't let anyone close them.



Dear Brethren,
All is well here in Cruzeiro and busier than ever it seems. We are working on the new building at full steam. We have just finished doing the stucco on the audtiorium walls and some of the outside. We just received the frames for all of the outer doors and windows. I built the trusses a couple of weeks ago. There was quite a bit of suspense here in town when it came time to put them up. People were wanting to know how we were going to life 16 meter trusses that weigh a ton and a half. For you felling



our side though and the job went smoothly. The roof should be on by next week. There have been plenty of people from church coming out to help. This has cut down on many expenses. One of our men has a pick up truck and is hauling materials for us free. Doesn't it sound strange that a church with over 150 members

should have only one member with a truck. That's the way it is though. What a blessing though. One of our men came by yesterday afternoon to bring his tithe because he knew we couldn't wait until Sunday. We are building with lots of faith and a good portion of hard work. The Church will be celebrating her anniversary in less than a month and we hope to be into the new building by then. We are also expecting a very big special offering then. Our goal is Cr \$100,000,00.



We rejoice in the Lord! Since last month's
letter to you, our church - (14th of December
Baptist Church) has been blessed of the Lord - in
spite of the fact that - we lost one member by death,
three by letter and seven by
exclusion. We gained six by
baptism and have some twenty
awaiting baptism. We have six
of our young people taking
piano lessons. At the present
we have no one in the church
that can play the organ during
the services.

On the 27th of April, Mrs.
Bratcher & I left Manaus.
After nine hours of traveling on the Amazonas River aboard the "Nacional" we arrived at Novo Remanso. On Tuesday the 28th I performed a wedding ceremony and then baptized the bride and groom and four others. We had almost 100 people present for the wedding and baptism. A group from the New Jerusalem Baptist Mission were present. I marked with them or promised that we would be with them for five nights, finishing on Sunday, June 21st with a baptizing. Thus, in June our church will have a new

mission already with a meeting house with thirteen or more baptized members. However, we'll have to assume a debt of around \$400.00 on the building. We remained at Novo Remanso until Friday night, the lst of May, when we returned to Manaus on the "Nacional"

remained at Novo Remains until Friday light, and stof May, when we returned to Manaus on the "Nacional."

On Sunday, May 3rd the Lord blessed with 693 (Six Hundred and ninety three) in Sunday Bible School. Asa Mark preached at the Morning Worship hour. This near record attendance puts us in front of Addyston, Ohio, Baptist Church in attendance contest by 139 points. Sunday May 10th will determine the final winner!

Since day before yesterday I am driving a different car. We were able to buy for \$5,500. a 79 Ford - small type station wagon. We thank all of you who gave to purchase of us a new car. Even though we were not able to get a new car on what came in designated for "Bratcher Car" we trust that this car will give us good service in the work of the Lord. Please continue to give so that the work of the Lord here in the city and in the interior will continue to be blessed of the Lord. We appreciate all that you do for us. Give to the regular fund and to the designated causes as well.

Dear Brethren,

This past month has been pressing, profitable, and prospective. Travels that included South Carolina, Florida, Tennessee, Indiana, and Kentucky made it pressing. Fellowship with friends, churches, loved ones of our families, and the conclusion of my graduate studies with Luther Rice Seminary made the month profitable. And the month offered some good prospects



Seminary made the month profitable. And the month offered some good prospects for the future of the Mission work. We visited one church that averages about 450 in Sunday School. The people made a total Faith Promise of 37,000 dollars for missions in the coming year. Another church we visited had a mission conference and their Faith Promise was 13,150 dollars by Thanksgiving with a goal of over 20,000 for the entire year. This church has about 105 members and is in a new building program. Another church that gives almost 50% of their total offerings to missions is planning a faith promise mission conference with a desire to increase their out reach even more. The prospect is—Where there is a will to spread the gospel there will be awy. Let me share with you a possibility for overcoming the financial needs in the face of inflation and high interest rates. In Brazil the inflation runs close to 80% annually. How could you buy a car with such interest rates? Just buy it without interest. Here is how. Sixty persons who want to buy a car share the total price of two cars each month. Two men receive cars each month. The second month all 60 pay the total pice of two more cars and two more men receive cars. At the end of 30 months all 60 persons have their cars and by helping one another they bought them without paying interest. THINK OF THIS—If there were 35 churches months all 60 persons have their cars and by helping one another they bought them without paying interest. THINK OF THIS—If there were 35 churches or individuals who would give \$1,000 in a lump sum every six months for new works there could be a new work opened in two places every six months. Money that comes in small amounts for new works loses its value more than 50% per year in Brazil, while it lies in the bank. God has given us the means. The harvest is

great and white. If you or your church would like to be one to participate in planting two new churches in new cities and towns in Brazil, please write me and tell
